### ORDER:

In Government Order first read above, orders have been issued according permission to implement the Trauma care network in the name of 'Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Initiative (TAEI) and the Mission Director, National Health Mission is designated as ex-officio Commissioner of Trauma care. In Government Order second read above, permission has been accorded to start the baseline survey in the following four Hospitals:

a) Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital attached to Madras Medical College.



- b) Villupuram Medical College Hospital
- c) District Headquarters Hospital, Cuddalore
- d) District Headquarters Hospital, Perambalur
- 2. In Government Order third read above, orders have been issued to establish 'Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Initiative (TAEI) Steering Committee under the Chairmanship of the Principal Secretary to Government and 'Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Initiative (TAEI) administrative structure. In Government Order fifth read above, orders have been issued approving the Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Policy.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has informed that Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program is a World Bank supported project implemented by Department of Health and Family Welfare (DoH&FW) of Tamil Nadu Government on Program for Results (P for R) basis. The program claims at achieving SDG 3 target by ensuring health lives and promising wellbeing for all at all ages in Tamil Nadu. The total budget of the program is 287 million US\$ over a period of 5 years which will supplement the overall budget of Government of Tamil Nadu in health department of 4,990 million US\$ in next 5 years to achieve the results. The loan agreement was signed on 04.06.2019 and the effectiveness date is declared as 29.07.2019. In the Government Order fourth read above, the Administrative Sanction of the project was accorded. The Goal of the Project is to improve quality of care, strengthen management of non-communicable diseases and injuries, and reduce inequities in reproductive and child health services in Tamil Nadu. The project is being implemented and the first-year activity carried out from July 2019 to March 2020. In first year, all the disbursement linked results were achieved and disbursement claimed to the World Bank of USD 5,20,23,500 and the budget allotted for the first year activity was sanctioned in the Government Order sixth read above.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has forwarded the proposal approved by the State Empowered Committee headed by the Chief Secretary to sanction an amount of Rs.27.84 Crores (Rupees Twenty seven crore and eighty four lakh only) towards implementation of second year activities of Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program for Upgradation and Strengthening of Trauma Care Centers as detailed below:

The Government of Tamil Nadu is committed to reduce the avoidable morbidity and mortality due to trauma including Road traffic accidents (RTA) and other emergencies. In trauma care, definitive management at the appropriate level of institution at the earliest possible time (Golden Hour) is essential to reduce mortality and morbidity. Towards this, the Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Initiative (TAEI) program of the Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu has brought about considerable improvement in trauma care services. As a further impetus to the ongoing process of upgradation of our trauma care services, World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program (TNHSRP) is working on Disbursement Linked Indicator (DLI) on

- · Improved provision of quality trauma care services
  - Establishment of Trauma registry
  - · Facilitating early surgeries among the emergency admissions
  - Reduction in the Inter-Facility Transfers (IFTs)

Improved Capacity of trauma care providers.

A detailed gap analysis of the existing trauma care services was done and the following were the observations,

- a) Shortage of specialists (Neurosurgeons, Anesthetists, etc) in some institutions were noted
- b) Some institutions need augmentation of Emergency Operation Theatres services with provision of additional OT suites for taking up of clean cases (Neuros and Orthopaedic emergency surgeries)

c) As part of capacity building there is need for continuous Trauma Care and Emergency management training to all personnel involved in Trauma and

emergency care services including First Responders

d) The Inter Facility Transfer (IFT) calls percentage stands at 43% which is quite high, in this trauma related cases form a sizeable proportion (30%). Taking the right patient to the right centre at the right time reduces the avoidable interfacility transfers and also the mortality and morbidity

To achieve the indicators mentioned in the Disbursement Linked Indicator (DLI), the trauma and emergency care system in the state needs to be strengthened, so that the timely and assured care are provided to critical and emergent patients at the assured level of trauma care centers.

### PROPOSAL

- Strengthen and Upgrade 13 institutions as Level-1 and 29 institutions as Level-2 with additional HR, Civil modifications and equipment (The list of institutions and components are in annexure annexed to this Government Order)
- ii) Establishment of State apical trauma surveillance center at the headquarters with real-time monitoring of trauma related activities in 13 level-I institutions.
- iii) Establishment of Training centres at 13 Level-1 institutions to provide Level-3 (BTLS), Level-4 (ATLS), other emergencies related training including First Responders.

This proposal had been duly approved by the state Empowered committee in its meeting held on 03.08.2020 and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has therefore requested the Government to issue necessary orders for upgradation of trauma centers by sanctioning the required posts for HR upgradation and to perform the civil modification as mentioned above.

- 5. The Government after careful consideration of the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program have decided to accept the same and accordingly issue the following orders:
  - i) The Director of Medical Education is permitted to Strengthen and Upgrade 13 institutions as Level-1 with additional HR, Civil modifications and equipment as detailed in the annexure annexed to this Government Order.

- ii) The Director of Medical Education and Director of Medical and Rural Health Services are permitted to strengthen and Upgrade 29 institutions as Level-2 with additional HR, Civil modifications and equipment as detailed in annexure II annexed to this Government Order.
- The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program is permitted to Establish State apical trauma surveillance center at the headquarters with real-time monitoring of trauma related activities in 13 level-I institutions detailed in annexure annexed to this Government Order and sanction is accorded to utilize Rs.3,25,000/- (Rupees Three lakh twenty five thousand only) as detailed in annexure III annexed to this Government Order.
- iv) The Director of Medical Education is permitted to establish trauma and emergency surveillance centre to monitor trauma related activities at 13 level 1 centres and sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs.0.23 crores (Rupees twenty three lakh only) to the Directorate of Medical Education towards the Establishment of Trauma and Emergency Surveillance center in 13 Level-1 centres.
- v) The Director of Medical Education is permitted to Establish Training centres at 13 Level-1 institutions to provide Level-3 (BTLS), Level-4 (ATLS), other emergencies related training including First Responders as detailed in annexure III annexed to this Government order.
- vi) Sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs.13,28,90,040 (Rupees Thirteen crore twenty eight lakh ninety thousand and fourty only) and Rs.70,01,760 (Rupees Seventy lakh one thousand seven hundred and sixty only) to the Directorate of Medical Education and Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services respectively towards the salary component as detailed in annexure III annexed to this Government Order.
- vii) Sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs.2.5 crores (Rupees two crore and fifty lakh only) and Rs.0.4 crores (Rupees fourty lakh) to the Directorate of Medical Education and Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services respectively towards the civil modifications for emergency operational theatre through Public Works Department (PWD) detailed in annexure annexed to this Government Order.
- viii) Sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs. 3.1 crores (Rupees three crore ten lakh) to the Directorate of Medical Education towards the procurement of equipment through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation (TNMSC) as detailed in annexure annexed to this Government Order.
- ix) Sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs.4.70 crores (Rupees four crore seventy lakh only) and Rs.0.3 crores (Rupees thirty lakh only) to the Directorate of Medical Education and Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services respectively towards the operational cost (including item No.7.14 providing alteplase vials to 41 institutions detailed in annexure annexed to this Government order.
- x) Sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs. 2.06 crore (Rupees two crores six lakh only) to the Directorate of Medical Education towards the establishment of the training centers in 13 level-1 centers through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation (TNMSC) detailed in annexure annexed to this Government order.
