ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Government is determined to reduce the maternal mortality rate and infant mortality rate in Tamil Nadu and has initiated several steps to achieve this objective. One such step is the designation of 66 hospitals throughout the state as CEmONC Centers to provide round the clock, Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) services. This is a guaranteed service where a pregnant woman at the time of delivery can confidently go to these centers and safely deliver or undergo caesarean surgery, if required, without being referred to another institution. This system has been functioning since April 2005. The Government had also designated a second batch of CEmONC Centres in 32 hospitals as a Phase II activity. Hence, there is a total of 98 Government Hospitals in the State that have been designated as CEmONC Centers. Each district has 2 – 3 CEmONC Centres, which are reachable within one hour's travel from the residence.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has further stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has taken up strengthening of these CEmONC Centres with additional buildings for maternity wards, operation theatres etc., Through the Project, 400 Specialist Doctors and 400 Nurses are being appointed to provide round the clock services. Necessary equipment has also been provided to these hospitals. The Project Team had conducted a base line survey and social status of beneficiaries for the CEmONC hospitals during Phase I of the Project. The project team is regularly collecting the performance report of these hospitals every month and is monitoring the activities. As the phase II CEmONC hospitals have also begun offering

round the clock CEmONC services, training activities need to be taken up to improve the quality of services being rendered in these hospitals.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that it is proposed to train Obstetrician and Gynaecology Specialists, Paediatric Physicians, Nurses, Auxiliary Nurse and Midwives (ANM) and Maternity Assistants working in the CEmONC hospitals and Sub district hospitals such as Taluk and Non Taluk hospitals in order to strengthen the 24 hours Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New born Care services as detailed below.

(i) Training of health care providers on CEmONC services

The Government had sanctioned 400 posts of Specialist Doctor and 400 posts of Nurse to work in the CEmONC Centres. In most hospitals, they have been appointed. Now, it is necessary to train these personnel in safe labour room procedures and neonatal resuscitation.

(ii) Training institutions

- The training for doctors will be conducted in the nearby Medical College Hospitals.
- The Nurses will be trained in the Medical College Hospitals or in the District Head Quarters Hospitals.
- The Auxiliary Nurse and Midwives and Maternity Assistants will be trained in the District Head Quarters Hospitals.

Training modules

The training module shall be developed by the Specialists and Project Management Unit Team of the Project.

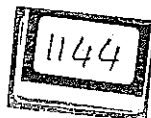

(iii) Training load

The Government have already sanctioned training of 820 nurses working in CEmONC hospitals on labour ward practices and other CEmONC services. Now it is proposed to train the doctors working in CEmONC hospitals and first referral units, namely, the Taluk and Non-taluk hospitals. It is also proposed to train the Nurses, Auxiliary Nurse and Midwives (ANM) and Maternity Assistants working in the district, taluk and non-taluk hospitals.

(iv) Training batches

a) Obstetrician and Gynaecology Specialists - 5 per batch for a total of 32 batches.

b) Pediatric Physicians - 5 per batch for a total of 32 batches

c) Nurses - 6 per batch for a total of 24 batches

d) ANMs and Maternity Assistants 5 per batch for a total of 104 batches

4. The activity of clinical skill development for Doctors, Nurses, ANMs and Maternity Assistants working in CEmONC hospitals and other Taluk and Non Taluk hospitals is included in the Component I, Sub component 1 in the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) document approved by the World Bank. The non-recurring expenditure involved in the proposal is Rs.52.908 lakh, which is reimbursable by the World Bank.

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project has placed the above proposal before the members of the State Empowered Committee and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the orders of the Government in the matter.

6. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the following orders are issued.

(i) Sanction is accorded for Rs. 52,90,800/- (Rupees Fifty two lakh ninety thousand and eight hundred only) towards clinical skill development for Doctors, Nurses, ANMs and Maternity Assistants working in CEmONC hospitals and other Taluk and Non Taluk hospitals as indicated in the Annexure to this order.

(ii) The expenditure sanctioned in para 6(i) above shall be debited to the head of account: 2211 - 00 - Family Welfare - 103. Maternity and Child Health - Schemes in the Eleventh Five Year Plan - II. State Plan - PA. New Initiatives on Infant, Child and Mother Morbidity and Mortality - 72. Training - (DPC 2211-00-103 PA 7207)

(iii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to draw the amount of Rs. 52.908 lakh (Rupees Fifty two lakh and nine hundred and eight



thousand only) in advance towards imparting clinical skill development for Doctors, Nurses, ANMs and Maternity Assistants working in the CEmONC hospitals and other Taluk and Non taluk hospitals and adjust the amount after the above activities are conducted without adhering to the time limit stipulated for drawl of advances from the Treasury.

(iv) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to reallocate the non recurring expenditure within the components without exceeding the total amount sanctioned.

7. Necessary additional funds of Rs. **52.91** lakh (Rupees Fifty two lakh and ninety one thousand only) will be provided in Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2007 - 08. Pending provision of such funds, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is authorized to incur the expenditure. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is also requested to include this expenditure while sending proposals for Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2007 - 08 to Government in Finance department without fail.

This order issues with the concurrence of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O.Ms.No.28 Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 28.02.2005 and Finance Department vide its U.O.No. 45 / HI / 08 dated 21.1.08 and Additional Sanction Ledger No. 1682 (One thousand six hundred and eighty two).

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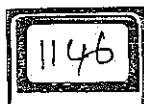

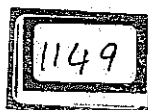

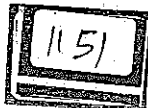

ORDER:

Upgradation of the infrastructure of secondary care hospitals consisting of 29 district head quarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals under the administrative control of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is a core area of activity planned by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The programme consist of provision of additional buildings, equipments, hospital accessories, furniture and staff.

2. In order to assess the existing infrastructure situation at all the above 270 health facilities, a detailed facility and equipment survey of health facilities and their performance was conducted by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The findings of the survey disclosed that most hospital buildings needed repair and renovation and many hospitals required additional buildings, internal renovation will include structural repairs, repairs of seepage and water proofing, providing proper flooring, painting of walls, refurbishing of toilets, internal electricity and water supply system etc. The external repairs will include refurbishing and providing external electricity supply system, external water supply, sewerage system, surface drainage, repairs to campus roads, boundary walls, gates, landscaping etc. The Civil works at the project facilities will also include installing storage and disposal facilities for the waste management system and also those required to ensure safe water and properly functioning sewerage systems. Each hospital was inspected by a team of officials consisting of Senior Doctors, Engineers and Architects. The team had gone into the performance of hospitals and held detailed discussions with the health care providers of these hospitals. The civil works required were identified and listed. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project team had carefully analyzed the proposals and finalized the works to be undertaken.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to strengthen the infrastructure of the following 15 secondary care hospitals in Phase II



15th Batch of the Project by undertaking civil works to provide hospital equipments, furniture and staff for the proposed buildings.

- (viii) Government Hospital, Marakanam, Villupuram District
- (ix) Government Hospital, Ambasamudram, Tirunelveli District

- (xii) Government Hospital, Kalankudiyeruppu, Thoothukudi District

The details of approximate cost for the proposed civil works, hospital equipments, furniture and staff for the above mentioned 15 hospitals are given below.

Civil Works	- Rs.2008.76 lakh

Staff	- Rs.188.79 lakh

The temporary staff are to be appointed for a period of 2 years under 10 (a) (i) of Tamil Nadu Subordinate Service Rules and shall be provided time scale of pay admissible for the post or during the life of the project whichever is earlier. The staff will be recruited during the year 2008-2009 by the recruiting authorities concerned to be in position at the time of completion of civil works. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and the above expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has circulated the above proposal to the members of the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee has approved the above proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has requested the Government to issue orders in this matter and also to provide Rs.2295.76 lakh towards non recurring expenditure and Rs.188.79 lakh towards recurring expenditure in the Final Modified Appropriation for 2007-08.

5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, sanction is accorded for a non recurring expenditure of Rs.2008.76 lakh (Rupees Twenty crore

eight lakh and seventy six thousand only) towards civil works of the 15 secondary care hospital as mentioned in the Annexure I to this order and Rs.287.00 lakh (Rupees Two crore eighty seven lakh only) towards procurement of equipment, goods and hospital accessories Rs.285.00 lakh (Rupees two crore eight five lakh only) for procurement of Equipment and Rs.2.00 lakh (Rupees Two lakh only) towards the advertisement as mentioned in the annexure II to this order and a recurring expenditure of Rs.188.79 lakh (Rupees One crore eighty eight lakh and seventy nine thousand only) towards salary for the temporary additional staff to be employed for the secondary care Government Hospitals as mentioned in the Annexure III to this order.

6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited to the following heads of account:

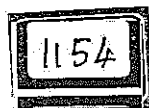
7. The Government also issue the following orders:

(i) The Chief Engineer (Buildings), Public Works Department is permitted to construct the civil works for the 15 secondary care hospitals as sanctioned in para 5 above. The invitation for bids shall be floated and the bid finalized by the Public Works Department by following the appropriate World Bank Procurement Procedures as approved in the Procurement Plan. The works shall be executed by the Public Works Department by following the normal Public Works Department procedures. The Letter of Credit System in vogue in the Public Works department shall be followed. The Chief Engineer (Buildings), Public Works department and his officials at the regional level shall send the monthly Statement of Expenditure (SOE) and the progress report to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as per the requirement of the World Bank for submitting the reimbursement claims.

(ii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to procure the equipments, goods and Furniture through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation by following the World Bank procurement procedures. The amount of Rs.287.00/- lakh (Rupees two crore eighty seven lakh only) sanctioned in para 5 above towards equipments, goods and furniture shall not be paid in cash but credited to the deposit head of account.

"K deposits and Advances – (b) deposits not bearing interest – 8443 – 00 – civil deposits – 800- other deposits – CE. Deposits of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited (DPC 8443 00 800 CE 000H. Receipts) by a crossed cheque in favour of the Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation towards procurement of hospital equipments, goods, hospital accessories and furniture as per list and specifications to be provided by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by following World Bank Procurement Procedures and supply of the above stores as per the list to be provided by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to the Chief Medical Officers/Hospital Superintendents of the project hospitals and to settle the account with the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Ltd. is requested to send progress report of utilisation of funds periodically to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project.

(iii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to recruit the temporary staff during the year 2008-2009 as proposed in the time scale of pay under Rule 10(a)(i) of Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Service Rules for the proposed new buildings. The Medical Officers shall be recruited by calling for list from employment exchange, through a committee headed by the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and the Director of Medical Education being the members of the Committee. The appointment order shall be issued by the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and the posting order shall be issued by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services.



(iv) The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is permitted to recruit the Nurses from the seniority list maintained by him.

(v) The Joint Director of Health Services of the concerned Districts are permitted to recruit the Pharmacists, Lab Technicians, by getting the list of candidates from the Employment Exchange.

(vi) The Chief Medical Officers of the concerned hospitals are permitted to hire the Hospital Workers, Sanitary Workers and cooks sanctioned in their hospitals on daily wages based on the rates to be fixed by the District Collector.

(vii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to make the monthly payment for the above staff through the appropriate District level / Hospital level authorities as per the scale of pay as proposed.

8. Necessary additional funds of Rs.2008.76. lakh (Rupees twenty crore eight lakh and seventy six thousand only) towards civil works, as mentioned in Annexure I to this order will be provided in Revised Estimate/Final Modified appropriation 2007-2008. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to incur the above mentioned non recurring expenditure, pending provision of funds in Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation 2007-2008. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is requested to include the above expenditure while sending Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation 2007 –2008 proposals to Government in Finance Department without fail. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is requested to send necessary proposal to Finance department for specific inclusion of the above expenditure in the supplementary estimates for 2007 – 2008 at an appropriate time.

9. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to modify the non-recurring expenditure with in the components without exceeding the total cost.

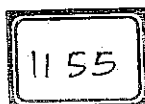



ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government sanctioned, among others, the establishment of a Health Promotion Cell in the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, to oversee the implementation of the Behavior Change Communication activities planned in the Project. One post of Officer (Communication and Field Operations) has been created in the cell, to be appointed on contract basis. In the Government order second read above, qualifications for appointment to the post were prescribed.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that a News paper advertisement was issued calling for applications to fill up the post from open market and that 5 persons attended the interview conducted by a Selection Committee, but the Selection Committee observed that the candidates who attended the interview did not have the required ability to hold the post. The Selection Committee observed that as the contract payment for the post was only Rs.12,000 per month, candidates with good qualification and experience have not applied for the post. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has sent a proposal for enhancement of the contract pay. Accordingly, in the Government order third read above, the contract payment for the post has been increased from Rs.12,000 to Rs. 20,000 per month.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that after issue of advertisement in News papers, an interview was conducted on 10.10.2006, that the Selection Committee observed that no candidate attended the interview was found fit to hold the post and that the post has not yet been filled up. The Project Director has further stated that in the 2 interviews conducted for the post, it has been observed that since persons with the qualification of Degree / Diploma in Mass Communication, as prescribed by the Government, are already working in well paid secured positions, it has not been possible to identify talented young persons for the post. He has therefore proposed that instead of the prescribed

qualification of Degree / Diploma in Mass Communication, any Masters Degree with adequate experience for a period of over two years in health related aspects may be prescribed so as to retain a talented person.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has circulated the above proposal to the members of the State Empowered Committee and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders.

5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, in partial modification of the orders issued in the Government order second read above, the Government direct that for appointment to the post of Officer (Communication and Field Operations), the following qualification be prescribed.

"Master's Degree/ P.G. Diploma in Journalism or M.A / P.G. Diploma in social work with two years experience in health related promotion campaigns or projects or field activities in the social sector."

6. This order issues with the concurrence of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. (Ms). No.28, Health and Family Welfare, dated 28.02.2005.

ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Government of Tamil Nadu is committed to improving the Quality of Care in Secondary care hospitals and in all other medical institutions under its control. Predominantly, the poor are accessing medical services in the primary, secondary and tertiary sector and are helped in reducing morbidity, mortality and disability levels in the State. In order to ensure that the facilities available in the Government Health Care Institutions are maintained at a satisfactory level. Budgeted funds are made available every year for staff, equipment, civil works and other infrastructural support. However, considering the public demand in these facilities much requires to be done to maintain services and quality of care at a high level. Public Private Partnership and involvement is necessary to harness public minded individuals and institutions in upgrading the quality of care in primary, secondary and tertiary care facilities. On several occasions, big and small corporates have evinced keen interest in provision of infrastructure – both civil and otherwise and sometimes in maintenance aspects as well.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has now stated that the following proposal on the above project have been placed to State Empowered Committee.

A. Scope of involvement:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to ensure a concrete arrangement at the health care facility level to enable public private partnership and involvement in upgrading and maintenance of facilities at the institution itself (i.e. at the PHC / Government Hospital level). By authorizing the Medical Officer directly in charge of the health care facility, it provides the needed flexibility and enables early response to interested persons. The type of involvement may range from capital intensive to recurrent expenditures in the provision and maintenance of certain facilities. Some of the specific areas that are likely to attract such partnerships and involvement are:

- (a) Landscaping of entire / part of the premises of the Primary Health Centre (PHC) / Government Hospitals.
- (b) Tree planting and maintenance
- (c) Provision of drinking water booth / stand and maintenance within the premises – Provision of bore well and / or overhead tank.
- (d) Provision of Medical equipment and furniture to improve the quality of care.
- (e) Maintenance of Medical Equipment.
- (f) Routine maintenance of specific areas in the hospital / PHC inclusive of sanitation and cleaning the premises.
- (g) Improved amenities for patient welfare.
- (h) Provision of Library, Books, Magazines, Newspapers.
- (i) Maintenance of Patient waiting Hall and amenities therein.
- (j) Maintenance of ward, toilets and any other part of the premises
- (k) Renovation of ward / toilets or any other part of the premises.
- (l) Special functions within the hospital to encourage both the health care providers and patients.
- (m) Construction of compound wall / cattle trap / enclosures etc.
- (n) Any other infrastructure or service that will support the PHC / General Hospital to improve the quality of care on the premises of the health facilities.

B. Methodology

- (a) Any interested person / Non Governmental Organisation / Company / Institution may approach the Chief Medical Officer / Medical Superintendent / PHC Medical Officer and submit an offer letter specifying the nature of partnership / involvement. The officer in charge of the Medical Institution (PHC / GH) may also request prospective sponsors for such Public Private Partnership (PPP) / involvement. Those who have volunteered to provide the infrastructure / service shall bear the cost. The Memorandum of Understanding shall be signed by the Chief Medical Officer / Medical Superintendent / PHC medical Officer as the first party on behalf of the Health care institution with the sponsor as the second party. The draft Memorandum of Understanding as found in the Annexure shall form the

main content of the Agreement and shall be suitably modified to suit the type of sponsorship.

- (b) A copy of the signed Memorandum of Understanding shall be sent to the
 - Deputy Director of Health Services (with reference to PHCs)
 - Joint Director of Health Services (with reference to GHs)
 - Deans (with reference to Medical College / GHs)
- (c) If the sponsor is unable to honor the commitment the Medical Officer shall terminate the agreement and inform the sponsor of the reason therein.
- (d) In the event of a termination of the Agreement that aggrieves the sponsor, an appeal shall be made to the District Collector whose decision shall be final.
- (e) The sponsor is permitted to display publicity boards in size 18" x 9" or smaller size at locations mutually agreed upon. Wherever landscaping is being done, an additional board of size 2" x 6 " may be displayed at the entrance of the GH.
- (f) Political and religious organizations shall not be permitted to display any publicity boards.
- (g) Wherever the nature of involvement is of a continuous nature as in providing a service and so on, the agreement may be renewed with mutual consent for a further period of five years at a time.
- (h) All monitoring contributions shall be channelised through the patient welfare society of the concerned institution. The non recurrent expenditure for advertisement cost for inviting expression of Public Private Partnership in hospital interest is Rs.4.00 lakh. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and the above expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.

3. The Project Director has circulated the above proposal to the members of the State Empowered Committee and State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in this matter.

4. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to incur a non recurring expenditure of Rs.4.00 lakh (Rupees Four lakh only) towards the advertisement cost for inviting expression of Public Private Partnership in hospital interest.

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to float the advertisement through the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation and the Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation is permitted to utilize the savings in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project advertisement charges available in the Personal Deposit account.

6. The Government also issue the following orders:

- (i) The Chief Medical Officer of Primary Health Centre / Chief Medical Officer, Hospital Superintendents in General Hospitals / Deans of Medical College Hospitals are permitted to approach individuals / Non Governmental Organisations / Trusts / Companies / Institutions / Others in the district / State and request for their partnership / involvement in the manner as indicated in paragraph 2 above as suitable to them.
- (ii) The Chief Medical Officer of Primary Health Centre / Chief Medical Officer, Hospital superintendents in General Hospitals / Deans of Medical College Hospitals are permitted to sign a Memorandum of Understanding format annexed to this order with such persons accepting their request.
- (iii) The Government also permit minor alternations as appropriate to the type of partnership.
- (iv) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to implement this program through Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare in the State.
- (v) The Government direct that the District Collector shall be the Appellate Authority in the event of a party being aggrieved by an order of cancellation.

7. This order issues with the concurrence of State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O.Ms.No.28, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 28.2.2005 and Finance Department vide its U.O.No. 4299 / H I / 2008, dated 29.1.2008.

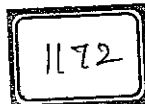

The Second party agrees to provide the following infrastructure / service to the PHC / Hospital with the following terms and conditions.
2. Whereas the (Name of the Hospital) has requested firms / companies to provide the following infrastructure / service at the PHC / Government Hospital. (Name of the place) at their own cost and to display their Boards as mutually agreed upon in the determined size and agreed to this to provide the same.
3. Whereas (Name of the sponsor) Agree to maintain the Landscape Area at Government Hospital, (Name of the place), for a period of year (s) and also requested to display their board in the premises of the Government Hospital, (Name of the place). (This clause is only applicable to landscaping partnership / involvement)

THIS INDENTURE WITNESS :-

- (a) In Pursuance of the above, the request of CMO has been considered and the (Name of the sponsor) has agreed to provide the following infrastructure / service. (specify the type of infrastructure / service being offered by the sponsor).

7. In the event of inability to maintain the required service, the Medical Officer incharge of the PHC / GH may terminate the MOU after communicating the reasons to the second party. The publicity boards if any, will then be removed.
8. This agreement shall come to an end on theday monthyear.
9. This agreement may be renewed with Mutual consent for a further period of five more years. (this clause is only for services or those where maintenance of a continued nature is involved).

ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, sanction was accorded for conducting a Pilot Project on primary and secondary prevention of Cardio Vascular Diseases including Hypertension and Diabetes Mellitus in two districts, viz, Virudhunagar and Sivagangai.

2. In the letter second read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is piloting Prevention and control of Cardio Vascular Diseases in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts. There are non modifiable risk factors like age, sex, genetic factors etc., and modifiable risk factors such as obesity, high intake of fat and salt, smoking, lack of exercise etc., leading to Cardio Vascular Diseases. The pilot has been devised with the principle that even a small change in the risk factors in the whole community leads to remarkable reduction in the morbidity and mortality of cardio vascular diseases. Earlier, the project had undertaken a survey on awareness of risk factors in the minds of the people in Villupuram, Theni, Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts in the year 2006. Of these Villupuram and Theni districts are taken as control districts and Virudhunagar and Sivagangai are selected as intervention districts. The CVD pilot has 4 components, namely,

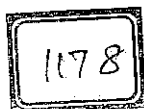
- i. Clinic based hypertension pilot including lifestyle modification counseling.
- ii. School based behaviour change communication (BCC) activities for lifestyle modification
- iii. Workplace based BCC activities for lifestyle modification
- iv. Intense BCC activities focused on the whole community

3. The Project Director has stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project Team has selected 50 schools and 50 work places in each of the two pilot districts. Out of 50 schools, 25 will be control schools and 25 will be intervention schools. Similarly, among the work places, 25 will be control and 25 will be taken for interventions. The Project Director has proposed to carryout BCC intensively for the 7th and 8th standard students for 2 years on lifestyle modification for prevention of cardio vascular diseases in the 25 control schools in Virudhunagar district and another 25 schools in Sivagangai districts. Similarly, the Project Director has proposed to undertake BCC activities for all the workers and staff in identified 25 workplaces each in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts, which include the Collector's Office, some industries and manufacturing places in both the districts. Before commencing the interventions, which will be in place for two years, the Project Director has proposed to conduct a baseline study on awareness of CVD risk factors in all the above selected schools and work places in both the districts. The World Bank during their previous mission in March 2007 has observed that a baseline study of schools and workplace needs to be conducted before starting the pilot. It is proposed to conduct the study by utilizing the services of the departmental staff from Health and Family Welfare Department. The duration of the Study will be for 30 working days for school survey and 30 working days for workplaces. The Project Director has stated that the survey format for schools and the workplaces have already been developed by the project team and approved by the World Bank consultant for non-communicable diseases. The action plan for the Baseline Study is as follows:

- i. The Statistical Assistants and the Block Health Statisticians working in the Block Primary Health Centres shall be identified as Investigators. A total of 30 Investigators will be selected to carry out the Survey for both the districts.
- ii. A sensitisation meeting for the Investigators will be conducted in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai where they will be briefed about the formats.
- iii. A pre testing will be conducted at 5 schools and work places each in the two districts and the findings analysed.
- iv. The actual survey will be conducted and the findings shall be analysed.
- v. District level officials from the Project Management Unit will be sent to the districts and the officials for supervision of the Survey.

4. The Project Director has stated that the activity of conducting a baseline survey on awareness of risk factors among the school children and employees of work places in two districts piloting prevention and control of CVD is included under Component II, Subcomponent 2 of the Project Implementation Plan which has been approved by the World Bank. The total non-recurring expenditure involved in the proposal is Rs.3,27,000. This non-recurring expenditure is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank.

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed the above proposals before the State Empowered Committee for approval and the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposals. The Project Director has requested orders of the Government in the matter.



6. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly the following orders are issued.

i. Sanction is accorded for incurring a non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 3,27,000/- (Rupees Three lakh and twenty seven thousand only), as detailed below, towards conducting a Baseline Survey on awareness of risk factors among the school children and employees of work places in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts piloting prevention and control of Cardio Vascular Diseases as proposed in paragraph 3 above.

In Sivagangai and Virudhunagar district 25 schools shall be selected in each district randomly for intervention and another 25 schools each for control. Based on the pre-testing done in both districts during September 2007, questionnaires for school and work places have been designed and annexed to this order.

9. This order issues with the concurrence of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O Ms No.28, H&FW, dated: 28.2.2005 and Finance department vide its U.O No. 4300 / H I / 2008, dated 30.1.2008 and ASL No.1758 (One thousand seven hundred and fifty eight).

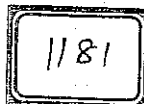



ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in his letter second read above, has stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) is being implemented from January 2005. The Project implementation period is for 5 years till March 2010. As per the Project agreement and Project Appraisal Document (PAD), the World Bank is required to review the implementation progress of the project activities, with regard to the achievement of project objectives and to suggest any mid course corrections if required in respect of project activities. The midterm review mission (MTR) may also look into the expenditure pattern and recommend any modification in the project cost. In the G.O first read above sanction was accorded for a recurring expenditure of Rs.12.00 lakh (Rupees Twelve lakh only) per annum towards the Management Fund to meet the expenses in connection with urgent, innovative and research type of activities under the various components dealt by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, i.e, conducting Workshops, Seminars, hospitality expenses, engaging Consultants, purchase and repair of equipments and incidental expenses relating to arrangements for the visit of World Bank Teams, Government of India Officials, Officials from other States, etc, during the Project period. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is also permitted to draw and incur the recurring expenditure from the Management fund not exceeding Rs.1.00 lakh at a time in advance, for the purposes mentioned above, to be recouped after spending one advance amount, subject to an annual ceiling of Rs.12.00 lakh.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that due to the restrictions of Rs.1.00 lakh at a time and the fact that treasury operations for Bills can be processed only within 15 days of the month (due to pay bill formalities), the Project Management Unit-Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has been in a position to draw only Rs.6.00 lakhs in 2005-06 and Rs.6.00 lakhs in 2006-07. In the current year 2007-08, the Project Management Fund has been encashed only for Rs.5.00 lakhs

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and accumulated bills are pending to the tune of Rs. 16.37 lakhs. Apart from the reasons mentioned above, extra expenditure in one head is also due to the following: The Phase II civil works began with the preparatory stage namely architectural drawings. As the Chief Architect, Public works Department indicated their inability to take up the drawings for 220 secondary hospitals in Phase II, it was decided to employ architects through the employment exchange. Several efforts were made and only nine young architects with little experience joined the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Among these architects, except for one, all of them resigned as they were unable to produce the standard drawings. The situation began to turn into a crisis and with great difficulty, a few experienced architects were contracted as consultants with a consultancy fee of Rs.1,000/- for every day worked. With great difficulty, on a weekly basis, each of the sites were inspected and the drawings began to steadily pour in. After the preliminary check and required modifications, these drawings were sent to the World Bank Architect, Delhi as stipulated and this was then subjected to further modifications. The modified drawings were then sent to the World Bank and finally approved. Following the approval of the World Bank, the Government issue orders for the commencement of work by following tender procedure. Currently, three consultant architects are involved in completing detailed line drawings of water supply and electricity for all additional buildings proposed in 270 hospital premises.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that expenditure till date towards hiring consultant architects is Rs.14.50 lakhs. Considerable savings have incurred on account of this effort. If architects had been hired in the traditional manner, a minimum of 3% of the total estimated cost would have had to be paid as consultancy fee. The phase II civil works is estimated at a cost of Rs.220 crores and if the minimum of 3% is paid as per the Council of Architect rules it would have resulted in an expenditure of Rs.6.60 crores. The World Bank Mission is undertaking its Mid Term Review and there is an urgent need for funds in the Project Management Fund together with a modification in the terms of operation of the Project Management Fund.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore requested for sanction of additional allotment of Rs.15.00 lakhs to the Project Management Fund of the Project Management Unit for payment of expenses to architectural consultants and for effective preparation and for making arrangements for mid term review mission by the World Bank to carryout such activities to project the performance of the project during the last two years and half. He has also requested for removal of condition of Rs.1.00 lakh at a time, as made out in the Government Order in G.O (2D) No.43 dated 13.07.2005 so as to settle the pending payments and urgently required advances. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has also stated that the State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that expenditure proposed is an approved activity by the World Bank and is included in the component III sub component 4(iv) in the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) document approved by the World Bank during negotiations. The non – recurrent expenditure involved in the above proposal is Rs.15.00 lakh, which is reimbursable by the World Bank.

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5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the following order is issued.

Sanction is accorded for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs.15.00 lakh as additional allotment to the Project Management Fund (above the current allocation of Rs.12.00 lakh) of the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project towards settlement of pending bills, urgently required advances until March 2008.

6. The non – recurring expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited under the "Head of account" 2210 – Medical and Public Health – 01 Urban Health Services – Allopathy – 001 – Direction and Administration - SCHEME IN THE ELEVENTH FIVE YEAR PLAN - II - STATE PLAN – PA. Health System Project - Management Unit - 99. Miscellaneous (DPC 2210 – 01 – 001 PA.9907).

7. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to settle pending bills and take urgently required advance without the current restriction of Rs.1.00 lakh at a time.

8. This order issues with the concurrence of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. Ms. No. 28, Health and Family Welfare dated 28.02.2005 and Finance Department vide its U.O. No. 8948 / H I / 2008, dated 20.2.2008.

ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government sanctioned the establishment of Project Management Unit at State and District level with supporting staff. Except certain posts all other posts were ordered to be filled up by redeployment. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in his letter second read above has reported that several posts sanctioned could not be filled up by redeployment. Since the activities of the project have increased, the Project Director has proposed creation of certain posts on regular basis. He has stated that the following posts already sanctioned in the Government order first read above and ordered to be filled up by redeployment may be converted as regular posts temporarily during the project period and filled up by transfer from Government department and the persons may be reverted to the parent department after the project is completed.

- (i) One post of Statistical Officer in the Quality and Systems Improvement Cell.
- (ii) One post of Accounts Officer in the Financial Management Cell

2. The Project Director in his letter second read above has also proposed creation of the following two contract posts by surrendering one post of Statistical Officer (HMIS & IT) sanctioned in Serial No.V (3) in Annexure I and one post of Public Health Nurse out of two posts already sanctioned in Serial No.VI (3) in Annexure I to the Government order first read above.

1. Senior Statistical Expert
2. Quality of Care Coordinator

The Project Director has also requested to permit him to utilize the services of Thiru.P.Muniappan in the post of Senior Statistical Expert from 01.09.2007, from which

date he is assisting the Project and also to permit him to utilize the services of Selvi.V.Jasisee Suvetha who was working as Assistant State Co-ordinator in the State Resource Cell and in the Child Labour Project as Quality of Care Coordinator in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. He has also proposed for creation of two temporary posts of Assistant Cum Accountant in the Financial Management Cell to manage the accounts by surrendering two posts of Assistants already sanctioned and ordered to be filled up by redeployment.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that contracting of Personnel for carrying out the project activities in the Project Management Unit is an approved activity by the World Bank and is included under component III subcomponent 4 (i) of the Project Implementation Plan approved by the World Bank during the negotiations. The cost of engaging personnel on contract for implementation of project activities in the Strategic Planning Cell of the project is reimbursable by the World Bank. Salary for the Government staff is included in the project cost and not reimbursable by the World Bank.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has circulated the above proposal to the State Empowered Committee. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal except creation of one post of Statistical Officer. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested orders of the Government in the matter.

5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the following orders are issued.

(i) Sanction is accorded for conversion of one post of Accounts Officer in the scale of pay of Rs.8000 – 275 – 13500 in the Financial Management Cell of the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, sanctioned in G.O. first read above vide Sl. No.(IV) 3, as regular post temporarily during the project period. The post shall be filled up by transfer of person from the Government Department and the person shall be reverted to the parent department after the project is completed.

ORDER:

Response time is vital for medical emergency and emergencies occur not only due to medical reasons but also due to road traffic accidents, suicides, and crimes. Although a good network of Medical College Hospitals, Government Hospital etc. is prevalent in Tamil Nadu, ambulance facilities already provided to these institutions are not available round the clock due to various operational / administrative reasons. An efficient emergency management service can play a crucial role in saving precious lives of pregnant women, women in labour, victims of Road traffic accidents, Medical and Surgical emergencies etc.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that considering the importance of providing emergency ambulance services, 187 ambulances with medical equipments have been purchased and supplied to 15 districts through the World Bank aided Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, that these ambulances are being operated through select 146 NGOs in the 15 districts from 01.01.2007, that the NGOs were permitted to charge one way from the patients at the rate of Rs.5/- per kilometer from the strategic point to meet out the fuel, vehicle maintenance and other operating expenses including staff salary in addition to payment of a sum of Rs.30,000/- per annum towards insurance and expenses towards fitness certificate per vehicle and a maintenance grant of Rs.1.20 lakh per annum towards operating expenses per vehicle and that their activities are being monitored by the District Monitoring Committee chaired by the respective District Collector. The Project Director has reported that the total expenditure for the scheme is approximately Rs.17.16 crore towards the cost of ambulances and Rs.2.80 crore towards recurring expenditure.



3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further reported that as several difficulties were experienced in running the existing emergency ambulance services through multiple NGOs, a focused effort was made to identify a professional and experienced NGO that would manage and provide efficient delivery of Emergency Management Services and Expression of Interest was invited through an advertisement (dated 03.11.2007) at all India level for developing and operationalising management of a comprehensive response service for providing a reliable, trust worthy and quality Emergency Response Service in Tamil Nadu from experienced / registered non profit organizations with the following experience:

- “(1) Experience in running centralized emergency response centre for an entire state in public private partnership with any state Government on a non-profit basis. Testimonials of such experience should be enclosed with the Expression of Interest.
- (2) Should have operated and managed a fleet of over 200 ambulances.
- (3) Should have experience in computer telephony integration with the ability to log calls combined with geographical information system together with GPS integrated ambulance monitoring system to facilitate quick dispatch of vehicles to the point of emergency.
- (4) To have comprehensive training modules for ambulance drivers, ambulance nurses and supervisory personnel in the implementation of the emergency response system.
- (5) Should have executed at least one similar project at a budgetary outlay of Rs.500 lakhs in the preceding or current financial year”.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that based on the advertisement issued, Emergency Management and Research Institute (EMRI), Hyderabad, expressed its interest to provide the above service, that based on the reference mentioned in para 3 above a request for proposal was sent to the above organization and that the institution has sent detailed technical /financial proposals. The Emergency Management and Research Institute proposal was evaluated and it was found that Emergency Management and Research Institute has the necessary experience and prequalification stipulated in the advertisement, dated 03.11.2007. Further, the Government of Andhra Pradesh has entered into a MOU with Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad and the services are extended to the entire State of Andhra Pradesh subsequently Emergency Management and Research Institute has also entered into MOUs with the Government of Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh.

5. The Emergency Response Center at EMRI consists of three mission critical teams and this model has been adopted in all states that it has taken up. The three teams that work together to attend to Emergency calls are as follows.

Sense: (Call taking, Call processing, Call dispatch), all located in a central control room which is technologically well equipped. Personnel at this central control room which resembles a modern day call centre are extremely well trained to deal with each type of call. Each call is recorded and handled professionally. The presence of a Geographical



Information System and GPS helps to track down the location of the call and the Ambulance as well. Approximately, 10,000 calls are received every day and the personnel have been trained to distinguish between serious emergencies and that which can be tackled through telephonic assistance and local help.

Reach: The process refers to the arrival of the Ambulance at the scene of the emergency. The 'Reach' protocol which begins from the response system on the Emergency Medical Technician receiving a call from the control room, confirms the location, arrival at the scene, dealing with the emergency, etc., It is a 32 step process. Each ambulance has drivers and emergency medical technicians for two shifts. Each ambulance has one substitute in the event of an absentee. Emergency medical technicians undergo an intensive training programme for six weeks.

Care: The Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) provides pre hospital care while transporting the patient / victim to the appropriate hospital for stabilization. These EMTs are also trained to receive guidance on correct and optimum treatment from doctors (Emergency Management research physicians) located at the control room.

6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that a team consisting of the then Hon'ble Minister for Health along with the Secretary and Special Secretary, Health and Family Welfare Department and officials from the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project visited Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad and were impressed with the functioning of the Emergency Management System from infrastructure, technology used, man power recruitment, training, monitoring, reporting and managerial efficiency displayed. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has sent a proposal to establish 24 hours Emergency Management Services System initially in 14 districts in Tamil Nadu and to the extended the same to the rest of the State, for the benefit of the people by signing a Memorandum of Understanding with Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad and to provide funds as Grant – in – aid to Emergency Management Research Institute to manage the Emergency Management Services.

7. The World Bank has agreed to provide the required 198 ambulances along with the equipment for them to Emergency Management Services and the cost of the ambulance and equipment is reimbursable by the World Bank. All the other expenditures is not reimbursable by the World Bank and is to be borne by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

8. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has circulated the above proposal to the members of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. (Ms) No.28, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 28.2.2005 and the Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

9. The Government after careful examination of the proposal issue the following orders:

(i) Sanction is accorded for establishment of Emergency Management Services in Tamil Nadu.

(ii) An Memorandum of Understanding shall be signed with Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad as a Public Private Partnership in provision of Emergency Management Services in Tamil Nadu. Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project shall be designated as the Nodal agency to operate the Emergency Management Service system in Tamil Nadu through Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is nominated as the Nodal Officer and he is permitted to sign the Memorandum of Understanding with Emergency Management Research Institute on behalf of Government of Tamil Nadu.

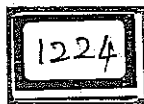
(iii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to set up initially a temporary control room in the Health Visitors Training Centre located at Government Kasthuri Bai Gandhi Hospital Campus, Chennai-5 and this centre shall be utilised as a temporary central control room and training centre till a permanent control room and training center is built. This temporary control room shall be suitably renovated at an estimated cost of Rs.1.85 crore provided with the required infrastructure for the purpose of Emergency Management Research Institute.

(iv) The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine is directed to handover the buildings of the Health Visitors Training Institute functioning in the Government Kasthuribai Gandhi Hospital Campus, Chennai-5, temporarily to the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by shifting the existing institute to function at Health and Family Welfare Training center, Egmore Chennai -8.

(v) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to setup a permanent central control room at Chennai on the land provided by the Government and the infrastructure should be developed by Emergency Management Research Institute in consultation with Government of Tamil Nadu from the funds provided by the Government. All infrastructure so created will be the assets of the Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu. Land required for the same shall be identified by the department. The Central control room shall be an integrated control room with representation from Police and Fire Departments.

(vi) The staff for running the central control room, ambulances, supervision and monitoring, management etc., shall be selected, trained and positioned by Emergency Management Research Institute in the respective positions.

(vii) The entire Emergency Response Management Service shall be organized, managed, supervised and monitored by Emergency Management Research Institute.



(viii) The arrangement with Emergency Management Research Institute is proposed to begin functioning from the date of signing of the Memorandum of Understanding. It will be operational for the period agreed to by both parties i.e. initially for a period of five years from the date of signing of the Memorandum of Understanding. Based on the functioning of the existing system in the fifth year, the arrangement will be assessed and extension of services in partnership decided accordingly.

(ix) After the Memorandum of Understanding is signed by Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad and Government of Tamil Nadu the first quarter funds for renovation and refurbishment of temporary call centre and training centre shall be released to Emergency Management Research Institute.

(x) Initially, the 198 ambulances under Phase II of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will be placed at the disposal of the Emergency Management Research Institute for providing Emergency Management Services in 14 districts i.e. Perambalur, Thiruvannamalai, Sivagangai, Virudhunagar, The Nilgiris, Salem, Vellore, Trichy, Madurai, Dindigul, Namakkal, Karur, Coimbatore, and Erode and extended to all districts in Tamil Nadu in a parallel manner as and when the remaining ambulances are surrendered by the NGOs.

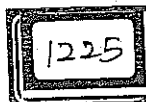
(xi) All Ambulances that are being surrendered by NGOs due to their inability to run the same shall be handed over to Emergency Management Research Institute and the coverage area shall also be extended gradually in other Districts.

(xii) All Ambulances that have now been parked due to having been met with an accident shall be handed over to Emergency Management Research Institute for repairs and then utilized along with the other vehicles.

(xiii) Uncovered areas such as Chennai Corporation, other Corporation areas, Municipalities, Urban areas which have not yet been covered shall gradually also be included in the service area. Ambulances for the purpose bought by the respective local bodies shall also be handed over to EMRI under the proposed arrangement.

(xiv) Ambulances that are bought by public minded institutions and gifted to the Government for utilization shall be handed over to Emergency Management Research Institute to form part of the overall pool of ambulances for Emergency Management Services. Other Ambulances purchased for Emergency Management Services (EMS) from time to time shall be handed over to Emergency Management Research Institute for utilization as earlier mentioned. The existing 187 ambulances run by NGOs in Phase I Districts, either surrendered or terminated after the contract period shall be handed over to Emergency Management Research Institute.

(xv) A monthly detailed performance report of all the activities in the Emergency Management Services shall be collected, analyzed and reported to the Government by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.



(xvi) The Emergency Management Services provided by Emergency Management Research Institute to the public is to be free of cost. No charge in any form shall be collected from the public.

(xvii) The fund for the Non recurring and recurring cost shall be released to the Emergency Management Research Institute by the Government through Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in advance for each quarter. Emergency Management Research Institute should produce the utilization certificate for the expenditure details at the end of the first quarter following the release of funds. Then Emergency Management Research Institute should provide the audited expenditure statement by the end of the second quarter after the release of advance. This mechanism shall be in place for all releases, which will be done on a quarterly basis. Only the actual expenditure will be borne by the Government and there is no extra cost involved other than the actuals.

10. The Government constitute a State level Advisory Committee with the following members to monitor the function of Emergency Management Services:

11. The Government also constitute a District level Executive Committee headed by the District Collector in each district. The Executive Committee shall meet once a quarter and co ordinate the actions required for efficient implementation and operation of the Emergency Management Services in the district. The Executive Committee shall consist of the following members:

- District Collector (Chairman)
- The Joint Director of Health Services (Convener)
- The Deputy Director of Health Services (Member)
- The Superintendent of Police (Law and Order) (Member)
- The Divisional Fire officer (Member)
- Three nominees of Emergency Management Research Institute
- Special invitees as decided by the District Collector from time to time

12. The expenditure shall be determined by the increased ambulances and related expenditure components that are likely to increase due to the scaled up volumes. Every year the projected expenditure for the following year shall be informed to the Government through the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for suitable budget allocation. For 2008-09, Rs.18.00 crore (Rupees Eighteen crore only), was requested through Project Implementation Plan (PIP) from National Rural Health Mission and out of this amount, Rs.9.54 crore (Rupees Nine crore fifty four lakh only) has been now allotted for this purpose by National Rural Health Mission. The amount required for 2008-09 is Rs.36.02 crore (Rupees Thirty six crore two lakh only) and as the initial amount allotted by National Rural Health Mission is already Rs.9.54 crore (Nine crore fifty four lakh only), the balance amount of Rs.26.48 crore (Rupees Twenty six crore forty eight lakh only) will be the contribution of Government. The Government contribution shall be adjusted against the state's share of contribution under National Rural Health Mission. In the event of delay in National Rural Health Mission funding, the required funds shall be advanced by the State Government and suitably replenished as and when National Rural Health Mission funds are received.

13. Sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs.36.02 crore (Rupees Thirty six crore two lakh only), towards establishment of 24 hours Emergency Management Services for the year 2008-2009. The projected recurring expenditure for the year 2008 – 09 is Rs.13.13 crore (Rupees Thirteen crore and thirteen lakh only) and the non-recurring expenditure for the year 2008 – 09 is Rs.22.89 crore (Rupees Twenty two crore and eighty nine lakh only). A detailed break up of expenditure is given in the Annexure to this order.

- a. The recurring expenditure of Rs.13.13 crore (Rupees Thirteen crore and thirteen lakh only) is sanctioned for operating 198 ambulances and the expenditure shall increase corresponding to the increased number of ambulances.
- b. The central control room expenditure of Rs.6.38 crore (Rupees Six crore thirty eight lakh only), is mainly related to procurement and installation of equipment, which will be permanent assets and will be moved from the temporary call centre to the permanent premises when constructed.
- c. The non recurring expenditure of Rs.6.00 crore (Rupees Six crore only), for refurbishing of ambulances is mainly meant for air-conditioning of the 198 new ambulances to be provided by the Government and to include certain additional equipments and modifications to the ambulances for picking up the patients in emergencies and to transport them to the hospitals with proper first aid and emergency management. When additional ambulances are handed over to the Emergency Management Research Institute, the corresponding expenditure will increase accordingly.
- d. The emergency response centre cost of Rs.10.51 crore (Rupees Ten crore fifty one lakh only), is for modification of temporary premises which includes renovation and infrastructure development and to establish the permanent site

and infrastructure to run the entire operations of Emergency Management Services (EMS).

14. The expenditure sanctioned in para 13 above shall be debited to the following head of account:

"2211. Family Welfare – 00-103. Maternity and Child Health. Schemes in the Eleventh Five Year Plan – II. State Plan – JN – State's share towards National Rural Health Mission Schemes – 09. Grants in Aid – 03. Grants for Specific Schemes (2211 00 103 JN 0937).

15. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is authorized to incur the expenditure sanctioned in para 13 above.

16. This order issues with the concurrence of State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. (Ms) No.28, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 28.02.2005 and Finance Department vide its U.O.No.178 / DS (AR) / Health I / 2008, dated 5.5.2008.

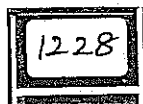

2. In G.O. 3rd read above, it was ordered that the staff working in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project shall go back to the original department on winding up of the Project. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the Project will come to close by 30.9.2010 and after closure of the Project, the staff who came from the DANIDA Project will have no department for absorption, as the DANIDA Project was already closed. (ii) Tmt. R. Suresh Devi, Assistant

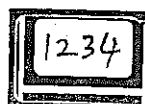

(vi) Thiru. V. Raghu, Office Assistant

The individual was joined duty on 30.3.1981 temporarily as Basic servant in the post sanctioned in G.O. Ms. No.162, Health and Family Welfare, dated 5.2.81 and his temporary services were regularised with effect from 30.3.1981 in DANIDA Project.

(vii) Thiru. A. Paramasivam, Driver

He was sponsored by the Employment Exchange, District Employment Office (Technical) Anna Nagar, Madras and temporarily appointed as Driver and joined duty as Driver on 30.6.1989 A.N. His temporary services were regularised on 30.6.1989 A.N. He completed the period of probation on 30.6.91 A.N. in DANIDA Project.

3. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services has stated that all the above individuals have no lien in Medical Department. He has suggested the following for consideration in the matter.

(i) Date of absorption in Government services:

The individuals may be absorbed in Government service from the date of absorption by the Government.

(ii) Creation of Post:

They may be absorbed in the existing vacant posts in the Department and hence question of creation of new posts does not arise.

(iii) Probation:

In respect of those who have already completed their probation in the DANIDA Project itself, they need not be placed again on probation.

(iv) Fixation of Pay:

They may be allowed to draw the pay already drawn in Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

(v) Payment of Leave Salary and Pension Contribution:

Since the staff were attached to projects like DANIDA and Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, the question of payment of pension contribution does not arise.

(vi) Counting of Past Service:

The services rendered in the Project shall be countable for terminal benefits.

(vii) Service Rules:

Since the post of Assistant, Driver and Office Assistant are already existing in the Medical Department, framing of service rules in respect of above categories does not arise. But, there is no post of Accountant in Medical Department. In the case of Thiru.D.Devadoss, Record Clerk his services are regularised in the post of Record Clerk cum Roneo Operator. But the above post of Record Clerk cum Roneo Operator is not available in Medical and Rural Health Services Department. The post of Record Clerk is available. Therefore he may be absorbed in the post of Record Clerk for which Service Rules are available. With reference to the recurring expenditure due to the absorption, the expenditure will be incurred under the relevant head of account related to the posts under which the individuals are proposed to be absorbed.

4. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services has further requested the Government to issue orders with regard to the posts to which the above individuals have to be absorbed in Medical Department and also the service condition including the fixation of seniority of the above individuals in the category of respective posts. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested to issue orders in the matter at an early date as it is now proposed to convert the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as a society model with effect from 1.4.2008 for effective implementation of the project.

5. Further It is reported that Tmt. R. Renugambal is holding the post of Accountant in the time scale of pay at Rs.5500-175-8000 and has passed DOM and Account Test for Subordinate Officers Part I. But, she does not possess the qualification of passing the Medical Code Test which is required for Junior Assistant / Assistant / Superintendent in the Medical Department. There is no post of Accountant in Medical Department. Therefore, Tmt. R. Renugambal may be absorbed in the post of Superintendent (Rs.5700-9200) by relaxing the rules relating to the method of appointment. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services has reported that the post of Computer Operator is manned by the Assistant in his department and no service rules has been framed for the post of Computer Operator. Therefore he has requested to absorb Thiru. M. Selvaraj, Computer Operator as Assistant by relaxing the rules relating for the method of appointment. All other individuals i.e. Tmt. R. Suresh Devi, Assistant, Thiru. A. Paramasivam, Driver, Thiru. D. Devadoss, Record Clerk, Thiru. V. Ragu, and C. Kannan, Office Assistants are holding the common categories and the vacancies are available in these categories.

6. The Government have carefully examined the above proposal of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and decided to accept it. Accordingly, Government direct that the 7 individuals now working in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project be absorbed in the posts

indicated against their names in the existing vacancies in the Department of Medical and Rural Health Services as indicated below:

The absorption of the above individuals in the Department of Medical and Rural Health Services is subject to the following conditions:

- i. Their services in the DANIDA Health Care Project and Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project are countable for pensionary benefits. However the seniority in the respective post absorbed shall be fixed from the date of absorption in the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services.
- ii. As the individuals have already completed probation, they need not again be placed on probation. However, Tmt. R. Renugambal, Tmt. Suresh Devi and M. Selvaraj should pass Tamil Nadu Medical Code examination within a period of two years. They will be the junior most in the respective category with reference to date of absorption. Tmt. R. Renugambal, should not claim for further promotion in the regular line of Superintendent and also should not claim the 5% PP drawn in the post of Accountant.
- iii. As the individuals have been serving only in the Government Departments, they shall be allowed to draw pay last drawn in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- iv. As the individuals are working in Government Departments, the question of payment of pension contribution does not arise.
- v. All these 7 persons shall be absorbed in the existing vacancies.
- vi. The absorption of Office Assistants shall be within the sanctioned strength of Office Assistants with reference to the revised norms of 12:1. It is a fresh appointment. The rule 4(a) (Employment Exchange) 3A (Rule of Reservation) 5(1) (Age) and 5(2) (Educational Qualification) of the Special Rules for Tamil Nadu Basic Service have to be relaxed in their favour if they are not qualified. Also the method of appointment to Rule 3(a) of Class III have also to be relaxed in their favour.

vii. The rule 2(b) (Method of appointment) 4(a) (Age) and rule 8 (Rule of reservation) of the special rules for Class XXII of the Tamil Nadu General Subordinate Service has to be relaxed in favour of Thiru. D. Devadoss.

viii. The rules relating to method of appointment, age and qualification prescribed for the post of Driver in Tamil Nadu Medical Subordinate Service, Branch V (Miscellaneous) has to be relaxed in favour of Thiru. A. Paramasivan, Driver.

ix. The Rule 4 of the Tamil Nadu Medical Subordinate Service has to be relaxed in favour of Tmt. R. Renugambal, Accountant and Thiru. M. Selvaraj, Computer Operator. In the case of Tmt. R. Suresh Devi, Assistant no rule has to be relaxed.

7. In exercise of the powers conferred under General Rule 48 in Part II of the Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby relaxes certain rules of Special Rules for Tamil Nadu Basic Service, Tamil Nadu General Subordinate Service and Tamil Nadu Medical Subordinate Service, Branch V (Miscellaneous) in favour of the individuals as mentioned in the Annexure to this order for absorption in the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services.

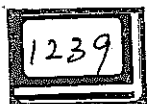

ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government accorded administrative sanction for establishment of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Project was implemented with World Bank support from January 2005. The goal of the Project is to improve the health outcomes of the people of Tamil Nadu, especially the poor and disadvantaged. The Project is now engaged in strengthening the infrastructure of 270 secondary care hospitals consisting of 29 District head quarters hospitals and 241 sub District hospitals.

2. While formulating the Project, it had been decided that the Treasury system of clearance of bills would be followed for all Project activities directly related to expenditure by the Project Management Unit and District Project Management Unit. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the Project has completed two years of implementation period and with three years left for the completion, the Project is experiencing certain difficulties by following the Treasury system of accounting, and that this has impacted the progress in implementation of various activities of the Project. He has stated that much time is being spent by himself and the senior finance staff awaiting clearance of funds and deadlines are proving difficult to adhere to. To avoid these constraints in functioning of the Project, he has submitted a proposal to the State Empowered Committee to constitute a society in the name of "Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society", which will be registered under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act, 1975, to carry out the activities of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. He has stated that constituting the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has been discussed with the World Bank and approval of the World Bank has been obtained on the following documents.



- (i) Memorandum of Association
- (ii) Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Bye-laws
- (iii) Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Service Rules
- (iv) Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Employees' Conduct Rules
- (v) Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Employees' Disciplinary Rules
- (vi) Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Finance Rules and Forms and Registers
- (vii) Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Finance Management System and Accounting Procedural Manual.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has circulated the proposal to the State Empowered Committee. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

4. After careful examination of the above request of Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project the Government issue orders as follows:

(i) The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society shall be constituted with effect from 1.4.2008 to carryout the activities of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

(ii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is directed to register the society under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act, 1975 immediately to carryout the activities of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and following completion of registration formalities, all Project activities shall be carried out by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society.

(iii) The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society will have three committees as follows and the members of each committee are indicated thereon.

a. State Empowered Committee.

ORDER:

Prevention and treatment of Cardio vascular diseases is one of the major activities being implemented by Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had conducted a survey on the awareness of risk factors leading to Cardio vascular diseases in the community in four districts in Tamil Nadu during 2005-2006. Based on the findings, the project is implementing prevention and treatment of Cardio vascular diseases in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai District as a pilot

2. The Government of Tamil Nadu is concerned about the huge number of heart patients belonging to the poorer section of population awaiting major heart surgeries. The facilities available in Government Hospitals are quite inadequate to perform such major surgeries in large numbers and the facilities are under extreme pressure. In the case of children requiring heart surgeries, it is difficult as only one Government Hospital has the facility and there is a huge backlog of cases. The Government studied the problem and decided to utilize the services of private hospitals to perform heart surgery for deserving poor children. Accordingly, in the Government order 1st read above, orders have been issued to refer poor cardiac patients whose age is less than 12 years who are residents of Tamil Nadu and whose parents income is less than Rs.50000/- per year to willing Private Hospitals for performing heart surgeries for which the following financial assistance will be sanctioned to the Private Hospitals by the Tamil Nadu State Illness Assistance Society:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services had obtained willingness from 19 major private hospitals for undertake heart surgeries, that it was decided to launch the programme on 21.11.2007 in the presence of the Hon'ble Chief Minister by signing a Memorandum Of Understanding with the Private Hospitals and that it was also decided to give wide publicity for the scheme so as to create awareness in the community to avail of the new facility. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that a sum of Rs.9,30,946/- was incurred by way of giving advertisement in the Newspapers on 20.11.2007 and 21.11.2007 through the Director of Information and Publicity.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore, placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 06.05.2008 for sanction of Rs.9,30,946/- towards settlement of advertisement cost incurred by way of giving wide publicity for launching of the scheme of provision of free of undertaking heart surgeries to the children in partnership with Private hospitals. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and also provision of Rs.9,30,946 in the Revised Estimate 2008 - 2009.

5. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction, for a sum of Rs.9,30,946/- (Rupees nine lakhs thirty thousand nine hundred and forty six only) towards settlement of advertisement cost incurred by way of giving wide publicity for launching of the scheme of provision of free heart surgeries to poor children in partnership with private hospitals.

6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited to the following head of account: "2210. Medical and Public Health - 01. Urban Health Services (Allopathy) - 001. 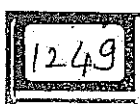

ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government sanctioned the establishment of Mortuary Van Services in 42 Government Hospitals through partnership with Non Governmental Organisations (NGO).The NGOs were permitted to charge Rs.5/- per kilometer one way from the strategic point where the mortuary vans are stationed for transporting the dead bodies towards the cost of fuel, maintenance and other operating expenses including the staff cost.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in the letter second read above has reported that several NGOs have represented that the maintenance charges given by the project and charges to be levied for the transport of dead bodies are insufficient to meet the expenditure especially when the cost of diesel is high and that the World Bank Team during the mid term review mission have also observed that the charges are less and needs revision.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore, placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards enhancement of the charges collected by the mortuary vans run by the NGOs. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

4. The Government, after careful examination, direct that the charges collected from the users by the mortuary vans run by NGOs under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project be enhanced from Rs.5/- per kilo meter one way to Rs.7/- (Rupees seven only) per kilo meter calculated both ways for transporting dead bodies from the

strategic point subject to a minimum of Rs.100/- while operating the mortuary van services to meet out the cost of fuel, maintenance of vehicle and other operating expenses including staff salary.

5. This order issues with the concurrence of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. (Ms).No.28, Health and Family Welfare, dated 28.02.2005 and Finance Department vide its U.O. No.34337 / Health I / 2008, dated 12.6.2008.

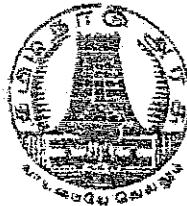

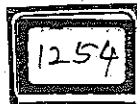

ORDER:

Prevention and treatment of non communicable diseases is one of the major activities being implemented by Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The project is being implemented as a pilot on universal screening of women in the age group of 30 to 60 years for cervical cancer in Theni and Thanjavur districts for the last one year. The duration of the pilot is two years. All Government Health Institutions namely Medical College Hospitals, Government Hospitals and Primary Health Centres are conducting the screening programme.

2. The beneficiaries which comprise of women in the age group of 30 to 60 years need to be motivated and brought to the screening centers in order to undergo the screening. As this involves gaining the confidence of all the women in each locality, personal motivation and awareness is being imparted by Village Link Volunteers (VLV). To facilitate this activity, the Government had permitted to engage Village Link Volunteers through NGOs @ one Village Link Volunteers for one Health Sub Centre area covering a total of 5000 population. A total of 469 Village Link Volunteers have been engaged through NGOs in both the districts. These Village Link Volunteers are now paid an honorarium of Rs.500 per month and a traveling expenditure of Rs.100/- per month. Now as the pilot is progressing well and more women are brought by the Village Link Volunteers to the screening centers. Moreover, additional work is involved such as follow up and monitoring of the screened women, taking the positive cases and referred cases to higher medical institutions, follow up of the cancer cases etc., which are also being handled by them. Due to the increased volume of work, the Village Link Volunteers have frequently represented for enhancement of the honorarium. The World Bank team during the mid term review in November - December 2007 had appreciated the performance of the Village Link Volunteers and recommended that their remuneration may be increased to Rs.1000/- per month in view of the various responsibilities being undertaken by them.

3. The Government had also sanctioned Counselor cum Assistants to each of the 106 screening centers in Theni and Thanjavur Districts. The Counselor cum Assistants help the Health care provider to perform the screening effectively by assisting and completing the documentation part. They also provide counseling services to the beneficiaries visiting the screening centers. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to

impart training to these counselors by the departmental staff. He has also proposed to undertake IEC activities in the two districts to create awareness among the women to motivate them to undergo the screening. He has also proposed that two Programme Officer from the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project may visit in Theni and Thanjavur district every month to monitor and review the field activities at a non recurring cost of Rs.1,84,550/- and a recurring cost of Rs.44,43,200/- p.a. This activity has been approved by the World Bank and is included under Component II, Sub Component 2 in the Project Implementation Plan document approved by the World Bank and the above expenditure is eligible for reimbursement from the World Bank.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore, placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards enhancement of honorarium to the Village Link Volunteers, conducting a training programme to the Counselor cum Assistants, undertaking IEC activities for creation of awareness and filed review and monitoring the project. The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and also to provide Rs.46,27,750/- in the Revised Estimate 2008-2009.

5. The Government, after careful examination issue the following orders.

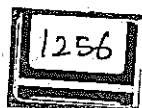
(i) Sanction is accorded for enhancement of the honorarium paid to the Village Link Volunteers, working in the pilot project of Cervical Cancer screening in Theni and Thanjavur districts from Rs.600/- per month to Rs.1000/- (Rupees one thousand only).

(ii) Sanction is also accorded for non recurring expenditure of Rs.1,84,550/- (Rupees One lakh eighty four thousand five hundred fifty only) towards imparting training of Village Link Volunteers and Counsellors cum Assistants engaged in Cervical Cancer screening pilot being implemented in Theni and Thanjavur districts and an annual recurring expenditure of Rs.44,43,200/- (Rupees Forty four lakh forty three thousand and two hundred only) towards additional honorarium of Rs.400 per month per village link volunteers till the cervical cancer screening pilot is being carried out in the above two districts, field visit and monitoring of the pilot by the programme officers and for carrying out IEC activities as indicated in the Annexure to this order.

(iii) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to draw the non recurring expenditure of Rs.1,84,550/- sanctioned in para 5(ii) above in advance and spend the money for carrying out the activities at the cost worked out in the Annexure to this order and to settle the advance after the training programme is over.

(iv) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is also permitted to depute two programme officers every month to Theni and Thanjavur districts and to incur the expenditure at the cost worked out in the Annexure to this order.

(v) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to make the increased monthly payment of honorarium from Rs.600 to Rs.1000 per month from the date of issue of the Government Orders to the village link volunteers through the NGOs who have engaged them through the Joint Director of Health Services in Theni and Thanjavur districts.



(vi) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to incur an expenditure of Rs.20,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty lakh only) towards IEC activities and awareness creation in the community regarding cervical cancer in Theni and Thanjavur districts as mentioned in the Annexure to this order through the Joint Directors of Health Services Theni and Thanjavur districts.

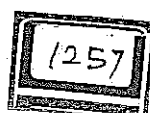

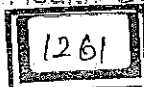
ORDER:

The internal audit system in the Medical Department is in existence from 1959. There are nine regional audit parties and five audit parties in the State Headquarters under the Directorate of Medical & Rural Health Services. While the internal audit system is expected to carry out cent percent audit on the accounts and stores maintenance, the test audit, apart from performance audit on the plan schemes, are carried out by the Accountant General. The procedures on procurement of drugs, consumables, surgical items, diet articles, etc. to Government medical institutions have undergone vast changes. Financial powers have also been revised. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has reported in the letter read above that the system of internal audit instead of its corrective and guiding functions has created a negative impression on the exercise of administrative and financial powers by the Joint Directors, Deputy Directors, Superintendents of Hospitals and Chief Medical Officers.

2. In order to study the problem of non exercise of powers and under - utilization of infrastructure due to the impact of internal audit, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to constitute a Committee to study and suggest measures to overcome these issues. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards constitution of a Committee for this purpose. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

3. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for Constitution of a Committee consisting of the following Officials to study the negative impact of internal audit and to suggest measures to overcome issues leading to non - exercise of powers and under utilization of resources

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has stated that the nursing staff play a prominent role in the care of patients and carry out the instructions given by the Medical Officers such as giving injections and medicines to the patients, preparing the patients for surgeries/deliveries, receiving the admitted patients, preparing the discharge summary, assisting the surgeons in surgery, conducting deliveries and innumerable other duties including filling up the registers and forms, general up keep of the wards, etc., The work of the nursing staff is supervised by three categories of Nursing Superintendents. As the Nursing Superintendents need training in modern nursing and ward management to keep up with the latest trends in the management science, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards conducting training programme to the Nursing Superintendent. The Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and also provision of Rs.4,31,300/- in the Revised Estimate 2008-09. The activity of skill development of health care personnel is on approved activity by the World Bank under component IV subcomponent 3 of Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure is reimbursable by World Bank.

2. The Government, after careful examination, sanction a sum of Rs.4,31,300/- (Rupees Four lakh thirty one thousand three hundred only) as detailed in the annexure to this order for conducting a training programme for all grades of Nursing Superintendents working in all Secondary Care hospitals on the principles of management of nursing and ward management.

3. The Government also direct that the training programme shall include general management principles, Health Care Administration, public relations, quality assurance including medical audit, hospital equipment maintenance, hospital information system,

Bio Medical Waste Management, materials management, personnel management, records and registers, house keeping services, organization and maintenance of CEMONC service etc. The training shall be conducted at Health and Family Welfare Training Centers in Madurai and Chennai, Institute of Public Health at Poonamallee, Health Manpower Development Institutes at Villupuram and Salem. The training period shall be 2 days. The resource persons shall be a team from Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and teachers from nursing colleges. The training shall be conducted in batches of 30 nursing officials per batch for a total of 3 batches.

4. The expenditure sanctioned in para 2 above shall be debited to the following head of account: "2210 – Medical and Public Health – 06 – Public Health – 003 – Training – SCHEMES in the ELEVENTH FIVE YEAR PLAN – II STATE PLAN – PA. 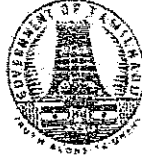

ORDER:

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has established patient counseling services in 166 hospitals throughout Tamil Nadu. The counseling services are rendered by 3 Counselors in each hospital round the clock. The Counselors have been appointed by Non Governmental Organizations for whom the expenditure is provided by the project. The counseling centers are functioning from January 2006. The counselors are all graduates and had undergone initial training in counseling as well as interpersonal communication. During the last two years, many counselors have left the job and new counselors had joined. Hence, there is a need for conducting a refresher training course for the counselors.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards conducting refresher training course for the Counselors working in the patient counseling centres in 166 Government hospitals. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and provision of Rs. 6,869 lakh in Revised Estimate 2008-09. Provision of refresher training to the counselors working in counseling centres is an approved activity by the World Bank under Component I, Sub Component 3 in the Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure to be incurred is reimbursable by the World Bank.

3. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction a sum of Rs.6,86,900/- (Rupees six lakh eighty six thousand and nine hundred only), as non recurring expenditure and as detailed in the Annexure to this order towards conducting refresher training course for the Counselors working in the patient counseling centres in 166 Government hospitals.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to conduct the training in the Institute of Public Health at Poonamallee, Health and Family Welfare Training Centre in Chennai and Madurai and Health Manpower Development Institute, Villupuram and Salem by the Training faculty consisting of the officials from the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and the instructors from training institutes.

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to conduct the training in batches of 30-35 candidates in a batch. The training module already developed shall be modified wherever necessary and used for this training.

ORDER:

Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is implementing various programmes to improve tribal health. While monitoring the implementation of the programmes, it was noticed that because of the remoteness of many tribal villages from the nearest Primary Health Centre / Government Hospital and inaccessibility and also because of their belief and inhibitions, the deliveries are conducted at home with elderly women or Dais attending to deliveries in tribal areas. This often results in more number of preventable maternal and neonatal mortality and morbidity.

2. During the Mid Term Review mission in November/ December 2007, the World Bank mission visited Government PHC at Kottapatty in Dharmapuri district where the Antenatal mothers are admitted 3 days prior to their Expected Date of Delivery (EDD) along with one attendant, who are given food and shelter during their stay till discharge after delivery. They are provided with ambulance facility for transportation from their residence or nearby pickup place and back. If the antenatal mothers develop any complication during their stay or if they require operative procedures like caesarean, they are referred to higher institutions and transported in the ambulance on time and brought back. The entire expenditure is met out of the Patient Welfare Fund. As a result, the number of deliveries in the above PHC has doubled. The World Bank mission appreciated the above services and recommended that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project may take up a similar programme as a pilot in four PHCs in other tribal districts including this Primary Health Centre.

3. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for stay of antenatal tribal mothers in advance for delivery to prevent maternal mortality and morbidity as a pilot programme in 5 identified Primary Health Centers in tribal areas in 5 districts with the following objectives.

- i. To bring all tribal antenatal mothers from remote and inaccessible areas to Primary Health Centres for safe delivery.
- ii. To promote institutional deliveries.
- iii. To reduce Maternal and neonatal mortality and morbidity among the tribal population.
- iv. To educate the tribal community health workers and health professional about the importance of safe and institutional delivery.
- v. To detect complications at an early stage and to refer the cases to higher institutions for timely interventions.

4. The Government after careful examination of the proposal permit to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for implementation of a pilot project for stay of antenatal tribal mothers for a period of two years in the following Primary Health Centres.

- (i) PHC Valavanthi, - Salem Health Unit District (HUD), Salem District
- (ii) PHC Kariyalur - Kallakurichi HUD, Villupuram District
- (iii) PHC Alangayam - Thiruppathur HUD, Vellore District
- (iv) PHC Valavanthinadu - Namakkal HUD, Namakkal District
- (v) PHC Kottapatty - Dharmapuri HUD, Dharmapuri District

5. Sanction is accorded for incurring a recurring expenditure of Rs.6,25,000/- (Rupees six lakh and twenty five thousand only) as detailed below for implementing the pilot project.

- i. The Medical Officer in charge of the PHC will be the officer in charge of this programme.
- ii. The Village Health Nurses (VHN) of the local tribal areas will identify all the AN mothers of that area.
- iii. The VHNS will inform the mothers and Medical Officers 4 to 5 days prior to the expected date of delivery.
- iv. The Medical Officer, on information, will arrange for the transport of AN mothers from their place of residence or nearest pickup point in the Government ambulance 3 days prior to the expected date of delivery.
- v. The AN mothers will be admitted in the PHCs. One attendee will be given shelter in the PHC.
- vi. They will be given food or amount for food during their entire stay in the PHC @ Rs.50 per patient and Rs.50 per Attender per day.
- vii. All the necessary investigations will be done and all precautions will be taken for a safe delivery.
- viii. After safe delivery, the mother will be discharged in 3 to 7 days depending upon each individual case.
- ix. During their stay in the PHCs, the new born child will be given all necessary immunization.
- x. If the Medical Officer anticipates/detects any complication or the necessity of LSCS, the mother will be referred to a higher institution along with the attendee in the ambulance. They will be brought back to their place of residence in the ambulance after discharge.
- xi. The mothers and children will be followed up by the VHNS.
- xii. All the registers will be maintained separately for this programme by the Medical Officer in the PHCs.
- xiii. A monthly report will be sent to the District Project Management Unit with a copy marked to Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by the Medical Officer in the prescribed format and claim for reimbursement will be made accordingly.
- xiv. The DPMU will make available the fund for 3 months as an advance to the Medical Officer of the PHC.

ORDER:

One of the major activities undertaken by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is to bring out effective models to prevent and control non communicable diseases effectively which can be integrated into the existing health system. Accordingly, in the Government order first read above, the Government accorded sanction for implementation of a pilot project on Cervical Cancer Screening in Theni and Thanjavur districts. In the Government order second read above, the Government accorded sanction for implementation of pilot project on prevention of Cardio Vascular Diseases in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts.

2. These two pilot projects are being implemented on a large scale by following international protocols for conducting the pilots. These pilots are regularly monitored both at the district and State level. They are also being documented from the time of inception which will continue through out the pilot. Now there is a need for evaluation of the pilots at the field level. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to engage the National Institute of Epidemiology, Chennai, to undertake concurrent evaluation of the two pilot projects referred to above at a non recurring cost of Rs.3.77 lakh after signing a Memorandum of Understanding with the Institute. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has, therefore, placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 06.05.2008 to undertake the concurrent evaluation. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and also to provide Rs.3.77 lakh in the Revised Estimate 2008-2009.

3. The activity to undertake concurrent evaluation of the two pilot project referred to in para 1 above is approved by the World Bank and is included under Component II,

Sub Component 2 in the Project Implementation Plan document approved by the World Bank during the negotiations. The expenditure to be incurred under this proposal is reimbursable by the World Bank.

4. The Government after careful examination accept the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and direct that a concurrent evaluation of the pilot project on Screening of Cervical Cancer being implemented in Theni and Thanjavur districts and the pilot project on prevention of Cardio Vascular Diseases being implemented in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts, be undertaken by the National Institute of Epidemiology, Chennai after signing a Memorandum of Understanding with the institute.

ORDER:

The Tamil Nadu Health System Project had undertaken a survey on awareness of risk factors in the minds of the people in Villupuram, Theni, Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts in the year 2005 - 2006 and of these, Virudhunagar and Sivagangai Districts have been selected as intervention districts. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is piloting prevention and control of Cardio Vascular Diseases in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts. There are non modifiable risk factors such as age, sex, genetic factors etc., and modifiable risk factors such as obesity, high intake of fat and salt, smoking, lack of exercise etc., with a pre disposition to Cardio Vascular Diseases. The pilot has been devised with the principle that even a small change in the risk factors in the whole community would lead to a remarkable reduction in the morbidity and mortality of cardio vascular diseases.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the pilot project is being implemented in the above two districts from July 2007 onwards and that on assessing the progress of the programme, it is found necessary to post nursing staff to the nodal centers namely 18 Government hospitals in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts for the benefit of the staff to harness the lifestyle interventions being conducted and these would further improve the implementation of the pilot. The activities of appointment of nursing staff and utilizing their services in 18 Government Hospitals is approved by the World Bank under component II, sub component 2 of the Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure incurred is eligible for reimbursement by the World Bank.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore, placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards appointment of Staff Nurses and establishment of counseling services in Collectorates of Sivagangai and Virudhunagar districts. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal for

appointment of staff nurses only. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

4. The Government after careful examination of the proposal, accord sanction for creation of 36 temporary posts of Staff Nurses at the rate of 2 Staff Nurse per centre in the 18 nodal centres as indicated in the Annexure to this order in Sivagangai and Virudhunagar Districts piloting Cardio vascular Diseases for a period of two years from the date of appointment or till the completion of the pilot, which ever is earlier.

5. Sanction is also accorded for incurring recurring cost of Rs.15,24,000/- (Rupees Fifteen lakh twenty four thousand only) towards salary for Staff Nurse and training and supervision charges to NGO as indicated in the Annexure to this order.

The appointment of the Staff Nurses shall be made by the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services on contract basis for 2 years as per the seniority and communal rotation list maintained by the Directorate. The Staff Nurses shall possess a Diploma / Degree in Nursing from any recognized University and registered in the Tamil Nadu Nursing Council. 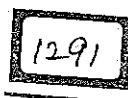

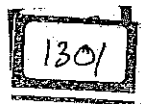
ORDER:

The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is institutionalizing many schemes to improve the infrastructure and functioning of the Government Hospitals with an over all objective of improving quality of care in the hospitals. With a view to improve the cleaning and sanitary services in Government Hospitals, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed to outsource the under mentioned three services with more thrust on cleaning and sanitation services in some of the Government Hospitals as a pilot scheme.

- (a) Cleaning and sanitation services
- (b) Laundry services
- (c) Catering services

2. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards implementation of a pilot project for outsourcing the three services referred to above in some of the Government Hospitals. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal subject to the condition that the prior consent of the hospitals concerned may be obtained. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter. Outsourcing hospital services to private providers is an approved activity by the World Bank under component IV, sub component 1 in Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank.

3. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for implementation of a pilot project for out sourcing the following services in some of the Government Hospitals, subject to the condition that prior consent of the hospitals concerned should be obtained.



- (a) Cleaning and sanitation services
- (b) Laundry services
- (c) Catering services

4. The Government also pass the following orders

- (i) Sanction is accorded for incurring recurring expenditure of Rs.20,00,000/- (Rupees twenty lakhs only) towards outsourcing the services referred to above.
- (ii) Sanction is also accorded for incurring non-recurring expenditure of Rs.4,00,000/- (Rupees four lakhs only) towards cost of advertisement for calling for Expression Of Interest for provision of cleaning , laundering and catering services separately

5. The expenditure sanctioned in para 4(i) on para 4 (ii) shall be debited to the following head of accounts:

"2210- Medical and Public Health - 01, Urban Health Services -- Allopathy -- 110 - Hospitals and Dispensaries - Schemes in the Eleventh Five Year Plan - II State Plan - PA. Rationalization of Secondary Care Facilities under Health Systems Project

6. The pilot shall be carried out for a period of 2 years in a minimum of 4 hospitals for each of the services. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to select the service providers based on a detailed Term Of Reference which will detail the type and quality of service to be rendered.

7. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is authorized to call for expression of interest from the prospective bidders/ self help groups to offer the cleaning, laundering and catering services and select the successful bidder separately by following World Bank Procurement Procedures for services. He is also permitted to select the number of hospitals for each of the services and be the Nodal Officer for the pilot scheme.

8. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is also permitted to examine the possibility of involving Self Help Groups within a defined radius of the

hospitals to participate in a localized bid and where necessary also to examine the possibility of professional agencies that would bid for providing the services as required

9. The Staff already employed for these services by the department shall be accommodated in the existing vacancies of skill categories that they are able to fit into.

10. A study shall be conducted before the pilot, after one year from the date of starting of the pilot and during the end of the pilot on an in house basis by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

11. Necessary additional provision of Rs.4,00,000/- towards advertisement will be made in the Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2008-2009. Pending provision of such funds, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to incur the expenditure. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is requested to include the above expenditure while pending Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2008-09 proposals to Government in Finance Department without fail.

ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, sanction was accorded among others, to recruit 200 posts of specialist, doctors, comprising of obstetric and Gynecology specialists, paediatricians and Anaesthetists, for phase I, in 24 hours CEmONC hospitals. In the Government order second read above, sanction was also accorded among others for another 200 post of specialists doctors for phase II, in 24 hours CEmONC hospitals.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project further stated in the letter third read above that the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine who has been designated as recruitment authority for the above doctors, have conducted 5 sessions of counseling to recruit the above doctors since November 2006. However, only 168 out of the 400 posts could be filled up and even among the 168 doctors who were issued with the posting orders some doctors have left the service. The possibility of getting the remaining posts filled up by the appropriate specialist doctors is also minimal though that option is not given up. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that Since doctors are urgently required in the above hospitals, he requested the Government to permit the Director of Public Health and

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Preventive Medicine to recruit MBBS graduates through the employment exchange to fill up the vacancies mentioned in para 3 above subject to the following conditions

1. Women doctors with MBBS qualification will be recruited against DGO vacancies when DGO candidates are not available.
2. Doctors from either sex with MBBS qualification will be recruited against DCH and DA qualifications when DCH and DA qualified candidates are not available
3. The above MBBS graduates shall be provided with 3 months regular training in the required specialists by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
4. They shall work under the supervision and guidance of the qualified post graduate doctors in their places of posting.
5. The above doctors shall be shifted to other duties when qualified specialist doctors are available subsequently

3. In the reference 4th read above, the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has stated that so far, out of 400 posts sanctioned in CEmONC centres, 213 have been filled up. Similarly, out of 85 posts sanctioned in upgraded Primary Health Centres only 23 have been filled up. As such (187+62) 249 numbers of post are yet to be filled up totally both in CEmONC centres and in BEmONC centres. The Assistant Director of Professional and Employment Exchange, who has been addressed to sponsor further list of candidates has informed that the list of specialty doctors of DA / DGO / DCH have been exhausted and also certified that there is no other candidate available with him. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has therefore suggested that the vacancies may be filled up by making appointment of Assistant Surgeons through paper advertisement on walk in interview basis and also may be filled up from among the retired doctors from Paediatrics, Obstetrics and Anaesthesiology specialty with a consolidated pay as detailed below:

Diploma Holder :	Rs.20,000/-
PG Degree :	Rs.25,000/-

The General Surgeons with MS qualification may also be recruited for CEmONC and they can be trained in performing caesarian.

4. After detailed examination the Government have decided to accept the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Accordingly the Government permit the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine to recruit MBBS graduates through the Employment Exchange in the vacant specialist doctors for CEmONC hospitals subject to the following conditions:

1. Women doctors with MBBS qualification will be recruited against DGO vacancies when DGO candidates are not available.
2. Doctors from either sex with MBBS qualification will be recruited against DCH and DA qualifications when DCH and DA qualified candidates are not available

3. The above MBBS graduates shall be provided with 3 months regular training in the required specialists by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
4. They shall work under the supervision and guidance of the qualified post graduate doctors in their places of posting.
5. The above doctors shall be shifted to other duties when qualified specialist doctors are available subsequently.
