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ABSTRACT

Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project - Strategic Planning Cell - Collection of Baseline data of utilisation of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals, Social assessment study of users of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services and Collection of baseline data for cervical cancer patients attending tertiary care hospitals - permission accorded - Orders issued.

ORDER:

The Government of Tamil Nadu have designated 62 Government hospitals throughout Tamil Nadu as Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals to provide round the clock Comprehensive Emergency Obstetrics and Newborn Care Services. It is also planned to designate another set of 28 hospitals as Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals in order to fulfill the aim of the Government to provide Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services within one hour reach from anywhere in Tamil Nadu. The statistics being received in respect of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals show a definite improvement in the number of patients attending these hospitals. However, it is essential that these improvements need to be properly documented. Moreover, it is to be evaluated whether the poor people belonging to the lowest income quintile and people belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are utilising the Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services. It is also proposed to collect data about the socio-economic status of the patients utilising Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services.

2. A pilot cervical cancer screening and treatment programme has been launched in two districts in Tamil Nadu. Data collected from these two districts would be useful for scaling up the project in other districts later. Therefore, there is a need to collect baseline data.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to document the utilization of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services by conducting a survey as follows:

- (a) Collection of base line data on utilisation of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services in the 62 Comprehensive

Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals and 4 hospitals in Chennai for the pre Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) period i.e. from 01.04.1999 to 31.03.2005. The collection of baseline data for the proposed 28 hospitals to be designated as Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals in the second batch will be for the period from 01.04.1999 to 31.03.2005.

- (b) To conduct a social assessment study of the users of the Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services in Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals.

In addition to the above studies, the Project Director has proposed to conduct a survey on the utilisation of hospitals by the patients suffering from cervical cancer to serve as a baseline for conducting a pilot on cervical cancer screening and treatment.

4. The Project Director has stated that all the above Studies / Surveys are planned by the Strategic Planning Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and they will be carried out by utilising the services of the departmental personnel under the guidance of expert advisors. She has proposed to conduct the Studies by utilising the services of the Statistical Assistants (SA), District Public Health Nurses (DPHN) non re-designated as District Maternal and Child Health Officer and Block Health Statisticians. For Chennai city, the Statistical Assistants and District Public Health Nurses attached to the Chennai District Family Welfare Bureau will collect the data.

5. In order to train the Statistical Assistants and District Maternal and Child Health Officers for the surveys, the Project Director, has proposed to organize two Workshops. One workshop will be conducted for briefing the Statistical Assistants and District Maternal Child Health Officers about the objectives and conduct of the surveys and to evolve the formats and questionnaires and another Workshop will be conducted after the survey is over to compile all the data and arrive at conclusions. The World Bank interim review mission during November 2005 had agreed for undertaking the above studies. The activity of conducting the Studies and Surveys comes under the Strategic Planning Cell which is included in Project Implementation Plan. All the above Studies and Surveys would be conducted by utilising the services of the Statistical Assistants, District Maternal Child Health Officers and Block Health Statisticians. The investigators will be paid TA/DA as per Government of Tamil Nadu norms only. The non recurrent cost involved in this proposal is Rs. 9.83 lakhs. This expenditure is fully reimbursable by the World Bank.

6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed the above proposals before the State Empowered Committee (SEC) has in turn approved the proposals. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee (SEC), the Government issues the following orders:-

- (i) Sanction is accorded for an expenditure of Rs.9.83 lakhs (Rupees Nine Lakhs and Eighty Three Thousand only) towards Collection of Baseline data of utilisation of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) hospitals, Social assessment study of users of Comprehensive Emergency obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services, Collection of baseline data on cervical cancer, and to conduct two Workshops, one to train the personnel in

undertaking the survey and another Workshop to evaluate the data as detailed in the Annexure to this order.

- (ii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to conduct the above Studies / Surveys and Workshops as per the costing indicated in the Annexure to this order.
- (iii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to reallocate the non-recurring expenditure within the components without exceeding the total cost and no additional provision will be provided at any cost.

7. The non recurrent expenditure of Rs.2.38 lakhs towards conduct of two workshops shall be debited under the head of account "2210 - Medical and Public Health - 01 Urban Health Services (Allopathy) - 200 Other Health Schemes - schemes in the Tenth Five Year Plan - II State Plan - PA Strategic Planning Cell under Health Systems Project - 80 lumpsum provision (DPC 2210 - 01 - 200 PA 8004)"

(ii) The non recurrent expenditure of Rs.7.45 lakhs towards conduct of survey shall be debited under the head of account "2210 - Medical and Public Health - 01 Urban Health Services (Allopathy) - 200 Other Health Schemes - Schemes in the Tenth Five Year Plan - II State Plan - PA Strategic Planning Cell under the Health Systems Project - 99 - Miscellaneous (DPC - 2210 - 01-200 PA - 9905)"

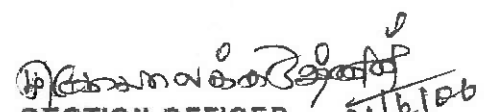

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has now stated that in the proposal approved by State Empowered Committee (SEC), it was proposed to authorize the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, to draw and incur the sanctioned amount in advance. But this is not reflected in the Government Order. She has, therefore, requested to issue necessary orders to authorize the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, to draw and incur the expenditure in advance as approved by the State Empowered Committee (SEC).

The annual recurring expenditure towards contract payment to the Officer (Communication and Field Operations) is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank.

4. ORDER:

One of the major activities of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is to improve the infrastructure facilities in all the secondary care hospitals in the State. It is planned to improve 29 District Head Quarters Hospitals and 241 Sub District Hospitals comprising of Taluk, Non-Taluk hospitals and Women and Children Hospitals in the State. The Project will undertake civil works in all these hospitals in two phases as follows.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that Phase II of the Project starts from July 2006. Since 232 hospitals have to be inspected and sufficient time needs to be given for preparation of drawings, bidding documents etc., it is necessary to start the civil work preparation for Phase II. She has further stated that it is therefore proposed to form a Technical team of Officials consisting of Architects and Engineers from Public Works Department and Project officials to inspect all the hospitals in the 24 districts to select the buildings requiring repair, renovation, replacement and requirement of additional buildings etc. The Architects and Engineers will be deputed by the Chief Engineer (Buildings), Public Works Department. The Technical team will make a detailed inspection and submit the details of the civil works to be taken up in each of the hospital with the justification to the Project Director. The Technical team will also collect information on the buildings which are to be renovated and necessary photographs will also be taken to have a record of the condition of the buildings before renovation. They are all Clinicians working in the wards and are not exposed to management principles till they become Chief Medical Officers. Management of hospitals requires knowledge and competency in managerial and administrative fields. Most of the present heads of hospitals have no training in management sciences and yet are made responsible for management of the health institutions. Since they do not have enough administrative training, very often there are lapses resulting in the failure of hospital systems affecting the medicare to the poor people visiting the Government hospitals for treatment. It also attracts criticism from the public and results in wastage of Government money. Hence, there is an urgent need to train these Doctors and other Senior Doctors who are to occupy administrative positions in general management principles and all aspects of hospital administration

2. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project proposes to improve the administration of all Government Hospitals, especially District and Sub District hospitals under the administrative control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services by imparting hospital administration training to the Hospital Superintendents, Chief Medical Officers and District level Health Administrators on the topics indicated in the Annexure to this order. The activity of imparting hospital administration training to the Medical Officers and Administrative Officers is included in the Project Implementation Plan document approved by the World Bank. The non recurring cost involved in conducting the hospital administration training to the Medical Officers and Administrative Officers is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal for Imparting hospital administration training to Medical Officers and Administrative Officers before the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 4.7.2006, has approved the proposal.

4. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issue the following orders:

(i). Sanction is accorded for a non recurring expenditure of Rs 80.95 lakh (Rupees Eighty lakh and Ninty Five Thousand Only) as indicated below, for conducting the hospital administration training for Superintendents, Resident Medical Officers, Administrative Officers and Chief Medical Officers of the Government Hospitals under the administrative control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and for District Level Officers, namely, Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services and Deputy Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services in the Anna Institute of Management, Chennai-28, as indicated in the Annexure to this order.

The District Project Management Unit (DPMU) is the functional administrative unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in the district. It is headed by the Joint Director of Medical, Rural Health Services and Family Welfare. The District Project Management Unit consists of a District Health Systems Project Officer, an Assistant cum Accountant and a Driver. These posts have been sanctioned in the Government Order 1st read above. The District Project Management Unit has the following duties.

1. Preparation of annual plans and progress reports.
2. Preparation of the monthly progress reports and expenditure statement for submission to the Project Management Unit (PMU).
3. Co-ordinate implementation of the activities among various agencies.
4. Assist the Project Management Unit in local procurement.
5. Facilitate and monitor project interventions including civil works at the district level.
6. Design and implement training plans for the Staff.

The District Project Management Unit is located in the office of the Joint Director of Medical, Rural Health Services and Family Welfare in the district. Most of the interventions under Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project are at the district level. The mobility of the officials at the District Project Management Unit has to be ensured to carry out all the activities efficiently. Moreover, various teams would be visiting the districts for supervision and monitoring of the project activities frequently. The quality teams will be inspecting the hospitals for improvement of quality of care in the hospitals. The district teams need mobility for visiting various hospitals in the district.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the following schemes are being undertaken by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

- a. Establishment of Emergency Ambulance Services in 187 Blocks at the rate of one Ambulance per Block in 5 districts in Phase I viz, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Pudukottai, Kanyakumari and Theni and in 10 districts affected by Tsunami, viz,

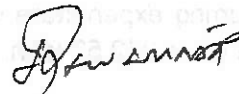

The World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) aims to improve the quality of services in all secondary level hospitals and reduce the maternal and neo natal mortality in the State. About 12,00,000 deliveries take place every year in Tamil Nadu, of which approximately 6,00,000 deliveries are conducted in Government Medical Institutions. Partograph sheet, a printed tabular sheet, is used to record the clinical information of the mother during labour. This Partograph helps the doctor and other paramedical persons in deciding the time and mode of intervention during labour, thereby preventing maternal and neonatal morbidity and mortality.

2. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project proposes to provide Partograph Sheets and supply them to all Government Health Institutions in the State and provide training in Partography to all the Doctors, Staff Nurses and Maternity Assistants working in the Maternity Wards by Specialists in Obstetrics & Gynaecology. This proposal has been included in the Project Implementation Plan approved by the World Bank. The World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP), aims to improve the quality of services in all secondary level hospitals. The need for improving the quality of care in Government Medical Institutions is a priority. One of the interventions in improving the quality of care is to follow Standardised Treatment Regimen for treating the patients. Various Studies conducted reveal a need for developing Standard Treatment Protocols (STPs) for various diseases for which patients seek treatment in Government Hospitals. Even in private hospitals, different doctors offer different regimen of treatment for the same illness. It is planned to develop Standard Treatment Protocols and educate the doctors to streamline the treatment.

2. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to undertake an exercise of preparing Standard Treatment Protocols for common diseases through a participatory approach involving Stakeholders at different levels of health care delivery to improve the quality of treatment. The Standard Treatment Protocols would be developed for both Allopathy and Indian Systems of Medicine. The Standard Treatment Protocol would cover key areas covering (i) Obstetrics and Gynaecology (ii). General Medicine including Paediatrics and other Specialties (iii) Emergency Management Services including Toxicology (iv). General Surgery including Specialties. Administrative sanction was accorded for the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in the Government Order 1st read above. Project Management Unit (PMU) and District Project Management Units (DPMU) have been created in the Government Order 2nd read above for implementation by the said Project at the State and District level. The major activities planned to be undertaken by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project includes improving infrastructure in all the 270 Secondary care hospitals, comprising of 29 District Head Quarters Hospitals and 241 Taluk and Non Taluk hospitals throughout Tamil Nadu, functioning under the administrative control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services. The following activities are proposed under the project:

1. Interventions to bring down maternal and infant mortality;
2. Improving tribal health;
3. Facilitating the use of hospitals by the poor by maintaining Counseling Centres in the hospitals;
4. Large scale health promotion activities;
5. Pilot testing of clinic based non communicable disease control for Cancer Cervix and Cardiovascular diseases;
6. Monitoring and evaluating the performance of the hospitals;
7. Improving the quality of care; and
8. Operationalising health care waste management in all hospitals, etc.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that all the above mentioned activities as well as the administration of the Project are being undertaken by the Project Management Unit headed by the Project Director. The following nine cells functioning in the Project Management Unit assist the Project Director in the implementation of project activities.

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1. Strategic Planning Cell,
2. Equipment Cell,
3. Engineering (Civil Works) Cell,
4. Financial Management Cell,
5. Quality and Systems Improvement Cell,
6. Human Resources Development Cell,
7. Health Promotion Cell,
8. Public Private Partnership Management Cell,
9. Project Management Unit Administrative Cell.

Each Cell is headed by an Officer aided by support Staff. A total of 108 Staff has been sanctioned for the Project Management Unit in the Government Order 2nd read above

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated in the reference 3rd read above that at present, the Project Management Unit is functioning in a few rooms in the DMS office and a temporary building in front of DMS office. This space is not sufficient for the Project office. She has further stated that the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services also needs additional space to accommodate some sections for better co-ordination since this Project mainly deals with the hospitals under his administrative control. Moreover, sufficient space is needed to accommodate the following units which need to function permanently even after the project is completed.

- ✓ Strategic Planning
- ✓ Partnership Management
- ✓ Private Clinical Establishment Act Administration
- ✓ Health Financing Experiments including Health Insurance Options
- ✓ Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques Regulation Act Administration
- ✓ Health Management Information System and Financial Management System Monitoring
- ✓ Quality of Care in Hospitals including Accreditation of Hospitals
- ✓ Evaluation and Assessment of Innovations
- ✓ Personnel Data Bank

4. The Project Director has, therefore, proposed to construct a DMS Annex building within the DMS Campus. The proposed DMS Annex building will house the Project Management Unit with its nine cells and the above mentioned 9 units. The building will also have a big meeting hall for conducting Seminars and Conferences and smaller meeting halls to conduct review meetings, a Library, Computer section and other modern facilities like Videoconference Room etc., for better administration. The Project Director has stated that the invitation for bids, finalisation of tenders, settlement of the contract and execution of the works will be carried out by the Public Works Department by following the World Bank Procurement procedures. Since it is a new office, the Project Director has proposed to provide office equipment and furniture during the year 2007-2008 after the completion of the building. ORDER:

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has planned to pilot screening of Cervical Cancer in two pilot districts for all the women in the age group of 30 - 60 years and orders have been issued in the Government Order 1st read above for piloting screening of Cervical Cancer in the two pilot districts viz., Theni and Thanjavur.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the following additional inputs are required to conduct the piloting successfully.

(i). Provision of Cryotherapy equipment to referral institutions

The treatment protocol for screening for cervical cancer has been developed by the Project Team involving the experts in the field. The treatment protocol was vetted by Tata Memorial Hospital which is one of the premier institutions in Oncology. The protocol has also been cleared by the World Bank. One of the treatment modality is Cryotherapy as per the treatment protocol. In the Government Order 1st read above provision was not made to provide Cryotherapy equipments. Hence, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, proposes to provide Cryotherapy equipments at the rate of two equipments in all the referral institutions in the two pilot districts.

(ii). Provision of Video Colposcopes

It has been proposed to train Gynaecologists from secondary care hospitals in Colposcopy so that their services could be utilised in secondary care hospitals for cases referred from the designated hospitals and Primary Health Centers conducting screening of Cervical Cancer. In the Government Order 1st read above, orders have been issued for procurement of 10 Colposcopes @ Rs.1.00 lakh each to be provided to 5 hospitals @ 2 Colposcopes for each hospital. In addition to the 10 Colposcopes mentioned above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project proposes to procure and provide 2 Nos. of Video Colposcopes to facilitate training of Gynaecologists during the pilot and to provide training when the pilot is scaled up to the entire State.

(iii). Provision of Ring Lens System with Illumination to the Cervical Cancer screening centres

The Institutions where the cervical cancer screening are planned to be carried out would be supplied with "Visual Inspection Acetic Acid / Visual Inspection Lugol's Iodine (VIA/VILI) kits as per the Government Order 1st read above. The Experts in the field recommend provision of a lamp having "Ring Lens System with Illumination" to these Centres for better vision during examination and prevention of false positive cases. Hence the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, proposes to provide a Lamp with Ring Lens System with Illumination to each of the 106 health institutions selected for screening for Cervical Cancer in the pilot districts.

(iv). Training of Village Link Volunteers

In the Government Order 1st read above, provision has been made for utilising the services of Village Link Volunteers to motivate and mobilise women from their households to the health institutions for undergoing screening for Cervical Cancer. The Link Volunteers would be selected by the Non Governmental Organisations who would be hired by the District Project Monitoring Committee. The Link Volunteers would be hired @ 1 per Health Sub Centre area. Approximately, 500 Link Volunteers would be selected. Training to the Link Volunteers is necessary. In the Government Order 1st read above, no provision has been made for sensitising the Link Volunteers. Hence, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, proposes to provide one day Sensitisation Training to the Link Volunteers in the District Head Quarters Hospitals. The training will be provided by Medical Officers, District Public Health Nurses and Community Health Nurses.

(v). Sensitisation of Stakeholders (Self Help Groups, Non Governmental Organisations, Panchayat Raj Institutions Members, Media, Teachers and Women's Associations)

Since the piloting of universal screening of cervical cancer in the pilot districts is a massive programme, it is necessary to create awareness in the community about the pilot. Hence, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, proposes to hold Sensitisation Workshops for Community Link Leaders like Self Help Groups, Non Governmental Organisations, Panchayat Raj Institutions Members, Media, Teachers, Women's Associations etc., to mobilise the community. It is proposed to hold 4 such Workshops in each of the pilot districts.

(vi). Provision of support staff on contract for Cancer Control Unit during the pilot period

A post of Cancer Control Officer to each of the two districts to be filled up by contract appointment has been sanctioned in the Government Order 1st read above. However, no support staff have been provided for in the Government Order. The intensive piloting of cervical cancer screening would be carried out in the pilot districts for a period of 24 months. It is expected that more than six lakh women would be screened during this period. Since a large scale piloting is going to be carried out for the first time in Tamil Nadu, a large amount of data needs to be compiled and analysed during the pilot. Hence, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, proposes to provide support staff to the Cancer Control Units during the pilot period on contract basis. The support staff to be provided to each of the two districts are as follows.

1. Data Entry Operator - 1
2. Statistical Assistant - 1

The above staff would be contracted for a period of 30 months only (3 months preparatory phase + 24 months pilot period + 3 months post pilot evaluation phase).

3. The activity of conducting a pilot on universal screening for cervical cancer has been included in the Project Implementation Plan which has been approved by the World Bank. The expenditure involved in piloting the universal screening for Cervical Cancer is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal for providing additional inputs for conducting the Pilot Project on Cervical Cancer Screening and Treatment in the Pilot Districts viz., Theni and Thanjavur through partnership with Non-Governmental Organisations at a non recurring cost of Rs. 23.07 lakh and recurring cost of Rs. 1.68 lakh before the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee, in its meeting held on 4.7.2006, has approved the proposal.

5. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issue the following orders:

i). Sanction is accorded for a non recurring expenditure of Rs.19.95 lakh (Rupees Nineteen Lakh and Ninty Five Thousand Only) towards cost of 10 Nos. of Cryotherapy units including Nitrous Oxide cylinders, 2 Nos. of Video Colposcopes for training of Gynaecologists and 106 nos. of Focus Lamp with Ring Lens with Illumination to be supplied to the Screening Centres. The equipments shall be provided through the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation by following the World Bank procurement procedures.

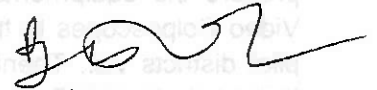

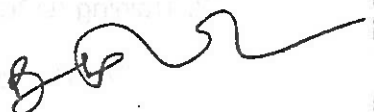

- (viii) Invitation for bids, finalisation of tenders and award of contracts.
- (ix) Actual execution of works.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that since the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had a very long preparatory phase, the initial steps for

civil work for the 35 Phase I hospitals were undertaken by the Project Team with the help of Public Works Department Architects and Engineers. For Phase II buildings, the preparation needs to be started immediately. The preparation requires collection of technical details, location of sites, designing of buildings, preparation of bidding documents, etc. There are 235 hospitals in 24 districts and 3 Phase I districts, which need to be strengthened in Phase II. There are rigid time lines to be followed to complete the above mentioned work on time. A total of 18 Staff have been sanctioned to the Engineering Wing of the Project Management Unit of the Project in the Government Order 1st read above. The Project Director has stated that since Public Works Department is unable to send the required number of Engineers on redeployment, there is only one Executive Engineer working on diversion from the PWD in the Engineering Cell and the Project Management Unit. The Engineering Cell is not adequately staffed to handle preparations for the civil works.

4. The Project Director has stated that this matter was discussed in the second meeting of the State Empowered Committee (SEC) held on 04.07.2006. The State Empowered Committee had suggested to workout the staff requirement for the Engineering Wing and the source from which they could be deputed or contracted. It was also suggested that retired engineers could also be considered for contracting. She has further stated that based on this, a meeting was convened by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, on 17.07.2006 with the Public Works Department officials to workout the staff requirement for the Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit (PMU) to carryout the preparations for civil works in Phase II

5. Based on the above meeting, the Project Director has stated that it is proposed to strengthen the Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit to prepare the architectural designs, estimates, bidding documents and procurement plan, etc, for the Phase II civil works. The procurement of civil works and the execution of works like floating the bids, execution of works, etc, would be carried out by the Public Works Department. It is also proposed to group the 24 districts in Phase II into eight regions and to appoint staff for each of the 8 Regions. The Project Director has stated that the Staff will be engaged up to 31.03.2007 or till the completion of the works, whichever is earlier and they will be located in the office of the Project Management Unit. The Project Director has proposed to restrict the contract payment for the retired officials to the last pay drawn minus pension. Contracting of the Staff for carrying out project activities is an approved activity of the World Bank and this activity is included in the Project Implementation Plan document, approved by the World Bank. The recurring cost involved in the proposal is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank.

6. The Project Director has placed the above proposal for strengthening the Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit before the State Empowered Committee of the Project for approval. The State Empowered Committee in its second meeting held on 4.7.2006, has approved the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

7. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issues the following orders.

i. Sanction is accorded for the formation of an Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit (PMU) and 8 Regional Engineering Wings. Sanction is also accorded for creation of the posts for strengthening the Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit

of the Project and for the 8 Regional Engineering Wings as well as the mode of recruitment of the staff is indicated in Annexure I to this order. The details regarding period of contract, the contract payment, the duties of various teams in the Engineering cell and their place of duty are mentioned in the Annexure II and III to this order respectively.

ii. If the posts sanctioned in para 7 (i) are to be employed on contract basis, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is authorised to employ the Engineers, Architects, etc, indicated in the Annexure I to this order, by advertising in News paper and calling for applications and conducting an interview by following the codal procedures.

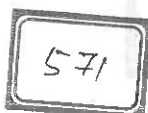
iii. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to enter into contract agreement with the contracted persons in a proper contract agreement form and allot different regions to the persons contracted.

iv. Sanction is also accorded to incur a non recurring expenditure of Rs. 2.00 Lakh (Rupees Two Lakh only) towards advertisement cost and a recurring expenditure of Rs. 99.47 lakh (Rupees Ninety Nine Lakh and Forty Seven thousand only), as detailed below, towards contracting of Engineers and Architects for preparation of the civil works involving preparation of architectural drawings, estimates and bidding documents for civil works to be undertaken in 232 hospitals in 24 districts in Phase II districts and 3 hospitals in Phase I districts as indicated in Annexure IV to this order.

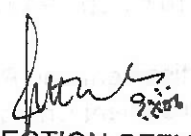

B. Regional Engineering Wings at Project Management Unit

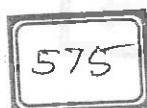
The duties of the eight Regional Engineering Wings located in the Project Management Unit are as follows.

ORDER:

In the Government Order 1st read above, sanction was accorded for creation of Project Management Unit at the State level comprising of 9 Cells with the composition of staff. Sanction was also accorded for creation of District Project Management Unit in each district headed by the Joint Director of Medical, Rural Health Services and Family Welfare with supporting staff in all the 29 revenue districts, except Chennai city, to monitor and implement the district level project activities. It was ordered that various categories of staff shall be appointed on contract basis and also on redeployment basis.

2. In order to carryout the Project activities effectively and also to meet the timelines for the various Project activities, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in the reference 3rd read above, has proposed to convert some of the posts which were ordered to be filled up by redeployment vide reference 2nd read above as contract appointment posts. Since it is difficult to get the staff on redeployment basis and that contract appointment is advantageous since the recruitment can be made immediately and the expenditure incurred towards contract payment to the incumbents is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank, he has proposed that the following posts may be filled up on contract basis:

3. The Project Director has also proposed for creation of 29 posts of Medical Officer on time scale of pay in the grade of Assistant Surgeon / Senior Assistant

Strengthening of secondary care hospitals consisting of 29 district headquarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals coming under the administrative control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is an important activity planned by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Strengthening of these hospitals consists of provision of required additional buildings, equipments and hospital accessories. In many of the hospitals, cots, mattresses, pillows, bedspreads, pillow covers etc., have not been provided for quite some time and many of the cots already available are worn out and require condemnation and replacement. The non-availability of cots, mattresses, etc., in sufficient numbers impacts the holistic service provided by the hospitals to the patients.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that based on the requirement of the hospital items furnished by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, it is proposed to provide hospital cots, mattresses, bedspreads, pillows, pillow covers and blankets to the 29 district headquarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals consisting of taluk hospitals, non taluk hospitals and women and children hospitals to make up the already existing deficiencies and to replace the worn out items at a non recurring cost of Rs. 679.83 lakh.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed the above proposal before the State Empowered Committee and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. 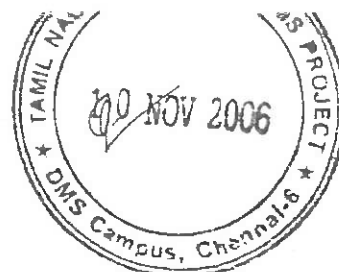

ORDER:

The incidence of Coronary Heart Diseases (CHD), Hypertension and Diabetes is increasing. The modifiable risk factors are high blood pressure, cigarette smoking, elevated serum cholesterol, diabetes, obesity, sedentary habits, stress etc., The accumulated evidence proves that Coronary Heart Diseases are preventable. The World Health Organisation Expert Committee Report on prevention of Coronary Heart Diseases recommends the following strategies to prevent Coronary Heart Diseases.

a. Population Strategy

1. Prevention in whole population
2. Primordial prevention in whole population

b. Secondary Prevention

The population strategy approach is based on the principle that small changes in the risk factor levels in total population can achieve the biggest reduction in mortality.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project plans to take up the issue of health promotion to bring in lifestyle changes in the whole population as means for reduction of risk factors leading to Coronary Heart Diseases. In this regard, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to undertake the following health promotion activities to create awareness to the District level Health Administrators and the community about the risk factors for cardio vascular diseases to bring in life style changes.

1. Advocacy Programme for Health Administrators
2. Awareness creation in the Community
 - a) Observance of World Diabetes Day
 - b) State wide awareness creation in the Community

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The above health promotion activities have been included in the Project Implementation Plan approved by the World Bank. The total non recurring expenditure involved in the proposal is Rs. 15,40,500/-, which is reimbursable by the World Bank.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has circulated the above proposal to the members of the State Empowered Committee and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the following orders are issued:

(i). Sanction is accorded for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs. 3,52,500/- (Rupees Three lakh fifty two thousand and five hundred only), as detailed below, to conduct a Workshop cum Symposium for the district level health administrators like Joint Directors of Health Services, Deputy Directors of Health Services, Deputy Directors of Medical Services, etc., for one day at Chennai to create awareness about Coronary Heart Diseases and Diabetes Mellitus, which have become major health problems and to sensitise these officials on modifiable risk factors and for propagating this message to the community in the respective districts.

The District Health Administrators, Medical Officers, Staff Nurses, Panchayat leaders, Self Help Groups, Private health care providers, Teachers etc., shall be invited to participate in a meeting. There shall be a detailed programme with lectures, plays, songs and video shows on the modifiable risk factors for Cardio Vascular Diseases and Diabetes Mellitus. The media shall be involved and message shall be publicised. There shall be rallies by school and college students and health care providers.

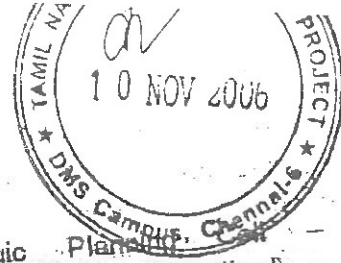

ORDER:

At present, recruitment of Staff Nurses to the Government Medical Institutions on contract basis at a consolidated pay of Rs.2,500/- p.m. is in vogue. Under this present system, the staff nurses appointed on contract basis are absorbed in the regular time scale of pay after serving for a period of 2 years as contract Staff Nurses based on the availability of regular vacancies. The provision of Emergency care and round the clock health services is under implementation in 780 Primary Health Centres with 3 Staff Nurses. 2340 Staff Nurses are employed in these 780 Primary Health Centres and their consolidated pay is met under Reproductive and Child Health Project. Two hundred contract Staff Nurses are employed in the CEMONC hospitals under the control of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and consolidated pay of these 200 Staff Nurses are met from Tamil Nadu Health System Project funds.

2. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services has stated that at present 2636 Contract Staff Nurse are working in various Government Medical Institutions and totally 2540 contract Staff Nurses are working in the Reproductive and Child Health Project and the Tamil Nadu Health System Project.

3. In the Budget for 2006-07, it has been announced that 5260 contract Staff Nurses would be appointed in time scale of pay. Subsequently, while moving the demand No.19, in the floor of the Assembly, Hon'ble Minister (Health) has announced that 2636 contract Staff Nurses working in the Government Medical Institutions would be brought to regular time scale of pay and that the consolidated pay of 2540 Contract Staff Nurses appointed under the Reproductive and Child Health Project and Tamil Nadu Health System Project would be raised from Rs2,500/-p.m.(Rupees Two thousand five hundred only) to Rs.3,500/-

p.m. (Rupees Three thousand five hundred only) in the first year and to Rs.4,000/- (Rupees four thousand only) in the second year and to Rs.5000/-p.m. (Rupees five thousand only) from the third year till they are regularly absorbed in the time scale of pay as per seniority

4. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services has therefore sent proposals to Government to implement the above announcements. He has stated that as on date 393 posts of Staff Nurses in the time scale are available and that 2243 Staff Nurses posts were sanctioned to the Medical Institution/ Hospitals on consolidated pay and therefore he has sent proposals for converting these 2243 contract Staff Nurse posts to the regular time scale of pay of Rs.5000-150-8000 so as to appoint the 2636 contract Staff Nurses in the regular time scale of pay. He has also sent proposals for Government orders to enhance the consolidated pay of Contract Staff Nurses employed under the Reproductive and Child Health Project and Tamil Nadu Health System Project from Rs.2,500/- (Rupees Two thousand five hundred only) to Rs.3,500/- p.m. (Rupees Three thousand five hundred only) in the first year and for Rs.4000/- (Rupees four thousand only) in the second year and for Rs.5,000/- p.m. (Rupees five thousand only) from the third year till they are regularly absorbed as per seniority.

b. The Government have carefully examined the proposals of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and they issue the following orders.

- (i) Government accord sanction to convert 2243 posts of Staff Nurses already sanctioned on various Government Orders as mentioned in the Annexure to the order on consolidated pay of Rs.2500/-p.m into time scale of pay of Rs.5000-150-8000
- (ii) Government also accord to bring the 2636 contract staff Nurses already working in the hospitals/Primary Health Centres including the 393 contract Staff Nurses (already working in the time scale posts as indicated in the annexure to the order on consolidated pay of Rs.2500/-p.m) to the time scale of pay of Rs.5000-150-8000 as per their service with effect from 1.9.2006.
- (iii) The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is permitted to appoint 2636 contract Staff Nurses working in the medical Institute/ Hospitals/ Primary Health Centres on consolidated pay of Rs.2500/- to regular time scale of pay of Rs.5000-150-8000 as per their seniority at an estimated cost of Rs.26.05 crore per annum with effect from 1.9.2006 by relaxing the condition that they should work for 2 years on contract basis on consolidated pay before regular appoint as Staff Nurses.
- (iv) The Government enhance the consolidated pay of 2540 Staff Nurses appointed on contract basis under Reproductive and Child Health Project and Tamil Nadu Health System Project from Rs.2,500/- p.m. (Rupees Two thousand five hundred only) to Rs.3,500/-p.m (Rupees Three thousand five hundred only) in the first year. They will be paid Rs.4,000/- (Rupees four thousand only) from the second year and Rs.5,000/- (Rupees five thousand only) from the third year till they are regularly absorbed as per seniority in the time scale of pay with an additional expenditure of Rs.3.37 crores per annum. The above benefits are with effect from 1.9.2006.

ORDER:

In the Government order 2nd read above, an Engineering Cell was sanctioned to the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The functions of the Engineering Cell include finalisation of Plans and Estimates for all civil works and inspection of the execution of all the civil works under the project.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that it has been proposed to take up civil works in 29 district headquarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals at a cost of about Rs. 212 crore, involving large scale repairs, renovations and construction of new buildings in the existing hospital buildings. The Project Director has stated that the services of a senior officer are required to professionally advise the Project Director on all the civil works and also for supervision of on going civil works, so as to complete the civil works early and to request for additional funds from the World Bank for further works. He has, therefore, proposed that Dr. V. Sukumar who has worked as Chief Engineer in the Public Works Department and retired on 31.01.2006 on superannuation may be appointed as Adviser (Civil Works) in the Engineering Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested orders of the Government on the proposal.

3 Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee, the Government issues the following orders

(i) Sanction is accorded for creation of a post of Adviser (Civil Works), on contract basis in the Engineering Cell of the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to provide professional advice to the Project Director on civil works and to supervise the functioning of the Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit and all the on-going civil works. The qualification for the post shall be a basic Civil Engineering Degree with more than 25 years of service in the field of civil construction and knowledge about Government procedures.

(ii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to utilise the services of Dr. V. Sukumar, Chief Engineer, (Retired), Public Works Department, as Adviser (Civil works) in the Engineering Cell in the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, on contract basis, for a period of 3 years with effect from the date of his taking charge or till his services are required, whichever is earlier, in the post created in paragraph 3 (i) above.

(iii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to make the following contract payment and other facilities to Dr. V. Sukumar.

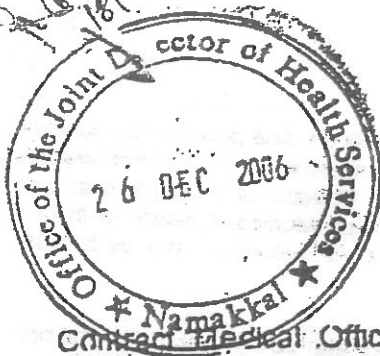

In the Government Order first read above, orders were issued for the creation of 186 posts of Medical Officers in the 93 upgraded Primary Health Centres on contract basis on consolidated pay of Rs.8,000/- at the rate of 2 posts for each upgraded Primary Health Centre.

2. In the Government Order second read above, orders were issued, pending selection of candidates by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, to recruit 2322 Assistant Surgeons in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service to be filled up on contract basis by calling for candidates from Employment Exchange for a period of 6 months or till the candidate selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission join duty on a consolidated pay as indicated below:-

- 1) Doctors with MBBS qualification - Rs. 8,000/- p.m.
- 2) Doctors with MBBS and Post Graduate diploma qualification - Rs. 9,000/- p.m.
- 3) Doctors with MBBS and Post Graduate degree qualification - Rs.10,000/- p.m.

3. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has stated that as on date against 186 posts of Contract Medical Officers sanctioned to the 93 upgraded Primary Health Centres, 153 Contract Medical Officers are in position and the remaining 33 posts are vacant. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has, therefore, stated that the 186 posts of Contract Medical Officers to the 93 upgraded Primary Health Centres.

3. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has stated that as on date against 186 posts of Contract Medical Officers sanctioned to the 93 upgraded Primary Health Centres, 153 Contract Medical Officers are in position and the remaining 33 posts are vacant. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has, therefore, stated that the 186 posts of Contract Medical Officers to the 93 upgraded Primary Health Centres sanctioned on a consolidated pay of Rs.8,000/- p.m. may be brought into time scale of pay of Rs.8000-275-13500.

4. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has also stated that as against the permission accorded for filling up 2322 Contract Medical Consultants in the vacancies available, only 1575 Contract Medical Consultants were in position as on May 2006. Even among these Contract Medical Consultants, some of them have been selected by Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission and they were given necessary appointment as Assistant Surgeon in the time scale of pay. The remaining 1352 doctors who are working as Contract Medical Consultants have to be absorbed in the time scale of pay. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has, therefore, requested the Government to consider the need for bringing the Contract Medical Officers / Contract Medical Consultants into time scale of pay of Rs.8000-325-13500 in order to make them to discharge their duties with more dedication and commitment in serving the vulnerable rural sections of the society.

5. Apart from the Contract Medical Consultants there are about 30 Medical Officers who are working in Tamil Nadu Medical Service on temporary basis on time scale of pay without being selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission for regular appointment in the Special Qualifying Examination held earlier.

6. The Government have examined the above proposals and direct that the 153 Contract Medical Officers and 1352 Contract Medical Consultants who were appointed on consolidated pay of Rs.8000/- p.m. be appointed temporarily as Assistant Surgeon in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service in the time scale of pay of Rs.8000-275-13500 with other allowances admissible to the post as per the rules and orders in force with effect from 1.11.2006 in relaxation of rule 10(a)(i) of the General Rules for the Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services and they will be allowed to continue in service pending passing of Special Qualifying Examination to be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. The Government also direct that about 30 temporary Assistant Surgeons who are working in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service on time scale of pay without being selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission for regular appointment in the Special Qualifying Examination conducted earlier are instructed to appear for the Special Qualifying Examination to be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission.

7. The Government also direct that their seniority shall be fixed by the merit list drawn by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission in the Special Qualifying Examination to be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission under rule 35(a) of the General Rules for the Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services.

ORDER:

In India 12.5 % of deaths are due to Coronary Artery Disease (CAD), 5% to Stroke, 3 % to Rheumatic Heart Diseases and 5 % to other Cardio Vascular Diseases. Thus, totally 24 percent of deaths are attributed to cardio vascular diseases. Disability adjusted life years (DALY) lost by cardio vascular diseases are 8 %. This is likely to increase rapidly in the next decade and 30 to 40 % of deaths may be attributed to cardio vascular diseases by the year 2010. The disease runs a virulent course leading to repeated hospitalisations and early deaths. The annual cost of drugs and hospitalisations would run to several crores of rupees. The cost of much more sophisticated treatments like Angioplasty and Bypass Surgery, etc, would be extremely high. Coronary heart disease, therefore, could be prevented to a great extent by focusing on modifiable risk factors. This approach is based on the principle that small changes in the risk factor levels in total population can achieve a large reduction in mortality. The aim should be to mobilise and involve the whole community to alter its life style practices that are associated with Coronary heart disease. The Specific interventions, therefore, could be at two levels viz., Primary Prevention and Secondary Prevention.

2. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has, therefore, proposed to undertake a pilot project on clinic and community based programme for primary and secondary prevention of Cardio Vascular Diseases, mainly, Coronary Artery Disease (CAD) including Hypertension and Diabetes Mellitus in Virudhunagar and Sivaganga districts at a total non recurring expenditure of Rs. 97.54 lakh and a recurring expenditure of Rs. 128.12 lakh. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed the above proposal before the State Empowered Committee (SEC) and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has requested orders of the Government on the proposal.

3. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the following orders are issued.

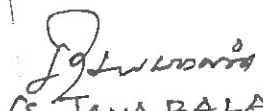

ORDER:

The World Bank funded Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) aims to strengthen all the secondary level hospitals in the State. For better planning, the Project has to (i) identify interventions requiring more support, (ii) study the health status and health seeking behavior of the community, (iii) identify institutions, which need strengthening, (iv) identify catchment areas of the institutions, (v) establish linkage with NGOs / Private hospitals and (vi) monitoring. Digital Mapping can play an important role in helping administrators identify gaps in the infrastructure for better planning and optimum utilisation of resources. Geographical Information System (GIS) based mapping exercise can help to generate important reports for better supervision and monitoring in real time. An exercise of this nature was already taken up under the erstwhile DANIDA Project, where mapping has been completed in six districts in Tamil Nadu. This exercise has given valuable insights for better understanding of available resources. The Project now has information about the location of the private health care providers, places where maternal and infant deaths have occurred, areas from where people are accessing Government health services, locations where trauma care services are needed, etc. The digitised maps up to the block level are available with the Tamil Nadu Water and Drainage (TWAD) Board.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has therefore proposed to undertake a Geographical Information System (GIS) based mapping exercise for the entire health infrastructure i.e. for mapping of the infrastructure and services up to Primary Health Centre level inclusive of health facilities outside the Governmental sector in all the districts in Tamil Nadu. The data on health infrastructure would be collected in-house by the department by utilising the services of the departmental staff. The data will also be collected on maternal and neo natal care centres throughout Tamil Nadu. The mapping exercise would be undertaken by selecting a Firm, which has expertise in GIS based data development by using Global Positioning System (GPS) mapping already available with the Education department. The Consultant Firm is expected to under take the following activities.

- a) Preparation of health infrastructure maps including maternal and neonatal care centres in Tamil Nadu
- b) Development of GIS based Health Information System (HIS) on a Global Positioning System (GPS) platform
- c) Imparting training to Health Information System users.
- d) Providing handholding Warranty and Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) services

The selection of the Firm will be done by following Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method of the World Bank procurement procedure. The activity of mapping of health facilities in the State is included in the Project Implementation Plan of the Project, which has been approved by the World Bank. The non recurring expenditure involved in this proposal is Rs. 21.70 lakh, which is reimbursable by the World Bank.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has circulated the above proposal to the members of State Empowered Committee and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. ORDER:

Increasing access and utilisation of health services by the poor and disadvantaged is one of the major components of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. It is planned by the Project to improve the tribal health through various interventions directed at the community, primary health care level and secondary health care level. A Tribal Development Plan (TDP) has been developed by the Project, which includes a broad range of interventions to address the issues identified and to provide quality health care to the tribal population in Tamil Nadu. One important aspect of the Tribal Development Plan is that many of the already existing programmes intended to increase access of health services to the tribal people will be integrated and appropriately strengthened so as to ensure convergence. This includes the tribal component of Reproductive and Child Health Project, the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP) and other ongoing Government Welfare Schemes. The Tribal Development Plan will extensively support Non-Governmental Organisation participation in health care delivery to the tribal population in the State. The interventions have been planned keeping in mind the following constraints to access / utilise health care services by the tribals.

- (a) Inadequate financial resources.
- (b) Poor or incorrect knowledge dictating inadequate health seeking behaviour.
- (c) Manpower at health facilities either not available or available only for a very brief period.
- (d) Inadequate data base on the tribal population. Poor information base for disease burden / health care utilisation of the tribal population.
- (e) Special problems such as sickle cell anaemia, tuberculosis, etc.
- (f) Remoteness of many tribal villages from the nearest Primary Health Centre / Government hospital.
- (g) Need for appropriate medical assistance to deal with inaccessibility of residential areas.

(h) Malnutrition.

(i) Inadequate accountability and monitoring of health care delivery to tribal population.

(j) Lack of special attention to tribal people in health care institutions in view of their beliefs and inhibitions.

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is already implementing mobile outreach health services in tribal areas through partnership with Non Governmental Organisations in 12 areas in 10 districts in Tamil Nadu. The Project has also instituted a Study on the burden of diseases, exclusively affecting the tribal population in Tamil Nadu through a Consultant Firm.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to develop the tribal health under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project at a total non recurring expenditure of Rs. 6.50 lakh and a recurring expenditure of Rs. 114.50 lakh. 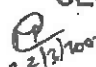

Order:

In order to avoid delays and to bring objectivity and transparency, the Government have reviewed the existing provisions for fixation of ratio for sponsoring of candidates to employers, from the Employment Exchanges.

2. In supersession of the Government Orders read above and all other orders and instructions issued on the subject, the Government, after careful consideration issue orders as follows:-

(i) for filling up of any vacancy in any employment in Government Departments, Local Bodies (Urban and Rural), Co-operative institutions, Public Sector Undertakings, all Government aided Educational Institutions and Government aided Engineering Colleges and Polytechnics etc., Employment Exchanges shall sponsor candidates to the employers in the ratio of 1:1 (one : one) as per seniority of registrants, who are in the live register;

(ii) for all other private organizations and institutions etc., for filling up of vacancies through Employment Exchanges, which needs selection as per merit, the Employment Exchanges shall sponsor candidates to the employers in the ratio of 1:15 (one : fifteen) from the registrants who are in the live register.

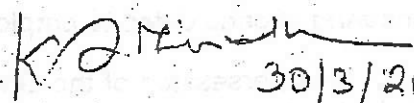
