ORDER:

In the letter read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that a Trust based at Bangalore, namely, 'Nayanjothi Trust' has submitted a proposal to Government about their services on creating awareness and enhancing eye donation with request for permission to utilize the 108 telephone number The main objectives of the trust are

- i. To build data base of Eye donation by creating awareness among the public
- To work with State Government to make use of existing emergency telephone number 108 facilitate speedy collection of eyes.
- To ensure cornea blind poor patients are supported by equitable and fair distribution of collected corneas.
- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has obtained the remarks of Chief Operating Officer, Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute and he has stated that the request of the Trust for utilizing the 108 telephone number for providing information to the eye bank for collecting cornea from the deceased, may be incorporated into the emergency response system of Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute. Also he has stated that their process would be that the calls received at ERC will be assigned to an appropriate and nearest eye bank or collection centre. But 108 ambulances will not be used for this purpose and no other support would be extended other than handing and forwarding the calls. However, he has also submitted a detailed proposal for 108 ERC to be used for handing eye donation.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to consider the remarks of Nayanjothi Trust & Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute and has proposed to utilize the toll free telephone number 108 for

providing information to the eye banks whenever the requests are received from the relatives of the deceased relatives. The roles and responsibilities of each stakeholder would be as follows:

Roles and Responsibility of the Emergency Management Research Institute

- > To receive calls from prospective donors and assign these calls to the nearest Government or private eye Bank/ eye collection center to harvest the corneas.
- > To follow up with eye bank to ensure timely response to such requests and keep record of all callers and eye banks
- > Calls will be assigned first come first service basis to the nearest eye bank
- > If one eye bank denies a call, then the same will be assigned to the next nearest bank
- > To create awareness about this service to the community.
- > To be transparent and generate reports from time to time as decided by the management.
- > 108 ambulances will not be used for this purpose and only calls will be handled and no other additional support would be provided.

Roles and Responsibility of the Government of Tamil Nadu

- > The Director, State Blindness Control Society, Egmore will be the Nodal Officer for implementing this service and will sign the agreement between the trust and Emergency Management Research Institute on behalf of Government of Tamil Nadu.
- > To help in gathering updated list of eye banks / collection centers across the state regularly
- > Help in networking with Government eye banks
- > To sensitize Government eye care providers / to avail this service along with protocol
- > To review the performance

Roles and Responsibility of the Trust

- > Responsible for networking with concerned officials involved in this initiative and support
- Creating awareness about this service among community
- > To participate in the review meetings of this project with Government and 108 ERS.

Budget : The Chief Operating Officer, Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute has stated that the Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) has developed a software called "Nethra Net" and agreed to furnish at free of cost for the

utilization at Emergency Response Centre. A comprehensive list of Eye banks and collection centres has been collected from Eye bank Association and uploaded in the soft ware developed by Tata Consultancy Services.

The Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute had agreed to utilize the telephone number 108 for providing information to the nearest eye bank and generate reports time to time which would be the routine assigning of the calls for the ERC. The Nayanjothi trust has agreed in their proposal for the Development of IEC awareness among public and to publicize this facility. Hence there will not be any additional expenditure to the Government for this purpose.

Monitoring and Evaluation:

The Project Director, State Blindness Control Society, Egmore, Chennai, will be the Nodal Officer for implementing this service. To monitor the utilization of the 108 telephone number for providing information to the eye bank and the utilization of the harvested corneas, the Nodal Officer shall be the overall in charge of the programme in terms of planning, coordinating with various eye banks, eye hospitals, EMRI and the Nayanjothi trust. A Committee headed by the Secretary to Government, Health and Family Welfare Department will monitor this service once in quarter. The following officials would be the members of the Committee.

- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has put forth the following decision points:
 - The Project Director, State Blindness Control Society, Egmore will be the Nodal Officer for implementing this service and he/she will sign the agreement between the trust and Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research



Institute on behalf of Government of Tamil Nadu. Implementing and monitoring the services will be the responsibility of the Nodal Officer.

- II. The Nayan Jothi trust agreed to provide the IEC awareness programmer among public and providing information to update the datas, coordinating with the eye banks/eye collection centres at free of cost.
- III. The Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute agreed to utilize the telephone number 108 and to provide the information to the nearer eye bank/eye collection centre with the available resources of manpower, technology etc.,
- IV. The Tata Consultancy Services has agreed to provide the software at free of cost.
- V. The 108 ambulances will not be utilized for providing this service.

There is no expenditure involved for utilizing the telephone number 108 for providing information to the eye bank for harvesting the cornea from the deceased.

- 5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore requested the Government to issue orders to utilize the telephone number 108 for providing information to the eye banks for harvesting cornea from the deceased.
- 6. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and has decided to accept it. Accordingly, the Government issues the following orders:
 - I. The Project Director, State Blindness Control Society, Egmore will be the Nodal Officer for implementing this service and he/she will sign the agreement between the trust and Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute on behalf of Government of Tamil Nadu. Implementing and monitoring the services will be the responsibility of the Nodal Officer.
 - II. The Nayan Jothi trust will provide the IEC awareness programmer among public and providing information to update the datas, coordinating with the eye banks/eye collection centres at free of cost.
 - III. The Tamil Nadu- Emergency Management Research Institute will utilize the telephone number 108 and to provide the information to the nearer eye bank/eye collection centre with the available resources of manpower, technology etc.,
 - IV. The Tata Consultancy Services will provide the software at free of cost.
 - V. The 108 ambulances will not be utilized for providing this service. There is no expenditure involved for utilizing the telephone number 108 for providing information to the eye bank for harvesting the cornea from the deceased.
 - VI. The rules of responsibilities of the EMRI, Nayanjothi Trust and the State Government shall be strictly followed.

ORDER:

In the Government Order 1st read above, the Government direct that a fee of Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) be collected for embalming dead bodies. In the Government Order 2nd read above, orders were issued for establishment of Free Hearse Service in all the Government Medical Institutions on Public Private Partnership mode similar to 108 Ambulance Services.

- 2. In the letter 3rd read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Free Hearse Service has transported around 46,814 dead bodies during the last year and this is provided free of cost. Out of these, 46,814 cases, nearly 50% of cases are medico legal in nature. He has also stated that at present, cases beyond 300 kilometers are transported through railways. As per the railways protocol, Post Mortem cases should be embalmed before transportation by rail. Around 5% of the cases required embalming and as per the Government order, a sum of Rs.1000/- per case has to be remitted to Government account before embalmment.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has also stated that the Free Hearse Service program is fully funded by the State Government and hence, he has proposed to amend the Government order by waiving the embalming charge for Free Hearse Service programme. He has requested that necessary orders in the waiver.
- 4. The Government after careful consideration of the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, and waive the embalming charges for the Free Hearse Services Programme.

In the Government Order 1st read above, a sum of Rs.13.93,250/- was sanctioned towards Annual Maintenance Contract cost for computers and accessories in implementation of Comprehensive Health Management Information Systems in Secondary level Pilot Phase Hospitals in Kancheepuram, Vellore & Kanniyakumari District Hospitals and office of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, Chennai.

- 2. In the Government Order 2nd read above, a sum of Rs.21,29,850/- was sanctioned towards Annual Maintenance Contract cost for computers and accessories provided for 36/ Government Hospitals in 5 Districts and 5 Primary Health Centres during March 2009.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project stated that the Annual Maintenance Contract fund for Pilot Hospitals of Rs.13,93,250/- and the Annual Maintenance Contract fund of Phase-I Hospitals for Rs.21,29,850/- have already been released by him to ELCOT instead of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation in order to carry out the Annual Maintenance Contract with the vendor for the Pilot Phase-I location as sanctioned in the above said Government Orders.

Maintenance Contract fund to ELCOT Chennai instead of Tamil Nadu Medical Service Corporation, Chennai.

ORDER:

In the G.O 1st read above, orders were issued for implementation of a new Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme to achieve the objective of Universal Health Care to the people of Tamil Nadu. In the G.O. 2nd read above, the above Scheme has been extended to the Srilankan Refugees residing in the Refugees camps in the State.

2. In the letter 3rd read above, the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Rehabilitation and Welfare of Non Resident Tamils has requested to extend the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme to the Sri Lankan Tamils in the State, who have registered themselves as Non Camp Refugees in the local police station as per the 'Q' Branch report for the month of February 2013, about 13,289 families consisting 34,826 refugees have registered their names in the local police stations as non-camp refugees and obtained certificate for the same. The list of such non-camp refugees and their local addresses are available with the Commissioner of Police in the case of Corporation areas and Superintendent of Police of the districts in case of non-corporation areas.

- 3. In the letter 4th read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, has stated that the Sri Lankan refugees living outside the Camps also may be covered under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme, preferably without any income limit. He has added that however if the Government deems fit, suitable orders may be issued in this regard as only refugees in the camps alone are covered in this Scheme.
- 4. The Government after careful examination has decided to accept the request of the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Rehabilitation and Welfare of Non-Resident Tamils. Accordingly, the Government direct that the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme shall be extended to the Sri Lankan Refugees living outside the Refugee Camps in the State, who have requested themselves as Non Camp Refugees in the local police stations. The Operational Guidelines for extension of the above Schemes are detailed below:

| Eligibility:

- a. The beneficiary should have Registration Certificate issued by the Concerned local police station.
- b. There is no income ceiling for these beneficiaries.

II. Identification:

a. The Srilankan Non-Camp Refugees should obtain a certificate from the local police station. (Not below the rank of Inspector of Police).

Ill. Verification:

a. The beneficiaries identified should be verified with the existing Chief Minister's Comprehensives Health Insurance Scheme for Tamil Nadu (CMCHISTN) data for de-duplication.

IV. Enrolment:

- a. Enrolment is done at the concerned District Kiosk after following dueprocess of de-duplication.
- b. The Insurance Card should be issued to the beneficiary at District Kiosk through online printing.
- c. Monthly data on enrolment provided.

V. <u>Distribution of Cards:</u>

a. The cards to be distributed same day from the District Kiosk

ORDER:

Hon'ble Chief Minister has made the following announcements, among others, in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly on 08.05.2013 under Rule 110 of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly Rules:

- District Headquarter Hospitals in 15 non-medical college districts will be strengthened on par with medical college hospitals at a cost of Rs.18.51 crore.
- ii) Obstetric Intensive Care Units will be established in 55 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals at a cost of Rs.12.28 crore.

Hon'ble Minister for Health has also announced in the Assembly while moving the Demand of Health and Family Welfare Department, among others, that "laboratory-facilities will be established in 13 hospitals with the creation of 13 posts of Laboratory Technicians".

2. The Mission Director, State Health Society in his letters read above has stated that he has included necessary proposals in the PIP 2013-14 to implement the above announcements and got approved by the National Project Coordination Committee (NPCC), Government of India in the main PIP 2013-14 and supplementary PIP 2013-14. Government of India has also given approval to implement certain schemes viz. i) provision of Staff Nurses for the buildings constructed with NRHM funding. ii) provision of Emergency Obstetric Care (EmOC) trained Medical Officers to the Maternity Wings of all the Government Medical Colleges. iii) additional manpower for the Reproductive and Child Health (RCH) Centre of Excellence at Institute of Obstetric and Gynecology, Chennai, Kasturba Gandhi Hospital, Chennai and Government Medical College Hospitals at Madurai and Safem, and iv) provision of Radiographer to Government

Hospitals where there is no sanctioned post of Radiographer in the above PIPs for the year 2013-14.

- 3. The Mission Director, State Health Society has sent proposals to the Government for sanction of Human Resources as approved by the Government of India for the implementation of the above announcements and schemes. He has sent separate proposals for sanction of funds from Government for undertaking construction activities wherever approved for implementing the above schemes following the guidelines issued by Government in G.O. - 4. The Mission Director, State Health Society has requested sanction of manpower for implementing the following schemes as indicated below:
 - i) Strengthening of District Head Quarters Hospitals in Non-Medical College Districts on par with Medical Colleges.

At present, the medicare is provided through a network of 19 Medical College Hospitals (Tertiary Care Facilities) and attached institutions, 270 secondary care hospitals consisting of District Headquarters hospitals, Taluk & Non-taluk hospitals and 1634 Primary Health Centres. Diagnostic services and speciality services are available in almost all the Secondary and tertiary facilities. The Health care facilities in each of the districts are dependent on either the Medical College Hospital or the District Head Quarters Hospital of the district which is the major hospital in the district for the health care needs 17 districts are having Medical College Hospitals and 14 districts are devoid of them and the District Head Quarters Hospital is the highest Government referral facility for these 14 districts. The Medical College Hospitals are able to provide Comprehensive Health Care Services to the public without resorting the referral to other . institutions and it is not in the case of the District Headquarters Hospitals which are not provided with Super-Speciality departments from where the patients need to be referred to the Medical College Hospitals of the nearby districts for speciality care. It is proposed to strengthen the district headquarters hospitals of the 14 non-medical college districts and Kancheepuram District Head Quarters Hospital as addition to the level of Medical College Hospitals for provision of high end services. These facilities need to be strengthened with additional Human Resources as indicated below:

a) Medical Officers, Specialists and Super-Specialists

The existing speciality services in these hospitals need to be strengthened and the minimum number of specialists to be available in each of the facility is indicated below:

The Government of India approved the above 443 Staff Nurses. The existing entry level salary for the Staff Nurses has been enhanced by 10% in G.O.(Ms) No. 312, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 26.12.2013 as approved by Government of India in the supplementary ROP. Hence the contractual staff Nurses may be given an entry level contractual salary of Rs.7700 / month with an annual increase of Rs. 500 every year till they are regularized in the case of staff nurses placed through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or Medical Recruitment Board or till they move out for better opportunities in the case of Staff Nurses placed through outsourcing.

c) Lab Technicians and Radiographers

Apart from these, the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), Intensive Medical Care Unit (IMCU), Poison Treatment Centres, Accident and Emergency services and all important services will be available round the clock in the hospital.

ii) Establishment of Obstetric ICUs and strengthening of the existing maternity OTs in 55 CEmONC centres.

With financial and technical inputs from Tamil Nadu Health System Project, 105 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) Centres functioning in the Government Hospitals have been provided with additional buildings, specialist Doctors, Nurses and Equipments. As round the clock OG specialist, Anaesthetist and Paediatric Physician are made available in these centres, more and more complicated maternal admissions are handled in these CEmONC centres and large number of caesarean operations are performed in these hospitals. These centres serve as referral institutions for the nearby public and private facilities of the districts and sometimes to nearby district also. When complicated maternal admissions are made, they have to be admitted either along with general AN cases or admitted in the general IMCU of the hospital which causes much inconvenience to the patients and the doctors for providing focused specialized care to such patients. Hence, it is proposed to establish

one unique "Obstetric Intensive Care Unit" in 55 CEmONC centres functioning in the Secondary Care Government Hospitals across the State to provide intensive care to the complicated maternal cases. It is proposed to place 4 Staff Nurses on contractual basis in each of the 55 CEMONC ICUs for round the clock duty. The Duty Obstetrician of the CEMONC centre shall be vested with the management of the AN/ IN/ PN cases in the Obstetric Intensive Care Unit in co-ordination with the other specialists of the facility as the case warrants. These personnel will be provided necessary special training to man the obstetric Intensive Care Units. The Contractual staff nurses shall be placed through the existing procedure by Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or outsourced through outsourcing agencies. In these 55 CEmONC centres, it is proposed to place 4 additional contractual staff nurses and 4 OT technicians. To make the Operation theatres function round the clock without interfering with the normal staffing of the operation theatres, Government of India have approved 220 Staff Nurses at the rate of 4 Staff Nurses for the Obstetrics Intensive Care Units and 220 Staff Nurses at the rate of 4 Staff Nurses for the Operation Theatres of each of the 55 CEMONC centres. contractual Staff Nurses proposed to be appointed in the 55 CEmONC centres may be given an entry level contractual salary of Rs.7700 per month with an annual increase of Rs. 500 every year till they are regularized in the case of staff nurses placed through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or till they move out for better opportunities in the case of staff nurses placed through outsourcing.

(iii) Provision of Staff Nurses for the Buildings constructed with NRHM funds.

During the years 2009-2010 & 2010-2011, additional buildings have been constructed in the secondary care facilities with financial support from NRHM. Civil works have been completed and the buildings have been put into use. Due to the additional buildings provided, there is an increase in the bed strength in the 56 facilities indicated in the Annexure-IV to this order and no additional staff has been sanctioned for the increased bed strength. If 163 additional staff nurses are provided to these facilities, better use of these facilities would be possible. The Government of India has approved for 167 contractual Staff Nurses at the enhanced contractural pay of Rs.7,700 per month with annual increase of Rs.500 per month to these 56 facilities.

iv) Provision of EmOC trained Medical Officers / Medical Officers in the Maternity wings of the Medical Colleges

Maternity wings of the Medical colleges, being the tertiary referral centres for the Districts, are overloaded with complicated maternity admissions and most of the cases require intensive monitoring in the High Dependency Units / ICUs of the facilities. To monitor the high risk cases, 2 EmOC trained Medical Officers were provided to each of the 18 maternity wings of the 17 Medical Colleges as per the orders issued in G.O. (Ms). No.108, Health and Family Welfare (EAP-II/2) Department, dated 13.05.2013. In order to provide adequate number of Medical officers to do rotation duty at the obstetric HDU/ICUs (exclusively) and to manage the cases in the Obstetric Casualty, it is proposed to extend the scheme with four more Medical Officers to each of the facilities and also to extend the scheme to the new medical colleges at Tiruvannamalai and Sivaganga. Necessary proposals in this regard for provision of 84 Medical Officers / EmOC trained Medical Officers in addition to the already approved 36 posts have been included in PIP 2013-14 and the Government of India approved the proposals at the

consolidated pay of Rs.40,000 per month for Medical Officer. These Medical Officers shall be given 24 weeks EmOC training and retained in the facility for a minimum period of two years.

Additional Manpower for the RCH-Centre of Excellence at IOG, Madurai and Salem Medical College Hospitals.

RCH-Centre of Excellence is being established at the maternity wings of the Madras Medical College namely IOG Hospital Chennai and ISO&KGH for women and children, Chennai and its attached Training Institutions based on the approval of Government of India at a total cost of Rs.100 crores approved in PIP 2007-08 and administrative sanction in G.O. Ms. No. 283/Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 01.09.2008. The civil works are nearing completion and procurement of equipments is ongoing. The Centre of Excellence has added a bed strength of about 400 to IOG and the bed strength of ISO& KGH remains the same. To strengthen the maternity wings of the medical colleges in a phased manner similar to the above, it was proposed to strengthen the maternity wings of Madurai and Salem Medical College Hospitals into RCH-Centre of Excellence at a cost of Rs.50 Crores each and necessary proposals were approved by the Government of India in PIP 2012-13. Strengthening of the Maternity wings of Madurai and Salem Medical College Hospitals into RCH-Centre of Excellence have been approved in G.O.(Ms) No. 312, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 26.12.2013 and G.O.(Ms) No.172, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 19.07.2013 as announced by the Honourable Chief Minister in the floor of Legislative Assembly (110 announcements). As per the finalized civil work plans for RCH - Centre of Excellence at Madurai and Salem Medical College maternity wings, there will be an addition of about 500 beds for Salem MCH and about 480 beds for Madurai MCH. Considering the increase in the number of beds in the IOG, Chennai and Maternity wings of Madurai and Salem Medical Colleges, a proposal for provision of additional specialists and Staff Nurses has been included in PIP 2013-14 and got approved by the Government of India. vi) Provision of Lab Technician to Government Hospitals where there is no post of Lab Technician

Availability of Laboratory services in the health care facilities is essential for MCH care and also other healthcare services. There are 13 Government Hospitals where there are no sanctioned post of Lab Technician. Hence a proposal for appointment of Lab Technician to these 13 facilities indicated in the Annexure-VII to the order has been included in PIP 2013-14 and the same has been approved by Government of India in Main ROP 2013-14 at the consolidated pay of Rs.10,000 per month. This has been announced by the Honourable Minister for Health & Family Welfare in the Legislative Assembly.

vii) Provision of Radiographer to Government Hospitals where there is no post of Radiographer

The Government is committed to provide quality health care for the public approaching the government facilities and ensures that round the clock management, investigations and drugs are available in the Hospitals. There are 98 Government Hospitals in the State indicated in the Annexure-VIII to the order which have not been provided with the post of radiographer. Hence a proposal to provide a radiographer to these 98 facilities at contractual salary of Rs.10,000 per month was included in PIP 2013-14 and approved by Government of India. The Radiographer will be placed contractually or placed through outsourcing among the Radiographers who are having CRA qualification. They will be paid a contract payment of Rs. 10,000/- per month and the services of these radiographers placed on contract may be regularized as and when vacancy arises in the regular post of radiographers.

5. The Mission Director, State Health Society has stated that the proposals approved by the Government of India towards Human Resources for certain schemes in the main PIP and supplementary PIP for 2013-14 were placed before the 24th Executive Committee (EC) meeting held on 08.10.2013 and EC of the State Health Society has approved the proposals. He has requested the Government to issue orders sanctioning Human Resources to implement the above schemes. He has stated that the post of Specialists and Medical Officers may be sanctioned in time scale of pay from State funds under treasury mode and he may be permitted to remit the salary component of doctors

as approved by the Government of India to State Government receipt account. He has also suggested that the services of Staff Nurses, Lab. Technicians and Radiographers appointed on contract basis through DM&RHS may be regularized and absored in time scale of pay as and when vacancy arries in regular post.

- 6. The Government have carefully examined the above proposals of the Mission Director, State Health Society and decided to accept the proposals. They accordingly issue the following orders:
 - i) Sanction is accorded for the creation of 105 posts of Super Specialists, 183 Specialist Medical Officers, 60 Medical Officers and 3 Dentists in time scale of pay of Rs.15,600-39,100 + GP Rs.5400 and also for appointment of 443

contract Staff Nurses at the contractual salary of Rs.7700 per month with an annual increase of Rs. 500 per month, 14 contract Lab. Technicians at the consolidated pay of Rs.10,000 per month and 18 contract Radiographers at the consolidated pay of Rs.10,000 per month for strengthening of the 15 District Headquarters Hospitals indicated in the Annexures II, IIIa to IIId to this Government order.

- ii) Sanction is accorded for the appointment of 440 contract Staff Nurses at the contractual salary of Rs.7700 per month with an annual increase of Rs.500 per month for the ICUs and OTs in 55 CEmONC Centres as indicated in the Annexure I to this Government order.
- Sanction is accorded for the appointment of 167 contract Staff Nurses at the contractual salary of Rs.7700 per month with an annual increase of Rs. 500 per month for the additional buildings constructed under NRHM as indicated in the Annexure IV to the Government order.
- iv) Sanction is accorded for the creation of 84 posts of Medical Officers in time scale of pay of Rs.15,600-39,100 + GP Rs.5400 for observation of high risk mother in the maternity wings of the 19 Government Medical College Hospitals as indicated in the Annexure-V to the Government Order.
- v) Sanction is accorded for the creation of 49 posts of Specialist Medical Officers in time scale of pay of Rs.15,600-39,100 + GP Rs.5400 and 110 contract Staff Nurses at the contractual salary of Rs.7700 per month with an annual increase of Rs.500 per month for the RCH Centre of Excellence at Institute of Obstetrics and Gynaecology and Government Hospital for Women and Children, Egmore, Chennai-8 and Government Medical College Hospitals at Salem and Madurai as indicated in the Annexure VI to this Government order.
- vi) Sanction is accorded for the appointment of 13 contract Lab Technicians at the consolidated pay of Rs.10,000 per month to the 13 Government Hospitals indicated in the Annexure VII to this order.
- vii) Sanction is accorded for the appointment of 98 contract Radiographers at the consolidated pay of Rs.10,000 per month to the 98 Government Hospitals indicated in the Annexure VIII to the Government order.
- viii) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to fill up the above newly sanctioned posts of Super Specialists, Specialists, Medical Officers and Dentists in time scale of pay by transfer from the existing Assistant Surgeons / Senior Assistant Surgeons / Civil Surgeons in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or by direct recruitment through the Medical Services Recruitment Board.
- ix) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to appoint the contract Staff Nurses through Director of Medical and Rural Health Services as per the seniority list maintained by him or through outsourcing if Director of Medical and Rural Health Services could not appoint contract Staff Nurses.

- The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is permitted to appoint the contract Lab Technicians and Radiographers through the Medical Services Recruitment Board or outsourcing. If contract Lab Technicians and Radiographers are recruited and appointed through the Medical Services Recruitment Board, they shall be absorbed in time scale of pay as and when vacancy arises in the respective regular posts.
 - xi) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to revise the salary of the above contract personnel as and when the salary is revised by the Government of India.
 - xii) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to rationalize the number of personnel sanctioned to the facilities under Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Director of Medical Education based on the actual number of the specialists available out of regular posts and physical performance of the facilities. If Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is not able to fill the above posts, the Mission Director is authorized to fill up the posts by outsourcing through agency or by placing retired personnel contractually following the rules in force.
- xiii) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to remit the salary of all the Specialists and Medical Officers appointed in time scale of pay from State funds through treasury to the State Government receipt account at the rate approved by the Government of India.
- xiv) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to incur the expenditure towards the above human resources from National Rural Health Mission funds.
- xv) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to train the Medical Officers placed for observation of High Risk Mothers in the maternity wings of the Medical College in 24 weeks EmOC and to retain them in the facilities for a minimum period of 3 years.
- 7. The expenditure towards the Medical Officer posts including Super Specialists and Specialists sanctioned in para 6(iv) and 6(v) above shall be debited to the respective Institutions head of account under the control of Director of Medical Education shown in Annexure-IX to the Government Order.
- 8. The expenditure towards the Super Specialists, Specialist Medical Officers and Dentists sanctioned in para 6(i) above for the District Head Quarters Hospitals under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services shall be debited to the following head of account:

"2210 - Medical and Public Health — 01 Urban Health Services – Allopathy — 110. Hospitals and Dispensaries – I. Non Plan – AA. District Headquarte's Hospitals — 01 Salaries (DPC 2210-01-110-AA-0106)"

9. The Mission Director, State Health Society is directed to remit the salary component of the Super Specialists, Specialists Medical Officers and Dentists approved in time scale of pay from State Fund as approved by the GOI under the National Rural Health Mission to the following head of account:-

"0211-00- Family Welfare -800 Other Receipts — AN-Receipts under National Rural Health Mission" (DPC 0211-00 800 AN 0007)

and also to remit the amount towards salary for the Medical Officers who are working under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services to the following head of account:

"0210. Medical and Public Health — 01 Urban Health Services — 800. Other Receipts — BC. Receipts — under National Rural Health Mission (DPC 0210-01-800-BC-0006)"

- 10. The expenditure sanctioned in para 3 above shall constitute an item of "New Service" and the approval of Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure will initially be met by an advance from the contingency fund and orders regarding which will be issued by the Finance (BG-I) Department. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services / Director of Medical Education are requested to send application in the prescribed form along with a copy of this order to Finance (BG-I) Department for sanctioning the advance. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services / Director of Medical Education are also directed to send necessary note for inclusion of the expenditure in the Supplement Estimate for 2013-14 to obtain approval of the Legislative Assembly to the Finance (BG-I) Department at the appropriate time.
- 11. This orders issues with the concurrence of the Finance (CMPC) Department vide its U.O.No.5953/CMPC/2014, dated: 03.02.2014 and ASL.No.2772 (Two thousand seven hundred and seventy two).

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

ORDER:

The Government with strong commitment created Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services (CEmONC) in 125 Government Hospitals in the State to ensure maternal survival thereby to reduce Maternal morbidity and maternal deaths including new born deaths in the State. Out of these 125 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals, 20 tertiary care hospitals are under the control of the Director of Medical Education and the remaining 105 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals are under the control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services.

2. In the letter read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that after creation of the 125 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals, performances like maternal admissions, complicated admissions, Deliveries, Caesarean deliveries, Night Caesarean are continuously increasing in the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals. After creation of Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Centres, Maternal deaths, referral out of mothers for further management and still births are also decreasing. But intra uterine deaths and neonatal deaths are in the same proportion till now. The creation of NICU Centres in the State will supplement the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services programme in reducing new born deaths. These Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals are provided with Buildings, Operation Theatres, Man power, training, equipments and other necessary infrastructures required for maintenance of the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and by the National Rural Health Mission. These Hospitals are regularly monitored and supervised by the Director of Medical and Rural Health


Services, Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and the Director of Medical Education and all Programme Officers of these three Directorates.

- 3. The Project Director has further stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project which is functioning from 2004-05 is coming to a close during September 2014. In the circumstances stated above, there should be appropriate officer to supervise and monitor the activities of the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services hospitals in the absence of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, other than the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and the Director of Medical Education. The Director of Family Welfare who is looking after Family Welfare Programmes and who is also connected with delivery performance is the appropriate officer to look after the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospital's performance and this will further increase the performance and the functioning of the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services programme.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has therefore requested to issue necessary Government Orders to supervise the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals by the Director of Family Welfare at the State level and the Deputy Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services at the District level and submit their reports to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission. After the end of Project period of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, the Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission will be the responsible officer to have full control and monitoring of all Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Centres through the Director of Family Welfare.
- 5. The Government, after careful consideration of the above proposal have decided to accept the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Accordingly the Government direct that the Director of Family Welfare at the State level and the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services at the District level will supervise the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Hospitals and submit their reports to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission. After the end of Project period of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, the Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission will be the responsible officer to have full control and monitoring of all Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Services Centres through the Director of Family Welfare.
- 6. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its UO.No.71900/H-II/2013, dated: 19.12.2013.



ORDER:

In the G.O. first read above the Government have sanctioned Rs. 480.00 lakh towards procurement of 32 Mammography Units at the rate of Rs.15.00 lakh per Unit for supply to Government Medical College Hospitals and District Head Quarters Hospitals in districts where there is no Government Medical College Hospitals. However, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was permitted to initially procure 18 Mammography Units in Phase I and the rest under Phase II of the Programme.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that based on the opinion of technical experts, it has been decided to procure Mammography Unit with Computed Radiography System instead of conventional Mammography Unit and also to supply 30 numbers of Mammography Units with Computed Radiography System, which includes, 22 Government Secondary Care Hospitals and 8 Medical College Hospitals and 13 Computed Radiography Systems only for 13 Mammography Units at 13 Medical College Hospitals. He has also stated that the market cost of a Mammography Unit is approximately Rs.45.00 lakh that the cost of a Computed Radiography System is approximately Rs.20.00 lakh for Unit and that the estimated cost of procurement of the Mammography Units with Computed Radiography System will be Rs.1610.00 lakh. Taking in to account the amount of Rs.480.00 lakh already sanctioned in the G.O read above, the Project Director has proposed to sanction an additional amount of Rs.1130.00 lakh.

- 3. Accordingly, in view of urgency, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had circulated a proposal to the State Empowered Committee for sanction of an additional amount of Rs1130.00 lakh towards supply of Mammography Unit with Computed Radiography System. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.
- 4. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and comes under Component II and Sub Component B. The expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.
- 5.The Government, after careful consideration, accord sanction for incurring an additional expenditure of Rs.1130.00 lakh (Rupees Eleven Crore and Thirty Lakh only), over and above the expenditure of Rs.480.00 lakh already sanctioned in the G.O first read above, towards procurement of 30 numbers of Mammography Units with Computed Radiography System, which includes 22 Government Secondary Care Hospitals and 8 Medical College Hospitals and 13 Computed Radiography Systems only for 13 Mammography Units at 13 Medical College Hospitals.
- 6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to procure the Mammography Units through the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation by following the World Bank procurement procedures.
- 7. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited to the following head of account:
 - "2210 Medical and Public Health 06. Public Health 101 Prevention and Control of Diseases Scheme in the Twelfth Five Year Plan –II. State Plan PA Pilot Testing of Non-Communicable Diseases under Health Systems Project 19. Machinery and Equipments 01. Purchase (DPC: 2210 06 101 PA 1917)".
- 8. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to transfer the amount of Rs.1130.00 lakh towards procurement of Mammography Units, to the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited by Cheque and credit it to the Public Deposit account of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited under the following head of account. "K Deposits and Advances (b) Deposits not bearing interest 8443.00 Civil Deposits 800. Other Deposits of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited (D.P. Code:8443 00 800 CE 000H (Receipts)".
- 9. The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited is permitted to procure the Units by calling for tenders by following World Bank Procurement procedure. The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation is requested to supply the Mammography Units to the concerned Government Hospitals as per the list to be given by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and to settle the account with the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project after completing the work.

In the Government Order first read above, the Government have accorded permission to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for provision of Computer and consumables for the implementation of Health Management Information System (HMIS) in 100 hospitals under the control of Municipalities and Municipal Corporations.

2. In the Government Order second read above, the Government have accorded permission to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to

hire an appropriate software consultant to develop and implement the Health Management Information System (HMIS) in 47 health institutions under the control of Director of Medical Education and in the Office of the Director of Medical Education, Hospital Management System (HMS) in 2 Hospital viz. Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai and Government Thanjavur Medical College Hospital, Thanjavur, support and completion of Hospital Management System (HMS) implementation in 4 hospitals viz. Raja Sir Ramasamy Mudaliar Lying-In Hospital Chennai, Institute of Social Obstetrics and Kasturba Gandhi Hospital for Woman and Children, Chennai, Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children and Institute of Obstetrics and Gynaecology and Government Hospital for Women and Children, Chennai, College Management System in 19 Government Medical Colleges and an University Automation System in Tamil Nadu Dr.MGR Medical University, Guindy, Chennai.

- 3. In the Government Order third read above, the Government have accorded permission to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to implement Health Management Information System (HMIS) in all the tertiary care hospitals and Hospital Management System (HMS) in 8 Medical College Hospitals to cover the out patients services only, instead of taking up only two hospitals as ordered in the Government order second read above, within the cost sanctioned in the said Government order. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project was also permitted to redistribute the Information Technology infrastructure as per the need among the 8 Medical College Hospitals where Hospital Management Systems will be implemented as per the revised plan.
- 4. In the Government Order fourth read above, the Government accord revised administrative sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.6,87,05,691 (Rupees six crore eighty seven lakh five thousand six hundred and ninety one only) in order to meet the difference in the cost in the Phase II procurement of Health Management information System.
- 5. In the Government Order fifth read above, the Government have accorded permission to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to implement the Hospital Management System outpatient workflow in 37 health institutions including 1 Government Dental College under the control of Directorate of Medical Education. The Government also accorded sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.22,58,43,697/- (Rupees twenty two crore fifty eight lakh forty three thousand six hundred and ninety seven only) towards the procurement of Desktop Computers, Dot Matrix Printers, Online UPS, LAN connectivity, computer furniture, Tamil Nadu State Wide Area Network connectivity, Stationery and printer consumables for one year. Sanction was also accorded for incurring expenditure of Rs. Rs.2,28,78,631/- (Rupees two crore twenty eight lakh seventy eight thousand six hundred and thirty one only) towards the cost for Annual Maintenance Contract for the hardware (Desktop Computers, Dot Matrix printers, UPS and LAN connectivity) for a period of 3 years after the initial warranty period of 3 years.
- 6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in his letter 6th read above has stated that the Government have sanctioned a total amount of

Rs.52,23,49,545/- (Rupees fifty two crore twenty three lakh and forty nine thousand five hundred and forty five only) for Health Management Information System in Phase III implementation. The tender value and the revised estimate for the work is calculated to be Rs. 82,59,31,443/- (Rupees eighty two crore fifty nine lakh and thirty one thousand four hundred and forty three only) an additional amount of Rs.30.35 Crore (Rupees thrity crore and thirty five lakh only) is required.  - The demand for additional funding to the tune of Rs.19.97 Crore and the corresponding Comprehensive Annual Maintenance Contract charges of Rs.10.40 Crore after completion of 3 years warranty period are justifiable and probable savings if any shall be taken to Government account.
 - An amount of Rs.19.97 Crore for the project implementation initially and the Comprehensive Annual Maintenance Contract funds Rs.10.40 Crore can be sanctioned at appropriate time i.e during financial year 2017-18 as the expected Comprehensive Annual Maintenance Contract expenditure is envisaged only by September 2017.

Based on the above recommendations of the Sub Committee, the proposal has been reworked by incorporating the suggestions and the reworked proposal was approved by the State Empowered Committee.

Public Health and Preventive Medicine - Condemnation of disposable cold chain related items in the Primary Health Centres, Government Hospitals, Municipal Hospitals / Health Posts, Medical College Hospitals and in the Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine - Orders -Issued.

ORDER:

In the G.O. 1st read above, guidelines were issued for condemnation and disposal of the equipments which are beyond repairable condition in the Government Medical Colleges, Government Hospitals, Taluk/ Non-Taluk Dispensaries, Hospitals and Primary Health Centres. However, the Cold Chain equipments have not been included in the purview of the said Government Order.

2. In the letter 2nd read above, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has stated that considerable numbers of Cold Chain equipments supplied by the Government of India over the years to all the Government Health and Medical Institutions have become worn out beyond repairable condition. These equipments will also have to be condemned and disposed off. The Director, has therefore, submitted the following proposal in consonance with the guidelines issued in the G.O. 1st read above for condemnation of cold chain equipments belonging to the Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. As these equipments have been supplied mainly by the Government of India, proceeds of their condemnation need to be remitted into the Government of India's account as envisaged in the Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Letter No. Y.11030/ 1/ 2004- CC&V, dated: 11.07.2005, the Director has further stated that the guidelines may cover condemnation and disposal of the unserviceable cold chain equipments such as Walk-in-Cooler, Walk-in-Freezer, Cold Room, Ice Lined Refrigerators, Deep Freezers, Voltage Stabilizers, Generators, Cold Boxes, Vaccine Carriers, Day Carriers, Ice Packs and other cold chain related items available in the Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Offices of the Deputy Director of Health Services in Districts, Primary Health Centres, Medical College Hospitals, Government Hospitals, Government Taluk and Non-Taluk Hospitals, Corporations, Municipal Hospitals, Urban Health Posts and Grban Primary Health Centres.

a) State Committee

Condemnation Committee for cold chain equipments available in the Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine may be constituted as below:

1. Joint Director of Public Health

(Immunization)

2. Deputy Director (Administration)

5.Refrigeration Mechanic

-Technical Member

b) <u>District Committee</u>

Condemnation Committee for the cold chain equipments at the District level may be constituted as below:

1. Deputy Director of Health Services - Chairman

2. Assistant Program Manager

Member

3. Administrative Officer

- Member

4. Superintendent (Accounts)

- Member

5. Refrigeration Mechanic

- Technical Member

If the Technical Member in serial no. (5) is not available due to vacancy in a particular district, a Technical Member from any of the neighbouring Districts may be called.

c) Identification of equipment to be condemned

The Technical Member of the committee shall inspect the worn out cold chain equipments of the offices within the jurisdiction of the Committee in which he is the Technical Member and certify the unserviceable cold chain equipments for condemnation.

- d) All the Cold Chain equipments which are certified as unserviceable by the Technical Member shall be stored in the office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine/Deputy Directors of Health Services for necessary disposal by the Joint Directors of Public Health (Immunization)/ Deputy Directors of Health Services respectively.
- e) The Condemnation Committee shall meet as and when necessary and complete the condemnation of all the cold chain items at least once every month.



- t) List of unserviceable items certified by the Technical Member shall be placed before the Condemnation Committee by the Superintendent (Accounts) in case of Districts / Superintendent (Immunization) in case of Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. Chennal for orders.
- g) The Condemnation Committee shall record the reasons for condemnation specifically for each item and members shall sign thereto.
- h) The Condemnation Committees in the Health Unit Districts shall be vested with powers to decide on disposal of the condemned items, the original cost of which do not exceed Rs. 5 lakhs each. For items of value above Rs.5 lakhs, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine shall be vested with powers to decide based on recommendations of the State Condemnation Committee.
- All the Cold Chain equipments to be condemned should be taken to General Disposal Register of the concerned office. The entries in the General Disposal Register should tally with the items condemned and written off in the respective main stock register of the cold chain equipments. The stock in the general disposal register shall be reduced as and when such items are disposed.

- j) Public Auction shall be conducted if the upset price is less than Rs.25,000/- in each auction. The Deputy Director of Health Services in case of Districts / Joint Director of Public Health (Immunization) in case of Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine shall post-approve the auction sale as per G.O. (Ms) No.473, Health and Family Welfare (EAPI-1) Department, dated: 20.09.1996 and G.O. (Ms) No.327, Health and Family Welfare (EAPI-1) Department, dated: 19.12.2011.
- K) Limited Tender System shall be adopted if the value expected to be realised on disposal of the items condemned is less than Rs.10,00,000/- and the Deputy Director of Health Services in case of Districts / Joint Director of Public Health (Immunization) in case of Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine Office can be vested with powers of finalising the limited tender based on highest bid value. In cases where the condemned items are expected to fetch more than Rs.10 lakhs as proceeds, the respective Deputy Director of Health Services in case of Districts / Joint Director of Public Health (Immunization) in case of Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine shall finalize and award the Tender as per the Tamil Nadu Tender Transparency Act, 1996.
- L) Upset price for disposal of the condemned items shall be fixed locally by the District Committee in case of Districts / State Committee in case of Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine.

M) The money received through auction/tender shall be remitted into the Government of India's account under the Head of Account Grant No.900

Receipt Major Head "0211 – Family Welfare – 800-Other Receipt" as indicated in the Letter No. Y.11030/1/2004-CC&V, Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare dated: 11.07.2005.

- 3. As accumulation of old and worn out cold chain equipments are causing hardships in the maintenance and upkeep of cold chain and severe space constraints, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has requested to issue orders for condemnation of all the unserviceable stores and equipments of cold chain belonging to the Primary Health Centres, Government Hospitals, Municipal Hospitals / Health Posts, Medical College Hospitals and in the Office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Chennai 6 following the above mentioned guidelines.
- 4. The Government after examination have decided to accept the proposal of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. 2. In the Government order second read above, the Government revalidated the orders issued in the Government order first read above. Necessary additional fund of Rs. 186.35 lakh was provided towards payment for professional and special services in the Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2007-08.

3. In the Government order third read above, the Government, among others accorded sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs. 474.00 lakh towards payment to M/s Tata Consultancy Services for designing developing and implementing Health Management Information System in hospitals under the control of Director of Medical Education, Office of the Director of Medical Education, along with the



development and implementation of College Management Software for 19 Government Medical Colleges and Tamil Nadu. Dr. MGR Medical University and providing application maintenance for a period of 3 years for the Phase II and Phase III Health Management Information System.

- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the contract for Health Management information System Phase III was signed with M/s Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) on 7 July, 2011 and which expires on 6 July, 2014 and that the procurement of hardware for Health Management Information System Phase it institutions will take some more time to complete since it has been delayed due to retendering, implementation of election model code of conduct, etc. The Project Director has further stated that currently the installation of hardware has been initiated in the Health Management Information System Phase III institutions, that after the installation of hardware, training has to be imparted to the end users, there after the training the hospitals will start using the Health Management Information System application and that if there are any difficulties in the application usage, the services of M/s.Tata Consultancy Services would be required. As the whole procedure need some more time, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to extend the contract signed with M/s. Tata Consultancy Services for a further period from 06.07.2014 to 30.09.2014 at the cost equivalent to one quarter Annual Maintenance Contract payment made as per the existing Health Management Information System Phase III contract.

These contractual Assistants have represented that they have served for more than 4 years in the society with meager contractual pay. Based on their increased work load and

service rendered in the society they have requested for enhancement of their salary on par with the Assistants working in Tamil Nadu Health System Project .

- 2. The Mission Director State Health Society has further stated that in the Government Order second read above sanction has been accorded that the monthly contractual pay for the post of Assistant working in the Tamil Nadu Health System Project fixed at Rs.12,100/- PM with effect from 01.01.2012 and permitted to increase 5% of pay on first June of every year. To avoid variation in to pay of Assistants in various Projects, the Mission Director has recommended for the consolidated pay to the Assistants of State Health Society be increased on par with the Assistants working in the Tamil Nadu Health System Project i.e Rs.12,100/- P.M as on 01.01.2012 with a permission to increase 5% on first June of every year on par with Tamil Nadu Health System Project.

ORDER:

In the letter first read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has requested the Director of Medical Education, to convene a meeting with Deans and Head of the Departments Radiology of Madras Medical College, Stanley Medical College and Kilpauk Medical College, Chennai, Government Royapettah Hospital and officials from Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited, Chennai with regard to the utilization of the 'Robotic Tool for CT guided Tumor ablation & Biopsy' a product of M/s. Perfint, Health Care Private limited, Chennai with the request to offer the remarks as to whether the said product are useful to the beneficiaries of Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme / General Public and also about the preferred method to procure the above products.

2. In the reference third read above, the Director of Medical Education has stated that a meeting was conducted at the Directorate on 11.03.2013 and the opinion was furnished to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project

that the 'Robotic Tool for CT guided Tumor ablation & Biopsy' the product of M/s. Perfint Health Care Pvt. Limited is a useful Robotic Tool biopsy. It will slightly reduce the time of biopsy / case, Even without robotic tool and it can be done manual biopsies. In difficult areas, where multiple angulations are needed it will be very useful than manual positioning it is useful to the beneficiaries of Chief Minster's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme / General Public. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, Chennai has sent the proposed draft specification of the products used for image guided procedures to the Director of Medical Education, to furnish the remarks in consultation with Head of the Departments and Deans of Medical Colleges. Again a meeting was conducted on 07.05.2013 at the Directorate of Medical Education to discuss about the specification for CT & PET CT guided planning and needle positioning system for tumor ablation. After the meeting the draft specifications of the products to be used for image guided procedure has been sent to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project, Chennai.

- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project in his letter dated 12.06.2013 has requested the Directorate of Medical Education to pursue further action in the matter for procurement of products for the Government Medical College Hospitals using Chief Minister's Comprehensive funds as per need. Accordingly, all the Heads of Medical Institutions under the control of the Directorate were requested to forward a detailed proposal for procurement of 'Robotic Tool for CT guided Tumor ablation & Biopsy' for Radiology Department of their Hospitals for taking a final decision.
- 4. The proposals were received from the 12 Deans of Government Medical Colleges as shown in the Annexure to this order.
- 5. The Deans of the said Government Medical Colleges have given detailed justification for the procurement of the proposal and stated that the cost of this system was Rs.90.00 lakhs and the cost approximate of kit used for each procedure was Rs.60,000/- (Radio Frequency ablation kit). Under Chief Minister Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme, the reimbursement for each ablation procedure by the insurance company is approximately Rs.50,000/- and for the post management of the procedure is Rs.18,000/- is chargeable, from the insurance company which will fetch revenue to the Government Hospitals. The funds required for the purchase of this said 'Robotic Tool' will be met out from the funds available under Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme.
- 6. The Director of Medical Education, has further stated that the 'Robotic Tool for CT guided Tumor ablation & Biopsy' is recently installed at Tamil Nadu Multi Super Speciality Hospital at Omandurar Government Estate, Chennai at a cost of Rs.1,10,00,000/-. A beginning has been made in the treatment of a few patients, She has enclosed the purchase order of the same.
- 7. The Director of Medical Education has also stated that all the teaching hospitals requested for this equipment have well established Radiology departments with CT scanners, radiology faculty, Registrars and Postgraduate students who

routinely perform ultrasound guided procedure and a few CT guided procedures. When provided with this equipment, thereby inculcating such training to all radiologists of the Department feasibly and in turn they would be provided to perform complex and therapeutic and CT guided procedures in oncology and pain care. She has also stated that the major use of this equipment is to perform Tumor ablation procedure for Liver, Lung, Kidney, cancer as an effective alternative or where Surgery is not possible. Clinical Publications from various parts of world show that the survival rate of Ablation in liver is very close to surgery, whereas Tumor ablation is a minimally invasive procedure at a significantly lower cost and lower patient down time.

- 8. The Director of Medical Education, has also stated that currently the Medical institutions perform limited of Biopsy procedures mainly liver cases under Ultrasound Scanner and only a very few cases under CT Scanner. With the use of this equipment, Biopsies for all organs like Lung, Kidney, Liver, bone and other complex locations can be very safely performed under CT Scanner. This will enable early diagnosis and treatment of Cancer in these organs. Instead of sending patients from remote locations to where such experts are available, with this equipment the Radiologists can perform these procedures within the reach of patients. As these procedures are listed in the current Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme it will fetch revenue also.
- 9. The Director of Medical Education has further stated that there is no financial commitment for the Government in procurement of the Robotic Tool as the funds are available under Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme and she has therefore requested the Government to accord administrative sanction to procure and install the said 'Robotic Tool for CT guided Tumor ablation and Biopsy' for the Radiology Departments of their respective Medical College Hospitals as shown in the Annexure to this order, through the Tamil Nadu Medical Service Corporation Limited, Chennai utilizing the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme funds.
- 10. The Government, after careful consideration of the proposal of the Director of Medical Education, hereby accord administrative sanction to procure and install the 'Robotic Tool for CT guided Tumor ablation and Biopsy' for the use in the Radiology Departments of the twelve Government Medical College Hospitals as shown in the Annexure to this order at an approximate cost of Rs. 1,10,00,000/-(Rupees one Crore and ten lakhs only) per unit. Accordingly the Director of Medical Education is directed to mobilize the funds available under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme in consultation with Project Project and no additional Staff and additional funds Tamil Nadu Health System (both recurring and non-recurring) will be provided for this proposal and it should be manned by the existing staff available in the respective hospitals in the future also. Tata Consultancy Services for designing, developing and implementing Health Management Information Systems in hospitals under the control of Director of Medical Education, Office of the Director of Medical Education, along with the development and implementation of College Management Software for 19 Government Medical Colleges and Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University and providing application maintenance for a period of 3 years for the Phase I, Phase II and Phase III Health Management Information Systems. In the G.O. fourth read above, sanction has been accorded for implementation of Non-Communicable Diseases Intervention program in all the districts in Tamil Nadu.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported in his letter dated:09.08.2014 that initially when the application was developed, the software stack used was Solaris Operating System, SUN Java web, server, Glassfish application server and PostgreSQL database, when the entire software stack was open source which allowed Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to use it by downloading, free of cost and that Health Management Information Systems being a mission critical activity, the support for the software stack was alone procured, so as to resolve any issue that may arise during the use of the software stack for Health Management Information Systems application. The Project Director has further reported that the firm which provided support for the Solaris, SUN webserver & Glassfish was taken over by a proprietary firm, M/s. Oracle, which had recently informed that they will only support their proprietary software on their hardware and will not continue to support the open source software, that this necessarily will lead to vendor lock-in for both hardware and software components, that the firm also recently announced that it would not commercially support newer versions of Glassfish application server, that during the recent Phase III server tender, the cost quoted was exorbitantly high due to monopoly of the proprietary firm and that hence it was decided to move the Health Management Information Systems to a more openly supported software stack that will attract many bidders. He has also reported that a Committee was constituted under the chairmanship of Managing Director, ELCOT and including members from ELCOT, National Informatic Centre - Tamil Nadu State Data Centre, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, M/s Tata Consultancy Services & M/s Wipro- Tamil Nadu State Data Centre and in the meeting of the Committee held on 23 December, 2013, it was agreed to the proposal of Health Management Information Systems application vendor to migrate a portion of Health Management Information Systems, which includes Management Information System, College Management System and Government Medical College Websites to open source Linux, Tomcat, JBOSS and PostgreSQL, which would give an option to float a tender with technical specifications that will attract more competitive bidders to participate. He has also reported that the migration to a more openly supported software stack was also approved by World Bank and that it was also decided that once the initial MIS/CMS/website migration is stabilized, Hospital Management System will also be migrated to the more openly supported software & hardware stack.

3. The Project Director has also reported that under the existing Health Management Information Systems activities, the Tata Consultancy Services had developed the Non Communicable Diseases online screens which are very

important element for facilitating online data entry and analysis, which are also to be revised, for which payment has to be made to M/S Tata Consultancy Services.

4.The Project Director has also reported that the Health Management Information Systems (HMS/MIS/CMS/website) screens & modules developed under Health Management Information Systems Phase I & Phase III are based on the SRS document approved by, the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The change requests are being frequently submitted by various end users and officials. The change request consuming an effort of less than 3 man-days are covered under the existing contract and that the change request consuming more than 3 man-days are to be considered as an additional requirement and to be covered under a separate contract, for which payment has to be made.

5. For the above purposes, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 01.08.2014 for sanction of an additional amount of Rs. 49,88,784 for the following activities mentioned below:-

- f) The Justifications principally agreed by World Bank for Single Source Selection process for the migration and change management proposal are as follows:
 - i. The Migrating the Management Information System /College Management System / Websites, modification of Non Communicable Diseases screens and management of changes request is a nature continuation of previous software development carried out by the firm
 - Continuity in the technical approach, experience acquired and continued professional liability of the same Consultant is preferable than a new competition as the consultant performance in the previous assignment is satisfactory.
 - 6. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal.
- 7. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and comes under Component III and Sub-component A. The expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.
- 8. The Government after careful consideration of the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, hereby accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.49,88,784.00 (Rupees Forty Nine Lakh Eighty Eight Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Four only) to carry out the activities mentioned at para 5 above, as approved by the State Empowered Committee.

ORDER:

The Government of Tamil Nadu has established Bio Medical Waste Management System in all 270 Secondary Care Government hospitals, 41 Medical College hospitals and hospitals attached to Medical Colleges and 130 upgraded Primary Health Centres in the year 2008. All Health Care Providers in these institutions have been trained in the principles and practice of Bio Medical Waste Management namely segregation of the waste at the source of generation, transportation to the Bio Medical Waste Storage room, collection of waste by the Common Treatment Facility (CTF) operator and end disposal at the Common Treatment Facility. The Government had permitted contracting of 9 private Common Treatment Facility operators to collect the waste at the facility level, transport and dispose them of at their Common Treatment Facility. The contract was facilitated by the Tamil Nadu Medical Service Corporation. Since then the system is in place and is working well. However the Health Care Providers and other workers in the hospitals and PHCs need to be trained and re trained regularly in respect of new entrants and for existing workers respectively. As there is a shortage of free lance trainers for Bio Medical Waste Management, the Government as per the Government Order referred above had permitted Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) to establish Regional Training Centres on Bio Medical Waste Management in 7 Government Medical Colleges and Two Private Medical Colleges .

- 2. In the reference cited, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that so far 41,868 health care providers have been given training on the implementation of Bio Medical Waste Management and that about 25,000 persons are yet to be trained and that now it has been proposed to impart training on Infection Control practices also. For this purpose, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 01.08.2014 for sanction of Rs. 1,18,12,500 (Rupees one crore eighteen lakh twelve thousand and five hundred only) for imparting of training to the health care providers on the practices of Infection Control and Bio Medical Waste Management in Government Hospitals. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal, and accordingly, the Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in his letter third read above has stated that under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, 3740 posts of Staff Nurses on contract basis have been created in the Government Hospitals, Municipal Hospitals and Primary Health Centres.

- 2. In the G.O. first read above, the monthly contract payment of the Staff Nurses was increased from Rs.4000/- to Rs.7000/- for the first year, from Rs.4500/- to Rs.7500/- for the second year and from Rs.5500/- to Rs.8000/- from the third year onwards with effect from 1st April 2012 on par with the pay of the contract Staff Nurses appointed under the National Rural Health Mission.
- 3. In the G.O. second read above, orders have been issued that all the contractual Staff Nurses placed under National Rural Health Mission under various schemes in the State shall be given an entry level contractual pay of Rs.7700 per month from the existing pay of Rs.7000 per month with an annual increase of Rs.500 per month every year till they are regularized in the case of Staff Nurses appointed by Director of Medical and Rural Health Services or till they move out for better opportunities in the case of staff nurses appointed through outsourcing.



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- The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that as the contract Staff Nurses have been recruited from the common seniority list maintained by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, the increase in contract pay of the Staff Nurses appointed under the National Rural Health Mission may lead to disparity among the contractual Staff Nurses working in the same institution within the same department with similar nature of duties. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has requested that all the contractual Staff Nurses appointed under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to work in the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres, Project Hospitals, Non Communicable Diseases Prevention and Treatment Programme in the Government Hospitals and Primary Health Centres, may be allowed an entry level contractual salary of Rs.7,700/-per month with an annual increase of Rs.500/per month every year till they are regularized both in the case of Staff Nurses appointed through the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Medical Recruitment Board till they move out for better opportunities as in the case of Staff Nurses placed through Outsourcing on par with Staff Nurses working under the National Rural Health Mission. The difference between the old contract pay and the enhanced contract pay of 562 Staff Nurses working in the Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres and 746 Staff Nurses sanctioned for the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project Hospitals will be met from the State Government funds. As regard the remaining 2432 Staff Nurses sanctioned under the Non Communicable Diseases Programme, the enhanced contract payment upto 30.09.2014 will be met from the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project funds. For the period beyond 30.09.2014, i.e. closure of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, the expenditure may be met from Government funds.
- 5. The Project Director has therefore requested the Government to issue orders to enhance the monthly contract payment of the contractual Staff Nurses, with effect from the 01.04.2013, from which date the contract pay of the National Rural Health Mission Staff Nurse was ordered to increase in G.O.(Ms)No.312, H&FW Department, dated: 26.12.2013.
- 6. The Government after careful consideration has decided to accept the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and direct that the pay of the Contract Staff Nurses appointed under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project be enhanced from Rs.7000/- to Rs.7700/- per month with an annual increase of Rs.500/- per month with effect from 1st April 2013 every year, on par with the National Rural Health Mission Staff Nurses. The Project Director Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, in the reference cited, has reported that this system has been functioning since April 2005, and that each district has 2-4 Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres, which are reachable within half an hour's travel from habitations and that Project team is regularly collecting the performance report of these hospitals such as complicated Maternal Admissions, Deliveries, Caesareans and Night Caesareans which are continuously increasing every year.

The already functioning 14 Trauma Care Centres established with Government of India's assistance will also be included under this scheme. For the establishment of New Trauma Care Centre, the building and equipment norms have been developed for the Trauma Care Centres, as shown in Annexure II & III to this order. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated as follows:
 - i. Where there is deficiency of building / equipment, in any of the Hospital, they will be provided by the regular allotment of funds under the National Rural Health Mission.



- ii. When ever maintenance and repair works are required in the existing Hospitals such works shall be executed out of Maintenance and Repair funds allotted from the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services.
- iii. The hospitals under the administrative control of Director of Medical Education will get funds from out of Director of Medical Education's Maintenance and Repair expenditure funds.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has furnished the list of staff requirement of 61 various categories for the Trauma Care Centres as shown in Annexure-IV and their skill sets as shown in Annexure-V respectively to this Order. He has also stated that there shall be a minimum of 4 Orthopaedic Surgeons, 2 Anaesthetists, 2 General Surgeons and 4 General MBBS doctors (for Casualty) in each Trauma Care Centre so that round the clock availability of Orthopaedic Surgeon within the Hospital campus is ensured. The General Surgeon and Anaesthetists may be on call duty. The Orthopaedic Surgeons shall perform shift duties in rotation in 3 shifts each day. The Services of other Specialists like Neuro Surgeon, Cardio Thoracic Surgeon, Urologist, etc., can be availed by hiring the services on case to case basis. The fees shall be paid out of the National Rural Health Mission funds for specialist services. The Orthopaedic Surgeons, General Surgeons and Anesthetists required for the Trauma Care Centres shall be redeployed from other smaller hospitals / Primary Health Centres within the district where their services are not optimally utilized.
- 5. The Project Director, Tamil-Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that all Trauma Care Centres shall have a functioning Blood Bank with license and proper staff like trained Doctor, Staff Nurses and Lab Technicians who shall be available as per the staff norms which is shown in Annexure IV to this order.
- 6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that there shall be no referral out patients in the centre except for very major cases involving Neuro Surgery, Major Thoracic Surgery, Cardiac cases, those requiring dialysis etc. However, no patient shall be transferred out for want of Blood or Medicines. It is proposed that the web based Hospital Management System and Health Mänagement Information System will be employed for recording and reporting. Computers supply and LAN Connectivity etc., shall be provided by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) as per the overall plan for the Hospital concerned.
- 7. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has further stated that one Advanced Life Support (ALS) vehicle from 108 Emergency Ambulance Services will be stationed in each Trauma Care Centre to transport the patient requiring referral out to the Medical College Hospitals. The 108 emergency ambulance service functioning in the districts and adjoining places shall work in close coordination with these centers. The Trauma Care Centers will be connected to a proper capacity generator to cater to the whole centre in times of need.
- 8. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the training programmes will be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems

Project and the National Rural Health Mission for improving the skills of the Orthopeadic Surgeons, General Surgeons, Anesthetists and Staff Nurses, etc. A regular training Programme on Trauma Care for Doctors and Staff Nurses will be developed and they will be trained periodically.

- 9. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has further stated that sensitization of the District Level Health Administrators like Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, Deputy Director of Health Services, District Managers of 108 Emergency Ambulance Services, etc., will be carried out at the State level / Regional level on the functioning of Trauma Care Centres. The Hospital Superintendent and Chief Medical Officers of the Primary Health Centres will be sensitized at the district level regarding the availability of Trauma Care Services. The Certifying Teams will also be included in the Sensitization Programme. The funds required for the Sensitization Meetings shall be met out of the National Rural Health Mission funds.
- 10. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Trauma Care Centres shall be certified as fit to be a 24 Hours Comprehensive Emergency Orthopaedic and Trauma Care Centre by a Team of Specialists consisting of one Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery, one Professor of General Surgery and one Professor / Assistant Professor of Anesthesia. They will visit the hospital, inspect the various facilities available in the Trauma Care Centres, Staff available and their skills based on the Certification criteria which as shown in Annexure VI to this order. On satisfactory report of the Certification Team, the Government will grant Certification of the concerned Trauma Care Centres which will be valid for two years. Every two years, the same exercise shall be repeated and recertification shall be done. The expenditure for conveyance of the Certification Team, Resource person fee and other expenditure shall be met out of the National Rural Health Mission funds:-
 - Periodical Reports on performance, Staff and any requirement as per the proforma given in the Annexure-VII to this order shall be submitted online to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and to the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services regularly.
 - The functioning of the 24 Hours Comprehensive Emergency Orthopaedic and Trauma Care Centres will be reviewed periodically either through Video Conferencing or by State level / Regional level review meetings to be conducted by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services. The expenditure towards the meeting shall be met out of the National Rural Health Mission / Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project funds for Review Meetings.
 - The functioning of the 24 Hours Comprehensive Emergency Orthopaedic and Trauma Care Centres will be inspected periodically by the Joint Director of Health Services, Regional Consultants and District Project Management Unit Co-ordinators of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and the State level officers from the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.



- A Display Board shall be kept in front of the hospital depicting 24 Hours Comprehensive Emergency Orthopaedic and Trauma Care Centre in Tamil. The board shall not be lesser than 6 feet X 4 feet size. The board shall be painted in Enamel paint. The expenditure towards the meeting shall be met out of the Patient Welfare Society funds.
- One Nodal Officer each in the Directorate of Medical Education, Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services, National Rural Health Mission and Tamil Nadu Health System Project will be designated to monitor the activities of the Trauma Care Centres in their respective departments. They will report to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project who will be the State Level Implementing Officer.
- 11. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that some hospitals / upgraded Primary Health Centres will be designated as Stabilization Centres to receive the accident victims and to provide adequate resuscitation and stabilize the patients and make them fit for travel. These Stabilization Centres have been selected depending upon the distance from the accident spot to the appropriate hospital.
- 12. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project has stated that the Hospital Superintendents concerned will work out the requirement in terms of building, equipment, staff and consumables on their own and based on the findings of the certifying Teams the total cost involved will be arrived at. The funds be provided out of National Rural Health Mission funds or through Government budget subsequently.
- 13. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested to approve the above proposal and issue suitable orders on the following:
 - (i) To Establish 24 Hours Comprehensive Emergency Orthopaedic and Trauma Care Centres in 59 hospitals, the details of which given under "Annexure I(a) & I(b).
 - (ii) To nominate the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as the Nodal Officer along with Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Director of Medical Education for monitoring this program and to nominate the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as the Nodal Department and also to permit him to proceed to get these centres certified. The expenditure to be incurred for the Certification Team's visit may be met out of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project / National Rural Health Mission funds.
 - (iii) The Sensitization workshops may be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by utilizing Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project / National Rural Health Mission funds
- 14. After careful examination, the Government accept the proposal of Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have ordered,

- i. To Establish 24 Hours Comprehensive Emergency Orthopaedic and Trauma Care Centres in 59 hospitals, the details of which given under Annexure I(a) & I(b) to this order.
- ii. To redeploy the existing posts to the 24 hours Comprehensive Emergency Othopaedic and Care Centres and to use the maintenance funds and Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scehem funds for the establishment of Trauma Care Centre.
- iii. To nominate the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as the Nodal Officer along with Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Director of Medical Education for monitoring this program and to nominate the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as the Nodal Department and also to permit him to proceed to get these centres certified. The expenditure to be incurred for the Certification Team's visit to be met out of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project / National Rural Health Mission funds.
- iv. To conduct Sensitization workshops by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by utilizing Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project / National Rural Health Mission funds
- 15. This orders issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O. No.55845/H-II/2014, dated:16.10.2014.



ORDER:

In the Government order 1st read above, orders have been issued for the constitution of Medical Services Recruitment Board exclusively for Health and Family Welfare Department so as to centralize the mode of direct recruitment to all categories existing in Health and Family Welfare Department except those that are coming under the purview of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. Subsequently in the Government order second read above Rules of Procedures of Medical Services Recruitment Board for recruitment to various categories have been issued.

- 2. The Chairman, Medical Services Recruitment Board (MRB) has sent amendment proposal to the Rule of Procedure to be followed for recruitment based on the Judgement dated 9.6.2014 of the Hon'ble High Court in WA No.1027/2013 and MP No.1/2013.
- 3. The Government have examined in detail the proposal of the Chairman, Medical Services Recruitment Board (MRB) to amend the Rules of Procedure of the Medical Services Recruitment Board, 2013 and has decided to accept it. Accordingly the following amendments are issued to the said Rules:-



AMENDMENTS.

In the said Rules,- (1) for rule 3, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:-

"3. Method of Recruitment.-

The Medical Services Recruitment Board shall adopt the following methods of recruitment, namely:-

(A) Recruitment by open advertisement.

- (i) All Direct recruitment posts in Assistant Surgeon (General), Assistant Surgeon (Dental -General / Speciality) and Nurses shall be made, through open advertisement (in at least two newspapers and one of which must be in vernacular language), by conducting written examination (through physical or electronic mode) duly following the procedures prescribed.
- (ii) All direct recruitments to the post of Assistant Surgeon in various speciality Departments in Tamil Nadu Medical service shall be made through a 'walk-in' selection through open advertisement (in at least two newspapers and one of which must be in vernacular language), based on the marks obtained by the candidates in their Post Graduate Speciality subject. For the post of Assistant Surgeon (Speciality) a person in possession of Post graduate degree shall be preferred over DNB and DNB over a Post Graduate Diploma duly following the procedures prescribed.
- (iii) Para Medical & Technical Staff with following educational qualifications, namely:-. All direct recruitments to the post of Paramedical and technical staff shall be done through a selection process based on open advertisement (in at least two newspapers and one of which must be in vernacular language), along with notifying the vacancies with the Employment Exchange. After obtaining eligible list sponsored by the Employment Exchange, open advertisement in at least two newspapers, (one of which must be in vernacular language) be published inviting application. The list of candidates sponsored by the Employment Exchange be intimated to apply for the concerned post, as per the advertisement, to the Medical Services Recruitment Board. The process of selection shall be based on the marks obtained by the candidates in various examinations by giving weightages to their academic performance (up to two decimals in percentage) as detailed below:

(a) Wherever the basic essential qualification for a technical post is a diploma / certificate, has been changed from SSLC to HSC, in all such cases the weightage may be restricted to marks obtained in SSLC and the technical diploma / certificate (instead of HSC and the technical diploma / certificate).

(b) In cases of lesser number of vacancies for a particular post, and in cases where the notified vacancies are pertaining only to one or few districts only, the notified vacancies may be sent to the District Employment Exchanges concerned instead of the State level Employment Exchange.

(c) In cases where recruitment is to be done on an urgent basis, Government may specifically direct the Medical Services Recruitment Board to conduct recruitment by only way of open advertisement (in at least two newspapers, one of which must be in vernacular language).

iv) Selection process for Driver recruitment through open advertisement.

All direct recruitments to the post of Drivers be done by way of open advertisement from eligible candidates, apart from notifying the vacancies with the Employment After obtaining the list sponsored by the Employment Exchange, open advertisement in at least two newspapers, one of which must be in vernacular language be published inviting application. The list of candidates obtained from Employment Exchange need to be addressed to file an application (online) to the Medical Services Recruitment Board for the post of Driver.

- (1) Qualifications.- No person shall be eligible to appoint to the post, unless he possesses the following qualifications, namely:-
- (a) Educational Qualification, As per Adhoc rules.
- (b) A valid Driving License to drive Transport Vehicles (Heavy Motor Vehicles)
- (c) Nativity Certificate from the Appropriate Revenue Authority.
- (d) Experience of minimum 2 years after obtaining the licence for driving Heavy Motor Vehicles / Transport Vehicles.
- (e) Knowledge in vehicle maintenance / Traffic Rules etc. (Written Test) by physical or electronic mode - (100% weightage for selection)subject to the following:
- (i) Physical Fitness Certificate including Vision Certificate.
- (ii) shall pass the On Road Test Driving (conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Health Transport Department)
- (v) In addition, with the previous sanction of the Government, the Medical Services Recruitment Board can recruit the candidates by any other means as specifically approved by Government in this regard.

(vi) Age Limit:

As furnished in the Special Rules / Adhoc Rules of the post to which the recruitment is made";

- (2) in rule 4, for sub-rule(ii), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:
- "(ii) The Board shall call for the list of suitable candidates for future vacancies through open advertisement or other means approved by the Government, as the case may be. The Medical Services Recruitment Board shall recruit candidates duly following the procedure prescribed in rule 3. Method of Recruitment in this regard, on merit and duly applying rules of reservation and other priorities assigned through specific order of the Government.";
- (3) for rule 5, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:

"5. Collection of particulars from the candidates.-

The Medical Services Recruitment Board shall call for copies of photographs of the candidates and such other particulars as may be required and specified in such form by the Medical Services Recruitment Board as well as the originals of certificates of Educational Qualifications, date of birth and any other certificates / documents of relevance to the recruitment, so as to verify the eligibility / suitability of the candidates. The applications may be called for either by physical or electronic means. The Medical Services Recruitment Board shall cause further verification of documents / certificates, from the competent authorities, if deem necessary."

- (4) for rule 6, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:
- "6. Method of Selection and Seniority of Selected Candidates.-

(A) The Medical Services Recruitment Board shall select candidates who fulfil the

qualification as per the rules / norms governing the post:

- (i) For candidates recruited through open advertisement: The selection of eligible candidates who fulfil the qualification criteria shall be on the basis of rank / marks obtained in the written examination or duly following the procedure of merit approved in this regard, duly applying rules of reservation and other priorities assigned through specific orders of the Government.
- (B) The candidates selected as per sub-rule A (i) above shall be assigned seniority as in the same order of selection.
- (C) In the event of two or more candidates scoring equal marks in the written examination, (or) by any other means of merit the following will be the basis of selection or fixing of senicrity.
- (a) Senior in age shall be placed above:

(b) If the age too, is equal, the following will be the basis of fixing the seniority.
