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### ORDER:

ST Elevation Myocardial Infarction, a grave complication of Coronary Artery Disease (CAD) is a significant health care problem in India. By the year 2015, an estimated 65 million people will be affected by Coronary Artery Disease. 3-4% of Indians in rural areas and 8-10% in urban areas have Coronary Artery Disease. In India, Coronary Artery Disease affects people in the younger age group resulting in an extremely high loss of potentially productive years. Poor patients with Coronary Artery Disease in India are at a greater risk of complications and have a poorer outcome following ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction. The CREATE Registry Study gives the most contemporary statistics regarding ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction patients than higher percentage of ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction patients than North America and Europe, the patients being younger, belonging to a lower socioeconomic group and having limited access to adequate treatment.

- 2. In the letter read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore sent a proposal to implement a Pilot Project to establish a framework that can serve as a tool to begin the integration of care for patients through collaborative efforts between emergency medical care services and hospitals treating patients with ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction. The goal of the Pilot Project is to foster a collective approach and effective coordination between pre-hospital care providers, ED physicians and cardiologists and it is designed to remove any communication barriers that would delay patient management and future intervention.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that this programme would provide immeasurable benefit to the people of Tamil Nadu by providing access to a system of care for the treatment to patients with ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI). This programme through its implementation



would upgrade medical emergency services in the management of patients with STEMI, improve the standard of heart attack care across public and private hospitals in the State and upgrade technology in health care. With the involvement of the Chief Minister's Insurance scheme in this programme, the entire population of the State would have access to the State-of –the –art health care system for management of ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction.

4. The Collaborators of this project in the ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction Organization are the Government of Tamil Nadu and GVK-EMRI. This Project will be a 'hub and spoke' model of an integrated health care network which forms a cluster: The outlying hospitals (Class C & D) will serve as the 'spokes' and the central hospitals (Class A & B) – that is a PCI capable centre will be the 'hub'. Choosing to operate within clusters will address existing barriers to timely reperfusion with fibrinolytics where timely patient transfer cannot be affected. The 5 Clusters would be constituted under the following 5 hub hospitals in Tamil Nadu:

Madras Medical College Hospital, — a tertiary care Government hospital

Stanley Medical College Hospital, — a tertiary care Government hospital

Chennal — a tertiary care Government hospital

- A rural tertiary care hospital

- Urban private specialty hospital



- 5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has further stated that the patients with chest pain will be received by the 108 ambulance and the first aid provider will take ECG immediately using a recording device. His / Her vital signs will be recorded in the Monitoring device and then transmitted to the ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction Coordinator. A Hand Held device will collect the data and transmit it to the HUB or Spoke hospital through a Server and necessary instructions will be given to the ambulance to transport the patient to the nearest HUB hospitals (Class A and B). If the HUB hospitals are in far-off location, then the patients will be transported to nearest Spoke hospitals (Class C and D) where they will be thrombolysed, stabilized and then transported to the HUB hospitals through 108 ambulance for definitive management.
- 6. The Project Director, has also stated that the Role and Responsibilities of the Partners shall be as follows:

### Government of Tamil Nadu

To facilitate and empanel the 5 Hub Hospitals and the Spokes under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Insurance Scheme, if not already empanelled and to coordinate with stake holders like ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction, Emergency Management Research Institute, Director of Medical Education, Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, and Insurance company in finalizing the HUB and Spoke hospitals, protocols, Hardware and Software, empanelment of hospitals under the Chief Minister's Insurance Scheme etc.



#### **EMRI**

They will be responsible for the primary ECG acquisition and transfer of patients to the appropriate centre for management through the ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction Care Centres.

#### STEMI India

- i. To impart and disseminate the latest information from across the world.
- II. To help organize and train ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction teams in hospitals.
- III. Develop Systems of care appropriate to ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction care Tamil Nadu.
- IV. Public education including IEC to reduce delays in accessing appropriate care.
- V. Help organizations and individuals doing research or projects in ST Segment -Elevation Myocardial Infarction with expertise and where feasible, funding. They will utilize the technology partners, AOSTA and Mastestro technologies in developing soft ware and hard ware and Research Partner LCRA in training, research, Clinical trials, coordination etc.
- 7. The Pilot Project will comprise of three phases viz. planning phase Intervention phase I and Intervention phase II as follows:
  - I. Planning Phase: Enlist collaborators, write protocols, develop Memorandum of Understandings, train people, plan educational strategies etc.
  - II. Intervention phase I: Roll out the intervention in the first 3 clusters, while collecting outcome data.
  - III. Intervention Phase II: Will include intervention in other clusters including Government hospitals after capability re-assessment and analysis of Phase I data.
- 8. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has further stated that fund for this pilot project will be managed by ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction India. There will be no financial commitment on the part of Government of Tamil Nadu except the call center expenses involved by Emergency Management Research Institute. The Emergency Management Research Institute will manage the expenditure from the budget already provided by Government.
- 9. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has therefore requested to issue orders to implement the Pilot Project of ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction India as follows:
  - To accept the proposal submitted by ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction India for implementing this Pilot Project.
  - II. To utilize the 108 ambulances for this Pilot Project



- III. To Permit the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as the nodal officer.
- IV. To accept the 3 private medical institutions and two Government Medial Institutions as HUB hospitals and also other spoke hospitals for transporting the cases for management indicated.
- V. Empanelling these hospitals in the Comprehensive Chief Ministers Insurance Scheme.
- 10. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the following order are issued:-
  - I. The proposal of the ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction to implement a Pilot Project to establish a frame work for providing access to a System of care for treatment of patients with ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) is accepted.
  - II. The ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction shall utilize the 108 Ambulances to implement this Pilot Project.
  - III. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, shall be the Nodal Officer for this Project.
  - IV. The ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction India shall be the implementing agency for the Pilot Project Monthly Report should be submitted by ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction India to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project being the Nodal Officer for monitoring this project, shall review the report furnished by ST Segment - Elevation Myocardial Infarction India every month. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project shall finalize any decision like finalizing the protocol, hardware and soft ware, change of hub / spoke hospitals, etc. which arise in the course of implementation of the Pilot Project.

### **ORDER:**

In the charge memo first read above, the Director of Drugs Control in-charge initiated disciplinary action against Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy, formerly Office Superintendent under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules and framed the following two charges against him:

### Charge - 1:

Thiru S. Krishnamurthy while working as Office Superintendent in the Office of the Director of Drugs Control, Chennai-6 was on unauthorised absence from duty from 01.10.2007 without any intimation / leave application.

### Charge - 2:

A memo was issued to him on 18-10-2007 and a reminder was also sent to him on 6-11-2007 to his residential address calling for his explanation for his unauthorised absence from 1-10-2007 and instructed to report for duty immediately. But he has neither turned up for duty nor submitted either explanation for his unauthorised absence or leave application which exhibits his negligence in discharging of the official duties.

2. On finalisation of disciplinary case, the Director of Drugs Control in-charge in his proceedings second read above imposed the punishment of stoppage of



increment for two years with cumulative effect on him. Against the punishment Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy preferred an appeal to Government in the third read above.

- 3. In his appeal, Thiru S. Krishnamurthy has stated that final orders imposing a punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect was ordered without conducting inquiry. As per rule 17(b) of Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules, when the charges are not accepted totally, inquiry is mandatory. Further the appellant has stated that in as much as he has not accepted charge II and opted oral inquiry, inquiry should have been done before imposing punishment. But without conducting inquiry, major penalty of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect has been ordered by the Director of Drugs Control. By this, reasonable opportunity has been denied to him and Government rules are violated. Further he stated that normally the question of punishment is linked up with the gravity of the charge and penalty that is implicated is proportionate to the guilt. When the charge is trivial and prima facie merits only a minor penalty, a major penalty should not be given. He has, therefore, requested to set aside the punishment ordered by the Director of Drugs Control in Proc. Ref. No.15188/E3/2007, dated 29-8-2008.
- 4. The Appeal was referred to the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission under regulation 18(1)(a) of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations, 1954, for its views.
- 5. The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission in its letter fourth read above has offered its views as follows:-

"In this case, charges have been framed under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules and the explanation of the appellant was called for. A questionnaire form was also sent along with the charge memo. The appellant submitted his explanation accepting charge 1 and denying charge 2 and in the filled in questionnaire form, the appellant opted for an oral inquiry. But the oral inquiry was not conducted in the case and the final orders have been passed by the Director of Drugs Control imposing the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect, without conducting an oral inquiry which is a mandatory one.

Regarding conduct of oral inquiry, it has been stated as follows in the Handbook on Disciplinary Procedures (Part II - chapter - I, page 23)

- i) An oral inquiry shall be held if such an inquiry is desired by the person charged or is directed by the authority concerned.
- ii) Even if a person charged has waived an oral inquiry, such inquiry shall be held by the authority concerned in respect of charges which are not admitted by the person charged and which can be proved only through the evidence of witnesses.
- iii) The guiding factor in conducting the oral inquiry is that the accused officer should have a reasonable opportunity of defending himself.

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In the instant case, the appellant in his explanation had accepted the charge 1 and denied the charge 2. He opted for an oral inquiry. But his request was not complied with as per the above rules. The appellant has contended the above issue in his appeal. Thus, the disciplinary case initiated against the appellant runs into procedure flaw.

In G.O. (Ms.) No.113, Personnel and Administrative Reforms (N) Department, dated 02.08.2006, have issued amendment to the provisos to Rule 8, of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules suitably as follows:-

"Provided that the penalty of withholding of increment shall not be imposed on a Government servant, if the said penalty cannot be given effect to fully while in service;

Provided further that in cases where the penalty of withholding of increment cannot be given effect to fully for any contingency that arose after the penalty of withholding of increment is imposed, the monetary value equivalent to the amount of such increments that cannot be given effect to shall be recovered from the person:

Provided also that in cases of withholding of increment with cumulative effect, the monetary value equivalent to three times the amount of increments ordered to be withheld shall be recovered".

Thus, the final orders issued in this case also runs into procedural flaw:

Hence, the Commission advises Government to initiate denovo or resume disciplinary proceedings against the appellant under Rule 9 of the Pension Rules 1978 following scrupulously the procedure stipulated for charges under Rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules.

The Government examined the Appeal preferred by Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy carefully and independently with all the connected records along with the views of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. After examination, the Government have decided to allow the appeal of Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy and to set aside the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect imposed on Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy, by the Director of Drugs Control in-charge and to initiate denovo proceedings. The Government, accordingly, do and hereby order that the punishment of stoppage of increment for two years with cumulative effect imposed on Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy, formerly Office Superintendent, Office of the Director of Drugs Control, Chennai in the Director of Drugs Control in-charge proceedings second read above, be set aside and instruct the Director of Drugs Control to continue the disciplinary proceedings from the stage where the defects had crept in (i.e.) conduct of further inquiry by following the procedure stipulated for charges under rule 17(b) of the Tamil Nadu Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules providing the reasonable opportunity to Thiru.S.Krishnamurthy and to remit the papers to Government for passing final orders under rule 9 of the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules 1978.

ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above sanction was accorded for the establishment of Free Hearse Van Services to all the deceased in the state of Tamil Nadu to cater the needs of all unfortunate deaths that occur in all Government Medical Institutions on Public Private Partnership mode similar to 108 ambulance services and to call the services as "Tamil Nadu Free Hearse Van Services". The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was designated as Nodal Officer to operate this service in the state through the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch and Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was designated as the nodal agency to implement this programme. Accordingly a Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the Government and Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch on 02.02.2011 for two years.

2. During the State Level Advisory Committee meeting the Chief Secretary to Government on reviewing the performances of Free Hearse Service, has expressed that Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch should submit a proposal to continue the programme beyond the expiry of Memorandum of Understanding. Also the Secretary to Government — Health reiterated the same during the first State Level Advisory Committee meeting chaired by him. Accordingly the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch, has submitted a proposal with a request to permit them to continue the service.



- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch, initially operated 10 vehicles in Chennai and gradually extended to all the districts with current fleet strength of 138 vehicles. The vehicles were deployed after analyzing the deaths in various Institutions and to cover all the hospitals in the State. It is also planned to increase the fleet strength to 180 to supplement the present fleet strength based on the need. It has been observed during the various performance review meeting conducted, the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch is performing well and the utilization by poor and disadvantaged people has been gradually increasing in correspondence with the fleet strength. Initially the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch faced much difficulty in recruiting the drivers and operationalise the services in the institutions due to intervention of private operators. Stringent action taken by the Nodal Officer has resulted is enormous improvement in utilization of this service by the poor.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to continue the Free Hearse Service beyond 01.02.2013 on Public Private Partnership mode with the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch.
- 5. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project have decided to continue the Free Hearse Services for a period of 2 years. Accordingly, sanction is accorded to continue the Free Hearse Service in the State an Public Private Partnership mode with the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch for a period of 2 years from 02.02.2013. 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#### ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has improved the infrastructure facilities in Secondary Care Hospitals, created additional posts of Doctors, Nurses and Paramedical Staff to provide quality service to the patients and that many quality improvement activities have been initiated by the project such as development of Standard Treatment Guidelines, Protocol for Scorpion sting and snake bite, Establishment of Poison Treatment centres, formation of Quality circles in hospitals, employing Quality of care Indicators in the hospitals to measure the quality of care and to improve the performance, establishment of Health Care Waste Management system, Web based Hospital Mangement System and Health Management Information System and large scale Training Programmes to improve the technical and managerial skills of the Health care professionals. He has also reported that many doctors are not exposed to improvement of clinical and academic knowledge after finishing their medical degrees and that to improve their clinical knowledge, it is necessary to establish a Clinical Society. Accordingly, the Project Director had placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 29.01.2013 for establishment of "Clinical Society" in 72 Government Hospitals having 100 beds and above. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

2. The Government after careful consideration, direct that a Clinical Society shall be established in each of the 72 Government Hospitals having 100 beds and above, as indicated in the Annexure I to this order, to improve the Clinical knowledge of the medical professionals working in the hospitals. However, other hospitals are also free to start the clinical society in their hospitals provided they have sufficient doctors and willingness to continue the activity. Such hospitals can combine together with nearby hospitals and have the society.

- 3. The mode of functioning of the Clinical Society is indicated in Annexure II to this order.
- 4. Sanction is also accorded for incurring a recurring expenditure of Rs.10.80 lakhs (Rupees ten lakhs and eighty thousand only) towards establishment of Clinical Society in 72 hospitals at the rate of Rs.15,000/- per hospital, as detailed below.

# Annexure II

The Clinical Society will be called as "Clinical Society of \_ Hospital ". The Society will be headed by the Hospital Superintendent / Chief Medical officer of the hospital as the case may be. One enthusiastic Medical Officer will be nominated by the Joint Director of Health Services within the hospital as Secretary to the society and who will be the main person responsible for better functioning of the clinical society. The clinical society will meet at least once in every month on fixed days for e.g third Saturday of every month at 11.30 am for about 2 to 2 ½ hours. The clinical society meeting will be having both clinical and academic programmes. Interesting cases will be presented during the first half an hour or forty-five minutes and a lecture / symposium on topics of importance will be held after clinical case presentation. When common interest topics /discussions are covered during the meeting, the Staff Nurses and Pharmacists can also participate in the meetings. The Professors from nearby medical colleges may be invited to deliver the lecture or one among the doctors in the hospital can deliver the speech. If it is a symposium, few doctors can take up one topic each. This meeting can be combined with a Journal club meeting wherein the latest advances can be discussed. The Journals can be downloaded from the net whenever possible. Each year a Continuing Medical Education programme (CME) can be conducted by the Clinical Society of each hospital. A register will be maintained on the report of the meeting including the participants, a copy of which shall be sent to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by mail for reference. Wherever possible, the local doctors, doctors from nearby PHCs, Hospitals and IMA shall also be invited to actively participate in the meetings. A monthly report shall be submitted by the Joint Director of the district regarding the functioning of Clinical Society and its activities in the district to the Director of Medical and Rural Services and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project may honor the best performing three clinical societies in each year by giving them Rolling Shields.

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This training will be organized by the Hospital Superintendent / Chief Medical ifficers concerned for two or three hours each day in the afternoon i.e after duty hours of the health care providers batch wise every month. The Resource Person for the training will be the official / staff from same hospital or other hospital having good knowledge and trained on accreditation standards. The trainees are the various categories of staff of the respective hospital (where the in-house training organized), who may be doctors, nurses, Para-medical staff, administrative officials, ministerial staff and last grade servants. Since the total number of all category of official / staff (doctors, nurses, pra-medical staff, administrative officials, ministerial staff and last grade servants) differs from hospital to hospital, each training will be conducted in such manner for 25 - 40 officials / staff in a single batch and subsequent batches will be organized on regular daily basis to complete the training on accreditation to all the official / staff connected with the respective work / activities based on accreditation standards. In this in-house training programme, the training aids like charts, sketch pencils, over head projector sheets, pamphlets on accreditation standards, clinical protocols, etc. will be used to train the participants practically in an effective way and also tea snacks will be distributed to the trainees, as the officials /staff will be attending the session for more than two after duty hours. Hence, all 43 Hospitals are in need of minimum Rs.5000 per month as untied funds to organize the in-house training on accreditation on daily basis and thereby to improve the quality care services in the hospital.


In their letter first read above, the Co-Founder and Chairman, Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre, Chennai has stated that across India, nearly 1,20,000 patients are diagnosed with Blood Cancers every year and an additional 10,000 Children are born with Thalassemia (a disease necessitating one or two blood transfusion per month for the entire life span for survival). In Tamil Nadu, at any given time, there are several hundred patients admitted to various hospitals with blood cancers and Thalassemia. Across the World, matching stem cells are helping over 60% of such patients to live normally. He has also stated that the matching of stem cells of donor and recipient is highly dependent on ethnicity. In the absence of an Indian Stem Cell Bank, Indian patients if lucky to find a match, have to import the same at a cost of over Rs.25 lakhs. This is beyond the reach of most of these patients. The Co-Founder and Chairman, Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre has therefore submitted a proposal for sanction of Government grant of Rs.9 crores (Rupees Nine crores only) to collect process, test type and store 3000 cord blood donations over three years to ensure access to cure for patients with Blood Cancers and Thalaseemia, living in Tamil Nadu.

- 2. The Director of Medical Education in the letter second read above has constituted a technical committee to give its recommendation and the committee has recommended for the establishment of a good Public Cord Bank in Tamil Nadu.
  - 3. The Government after careful examination have decided to accept the request of the Co-Founder and Chairman, Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre. Accordingly, sanction is accorded for a grant of Rs.9.00 crores (Rupees Nine Crores



only) to Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre, Chennai, to collect, process, test type and store 3000 cord blood donations over three years to ensure access to cure the patients with Blood Cancers and Thalaseemia living in Tamil Nadu subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The above Government Grant of Rs.9.00 crores (Rupees Nine Crores) is sanctioned to Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre, Chennai to establish stem cell storage bank to collect, process, test, type and store 3000 cord blood donations for a block of three years to ensure access to cure patients with blood cancer and Thalaseemia, living in Tamil Nadu. To start the project, initially Rs.3.00 crores (Rupees three crores only) is released for 1000 cord blood donation processing and remaining funds of Rupees 6 crores shall be released in two equal instalments based on the completion of 80% of target for the funds already released (viz. after completion of 800 cord blood donations are processed) and on production of the audited statement of accounts of the Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre for the amount spent by them (Utilization Certificate) and after inspection of the institute by the inspecting officer of the Director of Medical Education and after satisfying that the usual conditions are satisfied.
- a) Grant of funds shall be deposited in a separate account and audited / monitored by the Office of the Director of Medical Education. All transactions will happen only through this account.
- b) The Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre should release 75% of Units free of cost to the patients referred by Government Hospitals. The patients must be residents of Tamil Nadu. In addition, employees of Government of Tamil Nadu and their dependants will also be eligible for free units. All the patients covered under the Chief Ministers Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme with income ceiling limit of below Rs.72000/- per annum will be eligible for free units. The Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre shall release 25% of units on commercial basis, to all the patients with the annual income between Rs.5 lakhs to Rs.10 lakhs. Residents of Tamil Nadu will pay Rs.50,000 for getting units. All the patients with the annual income of more than Rupees 10 lakhs from Tamil Nadu and those from any other part of India will pay Rs.2 lakhs for getting units and units will be released on first - come-first served basis and in the event of two patients needing the same unit, readiness of the patient for transplant will be the main consideration. In the event of all else is equal, priority shall be given to those eligible for free units. Revenue received from the patients for paid units be remitted to the grant bank account and used only to process additional units of cord blood donations and thus increase the inventory size. Since it is proposed to utilize the amount to increase the inventory size from the 25% of Commercial units, there should not be any financial commitment to the Government for increasing the inventory size. Since the processed cord blood has a life of >20 years there shall not be any maintenance cost.
- .c) The Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre should be opened for periodical inspection by the duly authorized officers of the Medical



Department and it should be maintained to the satisfaction of the inspecting officers.

d) The management should maintain proper accounts of receipts and

charges of the institution and have them duly audited.

- e) The accounts of the Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre shall also be open to audit by the Accountant General, Tamil Nadu. The Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre should furnish Utilization Certificate to the Accountant General II, Tamil Nadu, Chennai and to the Pay and Accounts Officer (South) Chennai with a copy to the Director of Medical Education, Chennai-10 with in a period of one month from the date of drawal of the grant.
- 4. The Director of Medical Education, Chennai-10 is authorized to draw the amount of Rs. 3.00 crores (Rupees Three crores only) sanction in para 3 above and she is permitted to release the amount of Rs.3.00 crores to the Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre, Chennai- 104. Subsequent grants shall be disbursed to the Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre as a block grant on production of audited statement of accounts of the Institution for that particular year and after inspection of the Jeevan Blood Bank and Research Centre by the inspecting officer to be appointed by the Monitoring Committee and also satisfying that the usual conditions are fulfilled.
- 5. The Government constitute a Monitoring Committee consisting of Secretary, Health and Family Welfare department, Principal Secretary, Finance department and Director of Medical Education with the other technical members to be nominated by the Government.
- 6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 3 above shall be debited to the following new head of account opened under Demand No.19.03 as follows::

ORDER:

In the G.O. read above. the Government accorded sanction for establishment of Emergency Management Services in Tamil Nadu under the Public Private Partnership Scheme. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Emergency Management Research Institute (EMRI), Hyderabad was signed on 06.05.2008 and the services were put into operation on 15.09.2008. As per the MOU, the staff for running the central control room, ambulances, supervision and monitoring, management, etc., shall be selected, trained and positioned by EMRI in the respective place. Further, the entire Emergency Response Management Service shall be organized, managed, supervised and monitored by Emergency Management Research Institute (EMRI). The Emergency Management Service provided to the Public is free of cost and the funds for Non recurring and recurring cost shall be released to the Emergency Management Research Institute by the Government through Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in advance for each quarter. Emergency Management Research Institute should produce the utilization certificate for the expenditure details at the end of the first quarter following the release of funds. Then, Emergency Management Research Institute should provide the audited expenditure statement by the end of the second quarter after the release of advance. This mechanism shall be in place for all releases, which will be done on a quarterly basis. Only the actual expenditure will be borne by the Government and there is no extra cost involved other than the actual.



- 2. The Memorandum Of Understanding signed between Emergency Management Research Institute and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for a period of 5 years expired on 04.05.2013. While reviewing the performance of Emergency Management Research Institute in the 4th State Level Advisory Committee Meeting held on 04.10.2012, it was informed that as the Memorandum Of Understanding signed between Emergency Management Research Institute and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for a period of 5 years will expire on 04.05.2013, a-proposal may be submitted to Government for consideration for extension of the service. The same issue was discussed in the 5th State Level Advisory meeting held on 29.01.2013 and based on the decision, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was requested to send a proposal to Government.
- 3 Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has sent proposals to continue the Emergency Ambulance Services for a further period of 5 years from 05.05.2013. The Project Director has reported that consequent on the change of management of Emergency Management Research Institute at Headquarters, the name of the organization has been changed as GVK, Emergency Management Research institute, Hyderabad. He has also reported that the fleet strength has increased from 187 Ambulances to 606 and it would further increase to 714 by the end of this financial year. Apart from providing Emergency Management Services, Inter Facility Transfer of patients between Government secondary care hospitals to tertiary care, hospitals for providing specialty treatment was also included. Also to reduce the death of sick new born babies, the specialty designed operation at Chennai, Kancheepuram, Cuddalore, Madurai and Dharmapuri. It is also planned to extend this Necnatal ambulance services in the remaining districts.
- 4. In the mean time, GVK Emergency Management Research Institute has represented to Government that the expenses incurred in providing the services has increased due to provision of further service extensions like Neonatal, Inter Facility Transfers (IFT), Patient drop back, Hill terrain services, Hospital Staff Training, 104 Health Help Line, Emergency Rooms, Fixed day Health Services etc., Hence, they have requested to sanction a fixed amount towards notional costs of Project Monitoring, Protocols and Process Implementation over and above the actual operating expenses incurred for the Tamil Nadu 108 services while renewing the Memorandum of Understanding for 5 more years and that this amount may be given as a fixed amount of Rs.5000/- per ambulance per month over and above the actual direct operational expenses of 108 Ambulance services. However, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the existing actual cost method only may be followed and the request for fixed cost need not be considered.
- 5. The proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was examined by the Government. The Project Director was instructed to constitute a Committee as per Sec. 16 (b) of the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Act, and taking into consideration Clause 3 (e) of the Memorandum of Understanding, dealing with Intellectual Property Rights and the current proposal being in actual expenditure basis, and introduction of another vendor may only result in development / standardization delays, increased costs for new protocol / software development or licensing and to forward the recommendation of the Committee to Government for further action.

- 6. Based on the instructions of the Government, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project constituted a committee.
- 7. The Project Director has reported that after considering the Technical Expertise, Training and Research, Efficiencies, Scale of Operations, Innovations, Professional, Transparent & Not -for-Profit of the proposal the Committee has recommended for the continuation of Emergency Management Services as per the existing terms and conditions through GVK Emergency Management Research Institute, considering the uniqueness of the service in terms of scale of operation, software, Intellectual property rights, technical expertise, protocol, costing model etc. He has forwarded the recommendation of the Committee to the Government and requested necessary Government Orders.
- 8. The Government have examined the proposal carefully taking into consideration the recommendation of the Committee also and decided to approve the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Accordingly, the Government direct that the Emergency Ambulance Services sanctioned in the Government Order read above, be extended for a further period of 5 years with effect from 05.05.2013 under the existing system of releasing funds on actual budgetary basis, and other terms and conditions as already ordered in the Government Order read above through GVK Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad, without 5% contribution by GVK Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad.



### **ORDER:**

In the Government Order read above, among others, the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs. 474.00 lakhs towards payment to M/s. Tata Consultancy Services for designing, developing and implementing Health Management Information System (HMIS) in hospitals under the control of Director of Medical Education, along with development and implementation of College Management System for 19 Government Medical Colleges and Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University and integrating College Management Systems with University Automation System and providing application maintenance for a period of 3 years for Phase I, Phase II and Phase III Health Management Information System.

2.The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that the Service Tax payable to M/s. Tata Consultancy Services has been inadvertently omitted to be included in the proposal and hence the Government have not also sanctioned the amount. Since the sanction of Service Tax component at 12.36% (as per S.T. Chart, Assessment Year 2012-2013, Financial year 2011-2012) for the total consultancy fee of Rs. 474.00 lakhs is necessary, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had placed a proposal for sanction of Service Tax and for issue of certain amendments to the Government order read above, before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 31.07.2012. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.



- 3. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and comes under Component III Sub Component A. The expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.
- 4. The Government after careful consideration accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs. 58,58,640/- (Rupees fifty eight lakhs fifty eight thousand six hundred and forty only ) towards payment of Service Tax on the total consultancy fees payable to M/s. Tata Consultancy Services towards software application development for phase III and continuation of phase II activities under Health Management Information System.
- 5. The Government also direct that for the existing paragraph 9 of the Government Order read above, the following paragraph shall be substituted.

The Project Director, Tamil nadu helath Systems Project is permitted to enter into a contract with M/s. Tata Consultancy Services by way of single source Selection process for the above purpose. The payment to the consultant shall be made as follows:

- a) 15% of the total contract value shall be paid as advance on the commencement of the project against the submission of a bank guarantee of 15% of Contract value.
- b) 15% of the total contract value shall be paid upon development of clinical specialty forms for Director of Medical Education, developing Director of Medical Education – Health Management Information System and College websites for all Government Medical Colleges.
- c) 15% of the total contract value will be paid upon completion of the development of College Management Software and University Management System.
- d) 15% of the total contract value will be paid upon completion of Health Management Information System training in 47 Director of Medical Education hospitals.
- e) 15% of the total contract value will be paid upon completion of training in College Management System in 19 Medical Colleges and the export of identified data facilitated from the College Management System to the University Automation System as required for the transfer of fee receipt details. However, if for any reason the University Automation System is not procured/not installed at the time of completion of the training on College Management System, the release of this payment shall be affected.
- f) 15% of the total contract value will be paid upon completion of HMS training in the 6 Director of Medical Education hospitals.
- g) 10% of the total contract value will be paid upon the successful completion of the 3 years application maintenance period.

The application maintenance cost of Rs. 1,55,0000/- will be released as per



the following schedule:

- Advance payment of Rs.11,00,000/- upon signing the contract
- Equal quarterly installments of Rs. 12,00,000/- released over a periof of 3 years
- The Government also direct that the contract ordered to be entered with M/s. ELCOT for the procurment of hardware and TANSWAN connectivity, ordered in paragraph 13 of the Government Order referred above shall be treated as an extension of contract of Phase II entered with M/s. ELCOT and payment of 2.5% of the total procurement value as service charges shall be made, in installments, as per the orders issued in the Government Order read above, and as mutually agreed and taking into account the value of hardware supplies made by M/s.ELCOT.
- 7. The expenditure sanctioned in para 4 above shall be debited to the following head of account:

ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has sent the proposal to the Government through Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has made significant strides in improving the health status and increasing access to health care services in all secondary care hospitals and that the following initiatives have been taken by the project to measure, monitor and improve the quality of health care services.

- 1) Standard treatment guidelines were circulated to all the health care providers of 270 district head quarter and taluk hospitals.
- 2) All health staff were trained on using the 14 quality of Care indicators in all the secondary care hospitals, performance are analysed and reviewed centrally at Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and supplemented with field visits.
- 3) Monthly quality circle meetings are conducted as and when required among the sensitized and motivated staff members in the presence of Chief Medical officer (CMO) at hospital level and the progress in health care services, assessment of the quality care indicators and other issues / requirements of hospital / staff / patients are being discussed and sorted out by them.
- 4) Discharge Parade are conducted by Chief Medical officer with the patients who are being treated at the hospital.
- 5) 12 hospitals were prioritized for accreditation process and intensive monitoring of the practice and procedures are being done by self assessment, pre-assessment and the final assessment is in the processing and
- 6) Hospital Staff were appreciated for best performance during the Hospital Annual Day Celebration.



The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further reported that since there are errors and mistakes being done by the Health Care Providers of secondary care hospitals in reporting the Quality Care Indicators, there is a need to conduct subsequent trainings in order to sensitize them on Quality Care Indicator and Quality Circle so that they can guide the other untrained staff in the hospital. He has also stated that there is a need to engage Advisors in each district to guide the Health Care Providers to enhance Quality Care related activities in all Secondary Care Hospitals. Accordingly, Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 29.01.2013 for conducting training on Quality Care to the District level officials and also for appointment for Advisors, Quality Care in each secondary care hospital. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

- 2. The activity has been included under Component-III Sub Component –B of the Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank.
- 3. The Government after careful consideration, direct that district level training on Quality of Care Indicators and Quality Circle be imparted to the various cadre of Health Care providers in each of the 31 districts.
- 4. Sanction is also accorded for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs.55,35,500 (Rupees fifty five lakhs thirty five thousand and five hundred only), as detailed below, for conducting training on Quality of Care Indicators and Quality Circle to the District level officials in each secondary care hospital.

The Government also direct that the training programmes will be conducted as follows.

a) District level training on Quality of care indicators and Quality circle will be conducted for Health Care Providers such as Hospital Superintendent / Chief Medical Officers, Second Level Medical Officer, Nursing Superintendent, Staff Nurses, Pharmacists, Lab Technicians and One Ministerial Staff of the



Government Hospitals. A maximum number of 250 Health Care Providers of various cadre will be trained in each of the 31 districts, as first round training and another 250 Health Care Providers will be trained in each of the 31 districts, as second round training, i.e. 500 trainees will be covered in each district and totally 15500 trainees will be included. Each batch of training consists of maximum 40 members so as to have a closed group interaction in the training session. The district level training will be conducted by the officers of Project Management Unit at District Head Quarters Hospital or Family Welfare Training Institute. The training period will be of one day duration. 15500 Health Care Providers will be trained and they will be provided with necessary course materials. The trainees will have to train the other few stakeholders in the hospitals, who are not covered in the training programme.

5. Sanction is also accorded for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs.37,37,000 (Rupees thirty seven lakhs and thirty seven thousand only), as detailed below, for visit of officials from the Project Management Unit to the Districts, for conducting State level Quarterly meeting / Workshop for all Chief Medical Officers and Printing of training manual.

- 6. Sanction is also accorded for appointment of "Advisor Quality Care" in each district to guide and monitor the Quality Care Initiatives in Government Hospitals in all Districts. The Quality Care Advisors may be appointed from the persons retired in the cadre of Chief Civil Surgeon / Joint Directors (Medical/Health)/Professors (Medical) / Deputy Director (Medical / Health), preferably specialized in Gyneacology, Peadiatrics, Orthopedics, etc., with experience in quality care. They may be hired on honorarium basis to serve, guide and monitor the quality care initiatives in all the Government Secondary Car Hospitals at district level. They will act as mentors for all government hospitals and will be called as "Advisor Quality Care ". Each of the 31 "Advisor Quality Care " will be in charge for one district and their expertise can be shared with other districts to improve the quality of services in all hospitals. The Advisor Quality Care will visit the secondary care hospitals in their respective districts on regular basis. The Advisor, Quality Care will be engaged for 50 vists initially and based on the performance, their period of services will be extended for next year. The roles and responsibilities of the Advisor Quality Care are indicated in the Annexure to this order.
- 7. Sanction is also accorded for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs.23.25 lakhs (Rupees twenty three lakhs and twenty five thousand only), as detailed below, towards the payment of remuneration to the Advisor Quality Care.

- 2) To actively participate and contribute in the Quality Circle Meetings at hospital level. To provide handhold support and make sure that the Quality Circles are put into effective use. To ensure that the staff take ownership of the problems and, feel as an integral part of the system and also to report the success stories, as a result of the Quality Circle Meetings.
- 3) To go through Quality Care Indicator, follow up and guide for correct application of quality care indicators for improvement.
- 4) To facilitate the health care providers to bring out error free and accuracy in reporting the Institutional Services Monitoring Report / Quality Care Indicator / Quality Circle / Accreditation / other Quality related activities in hospitals. To assess, rectify and improve the quality of indicators reporting and functioning of quality circle every month.
- 5) To guide the health care providers to discharge all services (clinical and nonclinical) in a systematic way in order to avoid duplication of services.
- 6) To counsel the Chief Medical Officer in the right track for better outcomes on the basis of results of data on Institutional Services Monitoring Report Quality Care Indicator, Quality Circle, Accreditation, etc.
- 7) To guide the Chief Medical Officers to conduct discharge parade, organize the in-house camps and Hospital Annual Day celebrations effectively on regular basis.
- 8) To ensure that the Standard Treatment Guidelines followed in all secondary care hospitals in their district concerned.
- To conduct periodic prescription audit and medical audit in the hospital.
- 10) To guide the Chief Medical Officers in order to practice evidence based medicine and Rational Use of Drugs.
- 11) To see that the Poison Treatment Centres are functioning well.
- 12) To ensure that proper counseling is given to discharged patients.



- 13)To monitor impact of various training conducted for health care providers and to ensure that the protocols are followed strictly for services relating to Poison Treatment Centre, Labour Department (CEMONC), Infection control / Bio-Medical Waste Management, Equipment Maintenance, Basic Life Support, Housekeeping services, Initial assessment, etc.
- 14)To provide necessary guidance in preparing the hospital for Accreditation, whenever required.
- 15)To inculcate correct knowledge about quality care activities among the health care providers while visiting hospitals or organizing the training Programmes / workshops.
- 16)To help and guide for proper and prompt use of funds available (under the head of account of Patient Welfare Society, Hospital Maintenance, Untied Funds, Annual maintenance, Hospital Annual Day Celebration and other funds released from Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project / Director of Medical and Rural Health Services / National Rural Health Mission then and there) for improvement in quality of services, as per guidelines.
- 17) To actively participate and contribute in Monthly Medical Officers Meeting at District level and Review Meetings at State level.
- 18)To coordinate for Continuing Medical Education programme at hospital level / quality assurance workshop at inter / intra district level with the help of funds already available in various components.
- 19) To be sure that all the activities of line departments like National Rural Health Mission, Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Director of Medical Education, Public Works Department, etc., are coordinated well to strengthen the performance in hospital.
- 20)To have frequent genial interaction with the Joint Directors of Health Services and Hospital Superintendents / Chief Medical Officers concerned in order to accomplish the given task successfully.
- 21)To manage the quality care activities of all hospitals along with the officials of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project i.e. the Expert Advisors, the Programme Officers, the District Project Management Unit Coordinators, the Bio-medical Engineers and the Information Technology Coordinators.
- 22) To submit the fortnight reports to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project with regard to improvements / follow up activities in all hospitals of respective districts.
- 23)To follow up and put constructive efforts for quality outcomes in all hospitals by making use of the available resources to the maximum level.
- 24) To strengthen and sustain a quality systematic approach in all endeavors of hospitals towards attaining patients' satisfaction and public recognition.



25)To update and step up the quality care activities with latest knowledge / standards in hospitals in turn to achieve accreditation status for hospitals.

## ORDER:-

The Hon'ble Chief Minister has made a statement under Rule 110 of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly Rules on 2.11.2012 that 776 Security Personnel and 1400 Watchman will be appointed to the Government Medical College Hospitals and other Government Hospitals with more than 200 bed strength, through outsourcing at a total cost of Rs.20.00 crores per annum.

- 2. Accordingly, the Director of Medical Education / Director of Medical and Rural Health Services were requested to send necessary proposal. The Director of Medical Education has requested to appoint 408 Security Personnel and 934 Watchmen to the Government Medical College Hospitals and other Government Hospitals under the control of Directorate of Medical Education with a salary of Rs.11,235/- per security person as and Rs.6,000/- per watchman which worked out to total cost of Rs.12,22,54,560/- per annum.
- 3. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services has stated that already orders have been issued for appointment of Security Personnel through outsourcing to



the 200 bedded hospitals, bigger hospitals and upgraded hospitals through Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and action is being taken for their appointment through outsourcing. Hence, currently for the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services, State funding is not necessary. As and when the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project funding gets over, the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services will send appropriate proposal to continue outsourcing of Security Personnel with State funds, on a need basis.

- 4. The Government have examined the proposal of the Director of Medical Education carefully. In the major Hospitals under Director of Medical Education Security staff are already deployed through outsourcing at entry gates, it has been mentioned that 122 people are already available as against the 408 required to man the 136 gates for 3 shifts. Hence the net additional need for deployment would be only 286. Regarding appointment of Watchman, deployment in wards restricted as 2 persons (2 Shifts per day) only for Intensive Care Units, Emergency Wards, Maternity Wards and Neo-natal Intensive Care Units as announced by Hon'ble Chief Minister.
- 5. In the circumstances, sanction is accorded for appointment of 286 Security Personnel and 868 Watchman to the Government Medical College Hospitals and other Government Hospitals under the control of Directorate of Medical Education through outsourcing at a consolidated pay of Rs.8000/- per head for Security Personnel and Rs.6000/- per head for watchman. The actual per head rate will be finalized through an open tender which will be floated through the Tamil Nadu Medical Service Corporation and applicable service taxes and service charges to the outsourcing agency have to be paid.
- 6. The expenditure for the posts sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited to the respective Government Medical colleges Hospitals and other Government Hospitals. head of account;

"Under 33. Payments for Professional and Special Services 04 - Contract Payment"

7. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall constitute an item of "New Service" and the approval of the Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure will be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. Orders regarding the sanction of advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued by the Finance (BG.I) Department separately. The Director of Medical Education is requested to send necessary proposals to Government in Finance (BG.I) Department in the prescribed format along with copy of this order to sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund. She is also requested to send necessary explanatory notes for inclusion of the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2013-2014 to Finance (BG.I) Department at an appropriate time.

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in his letter third read above has stated that the Hospital Management System (HMS) covering out patients services only, should also be extended to the remaining 37 Director of Medical Education institutions including One Government Dental College with the funds to be provided by National Rural Health Mission apart from the World Bank additional funds available, based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 29.01.2013 to implement Hospital Management System out patients workflow in 37 Health Institutions and 1 Government Dental College under the control of the Director of Medical Education.
- 4. The activity has been included in Component-III Sub Component —A of the Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank.
- 5. The Government after careful consideration and permit the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to implement Hospital Management System Out Patients workflow in 37 Health Institutions and 1 Government Dental College as in Annexure I under the control of the Director of Medical Education.
- 6. Sanction is accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs.22,58,43,697/-(Rupees twenty two crores fifty eight lakhs forty three thousand six hundred and ninety seven only) towards the procurement of Desktop computers, dot matrix printers, online UPS with 2 hours backup, LAN connectivity, computer furniture TNSWAN connectivity printer consumable and stationary for one year, as detailed in the Annexure II to this order. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to transfer Rs. 21,96,73,080/- (Rupees twenty one crores ninety six thousand seventy three thousand and eighty only) excluding ELCOT service charges and Service tax and release the same by means of a crossed cheque in favour of the Managing Director, ELCOT towards procurement of the computer hardware, computer furniture, LAN Connectivity, UPS with electrical cabling, printer consumables and stationary as per list, quantity and specifications to be provided by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by adopting World Bank Procurement Procedures. The ELCOT would procure and supply the items to the 37 DME Institutions, as per the quantity specified by Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- 7. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to enter into a contract with M/s ELCOT for the procurement of hardware and TNSWAN connectivity. The Project Director shall make a payment of 2.50 % of the total procurement value as service charges amounting to Rs. 61,70,617/-(Rupees Sixty one lakhs seventy thousand six hundred and seventeen only) to ELCOT. The



amount shall be released in instalments as mutually agreed to both the parties upon entering into a contract.

- 8. The Government also direct that the cost towards the procurement of consumables and stationery after the end of first year will be met from the regular budget of the Department of Medical Education.
- 9. Sanction is also accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs. 2,28,78,631/- (Rupees two crores twenty eight lakhs seventy eight thousand six hundred and thirty one only), as detailed in Annexure III to this order, towards the cost for Annual Maintenance Contract for the hardware (Desktop computers, Dot matrix printers, UPS and LAN connectivity) for a period of 3 years after the initial warranty period of 3 years. The AMC required after 3 years, shall be met from the regular budget of the Department of Medical Education. The cost of replacement of batteries after the initial warranty period of 3 years shall also be met by the Department of Medical Education. Out of the amount of Rs. 2,28,78,631/- sanctioned, Rs.2,22,53,530/- is towards the cost of Annual Maintenance Contract (including Service Tax of 12.36%) and Rs.6,25,101/- is towards Service charges payable to ELCOT on the Annual Maintenance Contract.
- 10. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to have flexibility based upon the Pilot and Phase I & II of the scheme to modify the number of items or packages to be procured, number of change management agencies to be contracted, agencies for LAN connectivity to be contracted, provision of computers etc., the quantity of consumables to the institutions / offices, within/ across the components without exceeding the total amount sanctioned.
  - 11. The expenditure shall be debited to the following head of account

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

# ORDER:

Hon'ble Chief Minister, among others, has made 110 announcement in the floor of the Legislative Assembly that a Training Institute for Hospital Administration and Health System Strengthening will be established in Chennai at a cost of Rs.10 crore to impart training to the Staff Nurses, Doctors, Village Health Nurses etc. of the Health Department.

- 2) The Mission Director, State Health Society in his letter second read above has accordingly sent necessary proposals for establishing a training centre at Chennai. He has stated that a strategy was drawn up in 2012-13 under Tamil Nadu Health System Project to establish a training centre for Hospital Administration and Health System Strengthening in DMS Campus, Chennai. Regular training programmes are being conducted on the following subjects under Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project:
  - i) Hospital administrative training to bring out a separate cadre of Administrative Medical officers.
  - ii) Training on Health Management Information System, Hospital Management Information System

iii) Training on Quality of Care

- iv) Health care Waste Management Training.
- v) Training on Non Communicable Diseases

vi) Training on Poison Management

vii) Training on Accreditation of Hospitals.

viii) Training on Acute Life Support (ALS), Basic Life Support (BLS)

ix) Technical Skill Development Programmes like CEmONC training.

x) Rational use of Drugs training

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- xi) Inter personal communication training
- xii) Training of motivation, leadership.
- 3) He has also stated that there are six Regional Training Institutes in the state catering mainly to Primary Health Care Trainings. There is a need for a training centre in Chennai to cater the above needs, for training of health personnel in secondary care institutions. With the above background it is proposed to establish a Hospital Administrative Academy and Health System Training Centre, in the DMS Campus in Chennai and to construct a building for this purpose. An amount of Rs.10.00 crore had been budgeted in PIP 2012-13 and approved in ROP 2012-13. The proposed training centre consists of lecture halls, meeting hall, computer room, library, dining hall, office, Gym and Yoga room, facilities / resource persons rooms, rooms and dormitories for the trainers and other essentials etc. The approximate cost of comprehensive civil work will be Rs.10 crore. The Tamil Nadu Health System Project will be managing the training centre and conduct the training programme with the assistance from NRHM and Health Department Directorates.
- 4) The Mission Director, State Health Society has requested Government orders to establish a Training Institute in Chennai and to remit the amount approved in ROP 2012-13 under National Rural Health Mission. He has also requested to sanction funds of Rs.10 crore from State funds for execution of civil works.
- 5) In G.O.Ms.No.116, Health and Family Welfare Dept., dated 25.3.2011, the provision of execution of civil works utilizing the National Rural Health Mission funds through the Public Works Department was streamlined. # ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, among others, orders have been issued to the effect that employees shall be allowed to move on to Selection Grade / Special Grade on completion of 10 years of service in the Ordinary Grade post and to Special Grade on completion of 10 years in the Selection Grade post or 20 years of total service in a post. The pay of such employees who have moved to Selection Grade / Special Grade on or after 01—01—2006 shall be fixed on the date of award of Selection Grade / Special Grade by granting the benefit of one increment equal to three per cent of the basic pay including grade pay in the same Pay Band and Grade Pay in the revised scale of pay.

2) Several Associations have represented before the Pay Grievance Redressal Cell to revive the scheme of seperate scales of pay to Selection Grade / Special Grade holders as in the previous Pay Commission periods as there are no promotional chances for several posts and that as the employees awarded Selection Grade / Special Grade between 01-01-2006 and 31-05-2009 alone have been given the concession to opt to come over to revised scale of pay on the date of award of Selection Grade / Special Grade by foregoing the arrears to accrue the benefit of higher scales of pay consequent on the revision of the scale of pay of the respective Ordinary Grade post and thereby requested to rectify the anomaly in the total emoluments between those awarded Selection Grade / Special Grade prior to and after 31-05-2009. The Pay Grievance Redressal Cell constituted in the Government Order second read above did not favour granting the Pay Band and Grade Pay of the promotion post for Selection Grade / Special Grade since this would give uneven benefit to employees existing in the same pay scale in different departments with different hierarchical patterns. However, the Pay Grievance Redressal Committee, considering the longstanding service rendered by the

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employees and with the intention to recognise their service properly has recommended to grant an additional increment benefit (over and above the one increment already allowed) equivalent to 3% + 3% of basic pay (Pay + Grade pay) for award of Selection Grade / Special Grade in the revised scale of pay.

- 3) After careful examination, the Government has decided to implement the above recommendation of the Pay Grievance Redressal Cell. Accordingly, Government direct that an additional increment benefit (over and above the existing one increment benefit) equivalent to 3% + 3% of basic pay (Pay + Grade pay) shall be granted to the employees on award of Selection Grade / Special Grade in the revised scales of pay implemented w.e.f. 01—01—2006.
- 4) The above orders shall take notional effect from 01—01—2006 with monetary benefit from 01—04—2013.

However in respect of Non-Communicable, Diseases Program under this Project, the Program has entered into the third year and the Staff Nurses on contract pay have to be paid Rs.8000.1 as monthly pay for one year as detailed below:-

The Project Director, has also stated that hence a sum of Rs.15 crores is totally required under the sub head "33 PP and SS (2210-06-101-PA-3344)" under the Major head relating to the above program. Further during the year 2013-14 in the regular budget allotment, only Rs.8.00 crore has been allocated. Hence, there is a shortage of Rs.7.00 crore in the budget allotment due to increase in contract pay to the Nurses working in this program with effect from 01.04.2012. 

30.09.2013. He has also stated that in addition, the additional financing was provided to scale up certain specific activities which were well performing including (i) the state-wide expansion of the Non-Communicable Disease (NCD) prevention and control activities which were piloted in two districts in the state of Tamil Nadu (ii) the state-wide implementation of the Hospital and Health Management Information Systems (HMS & HMIS) in health facilities including tertiary care institutions; and (iii) the expansion of maternal and neonatal health services to the tertiary level.

#### **ORDER:**

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that Thalassemia is a common genetic disorder found among Tribals, for which life long regular blood transfusion with iron chelation therapy is needed for sustaining life, that bone marrow transplantation is the only possible cure for this condition and that the most effective way to reduce the burden of the disease is by genetic counseling and prenatal diagnosis. As the disease appears to be more common among the Malayali Tribal groups inhabiting Jawadhu Hills in Vellore and Thiruvannamalai district, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to conduct a study on the burden of anaemia in Malayali Tribal population in Jawadhu Hills with special interest in assessing presentation of design and implement apropriate prevention minor and to programme for Thalassemia major based on the study results. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 10.08.2013 to sanction Rs. 3.662 lakh for hiring the services of Community Health And Development Hospital, Vellore by following Single Source Selection method of World Bank procedure. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

- 2. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and comes under Component I and Sub-Component C. The expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.
- 3. The Government after careful consideration, accord sanction for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs.3,66,200/- (Rupees three lakh sixty six thousand and two hundred only), as detailed below, for conducting the study on the burden of anaemia in Malayali Tribal population in Jawadhu Hills with special interest in assessing presentation of Thalassemia minor and for implementing appropriate prevention programme for Thalassemia major based on the study results.

- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to engage Community Health And Development Hospital, (Christian Medical College Hospital, Vellore) to carryout the survey and treatment of Thalassemia cases in Jawadhu Hills area in Vellore and Thiruvannamalai districts, by following Single Source Selection method of World Bank procurement.
  - 5. The survey will be carried out as follows;
    - All eligible persons will be contacted for enrolment in the study and those who consent will be interviewed for basic demographic information and relevant family history.
    - ii.) Haemoglobin, MCV and MCH tests will be done for all. The blood samples of those showing features suggestive of Thalassemia trait will be further tested with definitive test.
    - iii.) All study participants will be educated about Beta Thalassemia and those found to be carriers will be offered counselling and prenatal diagnosis if needed.
  - iv.) Thalassemia control and prevention program will have the following component;
  - a.) Intensive IEC program on Beta Thalassemia for adolescent, pre-marriage population in schools and other youth.
  - b.) Voluntary screening tests will be offered in monthly camps to the same age group of young men and women. The camp will also offer screening to any child with a sibling with Thalassemia major.
  - c.) All carriers will be offered appropriate counseling either for preventing marriage with another person with Thalassemia trait, or referred for prenatal diagnosis if needed.
  - d.) All persons suspected of Thalassemia major will be referred for diagnosis to Christian Medical College Hospital Hospital. Management of these



children will be organized with co-operation from Blood Bank of the Government Vellore Medical College, Community Health And Development Hospital, Hospital and Haematology Department of Christian Medical College.

- 6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is also permitted to conduct a similar survey of Thalassemia cases for the Tribal population living in Sitheri Hills in Dharmapuri District. Sanction is also accorded for incurring a non-recurring expenditure of Rs.3,66,200/- (Rupees three lakh sixty six thousand and two hundred only) for this purpose. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to engage a suitable agency for this purpose.

#### ORDER:

In the Government Order read above, the Government have ordered to provide free transport from home to Health facility, between facilities in case of referral and drop back facilities from the Institution to home for Post Natal mothers and sick new borns through Janani Sishu Suraksha Karyakram (JSSK).

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the National Rural Health Mission is providing funds for implementing Janani Sishu Suraksha Karyakram Scheme, under which every pregnant women and sick neonate are provided with free drugs, diagnostics, diet for the duration of the stay, free transport from home to facility, inter facility transfer and transport from facility back to home with the objective to reduce the out of pocket expenditure for pregnant women and sick neonates. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that at present 108 Ambulance Service is transporting mothers for institutional deliveries and also for interfacility transfer and that for drop back, funds are being released to the respective institution at the rate of Rs.250/- with a provision to the hospital for maintenance of vehicles, and that however, due to shortage of Drivers and poor up keep of vehicles, all mothers are not benefited. He has further stated that the National Rural Health Mission has alloted Rs.27 crore for Drop Back facility in the Project Implementation Plan 2013-14 and that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has been requested to float a tender for finalizing a central agency for operating Drop Back facility Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 10.08.2013 to permit the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health

Systems Project to float a tender for finalizing a Central Agency for operating Drop Back facility. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

- 3. The Government, after careful consideration, permit the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to float a tender and to finalize a central agency for opertating Drop Back facility by following the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tenders Act, 1988.
- 4. The Government also direct that the Drop Back facility shall be implemented as indicated below;
- (i) The Central Call response systems provide access to all the hospitals and the vehicles could be pooled and the free referral transport system will work without any interruption.
- (ii) The hired agency would set up a dedicated Call Centre, through extensive use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT).
- (iii) Application software should be developed by the agency for the use in the Call Centre.
- (iv) The Telecommunication facility should be available with the latest Technology / Instruments.
- (v) Each vehicle in the fleet will have to be fitted with a Global Position System locator to enable online tracking of the vehicles. Installation of Global Position System locator on vehicles and establishment of on-line, real time, vehicle tracking system will be done by the Agency.
- (vi) Branding and labeling will be done by the agency
- (vii) Complete Maintenance of the vehicle including breakdown maintenance, spares & tyres and third party accident insurance have to be undertaken by the Agency.
- (viii) Qualified drivers shall be appointed by the agency
- (ix) Any other work allotted by Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission as per need.

He has also stated that 6 Regional Consultants have been appointed to monitor and mentor all project activities especially Non Comunicable Diseases Programme and other programmes like Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centre, Healh Management Information Systems and Quality of Care activities. Since the Regional Consultants are retired Senior Officers and since their services are useful to the Project, the Project Director has proposed to increase their monthly contract remuneration from Rs. 40,250/- per month to Rs.50,000/- per month on par with the Consultants working in National Rural Health Mission.

#### ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that to reduce the Maternal Mortality Ratio and Infant Mortality Rate the Government had initiated several steps and one such step is the establishment of Comprehensive and New Born Care (CEmONC) services Obstetric Emergency Government Hospitals, which is a guaranteed service where a pregnant woman at the time of delivery can confidently go to these centres and safely deliver either normally or through caesarean surgery, if required, without being referred to another institution. This system has been functioning since April 2005 and each district has 2-4 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centre, which are reachable within half an hour's travel from the residence. The Project Director, has proposed to impart Clinical Skill Development re-training to the various categories of staff working in Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres so as to further improve the quality of services rendered in these Hospitals. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 10.08.2013 to sanction Rs. 97.968 lakhs for imparting Clinical Development re-training to Doctors, Nurses and Auxiliary Nurses Midwives working in Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

2. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and comes under Component I and Sub-component A. The expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.

## **Activities of Internal Auditors**

### I. Objectives:

The objectives of the internal audit is to (i) provide Project Management with timely information on the effectiveness of the Financial Management aspects of the project and (ii) enable the Internal Auditor to express a professional opinion on the operation of the overall Financial Management Systems including internal controls, compliance with financing agreements.

For the purpose of the audit the districts are classified into 5 regions comprising of 7 to 9 districts each as detailed below:

## Job Description of Officials in the Outsourcing Cell

The details of job functions for the above said posts are as follows:

### **Deputy Directors:**

- 1. He/She will be incharge of the Outsourcing Cell responsible for successful implementation of Outsourcing of Housekeeping activities, by way of achieving the objectives as mentioned in the contract.
- 2. He/She will monitor and review the implementation of Outsourcing services.
- He/She will analyse the daily reports / weekly / monthly reports received online and otherwise from the Hospitals and submit a report to Project Director everyday by using the Staff of Outsourcing Cell.
- He/She will review the Inspection Reports submitted by the Medical Officers, Nursing Superintendent, and other Officials and forward them to the Project Director with his/her remarks.
- 5. He/She will conduct periodic review meetings with the Deans / Joint Director of Health Services / Hospital Superintendents and the Contractors and submit the minutes to the Project Director and shall carryout the decisions taken in the meetings as instructed by the Project Director.
- He/She will scrutinise and forward all claim bills submitted by the contractors and verified with the internal reports received from the Hospitals to the Project Director for sanction. Based on the reports
- 7. He/she might suggest penalties as per the terms of agreement.
- 8. He/She will ensure that all staff of Outsourcing Cell carryout their responsibilities.
- He/She will ensure that the evaluation team regularly goes out to Hospitals
  and submit their findings regarding the Outsourcing Services which will be
  forwarded by him/her to the Project Director with his/her remarks.
- 10. To assess the existing service delivery standards of the Outsourced facilities.
- 11. To identify the baseline level of all quality indicators.
- 12. To benchmark the indicators.



- 13. To suggest any basic minimal civil structural alteration, if required in the hospitals in line with the requirement of housekeeping system.
- 14. Review of facilities including buildings and associated aspects i.e. Bio-Medical Waste Management System, Security System, disaster management system, etc.
- 15. To lay down standard operating procedures for all services with complete support of Contract Agency, if not already done.
- 16. To ensure that the trained key personnel are engaged for housekeeping services by contractor.
- 17. To review the outcome, as per the contract.
- 18. To review the services and instil the concepts to practice modalities of best practices in the minds of the personnel so as to achieve continuous quality improvement.
- 19. To conduct surprise visits to all the hospitals randomly to ensure that the services are on the track or any gaps to be filled up by the Hospitals or Contractor.
- 20. He/She will document both the text as well as with photographs all the activities concerned with Outsourcing of Housekeeping Services.
- 21. He/She will perform any other duties ordered by the superiors from time to time.

### Medical Officers:

- 1. To visit the Outsourced Hospitals regularly atleast 15 days in a month to monitor the implementation of the Outsourcing Services.
- He/She will discuss with the Hospital Superintendent / Regional Medical Officer/ Nursing Superintendent and Nodal Officer about the functioning of Outsource Services, and will set right any bottle necks / problems identified by him in the implementation of the programme.
- 3. He/She will go through the periodic reports received from the Hospitals whenever in the Head Quarters and give his/her remarks.



- 4. To review the reports and data available like outcome indicators based on evaluation parameter, quarterly quality check reports, accuracy of online reports generated daily basis by contractor about all services covered under housekeeping contract.
- 5. To have a sensitization meeting amongst workers of the hospital to make them understand the basic support required and how the objectives can be achieved.
- 6. To suggest any basic minimal civil structural alterations, if required for maintaining housekeeping services.
- 7. To study the manpower deployment against any pre set norms appropriate to the needs as per the requirements of hospital.





As the appropriate hospitals to which these patients are to be transported are sometimes very far off and sometimes the patients become much more serious or lose their life before they reach the hospital. In order to address this issue it is proposed to strengthen the accident and emergency services in the hospitals located strategically located in the high The strengthening will be in the form of buildings, equipment, staff and training etc., It is proposed to upgrade the following existing 14 accident and emergency care centres from NRHM funds of Rs.761.18 lakhs.

The Mission Director, State Health Society has also stated that the above proposal has been included in the PIP 2012-13 and the NPCC of Government of India has approved the activity and allotted a sum of Rs.761.18 lakhs (Rupees seven crore sixty one lakh and eighteen thousands only) towards the strengthening of existing Comprehensive Emergency Management Centres in the 14 Government Hospitals. The same was also approved in the 19<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee meeting held on 14.6.2012. The Project Director, TNHSP has already been asked to go ahead for taking up of civil works, Purchase of equipments, Furniture and conduct of training.

- 3. The Mission Director, State Health Society has requested the Government to issue the following orders to strengthen the Trauma Care centres in the 14 existing Hospitals:
  - i. To create 4 Medical Officer and 8 Staff Nurse posts in time scale of pay in each of the 14 Trauma Care centres. The above Post may be filled up by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services Chennai-6 as per procedures.



- ii. The four posts of Medical Officers will be utilized to perform the duties of the Causality Medical Officer in the Hospitals round the clock by doing shift duties.
- iii. The Trauma Care Centers including the operation Theatres should be functional 24 hours on all days. Four Orthopaedic Surgeons will be doing duties in the Trauma Care Centres by stay duty. Whenever there is deficiency of the Orthopaedic Surgeons, the Orthopaedic Surgeons from other hospitals in the district will be diverted to do the duties. Two M.S General Surgeons shall be available on call duty to assist the Trauma Care Surgeons for treating soft tissue injuries and multiple injuries. If there is a deficiency of General Surgeons in that hospital, the General Surgeons from other hospitals will be diverted to do the duties. The Anaesthetist posted for the CEmONC Centre and other duties will also provide anaesthesia coverage to the Trauma Care Centre.
- iv. The General Surgeons, Anaesthetist doing call duties in the nights will be paid incentive as per NRHM rates.
- V. The transfer / postings / diversion / long leave of Orthopaedic Surgeons, Anaesthetists, General Surgeons, Medical Officers, Staff Nurses working in casuality and Trauma Care Centers will be done only after getting the approval of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project.
- vi. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services Chennai-6 may be permitted to implement Trauma care in the 14 Hospital under the overall control of Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project.
- vii. The Mission Director may be permitted to incur the recurring and nonrecurring expenditure from the National Rural Health Mission fund for the 14 trauma care centre.
- viii. The Mission Director may be permitted to remit the allotted amount for the salary of Medical Officers and Staff Nurse posted in the 14 trauma care centres every year in to Government account.
- ix. The Project Director may be permitted to monitor the overall implementation of the 14 trauma care centres and to change any modification required during implementation.
- 4. The Government after careful examination have decided to accept the proposals of the Mission Director, State Health Society and they accordingly issue the following orders:
  - i. Sanction is accorded to the creation of 4 posts of Medical Officer in the time scale of pay of Rs.15600-39100+G.P.Rs.5400/- and 8 posts of Staff Nurses in the time scale of pay of Rs.9300-34800+G.P.Rs.4450/to each of 14 Trauma Care centres indicated in annexure to the Government Order and these posts be filled up by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services as per procedures. The Medical Officers and Staff Nurses sanctioned to the 14 trauma care



centres shall draw salary from state funds through the Treasury mode. An annual recurring expenditure of Rs.680.40 lakhs (Rupees Six hundred and eighty lakhs and forty thousand only) is sanctioned to Director of Medical and Rural Health Services towards salary of Medical Officers and Staff Nurses sanctioned to the 14 Trauma Care centres. These four posts of Medical Officers will be utlised to perform the duties of the causality Medical Officers in the Hospitals round the clock by doing shift duties.

ii. The above expenditure shall be debited to the following head of account:

2210-Medical and Public Health
01 – Urban Health Services – Allopathy
110 – Hospitals and Dispensaries
AA – District Headquarters
Hospitals – 01 Salaries
(DPC: 2210-01-110-AA-0106)

- iii. The Trauma Care Centers including the operation Theatres should be functional 24 hours on all days. Four Orthopaedic Surgeons will be doing duties in the Trauma Care Centres by stay duty. Whenever there is deficiency of the Orthopaedic Surgeons, the Orthopaedic Surgeons from other hospitals in the district be diverted to do the duties. Two M.S general Surgeons shall be available on call duty to assist the Trauma Care Surgeons for treating soft tissue injuries and multiple injuries. If there is a deficiency of General Surgeons in that hospital, the General Surgeons from other hospitals will be diverted to do the duties. The Anaesthetist posted for the Comprehenive Emergency Management Centre and other duties will also provide anaesthesia coverage to the Trauma Care Centre.
- iv. The General Surgeons, Anaesthetist doing call duties in the nights will be paid incentive as per National Rural Health Mission rates. The Mission Director, State Health Society and Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project are permitted to hire / outsource categories of staff mentioned in the Human Resource indicated in the Annexure to this order except Medical Officer and Staff Nurse as per the Executive Committee approval and payment shall be made as proposed by the Mission Director.
- v. The transfer / postings / diversion / long leave of Orthopaedic Surgeons, Anaesthetists, General Surgeons, Medical Officers, Staff Nurses working in casualty and Trauma Care Centers shall be done only after getting the approval of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- vi. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is permitted to implement the Trauma Care in the 14 Hospitals under the overall control of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project.



- VII. The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to incur the recurring and nonrecurring expenditure as indicated in the Annexure to the Government Order from the NRHM fund for the 14 Trauma Care Centres. He is also permitted to remit the salary component of Medical Officers and Staff Nurses sanctioned to the 14 Trauma Care Centers in time scale of pay as approved by the Government of India to Government receipt account every year.
- viii. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project is permitted to monitor the overall implementation of the 14 trauma care centres and to change any modification required during implementation.
- The Mission Director, State Health Society is directed to remit the funds received from the Government of India i.e. National Rural Health Mission towards salary for the Medical Officer and Staff Nurses under the following head of account:

0210-Medical and Public Health 01 - Urban Health Services - 800. Other Receipts - BC. Receipts Under National Rural Health Mission (DPC: 0210-01-800-BC-0006)

- 6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 4 above shall constitute an item of "New Service" and the approval of Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of legislature, the expenditure will be initially met by an advance from the Contingency Fund. Orders for sanction of advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued by the Finance (Budget I) department. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is requested to apply for Contingency Fund Advance in the prescribed form along with the copy of this order to Finance (Budget I) Department for sanctioning the advance. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is also requested to send necessary explanatory notes to include the above expenditure in the supplementary estimate for the year 2013-14 to Finance Department at the appropriate time without fail.

#### ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, among others, orders were issued by Government to grant financial assistance from Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund to poor patients who underwent life saving surgeries like Heart, Kidney etc., financial assistance to poor patients, who have undergone life saving surgery in accredited Private Hospitals approved by the Government, as in the case of existing system of Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund Scheme as Rs.25,000/-, the maximum amount to be sanctioned under Tamilnadu State Illness Assistance Society and the funds for issue of financial assistance will be provided by the Society to the District Collectors concerned and the sanction for each case will be ordered by the Government. If the patient had paid the amount already to the Hospitals, then the amount should be given back to the patients



and the Tamilnadu State Illness Assistance Society will release funds to all District Collectors to implement the Scheme through accredited Private Hospitals recognized by the Government under Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund to a maximum amount of Rs.25,000 under State Illness Assistance Society.

- 2. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services in his letter fifth read above has stated that under Agenda No.11 of the 17<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting of the Tamil Nadu State Illness Assistance Society, Chennai-6 held on 24.12.2012, it has been decided that the existing procedure of payment to the beneficiaries has been examined and it was suggested that the Collectors themselves may examine the cases in consultation with Deans of Government Medical College Hospitals / Joint Director of Health Services concerned District and to sanction financial assistance to the needy patients instead of sending the proposals for issuance of orders at Government level.
- 3. The Government after careful examination decided to accept the proposal of the Director of Medical and Rural Health services and to issue the following amendments to the G.O.(Ms) No.150, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated.01.08.2002.

#### **AMENDMENTS**

The para 6 in the G.O.(Ms)No.450, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated.01.08.2002 shall be substituted as follows:-

- (6) (i) All the District Collectors in Tamil Nadu are authorized to grant financial assistance for specialized treatment for life saving surgeries such as Heart and Kidney to the poor people from the fund of Tamil Nadu State Illness Assistance Society scheme ranging from Rs.5000 to Rs.25,000 by following the conditions stipulated in the G.O.(Ms)No.150, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated.01.08.2002.
- (6) (ii) All the District Collectors in Tamil Nadu are also directed to sanction financial assistance by scrutinizing the applications in consultation with the Dean of the Government Medical College Hospital in their district. In case where there is no Government Medical College in their district, the Collectors are requested to scrutinize the applications in consultation with the Joint Director of Health Services of the respective Districts and issue appropriate orders for sanctioning financial assistance by adopting the existing guidelines for the grant of Financial Assistance.
- (6) (iii) "Government ordered that the procedure followed in the case of Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund may also be taken into account while sanctioning orders from the Tamil Nadu State Illness Assistance schemes, the procedures laid down for the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund are indicated in the Annexure. The Director of Medical and Rural Health



Services is requested to release the sanctioned amount to District Collectors. The District Collectors will open savings bank account in State bank of India to deposit the amount released by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and the amount should be deposited in the fixed deposit scheme for a period of 30 days, 45 days, 90 days as the case may be".

"The applications received from the Chief Minister's Special Cell will be sent to the District Collectors concerned directly and the Collectors will scrutinize the applications and pass appropriate

orders".



- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project in his letter third read above, had requested the Government to issue an amendment to the Government Order first read above, so that signing up of the MoU/Contract agreement and processing the payment for the outsourcing / housekeeping in the hospitals may be done centrally by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. He had also requested the Government, to allot the budget requirement of Rs.35,71,06,262/(Rupees Thirty Five Crores, Seventy one lakhs, six thousand, two hundred and sixty two only), in order to start the outsourcing activities in the institutions under the control of the Director of Medical Education. He had also requested the Government, to open a separate Head of Account for the Tamil Nadu Health System project, in order to allot the funds for the institutions under the control of the Director of Medical Education through the Pay and Accounts Office, Nandanam, Chennai-35.
- 4. In the Government Order fourth read above an amendment has been issued to the Government order first read above, and it has been ordered that the signing up of the MoU/Contract agreement and processing the payment for the outsourcing / housekeeping in the hospitals may be done centrally by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- 5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Director of Medical Education carefully and sanction a sum of Rs.27,50,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty seven Crores and Fifty lakhs only) towards payment to the contracting agencies for the outsourcing of multipurpose hospital workers for housekeeping activities in the institutions under the control of the Director of Medical Education for the year 2013-14 (for 5 months.)
- 6. The expenditure sanctioned at para 5 above shall be debited to the following Head of Account:-
  - 2210- Medical and Public Health 05 Medical Education Training and Research 001 Direction and Administration I Non Plan AA Directorate of Medical Education 33 payments for professional and special services 04 contract payment (DPC 2210-05-001-AA-3342.)
- 7. Necessary funds will be provided in the Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2013-14. Pending provision of funds, the Director of Medical Education is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in para 5 above to the



Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project by means of a cheque drawn in favour of the Personal Deposit account maintained by Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project. However, this expenditure will be brought to the notice of the legislature by specific inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2013-14. The Director of Medical Education is directed to include this item of expenditure while sending the proposal for Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2013-14 and send necessary draft explanatory notes for inclusion of expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates to the Government in Finance Department without fail.

#### ORDER:

The Mission Director, State Health Society in his letter 4th read above has stated that to achieve the MDG goals on Maternity Child Health care, various strategies focusing on prevention of major causes of IMR & MMR have been formulated by the State and to implement the above strategies, Staff Nurses are posted on contractual basis in phased manner since the introduction of Reproductive Child Health under National Rural Health Mission (after giving them appropriate skill trainings) in various programmes i.e. 24 X 7 delivery care, Mobile Medical Units (Hospital on Wheels), Sick Newborn Care Units (SNCUs), Nutrition Rehabilitation Centres (NRCs), New Born Stabilization Units (NBSUs) etc., Availability of these staff nurses in the Institutions round the clock has brought quality Maternity Child Health care services to the community and has played a significant role in improving the OP census and institutional deliveries, especially in primary health care set up. The entry level contractual salary of the staff nurses placed under National Rural Health Mission schemes by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services was revised in the G.O. 1st read above. He has stated further that when contractual appointment through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is not feasible because of administrative reasons, Staff Nurses have been placed through outsourcing. An additional amount of Rs. 500 per month as National Rural Health Mission Rural allowance was approved by



Government for the staff nurses who are providing 24x7 delivery care services in G. O. (Ms.) No. 31 Health and Family Welfare Department (EAP II/2) dated 19.01.2012 to further motivate the Contractual staff nurses opting for primary health care institutions. In order to encourage the retention of these trained staff nurses with hands on experience in skill sets required for the specific Reproductive Child Health, National Rural Health Mission schemes and to ensure their further involvement in these work till they are regularized by the Government when appointed by Director of Medical and Rural Health Services till they move out for better opportunities in the case of staff nurses placed through out-sourcing, consolidated pay of contract Staff Nurses placed under various schemes of RCH/NRHM was enhanced with effect from 1st April 2012 in the G.O (Ms.) No.342 (EAP-II/2) Department dated 14.12.2012. In said G.O., contractual pay was revised from Rs.4000 per month to Rs.7000 per month for first year, from Rs.4500 per month to Rs.7500 per month for second year and from Rs.5500 per month to Rs.8000 per month from third year onwards. In the above Government Order, the Mission Director, State Health Society was also permitted to continue the payment of NRHM rural allowance and also to provide incentives to Staff Nurses working in 24 x 7 Primary Health Centres and Level-II Maternity Child Health Centres for additional services rendered by them.


- 2. The Mission Director, State Health Society has stated further that in the Project Implementation Programme 2013-14, an amount of Rs.10000 per month for entry level Staff Nurses with a hike of Rs.1000 per month for every year till they are regularized by the Government (when appointed by Director of Medical and Rural Health Services) or till they move out for better opportunities (in the case of staff nurses placed through out-sourcing), has been proposed to Government of India and insisted in the supplementary PIP for the year 2013-14. The existing entry level salary for the contract Staff Nurses has been enhanced by 10% by Government of India in the supplementary Project Implementation Programme as indicated below and this enhancement has also been approved in the 24<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting held on 08.10.2013:
  - i) All the contractual staff Nurses placed under National Rural Health Mission under various schemes in the state shall be given an entry level contractual salary of Rs.7700 / month (Existing level- Rs.7000/month) with an annual increase of Rs. 500/month every year till they are regularized in the case of staff nurses placed through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or Medical Recruitment Board / till they move out for better opportunities in the case of staff nurses placed through outsourcing. (As per the approvals of the Government of India in Supplementary ROP-I Ref.No.3)
  - ii) The provision of National Rural Health Mission Rural Allowance of Rs.500/month shall continue for the contractual Staff Nurses of (i) 24 X 7 delivery care services and (ii) Level II Maternity Child Health centres and the annual increase provided to them shall be Rs.550 every year till they are regularized in the case of staff nurses placed through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or Medical Recruitment Board / till they move out for better opportunities in the case of staff nurses placed through outsourcing.



- iii) The Staff Nurses of 24 x 7 delivery care services/ Level II Maternity Child Health centres are also eligible for the allowances for the additional services as per the G.O.(Ms) No.342 Health and Family Welfare (EAP-II/2) Department dated 14.12.2012.
- iv) The RMNCH Counsellors who have been placed in lieu of the Post Partum Counsellors in the 110 Post Partum Centres (as per the approval of the 22<sup>nd</sup> EC) shall be provided with the enhanced contractual salary on par with the approvals for the Staff Nurses (Approved in Main ROP).

The Mission Director; State Health Society has requested the Government to issue necessary orders to implement the above proposals as approved in the 24<sup>th</sup> E.C. meeting held on 08.10.2013.

- 3. The Government, after careful consideration, has decided to accept the proposals of the Mission Director, State Health Society and accordingly they issue the following orders:
  - i) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to enhance the consolidated pay of all the contractual Staff Nurses placed under NRHM with effect from 01.04.2013 as indicated below:
    - a) All the contractual staff Nurses placed under NRHM under various schemes in the state shall be given an entry level contractual pay of Rs.7700 per month from the existing pay of Rs.7000 per month with an annual increase of Rs.500 per month every year till they are regularized in the case of staff nurses placed through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or till they move out for better opportunities in the case of staff nurses placed through outsourcing.
    - b) The provision of National Rural Health Mission Rural Allowance of Rs.500/month shall continue for the contractual Staff Nurses working in the 24x7 delivery care Primary Health Centres and Level-II Maternity Child Health centres with an annual increase of National Rural Health Mission Rural Allowance of Rs.50 per month.
    - c) The incentives sanctioned to the contractual Staff Nurses in G.O. (Ms) No.342 Health and Family Welfare (EAP-II/2) Department dated 14.12.2012 shall continue till they are regularized or till they move out for better opportunities.
    - d) The RMNCH Counsellors who were placed in lieu of the Post Partum Counsellors in the 110 Post Partum Centres (as per the approval of the 22<sup>nd</sup> EC) shall be provided with the enhanced contractual salary on par with the contract Staff Nurses.



- ii) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to pay the salary arrears as per the enhanced contractual salary to the contract Staff Nurses and RMNCH counsellors with effect from 01.04.2013.
- iii) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to incur the expenditure from Reproductive Child Health funds.
- 4. This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O. No. 474/JS/(Dr.PU)/H-I/2013, dated: 04.12.2013.
