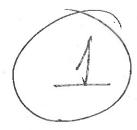

Order: The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) has been planned with the makin objective of improving the health outcomes for people. The Project is to be implemented with the assistance from the World Bank, at a total cost of Rs. 597.1554 crore. The Agreement for the Project was signed between the World Bank, the Government of India and the Government of Tamil Nadu on 5.1.2005 at New Delhi. The Project has become effective from 27th January 2005, for a period of five years:

- 2 During the Project period, it is plenned to provide buildings, hospital equipments, goods, vehicles and other items to 270 hospitals, i.e., 29 District Headquarters Hospitals and 241 Sub District Hospitals functioning under the control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services. Other than the above activities, it is planned to provide various other amenities and services through consultant services. During the World Bank Missions, Project Appraisal and Negotiations, it was agreed that procurement of equipment, goods and vehicles shall be entrusted to the Tamil Nedu Medical Services Corporation. The Civil works and Services will be procured by the Project Management Unit. During the negotiations with the World Bank; it was suggested that the following two Committees shall be constituted in order to facilitate the procurement activities by the Project Management Unit.

 - 2. Tender Finalisation Committee.

The World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will be implemented in Tamil Nadu, et a total outlay of Rs. 597.1554 crore, over a period of five years. The Project Agreement was signed on 5th January 2005 and the Project has become effective from 27th January 2005, A 4-tiered Project Management Structure has been planned for the Tamil Nadu \$5 65 BW 5 54 9 Health Systems Project, viz. Ar grant to

- 1. State Empowered Committee (SEC);
- ii. Project Steering Committee (PSC):
- III. Project Management Unit (PMU); and
- iv. District Project Management Units (DPMU).

The State Empowered Committee for the Project has been constituted in the Government Order 1st read above.

2. As per the Project Appraisal Document, the Project will undertake activities to provide renovations, refurbishment, additions and extensions to hospital buildings, provision of hospital equipment, goods, furniture, vehicles etc., to 270 Project hospitals, namely, 29 District Headquarters Hospitals and 241 District and Sub District Hospitals. The Project will also undertake various innovative activities for reduction of maternal and neo-netal mortality, improving tribal health, facilitating use of hospitals by the poor and disadvantaged, health management information system and a variety of other activities. The Civil works will be executed through the State Public Works Department. The equipment, goods, vehicles, etc., will be procured through the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. The services like Consultancies will be procured by the Project Management Unit. It is necessary to monitor and review the activities of the Project periodically, to supervise and guide the Project Management Unit, to seek suitable convergence and reduce overlap / duplication among various projects. monitor funds flow and facilitate smooth implementation of the Project, to achieve the desired results. The Project Director has sent proposals for the constitution of the Project Steering Committee.

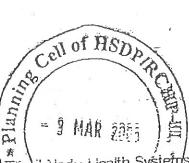

Tamil Nadu is the first State, selected to implement the "second generation" State Health Systems Project in India. The Project Component includes support to civil works for hospital buildings including equipment supply, information, education & communication, training, health management information system, NGO supported activities, tribal health, /health care waste management and public private partnership. The Project cost is Rs. 597.1554 crore. The World Bank has informed that the project takes effect from 27.1.2005.

- 2. As per the Project Design, a State Empowered Committee has to be constituted with high level representation from the departments concerned of the State Government, with financial powers to significantly improve the functioning of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- 3. The Project Director (in charge), Tamii Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the World Bank assisted Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, as any externally supported project, is time bound and target oriented with intensified monitoring of delivery of outputs 7 achievements internally and by periodic reviews by World Bank. In order to obviate delays in approvals and issue of sanctions and in order to timely implement / execute the project activities as per Project Implementation Plan, the Project Director (in charge), Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has suggested the constitution of a State Empowered Committee, headed by the Chief Secretary, Government of Tamil Nadu, with high-level representation from the concerned departments of the State Government:
- 4. The Government has examined the above proposal and has decided to accept it. Accordingly, the Government constitutes the State Empowered Committee for the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project with the following Officials.

- 5. The State Empowered Committee shall meet at least once in every six months to make major policy decisions to attain the project goals. Specifically, it shall solve inter departmental coordination problems and address issues related to convergence of services. The Committee shall also review the linkages between the Centrally Sponsored Schemes for Reproductive and Child Health, Disease control, etc and the State Health Systems strengthening effort.
 - 6. The powers of the State Empowered Committee shall be as follows:
- i. To sanction expenditure up to Rs.1.00 crore for civil works including repair and renovation, which have been approved in the Project Implementation Plan.
- ii. To sanction expenditure up to Rs.1.00 crore for non-civil works which have been approved in the Project Implementation Plan.
 - 7. The decisions of the State Empowered Committee shall be communicated as Government Order from the Health and Family Welfare Department.
 - 8. If on any issue coming up before the State Empowered Committee involving finance, the Development Commissioner and Secretary to Government, Finance Department or his nominee records a minute of dissent, the Health and Family Welfare Department shall issue orders only in consultation with the Finance Department and if there is no agreement between the two departments even at this stage, orders shall be taken in circulation as per Business Rule 25 (1)...
 - 9. If the project proposal submitted to the State Empowered Committee exceeds the Committee's financial powers, the proposal with budget shall be cleared by the State Empowered Committee, subject to approval in circulation by the concerned Ministers and Chief Minister, as need be.

The Project Director (in charge), Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Hon'ble Chief Minister has consented to launch the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project on 21st March 2005. The Project Director has stated that following activities are anticipated in connection with the Launching function.

The Project Director has stated that the approximate cost of the above activities works out to Rs. 2 lakh and the amount is urgently required to settle the bills. - 2. The Government, after careful examination, has decided to accept the request of the Project Director. Accordingly, sanction is accorded to an amount of Rs. 2.00 lakh (Rupees Two lakh only) to incur the expenditure towards launching of the Health Systems Project. The following orders are also issued:

Order:

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) has been planned for the improvement of the Health System of the State as a whole and development of Government Secondary Care Hospitals viz., 29 District Headquarters Hospitals and 241 Sub District Hospitals comprising of Taluk and Non-Taluk hospitals spread throughout Tamil Nadu.

- 2. The Project is to be implemented with the assistance of the World Bank. The World Bank has given approval for the Project in the Board meeting of the World Bank held on 16.12.2004 at Washington, USA. An Agreement between the World Bank and Government of India for the Development Credit Agreement (DCA) and the World Bank and Government of Tamil Nadu for the Project Agreement (PA) has been signed at New Delhi on 5.1.2005. The World Bank has now intimated that the Date of Effectiveness of the Project is 27.01.2005.
- 3. The Project is known as Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The total cost of the Project is fixed at Rs.597.1554 crore, of which the World Bank part is Rs.502.9465 crore and the part of the Government of Tamil Nadu to the Project is Rs.94.2089 crore. The Project is to be implemented in a period of 5 years from 2005 to 2010 in three phases. The first and second phase will be of 18 months duration each and the third phase will be of two years duration.
- 4. Apart from providing civil works to hospital buildings, hospital equipment, hospital goods, furniture and vehicles to the 270 hospitals, the Project will also undertake the following activities:
- Reduction of Maternal and Neonatal Mortality by, among other things, operationalising 1. the CEmONC Centres. Facilitating use of Hospitals by the poor and the disadvantaged such as the rural 2. women, people belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and the aged. 3. Developing Effective Models to combat the emerging burden of Non-communicable Diseases like Cardio Vascular Diseases and addressing the issues of Diabetes and lifestyles, Accidents and Trauma care and Cancer with special reference to Cancer Breast and Cancer Cervix.

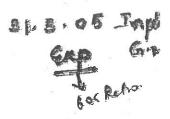

The World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) aims to strengthen the infrastructure facilities of all the 270 Secondary level hospitals in the State at a total outlay of Rs 597.15 crore. Order:

The World Bank funded Tamii Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) aims to strengthen the infrastructural facilities of all the 270 District and Sub-district hospitals in the State at a total outlay of Rs 597.1554 crore. The Project has taken effect from 27.1.2005. The project period is 5 years from the date of effectiveness.

- 2. The Planning Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was created in the Government Order 1st read above, with a skeleton staff with effect from 01.01.2004, by relocating some of the staff of the erstwhile DANIDA Tamil Nadu Area Health Care Project. The Planning Cell was assigned with the preparatory works of the Project. But, as per Article II (Execution of the Project) Clause 2.01(b) and Schedule II (Implementation Programme) Glause 2(a) of the Project Agreement, it is mandatory to have a fully functional Project Management Unit (PMU) with required personnel as set forth in the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) within 3 months from the effectiveness of the project.
- 3. As per the agreed minutes of negotiation between the Government of India, the Government of Tamil Nadu and the International Development Agency and the Project Appraisal Document, the infrastructural upgradation like addition of wards / renovation of existing buildings and supply of equipment and goods for all the secondary level hospitals in 5 districts viz, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Pudukottai, Theni and Kanyakuman will be taken up during the first 18 months of the project period, i.e. Phase I period. During the next 18 months in the Phase II period, infrastructural upgradation of all the secondary level hospitals in 14 districts will be taken up. Finally during the last 24 months, i.e. the Phase III period, the infrastructural upgradation of all the secondary level hospitals in the remaining 10 districts, except Chennai city, will be taken up. During the project period of 5 years. State level software items viz. Training, Information, Education and Communication (IEC), Health Management Information System (HMIS), Studies & Surveys etc. will be taken up. Besides, some Pilot Projects viz. (1) On screening and treatment of non communicable diseases based on primary prevention like cessation of smoking and prevention of hypertension and (2) Universal cervical cancer

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screening and treatment to be implemented in 4 districts viz, Ramanathapuram, Virudhunagar, Thanjavur and Coimbatore, will be taken up during the Phase-I of the Project period. Training, Health Care Waste Management, Health Management Information System and certain general activities will be taken up throughout Tamil Nadu during the Phase I itself.

- 4. The Project Director (in charge), Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Project activities are to be implemented at the State level in coordination with various departments like Directorate of Medical & Rural Health Services (DM&RHS), Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation (TNMSC), Public Works Department (PWD), etc. Hence, a full-fledged Project Management Unit (PMU) consisting of 9 Cells has to be created for the Project. Formation of District Project Management Units (DPMUs) has also been suggested to monitor and implement the Project activities at the district level. The Project Director has requested the Government to accord sanction for the creation of a Project Management Unit at the State level and District Project Management Units (DPMUs) at the district level to monitor and implement the project activities.
- 5. The Government has examined the proposals of the Project Director (in charge), Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and has decided to accept the proposals. Accordingly, the following orders are issued:
- i. Sanction is accorded for the creation of a Project Management Unit (PMU) at the State level comprising of the following 9 Cells with the composition of staff as indicated in the Annexure I to this order with effect from the date of effectiveness of the Project.
 - i. Project Management Unit Administrative Cell.
 - ii. Equipment Cell.
 - iii. Engineering (Civil Works) Cell.
 - iv. Financial Management Cell (FMC).
 - v. Quality and Systems Improvement Cell (QSIC).
 - vi. Human Resources Development Cell (HRD Cell).
 - vii. Health Promotion Cell (HPC).
 - viii. Public Private Partnership Management Cell (PPP Cell).
 - ix. Strategic Planning Cell (SPC).

The functions of the PMU are given in the Annexure – II to this order.

ii. Sanction is also accorded for the creation of a District Project Management Unit (DPMU) in each district headed by the respective Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare concerned with supportive Staff, as indicated in the Annexure III to this order in all the 29 revenue districts, except Chennai city, to monitor and implement the district level project activities. The supporting staff shall be filled up on redeployment basis and contract basis by the respective Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare. The District Project Management Units will function in the office of the concerned Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare. The functions of the District Project Management Units are given in the Annexure II to this order.

- iii. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is authorised to accommodate the Chief Accounts Officer, who is now working in the Planning Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, to officiate in the post of Financial Adviser & Chief Accounts Officer sanctioned to the Project Management Unit and to accommodate the remaining 12 staff sanctioned to the Planning Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, given in the Annexure IV to this Order, in equivalent posts in the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. All other posts sanctioned to the Project Management Unit shall be filled up in time scale of pay by redeployment from the Government departments / Corporations. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to fill up all the contractual appointments.
- iv. The expenditure on pay and allowances of the Staff on Time Scale, Wages, Payment for Professional and Special Services, for the persons appointed on Contract / Daily wages / Consolidated pay sanctioned for this Project shall be debited to the following head of account:

1. PMU ADMINISTRATIVE CELL

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The functions of the Project Management Unit Administrative Cell are as follows:

- ✓ Arrangement of vehicles, computers and other office needs.

2. EQUIPMENT CELL

The Equipment Cell will oversee the procurement of equipments and other goods under the various project sub-components, particularly the effective upgrading of clinical, management and support services. The Equipment Cell will be responsible for the following functions:

- ✓ Set equipment and maintenance standards in consultation with the Strategic Planning Cell and set specifications, matching with services and level of facility.
- ✓ Ensure scheduled procurement.
- ✓ Take steps for corrective and preventive maintenance.
- Forecast requirements for annual equipment procurement and replacement.
- ✓ Will co-ordinate the procurement of civil works, equipment, goods, vehicles, consultancies, services, etc. with the Project Management Unit Administrative Cell.
- ✓ The cell will also assist the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation in the preparation of bid documents, evaluation and finalising of the award of contract.

3. ENGINEERING (CIVIL WORKS) CELL

The Engineering Cell will finalise Plans and Estimates for all civil works, float and finalise tenders for all civil works and award the contracts. The functions of the Engineering cell are as follows:

- ✓ Finalisation and approval of all Plans and Estimates for all civil works.
- Checking and approval of estimates for repairs and renovation works prepared by district team.
- ✓ Ensure preparation of bidding documents for all civil works by the Public Works department
 as per the guidelines of the World Bank.
- ✓ Invitation of bids & award of contracts.

- Monitoring and Inspection of all the Civil and Electrical works under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- Ensuring quality of construction at every level.
- Ensuring timely completion of works as per the schedule given by the Project Director, tamil
 Nadu Health Systems Project.
- ✓ Preparation and submission of progress reports to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- Coordinating with other Government Departments and Non Governmental Organisations as and when need arises.

4. Financial Management Cell (FMC)

The Financial Management Cell will be responsible for all the financial management related issues both at the Project Management Unit and the District Project Management Units (DPMU). The functions of the FMC are as follows:

- ✓ Preparation of budget estimates to the State Finance department.
- ✓ Timely allocation of funds to the District Project Management/Units.
- Regulation of quarterly control appropriation.
- ✓ Preparation of Statements of Expenditure and Financial Monitoring Reports.
- Ensuring periodic internal audit of the project.
- ✓ Ensuring timely submission of Accountant General (AG) audit reports to the World Bank.

5. Quality and Systems Improvement Cell (QSIC)

The Quality and Systems Improvement Cell shall oversee the implementation of activities proposed under the Project for upgrading the quality of services provided through the public and private health systems. The Cell would be responsible for the following functions:

- ✓ Identify quality assurance indicators to monitor quality of the State's health system.
- Create and maintain a database related to hospital performance indicators, health services, health programmes, disease surveillance and hospital waste management.
- ✓ Set up feasible and acceptable standards of quality of care and prepare protocols for implementation of the standards.
- Develop a hospital inspection checklist and take up inspections to identify weaknesses and suggest improvements.
- Prepare status report on implementation of quality improvement programmes, information systems, disease surveillance and hospital waste management and submit it to the Project Steering Committee through the Project Director.
- ✓ In collaboration with the Strategic Planning Wing, develop ways to strengthen logistics and referral linkages and assist in their implementation

6. Human Resources Development Cell (HRD Cell)

The Human Resources Development Cell will be responsible for developing and implementing Institution strengthening strategies through improved human resource management. The responsibilities of the Human Resources Development Cell will be:

- ✓ Developing institution strengthening strategies.
- Regularly assess the need of clinical and management training for all levels of staff.
- Design training curriculum and modules.
- ✓ Prepare training calendars.
- √ Identify training organisations.
- ✓ Co-ordinate with the Directorate to identify trainees.
- ✓ Co-ordinate with the training institutions and trainees for scheduling and follow -up.
- ✓ Maintain inventories of training conducted and evaluate the impact of training.

7. Health Promotion Cell (HPC)

The Health Promotion (Behaviour Change Communication) Cellwill oversee the implementation of project strategies on innovations to enhance access and equity for disadvantaged sections. The responsibilities of the health promotion cell are as follows:

- ✓ Planning and designing comprehensive campaigns involving all means of communications mainly audiovisual communications, to reach the messages of health to the community. The cell will also take necessary steps for designing and printing the required Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) materials whenever the need arises.
- Assessing the need of Behaviour Change Communication especially for the disadvantaged population in the State.
- ✓ Planning and designing activities in the remote, tribal and inaccessible areas.
- ✓ Identifying Non Governmental Organisations and / or private sector agencies for implementing Behaviour Change Communication in the Community and generating demand for health care services.
- Monitoring and evaluating several community based interventions and assessing the impact of Behaviour Change Communication strategy in the Community under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

8. Public Private Partnerships Management Cell (PPP Cell)

The Public Private Partnerships Management Cell will be mainly responsible for finding areas where partnerships could enhance and complement the efforts of the Government in providing services to the people especially in remote and interior areas. The main tasks of the Cell are as follows:

- ✓ Setting the overall State Policy and Strategy for Partnerships.
- Cataloguing and analysing existing experiences in health sector partnership in the State and creating a permanent database of these documented experiences.

- Initiating and facilitating dialogue among Government, Non Governmental Organisations, Private Sector and Informal Private Providers and their associations in order to improve communications and explore options for future collaboration.
- ✓ Integrating and supporting existing partnerships in the State e.g., sharing experience among the managers of the State level Tuberculosis, HIV / AIDS, and other programs that currently work with the private sector.
- Designing the partnership activities to be supported under the World Bank financed project

9. Strategic Planning Cell (SPC)

The Strategic Planning Cell will act as the think-tank for the project and undertake various studies and policy research work for improving the efficiency and effectiveness of the health systems in the state. The functions of the Strategic Planning Cell are as follows:

- ✓ Identify issues, generate and evaluate options aimed at improving the performance of the State's health system. These could include strengthening strategic planning capacity in the department, improving human resource management and decentralisation.
- ✓ Guide in commissioning studies in operational and policy research for secondary level hospitals.
- ✓ Suggest changes in standards and norms in relation to staff / service / equipment / health care waste management / clinical care / essential drugs / referral, etc.
- Undertake various studies on important and critical issues for effective implementation of the project activities to achieve the desired output.

B. DISTRICT PROJECT MANAGEMENT UNIT (DPMU) AT DISTRICT LEVEL

A District Project Management Unit (DPMU) shall be set up in each district in the office of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare (JDM&RHS&FW). The unit will assist the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare in effective implementation of the project activities at the district level. The functions of the cell are follows:

- Assist the Project Management Unit in local procurement.
- ✓ Facilitate and monitor provisioning of the project inputs at the district level.
- ✓ Support implementation of systems for logistics, health management information.
- Monitoring and evaluation, and referral linkages in the project supported institution.
- ✓ Design & implement training plans for the staff

The World Bank supported Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has become effective from 27th January 2005. The administrative sanction for the Project was accorded in the Government Order. 2nd ead above. The total cost of the Project is Rs. 597.15 crore. The Project is to be implemented in a period of five years from 2005 to 2010. Apart from providing hospital buildings; hospital equipment; hospital goods, furniture and vehicles to 270 secondary care hospitals functioning under the administrative control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, the Project will also undertake many activities like operationalising Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEMONC) services in 62 hospitals, improvements in tribal health, measures to facilitate use of hospitals by the poor, developing effective models to compat non communicable diseases, health promotion activities, sining etc. The Project Management Unit (PMU) headed by an IAS Officer with nine cells has been sanctioned, in the Government Order 3rd read above, to the Project Management Unit to look after various activities of the project.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that there is a need to provide space for the staff to work in the Project Management Unit. The entire staff including officials could not be accommodated in the present office of the Project Management Unit. Construction of a new building to accommodate the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will lake some more time and therefore, temporary accommodation is urgently required dill then for the Project Management Unit. Vacant rooms are not available in the existing DMS building to accommodate the Project Management Unit. As a new DMS enriex building has been provided in the Project, spending huge amount as rent on private rented building does not seem to be viable.
- 3. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is mostly concerned with activities pertaining to the hospitals under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and therefore, it is essential that the Project Management Unit is located inside the DMS campus. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has therefore, proposed the pair two temporary Sheds available in the DMS campus to accommodate the Project Management Unit temporarily till the new DMS annex building is constructed. The PWD has prepared the estimates for both civil and electrical repairs to these Sheds.

4. The Project Director has stated that since the Project Office is a new one, office furniture have to be procured to furnish the Project Management Unit. The furniture requirement has been worked out keeping in mind the minimum requirement and the workload anticipated for the Project Management Unit. It is also proposed to provide communication facilities to the Office such as intercom and telephone facilities. The total cost involved in this proposal is Rs 41.86 lakh as non-recurring experiment and Rs. 2.43 lakh as recurring expenditure as detailed below.

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The World Bank supported Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has become effective from January 2005. In the Government Order 1st read above, a Project Management Unit (PMU) has been created for the Project at the State level to look after the Project activities. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Project will be implemented in coordination with various departments like Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services, Public Works Department, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation, etc. Officials from the World Bank, Government of India and other Dignitaries frequently visit the Project office. Very often at short notice certain meetings, small Workshops, Seminars, etc, have to be arranged either with the visiting Officials or with the Officials concerned at all level for taking important decisions for implementation of the Project. The Project also envisages several innovative interventions at secondary health care level. Several of these interventions have been planned for the first time in Tamil Nadu. Therefore, there may be unforeseen expenditure during implementation of the Project.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for sanction of Management Funds to take care of the unforeseen expenditure in the Project. Many of the expenditure requirements could be of immediate nature. She has, therefore, proposed to delegate financial powers to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, to incur expenditure not exceeding Rs 1,00,000/at a time to meet the expenses in connection with urgent, innovative and research type of activities under the various components dealt by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, i.e, conducting Workshops, Seminars, Hospitality expenses, engaging Consultants, purchase and repair of equipments and incidental expenses relating to arrangements for the visit of World Bank Teams, Government of India Officials, Officials from other States, etc, during the Project period. The total cost involved in this proposal is Rs.12.00 lakh per annum, which is the annual ceiling, with an advance of Rs 1.00 lakh at a time to be recouped after spending one advance amount during the Project period. The above expenditure is included in Component 3 Subcomponent 4.4 of the Project Implementation Plan.

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project aims to improve the health system in the State with a focus to strengthen the secondary care hospitals, namely, the district headquarters hospitals and sub district hospitals in the State. The interventions planned in the Project can be successful only when all the stakeholders are aware of the project activities and involve themselves in various innovative strategies planned in the Project. Therefore, it is important to sensitise all the stakeholders on issues concerning CEmONC Centres, Quality of care, etc. It is also important to sensitise and train the field level staff about various Project interventions to implement the Project objectives effectively.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that Workshops have been planned to prepare district action plans for the implementation of the activities of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. It is proposed to conduct 3 Workshops covering the following subjects during the current year.
- 1. Quality of Care Workshop: The aim of this Workshop is to develop quality of care indicators and benchmarks in Government hospitals. The duration of the Workshop would be 2 days. The participants for the Workshop would be selected from among the Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare, Deputy Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare, Superintendents, Chief Medical Officers, Professors from Medical Colleges and State level Officials. The total number of participants would be around 30.
- 2. Workshop on Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care Services: The aim of this Workshop is to review the services of the CEmONC hospitals in the State. The duration of the Workshop would be 2 days and it would be conducted in 7 batches. The participants for the Workshop would be all Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare, Deputy Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare, Chief Medical Officers / Superintendents, Gynaecologists and Paediatricians from CEmONC hospitals and State level Officials. The total number of participants would be around 350.
- 3. <u>Sensitisation of District Project Management Unit Officials</u>: The aim of this Workshop is to sensitise the officials who are responsible for implementing the project activities at district level.

The duration of the Workshop would be 2 days and would be conducted in 3 batches. The participants for the Workshop would be all Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare, District Health Systems Project Officers, Administrative Officers, Assistant cum Accountants in the District Project Management Units and State level Officials. The total number of participants would be around 150.

ORDER:

Non Communicable diseases now pose a major challenge to the department of Health and Family Welfare as they contribute to a high rate of mortality and morbidity. In India, 12.5% of deaths occur due to Coronary Artery Disease (CAD), 5% due to Stroke, 3% due to Rheumatic Heart Disease (RHD) and 5% due to other cardiovascular diseases. Indians are not only more vulnerable to the disease but they develop it quite early in life, i.e, by the age of 30s and 40s in contrast to the Western Society where the disease manifests at the age of 50s and 60s. Moreover, the disease runs a virulent course leading to repeated hospitalisations and early deaths. It is imperative that a strategy is developed to prevent these lifestyle diseases even before they manifest, as the cost of providing treatment to a large number of people having hypertension, diabetes and cardio vascular diseases is highly prohibitory and the annual cost of drugs and hospitalisations run into crores of rupees. It is, therefore, proposed to conduct a Baseline Survey for assessment of awareness of risk factors.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for hiring a Consultancy firm to conduct a Baseline Survey for assessment of awareness of risk factors including tobacco use and management of Non Communicable Diseases (NCD) prevalent in four districts viz, Villupuram and Theni, Virudunagar and Sivaganga in the State for control of Cardio Vascular diseases (CVD) and Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus (T2DM). The cost involved in this proposal is Rs 51.40 lakh.
- 3. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 09.06.2005, has approved this proposal. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issues the following orders:
- i. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is authorised to hire a Consultancy firm for a period of 9 months to conduct the baseline survey to fulfill the objectives, as detailed below, by following Quality-and Cost-Based Selection (QCBS) method of the World Bank procurement procedure.
- (a) To estimate the incidence of disease and prevalence of risk factors for Cardio Vascular Disease and Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus (T2DM) in the urban and rural population of four districts viz. Villupuram and Theni (Pilot districts), Virudunagar and Sivagangai (Control districts) in Tamil Nadu

Order.

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Under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, a Tribal Development Plan has been prepared to look into the specific health needs of the tribal population. The Study has highlighted the inadequate availability of the Government run health programmes in the interior tribal areas. The Study has suggested launching of an efficient and viable outreach programme in partnership with Non Governmental Organisations to ensure the reach of health benefits to the tribal population. The Study has identified 12 areas in 10 districts in Tamil Nadu where most of the tribal population is residing.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has therefore, proposed to reach out to the tribal population by establishing partnership with Non Governmental Organisations; The Government of Tamil Nadu has already entered into several mutually beneficial partnerships with Non Governmental Organisations in several areas of health in the past. It is proposed to involve the Non Governmental Organisations and other private sector organisations to expand the availability of health services through outreach services to (i) provide health services to the people of tribal areas, (ii) treat minor ailments, (iii) provide comprehensive maternal and child health care and refer to higher institutions whenever needed, (iv) collect reliable data on disease profile in tribal areas and (v) empower tribal communities to demand services from the public health care system. In the following 10 districts, 12 remote and inaccessible areas have been identified, where the tribal population is located in large numbers.

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to develop a micro plan in all these districts, in consultation with the District Collectors concerned, department officials, tribal representatives and Non Governmental Organisations. Each of the 12 areas would be assigned to the selected Non Governmental Organisations for running the outreach services during the project period. The Non Governmental Organisations would liaise with the public health care delivery system for referral and follow up. Based on the micro plan, the selected Non Governmental Organisations would cover the entire geographical area.

- 3. As per the Project Implementation Plan, it was proposed to purchase new vehicles for this programme. Meanwhile, the Government of India have already supplied Eicher vans to the Department of Health and Family Welfare for appropriate use and the Director, State Health Transport Organisation, has placed 12 vehicles out of a total of 120 vehicles, at the disposal of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for use in mobile outreach services in tribal areas. These vehicles, however, need some modifications to make them suitable as outreach vans. These vehicles would be fitted with lab equipments to undertake basic lab tests.
- 4. The Non Governmental Organisations will be responsible for running these vans for outreach activities in the above areas. The Project Director has proposed to provide Rs. 1,50,000/- per annum per vehicle to the selected Non Governmental Organisations for fuel and maintenance. This includes Rs. 10,000/- per month for fuel and maintenance of the vehicle and Rs. 30,000 per annum for Insurance and obtaining Fitness Certificate. Ownership of the vehicles will vest with the Government. The vehicle will be insured, maintained and covered under Service Contract by the Non Governmental Organisations. Manpower support for every van, viz, one Medical Officer, one Staff Nurse, one Auxiliary Nurse Midwife, one Driver, one Lab Technician and Drugs worth Rs. 5,000/- per month will be provided to the selected Non Governmental Organisations to provide the outreach services in the identified 12 tribal areas. The Project Director has also proposed to provide Rs. 10,000/- to each Non Governmental Organisation as one time Grant towards creating public awareness about the outreach services during the first year alone. The cost involved in this proposal is Rs 14.70 lakh as nonrecurring expenditure and Rs.72.72 lakh per annum as recurring expenditure during the project period.
- 5. The above proposal was placed before the State Empowered Committee. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 9.6.2005, has approved the proposal and has also made the following suggestions.
- i. The outreach van should be parked in a central location in the tribal area, for example, the vehicle meant for tribal areas in Vellore district could be parked in Jamuna Marudur.
- ii. Rs. 10,000/- per month may be provided to Non Governmental Organisations towards the fuel and maintenance cost of the vehicle.
- iii. Having regard to the hilly and remote terrain of the area of operation, it was agreed to grant Special Allowance of Rs. 2000/- per month to the Doctors, Rs. 1000/- per month for Nurses and Auxiliary Nurse Midwives engaged by Non Governmental Organisations in the tribal outreach services.

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, has now requested the orders of the Government in the matter.

6. The Government, after careful examination of the proposal, issues the following orders.

i. Sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs 14.70 lakh (Rupees Fourteen lakh and seventy thousand only) as non recurring expenditure, as detailed below, towards procurement of lab equipments, conversion of the vans into outreach vans, Grant for creating public awareness and advertisement.

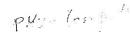

Order:

In the Government Order 1st read above, under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP), a Project Management Unit (PMU) was created with 9 Cells, viz, (i) Strategic Planning Cell (ii) Equipment Cell (iii) Engineering (Civil Works) Cell (iv) Financial Management Cell (v) Quality and Systems Improvement Cell (vi) Human Resources Development Cell (vii) Health Promotion Cell (viii) Public Private Partnership Management Cell and (ix) Project Management Unit Administrative Cell, to implement the various activities planned in the Project.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Project Management Unit would be the most crucial body for implementation of the Project. All the activities relating to procurement of goods, equipments, services, works etc., have to be coordinated by the Project Management Unit. Activities relating to District Project Management Units (DPMUs) also have to be supervised and monitored by the Project Management Unit. It is, therefore, essential that proper office facilities be provided to the staff in Project Management Unit to enable them to discharge their duties.
- 3. The Project Director has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for provision of adequate number of Computers with all accessories and other facilities such as Generator, Copier machine, etc, for use of the Project Management Unit. She has also proposed to provide Communication facilities, i.e., Cell phones to the Project Director, Additional Project Director and Deputy Director, Administration Cell. The Project Director has stated that in the Government Order 1st read above, only 2 posts of Computer Operator were sanctioned to the Project Management Unit of the Project. Therefore, in addition to the existing sanctioned staff, the Project Director has proposed to hire the services of 3 Computer Operators, on daily wages at the rates announced by the Collector of Chennai from time to time, in order to cope up with the volume of work in the Project Management Unit, during the Project period. The total cost involved in the proposal is Rs. 36.30 lakh as nonrecurring cost and Rs 7.75 lakh per annum as recurring cost for the Project period.
- 4. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 9.6.2005, has approved the above proposal. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issues the following orders:

(i). Order:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the present scenario of biomedical waste management from Tertiary institutions to Primary Health Centres has been studied in great detail by the Project team. The biomedical waste generated by the health institutions, both in public and private sector, need to be regulated under the Bio Medical Waste (Management and Handling) (Second Amendment) Rules 2000, Ministry of Environment and Forest, Government of India Notification, New Delhi. Currently, most of the hospital biomedical waste is being disposed off without treatment along with the municipal solid waste and by burning. The untreated liquid waste from the health institutions is let into the drainage. The status of poor waste management currently practiced in the State poses a huge risk towards the health of the general people, patients and professionals, directly and indirectly through environmental degradation.

- 2. Due to poor waste management practices, all health care workers (Nurses, Doctors, Lab Technicians), service personnel, rag pickers and the general public are at risk of contracting infections while handling, storage, and treatment. Incinerators operating at sub-optimal conditions are an added environmental and health hazard. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has developed a Health Care Waste Management plan of action for safe disposal of the biomedical waste in accordance with the guidelines of the Government of India and the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board. The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has been promoting setting up of Common Treatment Facilities (CTF) for collection, treatment, storage and safe disposal of the biomedical waste in the private sector. The proposed Hospital Waste Management plan is consistent with the Bio-Medical Waste (Management and Handling) (Second Amendment) Rules, 2000, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India Notification, New Delhi.
- 3. The Project Director has stated that it has been proposed to take up a Pilot project in all the 11 Secondary level hospitals in Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri districts for a period of one year, which could be scaled up on successful completion. The Pilot would include one day training for about 1500 officers and staff of the above 11 hospitals (about 700 staff in Dharmapuri district and 800 staff in Krishnagiri district). The training will be organised in the respective hospital premises by hiring the services of resource persons who are working exclusively in the field of biomedical waste management and have experience in training the health staff. The training course material and training aids will be provided by the Project. It has

also been proposed to provide necessary consumables like trolleys, colour coded bins, bags, gloves, masks, chemicals, etc, to these 11 hospitals in the Pilot districts. After the segregation and treatment at source, wherever required, the biomedical waste would be transported to the nearest Common Treatment Facility. The Project proposes to provide for the cost of transportation from the hospitals to the Common Treatment Facilities for the end disposal of the bio medical waste. Common Treatment Facilities have been set up in Salem district and Bangalore by private providers. The Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation would be responsible for hiring the Common Treatment Facility operator. The nonrecurring cost involved in this proposal is Rs 16.95 lakh and recurring cost is Rs 10.95 lakh for one year.

- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed this proposal before the State Empowered Committee. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 9.6.2005, has approved this proposal. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issues the following orders:
- i. Sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs. 16.95 lakh (Rupees Sixteen lakh and ninety five thousand only) as nonrecurring expenditure and a sum of Rs. 10.95 (Rupees Ten lakh and ninety five thousand only) as recurring expenditure, as detailed below, for taking up a Pilot project on Biomedical Waste Management in all the 11 secondary level hospitals in Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri districts, including training to the staff for a period of one year.

Order:

Tamil Nadu has a good network of Medical College Hospitals, District Hospitals, Sub district Hospitals and Primary Health Centres. Mortuary Van Service is not uniformly available in all these health institutions. Even where the mortuary vans are available, the services provided are inadequate. There are several bottlenecks in the existing mortuary van services. For the entire state of Tamil Nadu, only eight mortuary vans are available in the secondary health care sector. This is not only inadequate but also inefficient due to the fact that vans were purchased long time back and have lost their roadworthiness. Several other problems like fuel shortage, frequent repairs, vacancy of posts of driver, etc, exist. Due to non-availability of mortuary van services, people have to necessarily depend on the private sector providers. However, these services are expensive and beyond the reach of poor people. At present, people are required to pay a minimum of Rs. 100/- for 11 kilometres and Rs 6/- per additional kilometre, both ways, for utilising the Government run mortuary van services.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that Non Governmental Organisation participation model of Ambulance services has been found to be efficient and useful to the community. Hence, she has proposed to provide round the clock mortuary van services in all the 42 Health Unit Districts in the State at the rate of one mortuary van per Health Unit District, through partnership with the Non Governmental Organisations during the Project period of 5 years. The proposed 42 new vehicles would be procured through the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation by following the World Bank procurement procedures. It is proposed to permit the Non Governmental Organisations to charge for the van services at the rate Rs.5/- per kilometre one way from the static point subject to a minimum of Rs 100/-. Further, since the Non Governmental Organisations would be charging for the van services, they would have to meet the staff cost. Therefore, it is proposed to provide Rs. 5,000/-per month as Maintenance Grant for running the vehicle. It is also proposed to provide Rs 30,000/- per annum per vehicle to meet the cost of Insurance and getting Fitness Certificate. The mortuary vans would be insured, maintained and covered under annual maintenance contract by the Non Governmental Organisations. But, ownership of the vehicles would vest

with the Government of Tamil Nadu. The cost involved in this proposal is Rs 340.35 lakh as nonrecurring cost and Rs 37.80 lakh per annum as recurring cost during the Project period.

- 3. The Project Director has placed the above proposal before the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 9.6.2005, has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, has now requested the orders of the Government in the matter.
- 4. The Government, after careful examination of the proposal, issues the following orders.
- (i) Sanction is accorded for a non-recurring expenditure of Rs 340.35 lakh (Rupees Three hundred and forty lakh and thirty five thousand only) towards procurement of Mortuary Vans and advertisement charges for selection of Non Governmental Organisations and a recurring expenditure of Rs 37.80 lakh (Rupees Thirty seven lakh and eighty thousand only) per annum towards Grant on Insurance, Fitness Certificate and maintenance of mortuary vans, as detailed below, for establishment of Mortuary Van Services in all the 42 Health Unit districts through partnership with the Non Governmental Organisations during the Project period.

iii. The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation, is authorised to incur the expenditure of Rs 336.00 lakh and procure 42 mortuary vans as per the detailed specifications furnished by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, by following the World Bank procurement procedures and supply the same to the Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare concerned in consultation with the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation, is also directed to settle the accounts with the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

iv. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to establish mortuary van services in all the 42 Health Unit Districts at the rate of one van per Health Unit District through partnership with the Non Governmental Organisations. The Project Director is permitted to select the Non Governmental Organisations for the above services through the District Project Monitoring Committees headed by the District Collectors.

v. The Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare of all the 29 revenue districts are authorised to draw and incur the nonrecurring expenditure not exceeding Rs 15,000/- per revenue district towards advertisement charges for selection of Non Governmental Organisations in their respective districts for operation of mortuary van services.

vi. The Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare of all the 29 revenue districts are authorised to draw the recurring expenditure of Grants-in-aid not exceeding Rs 30,000/- per mortuary van per annum in their revenue districts and reimburse the same to the concerned Non Governmental Organisations for the actual cost incurred on Insurance and obtaining Fitness Certificate for the mortuary vans.

vii. 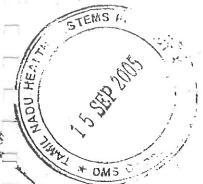

The Government of Tamil Nadu provides medical care to the people in the State through a large network of hospitals comprising of Medical College Hospitals, District and Sub district Hospitals, Primary Health Centres, Government Dispensaries and various Specialty Hospitals. The people of Tamil Nadu, especially the poor people, depend upon the Government health facilities for their health needs. On an average about 3,00,000 patients are treated as outpatients and 48,000 people are treated as inpatients daily in the above institutions. The secondary care institutions consisting of 29 District hospitals and 241 Sub district hospitals cater to maximum number of patients. The Government hospitals are preferred by the poor and the disadvantaged because of the availability of free medicines and treatment. 35% of the patients attending the Government hospitals belong to Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes community. At present, no counselling is provided to the patients either by the doctor or by the paramedics. Because of huge crowds during outpatient hours, there is no one to guide the patients and their attendants to various departments of the hospital or to the concerned doctors. There is hardly anybody in the hospitals to advice the patients about the care to be taken before, during and after the childbirth. Patients having diabetes or hypertension are also not provided with any counselling regarding life style changes to be adopted for better management of the disease.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to establish Counselling Centres in the State through partnership with Non Governmental Organisations in all the 141 secondary level hospitals in Phase I districts, viz, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Kanyakumari and Pudukottai and in Tsunami affected districts, viz., Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Villupuram, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli and 25 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals in other 14 districts, excluding Chennai, as detailed in the Annexure to this order, for a period of 2 years. The Non Governmental Organisations will appoint 3 well-trained Social Workers who will work round the clock in three shifts in the above hospitals. The Non Governmental Organisations will supervise the services of the Counsellors. The Social Worker

will be available to provide counselling and support to the poor and disadvantaged on the following aspects:

- 1. Facilities available in the hospitals
- 2. Explaining the doctors notes in the Outpatient slip to the patients
- 3. Guidance to make use of various facilities like investigations, etc.,
- 4. Advice on payment of fees, etc
- 5. Avoidance of exploitation
- 6. Guide in-referrals and out-referrals
- 7. Any other services entrusted with them that are required for the welfare of the patients in the hospitals.
- 3. The Project Director has also proposed the following:
- i. A Special Counselling Cubicle will be set up in the outpatient area of the hospital with "May I Help You" sign. A telephone will also be installed in the Counselling Cubicle to offer telephonic counselling services.
- ii. The Counselling Centres will function under the direct supervision of the Resident Medical Officers in District Headquarters hospitals and under the Chief Medical Officers in other hospitals.
- iii. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will provide: (i) Space and Cubicle at the entrance of the Outpatient department in the hospital premises, (ii) Furniture in the Cubicle, (iii) Training of Counsellors, (iv) Monitoring formats, (v) IEC materials for display and (vi) Operating costs.
- iv. Three days training will be given to all the Counsellors at the Health Manpower Development Institutes, Salem and Villupuram, Health and Family Welfare Training Institute, Madurai, and Institute of Public Health, Poonamallee.

The cost involved in this proposal is Rs 96.73 lakh as nonrecurring cost and Rs 234.26 lakh as recurring expenditure per annum for 2 years.

- 3. The Project Director has placed the above proposal before the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 9.6.2005, has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, has now requested the orders of the Government in the matter.
- 4. The Government, after careful examination of the proposal, issues the following orders.
- i. Sanction is accorded for a nonrecurring expenditure of Rs 96.73 lakh (Rupees Ninety six lakh and seventy three thousand only) and a recurring expenditure Rs. 234.26 lakh (Rupees Two hundred and thirty four lakh and twenty six thousand only) per annum, as detailed below, towards establishment of Counselling Centres in 166 secondary level hospitals in the State, as detailed in the Annexure to this order, for 2 years through partnership with Non Governmental Organisations.

Order:

The World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is under implementation in Tamil Nadu from January 2005. One of the most important objectives of the Project is to reduce the maternal mortality ratio and infant mortality rate. It has been proved that an efficient transport system can play a crucial role in saving the precious lives of pregnant women / women in labour, if they could reach the appropriate health institutions in time. The existing ambulance services in the district hospitals, sub district hospitals and the primary health centres need to be improved. There are a number of bottlenecks in the present system like frequent breakdown of vehicles, driver's vacancy, fuel ceiling, etc. In the absence of an efficient emergency transport system in the Government sector, people have to very often depend on the private emergency transport systems, which are highly expensive and beyond the reach of the poor people.

- 2. In order to strengthen the emergency transport system in the Government sector, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to purchase 187 new ambulances to start a comprehensive emergency transport service in all the 187 development blocks in Phase I districts viz, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Kanyakumari and Pudukottai and also in Tsunami affected districts viz., Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Villupuram, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli. This service would be operated in partnership with Non-Governmental Organisations during the Project period. The Project Director has also proposed the following for the emergency transport service:
 - o Ambulances with equipments would be provided to the selected Non Governmental Organisations free of cost.
 - o The Insurance and expenses towards getting the Fitness Certificate would be reimbursed to the Non Governmental Organisations, subject to a maximum of Rs. 30,000/- per annum every year.

- A nominal amount of Rs. 10,000/- per month per vehicle would be paid to the Non Governmental Organisations towards topping up of operating expenditure as Maintenance Grant.
- An amount of Rs. 10,000/- per vehicle would also be given to the Non Governmental Organisations as one time Grant towards creating public awareness about the services
- A one-time payment of Rs. 5,000/- would be made to the Non Governmental Organisations towards the cost of training the support staff.

The Project Director has stated that even though the Non Governmental Organisations would operate the services on behalf of the Government, the ownership of the vehicle would remain with the Government. The ambulances would be insured, maintained and covered under annual maintenance contract by the Non Governmental Organisations. The Non Governmental Organisations would operate the vehicles at a nominal cost and provide the services to the patients. People below poverty line would be exempted from making payment whereas people above poverty line would be required to pay. The Non Governmental Organisation would be permitted to charge one way from the patient at the rate of Rs. 5/- per km from the static point of the concerned block, to meet out the fuel, vehicle maintenance cost and other operating expenses including staff salary. The Non Governmental Organisation would recruit the ambulance staff, who would be trained in basic life saving skills. The cost involved in this proposal is Rs 1716.00 lakh as nonrecurring cost and Rs 280.50 lakh per annum as recurring cost. For the year 2005-06, the recurring expenditure is restricted to Rs 252.45 lakh for a period of 9 months.

- 3. The Project Director has placed the above proposal before the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 9.6.2005, has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, has now requested the orders of the Government in the matter.
- 4. The Government, after careful examination of the proposal, issues the following orders.
- i. Sanction is accorded for a non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 1716.00 lakh (Rupees One thousand seven hundred and sixteen lakh only) and a recurring expenditure of Rs. 280.50 lakh (Rupees Two hundred and eighty lakh and fifty thousand only) per annum, as detailed below, towards establishment of Emergency Ambulance Services in all the 187 blocks in Phase I districts viz, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Kanyakumari, Pudukottai and in Tsunami affected districts, viz, Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Villupuram, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli, indicated in the Annexure to this order.

The Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare of Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Pudukottai, Kanyakumari Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Villupuram, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli districts are authorised to draw a nonrecurring expenditure not exceeding Rs 15,000/- (Rs 10,000 + Rs 5,000) per ambulance, in advance and pay the same to the concerned Non Governmental Organisations in advance, towards Grant for creation of public awareness and training programme. The advances should be settled by the concerned Non Governmental Organisations within 3 months from the date of receipt of advance.

vii. The Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare of Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Pudukottai, Kanyakumari Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Villupuram, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli districts are authorised to draw and incur a recurring expenditure not exceeding Rs 30,000/- per ambulance per annum towards the actual cost of Insurance and Fitness Certificate for the vehicle which shall be reimbursed to the Non Governmental Organisations.

x. The Managing Director of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporations and the Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare of Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Pudukottai, Kanyakumari, Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Villupuram, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli districts are directed to send periodical progress reports to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, to prepare the consolidated Statement of Expenditure for onward transmission to the Government of Tami Nadu / Government of India / World Bank.

Order:

At present, the information system available in the secondary health care is highly fragmented and incomplete. There is no system for detailed analysis of the data collected from various institutions under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services. Data is also not shared with the stakeholders within the system and outside. Very often health department officials at the district level are not aware of progress made by their counterparts in the other districts. Officials in the directorates do not have access to the relevant and real time data from the districts on a continuous basis. The health related information is therefore not utilised for proper planning, supervision and monitoring. Therefore, a Comprehensive Health Management Information System (HMIS) is necessary to make the secondary care health system work efficiently. A Comprehensive Health Management Information System is needed for

- (i) Resource allocation
- (ii) Integration with primary level of care
- (iii) Planning and management
- (iv) Access and equity
- (v) Quality of services
- (vi) Human resources
- (vii) Referral system
- (viii) Role of private sector
- (ix) Utilisation of available information
- (x) Sustainability and cost sharing and
- (xi) Surveillance of communicable diseases

Health Management Information System is a systematic study of the procedures involved in each of the routine activities of the Health Services. The primary objective of the Health Management Information System is to provide operational information for policy formulation, monitoring and evaluation of operational activities that contribute to increased knowledge of inputs, processes, outputs, outcomes and impact of health services. The Health Management

Information System will focus on the collection, analysis and interpretation of data for decision-making.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to hire a Consultancy firm to study, design and develop software for a comprehensive Health Management Information System for the State of Tamil Nadu. The Consultant would also be required to train the users and implement the computer-based Health Management Information System. Financial Management Information system would be an integral part of the Health Management Information System. The Manual Reporting system in all the secondary level hospitals in the State would be replaced by a Web based System for a real time reporting of the current data. It is proposed to pilot test the System in 5 districts viz. Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Theni, Pudukottai, and Kanyakumari and then extend the System to the entire State on the basis of the outcome of the pilots. The selected Consultant shall also provide operational support and maintenance service for a period of one year from the date of completion of the piloting in the five districts. After satisfactory completion of the piloting, the Health Management Information System would be extended to the rest of the 24 districts. The objectives of the Health Management Information System are to:
- (i) Establish a computerised system in all the District Headquarters hospitals and Subdistrict (Taluk and Non-Taluk) hospitals involving the Offices of Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare / Deputy Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare. The main focus of Health Management Information System will be on clinical services, referrals and program related services.
- (ii) Establish a patient electronic data record system to track the past and current health profiles of the patients visiting any Government hospital.
- (iii) Network all the District headquarters hospitals and sub-district hospitals for tracking of referred cases and monitoring of outcome of programmes through a Computer Wide Area Network.
- (iv) Provide a linkage to the tertiary and higher medical institutions for referrals and follow up.
- (v) Provide feedback to service providers at field level for follow up, continuity of care and ensuring quality of health care from the medical institutions.
- (vi) Provide feedback to program managers for evaluation, monitoring and strategic planning, by establishing computerised systems at the State Directorates and the Secretariat.
- (vii) Provide information flow to all the other systems within the health community.
- (viii) Develop efficiency indicators along with selected indicators of key resources such as staff, financial status, essential equipments and drugs vital for service delivery and biomedical waste disposal, and
- (ix) Establish a personnel data bank for all the departments in health in the State including the Directorates.

The Consultancy would also include the following:

- A Baseline Study about the existing systems and practices of hospital management information system to finalise the baseline requirements.
- Design the application software, database structures and interfaces.

- Install the software and test the same in the 5 pilot districts and rectify any problems / defects that arise, in consultation with Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- Train the users on the software.

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- On satisfactory piloting, extend the System to other 24 districts.
- Support the operational maintenance for the completed districts for the next one year.
- Help in data migration and change management.

The total nonrecurring cost involved in the proposal is Rs 501.55 lakh.

- 3. Accordingly, the Government permit the re-deployment of One post of Executive Engineer and 2 posts of Assistant Executive Engineers from the Buildings wing of Public Works Department to the TNHSP subject to the condition that the Indering powers are vested with the Public Works Department.

- 4. The Engineer in Chief is directed to redeploy the staff mentioned at para 3 above immediately and send the details of posts which are redeployed together with the details of G.Os. In which the said posts were originally sanctioned and last continued.
- 5. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance department vide its U.O.82484/PW-V2005, dated 16.9.2005.

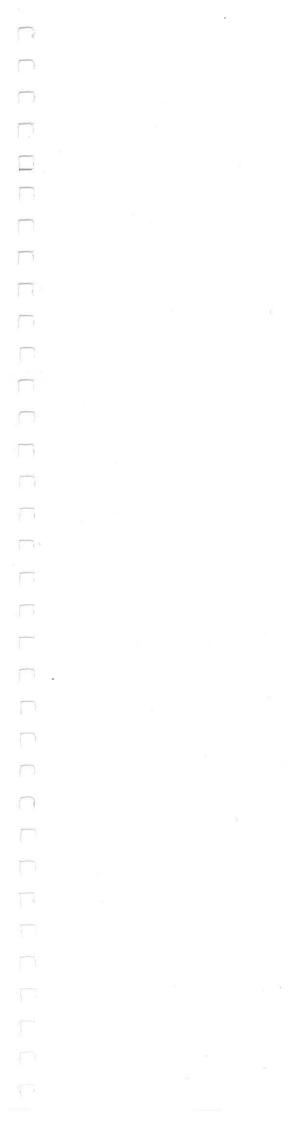
