The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated in the letter second read above that the Mission Director, State Health Society, Chennai has pointed out that the National Rural Health Mission is the funding Agency for running the Emergency Ambulance Services and it would be appropriate that the Mission Director or a nominee of that society should be represented in the committee. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore requested the Government to issue necessary orders to include the Mission Director, State Health Society or the representative also as Member in the State Level Advisory Committee to monitor the functions of the Emergency Ambulance Services.

3. The Government after careful consideration, accept the request of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and decide to include the "Mission Director, State Health Society" in the State Level Advisory Committee of Emergency Management Service in lieu of "Special Secretary to Government, Health and Family Welfare Department". Accordingly, the Government reconstitutes the State Level Advisory Committee with the following members to monitor the functions of the Emergency Management Services:

### ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, sanction was accorded for a non recurring expenditure of Rs.2008.76/- lakh towards civil works and Rs.287/- lakh towards procurement, goods and hospital accessories (Rs.285 lakh for procurement of equipment and Rs.2.00 lakh towards advertisement) and a recurring expenditure of Rs.188.79 lakh towards salary for the temporary additional staff to be employed for the 15 secondary care hospitals as mentioned below:

- (i) Government Hospital, Chidambaram, Cuddalore District
- (ii) Government Hospital, Mannarkudi, Thiruvallur District
- (iii) Government Hospital, Kayalpattinam, Thoothukudi District
- (iv) Government Hospital, Mudukulathur, Ramanathapuram District
- (v) Government Hospital, Batlagundu, Dindigul District
- (vi) Government Hospital, Kothagiri, The Nilgiris District
- (vii) Government Hospital, Sathur, Virudhunagar District
- (viii) Government Hospital, Marakannam, Villupuram District
- (ix) Government Hospital, Ambasamudram, Tirunelveli District
- (x) Government Hospital, Podaturpet, Tiruvallur District
- (xi) Government Hospital, Srivaikundam, Thoothukudi District
- (xii) Government Hospital, Kalankudiyeruppu, Thoothukudi District
- (xiii) Government District Head Quarters Hospital, Tenkasi Tirunelveli District.
- (xiv) Government District Head Quarters Hospital, Usilampatti, Madurai District.
- (xv) Government District Head Quarters Hospital, Perambalur Perambalur, District.

Out of Rs.2008.76 lakh sanctioned towards civil works for the above 15 hospitals a sum of Rs.110.58 lakh was earmarked to the Government hospital Marakanam in Villupuram District to carry out the following civil works:

- (i) Repairs and Renovation to the existing buildings
- (ii) Out patient block
- (iii) General wards totaling 36 beds
- (iv) Bio Medical Waste Storage room
- (v) The civil works shall include provision of a patient counseling booth /cubicle and a blood storage room.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported in the letter second read above that the Government of Rajasthan, after the Tsunami disaster, had come forward to construct buildings in certain hospitals including the Government Hospital Marakanam, where the following works at a cost of Rs.190.00 lakh have been taken up.

1. Maternity Wing
2. Outpatient Wing
3. In patient Wards
4. Administrative Wing

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further reported that a team of officials from the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and the Public Works Department inspected the Government Hospital Marakanam and decided that the following civil works may alone be taken up at a cost of Rs.54.00 lakh including the cost of 40 KVA Generator.

1. Ambulance shed for two vehicles
2. Generator room with 40 KVA generator
3. Postmortem room
4. X-ray room
5. Kitchen with gas connection
6. Pay and use toilet
7. Repairs and renovation to the two existing buildings
  - a. Present Out Patient block
  - b. Present Operation Theatre block

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the cost of equipments and the additional staff sanctioned for the hospitals in the Government order first read above may be allowed as the Government of Rajasthan is not funding for equipment and staff.



3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee towards modification of civil works in the Government Hospital Marakkanam. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders amending the scope of civil works and cost of civil works as mentioned in column 8 in Annexure I of G.O. (Ms) No.25, Health and Family Welfare, dated 28.1.2008 by deleting the already sanctioned civil works and cost in respect of Government hospital Marakkanam, Villupuram District.

4. The Government after careful examination accept the proposal. Accordingly, the following amendments are issued to the Government order first read above.

(i) For the existing cost of civil works of "Rs.2008.76 lakh" occurring in paragraphs 5 and 8 of the said G.O. shall be substituted as "Rs.1952.18 lakh" (Rupees Nineteen crore fifty two lakh and eighteen thousand only).

(ii) The existing scope of civil works mentioned at Sl. No.8 in Annexure I to the G.O. first read above shall be substituted by the following civil works:

1. Ambulance shed for two vehicles
2. Generator room with 40 KVA generator
3. Postmortem room
4. X-ray room
5. Kitchen with gas connection
6. Pay and use toilet
7. Repairs and renovation to the two existing buildings
  - a. Present Out Patient block
  - b. Present Operation Theatre block

(iii) The existing cost of civil works mentioned at Sl. No.8 in Annexure I to the G.O. first read above shall be substituted by Rs.54.00 lakh (Rupees fifty four lakh only) including the cost of 40 KVA Generator.

(iv) For the existing total cost of "Rs.2008.76 lakh" towards civil works for all the 15 hospitals occurring in the Annexure I to the said G.O. shall be substituted as "Rs.1952.18 lakh".

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to include one 100 MA X-ray unit with accessories in the list of equipments to be supplied to Government Hospitals, Markkanam, sanctioned in the Government order first read above, without exceeding the total cost already sanctioned for equipments.

6. No change in the cost of equipment and additional staff as mentioned in the Annexure II and III of the said G.O.

7. This order issues with the concurrence of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. (Ms).No.28, Health and Family Welfare, dated 28.02.2005 and Finance Department vide its U.O. No. 39890 / Health I / 2008, dated 4.7.2008.

### **ORDER:**

In the Government order first read above, the Government accorded sanction for hiring of a consultancy firm to develop and implement web based Health Management Information Systems (HMIS) for all the secondary care hospitals in the State. Accordingly, M/S. Tata Consultancy Services has been contracted to develop the software and to implement HMIS which includes Hospital Management System (HMS) and Hospital Management Information System.

**2. Considering that the target area includes 270 Government Hospitals and 20 Primary Health Centers, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed that the implementation of HMIS may be done in three phases as follows:-**

#### **I. Pilot :**

- 5 hospitals in 3 districts (2+2+1)
- Office of the Joint Director of Health Services (JDHS) in 3 districts

At the institution level (hospital and PHC), a Hospital Management System (HMS) is being installed. This effort will involve procurement for

- a) Provision of LAN (cabling etc) within the selected hospitals in the district
- b) Computers with Peripherals (with UPS or Generator backup)
- c) Consumables
- d) Internet connectivity at Data Centre and Hospitals (as the application is a web-enabled application) with backup i.e broadband can be backed up by ISDN or normal dial up connection.
- e) Change Management Agencies
- f) Software and Tools to monitor Server performance, maintenance and security e.g. Firewall, Anti Virus etc.
- g) Training of health care providers

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that the pilot phase will cover 5 hospitals located in 3 districts along with the hardware needed for Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services. He has stated that the following activities have been taken up:

- a) Assessing the number of nodes and their placement has been completed.
- b) Assessing the LAN cabling that requires to be done and estimate preparation have been completed.
- c) As TNSWAN has been commissioned, all the above hospitals will be linked to TNSWAN from the last Point Of Presence (POP) incurring minimum expenditure to secure Internet connectivity. The connectivity arrangements will be carried out by BSNL. Initial discussions have already been held with BSNL and the nature of costs will vary for each hospital depending on the distance of the hospital from the last POP.

4. The Project Director Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee to procure hardware components, consumables and services as per the quantities worked out so as to ensure timely execution of the project and adequate time for handholding and change management. The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and provision of Rs.3,06,48,250/- in the Revised Estimate 2008-2009. The activity of establishment of web based Health Management Information System in all secondary care hospitals and some primary

health centres is an approved activity by the World Bank under component III, sub component 1(i) of the Project Implementation Plan and the expenditure involved is reimbursable by the World Bank.

5. The Government, after careful examination accept the proposal and thereby issue order: Permitting the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to establish the comprehensive web based Health Management Information Systems on pilot basis in 5 Secondary Care hospitals in Padmanabhapuram, Colachel, Tambaram, Sriperumbudur and Sholingur, in the Offices of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, Kancheepuram, Kanyakumari and Vellore, Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services.

6. The Government also sanction a sum of Rs.2,88,15,000/- (Rupees Two crore eighty eight lakh and fifteen thousand only), as detailed in the Annexure I to this order towards the procurement of computers with peripherals, LAN connectivity, connectivity to TNSWAN POP, Servers, advertisement cost and cost of computer furniture and a sum of Rs.18,33,250/- (Rupees Eighteen lakh thirty three thousand two hundred and fifty only), as detailed in Annexure II to this order, towards procurement of computer consumables and AMC for all hardware.

### ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government accorded sanction for contract appointment of four Bio Medical Engineers for procurement, installation and maintenance of equipments and to create a data base of equipments in all the 270 project hospitals.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in the letter second read above has stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had hired 4 Bio Medical Engineers and along with the already available lone Bio Medical Engineer and posted them in 5 different regions in Tamil Nadu namely Coimbatore, Salem, Trichy, Madurai and Chennai. Each Bio Medical Engineer was entrusted with the hospitals in about 6 districts in the region under his care. The duty chart of the Bio Medical Engineers has been worked out and is being implemented. The equipment maintenance routine as a system has now been established. The number of equipments out of order has also come down considerably. During the reviews it was noticed that there is a need for additional Bio Medical Engineers so that each Bio Medical Engineer will be incharge of equipment maintenance in the hospitals in three districts instead of being spread over six districts. Currently, the Biomedical Engineers have been unable to attend to all breakdown maintenance in their designated area as the distances and requests for rectification are quite distant as the districts are far apart. It is informed that the World Bank during its mid term review mission had also observed the same and

also had commended the performance of the Bio Medical Engineers. This is the first such initiative for a system based equipment maintenance programme in the state.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that it is proposed to create 5 temporary posts of Bio Medical Engineers in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to be filled up by contract appointment for a period of 2 years or as long as the project is in operation which ever is earlier. The terms and conditions of payment shall remain the same as in the initial batch that have been employed. It is proposed that each Bio Medical Engineer shall be paid Rs.15,000 per month as contract payment. It is also proposed to provide a budget @ Rs.7500 per month per Bio Medical Engineer towards travel and daily allowance; however actual expenditure would be reimbursed subject to a maximum of Rs.7500 per month. The Bio Medical Engineers will be stationed in five regions under the control of Joint Director of Health Services of the head quarters. The Bio Medical Engineer shall utilize the office facilities available with the District Project Management Unit of the head quarters to which he is attached. The Bio Medical Engineers shall be selected by calling for an interview through press advertisement. The qualification, salary and job description of the Bio Medical Engineers shall be as approved in the G.O. first read above. Each of the 5 Bio Medical Engineers who would be contracted as per this proposal will be posted to regions comprising of an average of three districts each and will be responsible for equipment installation, maintenance, maintenance of inventory and the duties mentioned in the job chart for Bio Medical Engineers in respect of all the hospitals within their respective regions.

4. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for appointment of five Bio Medical Engineers on contract basis. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal for appointment of five Bio Medical Engineers. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter and also provision funds of Rs.14.10 Lakh in Revised Estimate 2008-2009.

5. The Government, after careful examination of the proposal, accord sanction for creation of 5 temporary posts of Bio Medical Engineers on contract basis for the period of 2 years or till the end of project which ever is earlier for procurement, installation and maintenance of equipments in the project hospitals. The Bio Medical Engineers shall be paid a contract payment of Rs.15,000/- per month and a Travel and Stay expenditure subject to a maximum of Rs.7,500/- per month. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to appoint five Bio Medical Engineers as per the qualifications prescribed in the Government order first read above, on contract basis, by calling for applications by publishing an advertisement in the newspapers.





### ORDER:

The Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) in Tamil Nadu is less than 1 for thousand births which is much lower than most Indian States. However, in view of its strong commitment to ensure maternal survival and to lower maternal morbidity, the Government wishes to bring down the maternal mortality ratio rapidly. Over the years, a great deal has been done by the Government to improve maternal care. The State has the best antenatal care, among all states, in terms of reach and access by the poor. The State has also raised the proportion of institutional deliveries to 90% of all deliveries. Currently, 75% of all maternal deaths take place during the intra natal and postnatal periods, while 25% occur during the antenatal period. Data also indicate that about one fifth of all maternal deaths occur during the process of search and transit to an appropriate and affordable health facility, following the onset of an obstetric emergency. With this background, and knowing that the further reduction of maternal mortality ratio in the State depends crucially on provision of emergency obstetric services, the Government in the G.O. first read above had designated 62 hospitals in the year 2004 throughout the State as 24 hours Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New born Care (CEmONC) Centres. Along with these 62 centers, 4 major maternity centers in Chennai making a total of 66 centers are contributing to emergency obstetric care from the year 2004. In the year 2006-2007, the Government had assessed the need for further improvement of the scheme and designated in the G.O. second read above 32 more hospitals through out Tamil Nadu as CEmONC centers bringing it to a total of 98 centers. The functioning and usefulness of these CEmONC centers were deeply studied

and documented. The hospitals so designated were equipped with adequate qualified manpower and equipments to provide uninterrupted services round the clock. The medical and para medical personnel attached to these hospitals were made fully responsible and accountable to provide quality services. Special certification teams were formed to certify these centres as CEmONC centres. These CEmONC centres are providing useful emergency obstetric and new born care services to the public round the clock.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that while reviewing the maternal mortality it is learnt that further refinement and extension of CEmONC services to more hospitals will further improve the services and bring down maternal deaths and complications. Hence the Project Director has proposed to designate an additional 27 hospitals as CEmONC centres as Phase III activity in the provision of 24 hours comprehensive emergency obstetric and new born care (CEmONC) services by creating 108 temporary post of Assistant Surgeons @ 4 posts per hospital for 27 hospitals in the categories of Obstetrics and Gynaecology specialists, Paediatric Physicians and Anaesthetists under Rule 10 (a) (i) of Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Services Rules and 162 temporary post of Nurses on Contract basis and provision of equipments and goods.

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that as per CEmONC norms a total of 10 Specialists (4 OG Specialists, 4 Paediatricians and 2 Anaesthetists) are required for each hospital. However for phase III CEmONC centres which are comparatively smaller hospitals it is felt that at least 4 Specialists (2 OG Specialists, 1 Paediatrician and 1 Anaesthetist) over and above the existing doctors shall be sufficient and any requirement for additional load if any could be managed by deputation or additional sanction after careful assessment of the need. No new buildings are proposed for functioning as 24 hours CEmONC centers as sufficient buildings are provided under civil works component of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Requirement, if any, which may be suggested by the certification teams on minor modification, maintenance etc will be undertaken under funds to be provided under special repairs and maintenance head of Director of Medical and Rural Health Services budget for the year 2008-2009. Sufficient equipments have been provided under the equipment component of Tamil Nadu Health systems Project for these hospitals. However it is proposed that any requirement for maternity and child health services based on proper assessment shall be provided by the project. A blood bank or a blood storage room is available in each of these hospitals to enable functioning as effective 24 hours CEmONC centers. Out of 27 hospitals only 4 hospitals have a blood bank/blood storage room. It is proposed that one of the rooms in the new buildings to be constructed by Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in other hospitals shall be earmarked for a blood storage room.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further added that It is essential to have counseling services in the CEmONC hospitals to provide counseling for the antenatal and post natal mothers. Out of the 27 hospitals now

proposed as CEmONC centers phase III, 15 hospitals already have counseling services established under phase I activity by Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Hence, it is now proposed to establish counseling services round the clock by hiring the services of 36 counselors @ 3 counselors per hospital in the remaining 12 hospitals through reputed NGOs who are already offering these services in other hospitals in the district under Public Private Partnership mode. It is proposed that CEmONC sign boards and other signages for these 27 hospitals shall be ordered by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as per the designs to be prepared by the Health Promotion Cell in the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

5. The above proposal for posting Specialist Doctors and Nurses for CEmONC services in CEmONC hospitals on temporary basis and provision of hospital equipments are included in Sub Component 1 in Component I and Sub Component 2 in Component IV and respectively in the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) which has been approved by the World Bank. The non recurring expenditure and recurring expenditure involved in the proposal are Rs.289.52 lakh and Rs.306.14 lakh respectively, which are reimbursable by the World Bank. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested orders of the Government in the matter.

6 The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly, the Government designates an additional 27 Government hospitals, as indicated in the Annexure I to this order, as Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (CEmONC) Centres as a Phase III activity under the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in order to provide 24 hours CEmONC Services.

7 (i) Sanction is accorded for creation of 108 temporary posts of Assistant Surgeons @ 4 posts per hospital for 27 hospitals in the categories of O & G specialists, Paediatric Physicians and Anesthetists for remaining two years of project period to be filled up by recruiting doctors under Rule 10 (a) (i) of Tamil Nadu State and Subordinate Service Rules in the minimum time scale of Rs.8000 - 275 - 13500 and also accord a sum of Rs.2,23,70,000 (Rupees Two crores twenty three lakh seventy thousand only) as mentioned in Annexure III to this order to work in the CEmONC, Phase III hospitals @ 2 OG Specialists, 1 Paediatrician and 1 Anaesthetist to each of the hospitals.

(ii) Sanction is accorded for creation of 162 temporary posts of Nurses for remaining two years of project period on contract basis on consolidated pay of Rs.3,500/- per month during the first year, Rs.4,000/- per month during the second year to work in CEmONC hospitals @ 6 staff nurses to each of these 27 hospitals for 24 hours CEmONC services and sanction a sum of Rs.6,84,000/- (Rupees Sixty eight lakh four thousand only) as mentioned in Annexure III to this order.

(iii) Sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs.14,40,000 (Rupees Fourteen lakh forty thousand only) as detailed in the Annexure III to this order towards contract payment for Counsellors and NGO supervision charges through NGOs.

(iv) Sanction is accorded for a non recurring expenditure of Rs.2,89,52,000/- (Rupees Two crore eighty nine lakh and fifty two thousand only) towards provision of certification, sensitization workshop, equipment, training of counselors and sign boards and signages to the additional 27 CEmONC, Phase III Centres as detailed in the Annexure II to this order:

9 (i) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to recruit the required number of specialist Doctors consisting of 54 Obstetrics and Gynaecology specialists, 27 Paediatric physicians, 27 Anesthetists for the Phase III, 27 additional CEmONC hospitals through a committee headed by the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and the Director of Medical Education as members. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine is permitted to issue appointment orders and the Director of Medical and Rural Health services is permitted to issue posting orders to the doctors. The specialist doctors shall be selected by calling for list from the Professional Employment Exchange and by observing seniority and communal rotation. The doctors shall be recruited for the particular hospitals in the district, where these posts are created.

(ii) The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is directed to recruit 162 contract Nurses @ 6 nurses to each of the 27 hospitals, on contract payment of Rs.3500/- per month from the seniority list of Nurses by following communal rotation and issue posting orders to them to work in CEmONC hospitals exclusively for CEmONC services.

10 (i) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is authorized to allocate sufficient budget to the Joint Directors of Medical and Rural Health Services of the concerned districts where these doctors and nurses are to be posted for payment of the contract amount.

(ii) The Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and Family Welfare of the concerned districts are directed to send a monthly consolidated expenditure statement towards the salary for these doctors.

11. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is directed not to transfer the specialists doctors and nurses from the CEmONC hospitals to which they are posted, or to transfer them to another CEmONC hospital only after obtaining the orders of the Government with the recommendation by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project when circumstances demand such transfers.

12 (i) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to procure the equipments as per the requirement to be given by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. The expenditure towards equipments and advertisement sanctioned in para 7 (iv) above shall not be paid in cash but credited to the following head of account: "K. Deposits and advances (b) Deposits not bearing interest - 8443.00, Civil Deposits - 800, Other Deposits - CE - Deposits of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited. (DPC

8443 008 00 CE 000H Receipts) by a crossed cheque in favour of the Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation.

(ii) The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation is permitted to incur the expenditure sanctioned in para 7 (iv) above towards to procurement of the equipments and for advertisement as per the detailed specifications furnished by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project by following World Bank procurement procedures and supply the same to the Superintendents / Chief Medical Officers of 27 additional CEmONC Hospitals and to settle the account with Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project after the equipment have been supplied.

(iii) The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation is directed to send periodical progress reports to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to prepare the consolidated statement of expenditure.

13. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to arrange the certification process for the certification of 27 additional CEmONC, Phase III hospitals within the cost sanctioned through the Professors from Medical Colleges and State and District level officials as per the established procedures for certification of CEmONC centres.

14. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to conduct a sensitization workshop for the Chief Medical Officers of 27 additional hospitals designated as CEmONC, Phase III hospitals.

15. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to establish counseling services @ 3 counselors per hospital to provide counseling services round the clock in 12 hospitals as mentioned in the Annexure IV to this order through the NGOs who have been selected by the District Project Management Committees headed by the District Collector who have already established CEmONC counseling services in the districts under the project and to incur the expenditure.

16. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to conduct training programme for the counselors.

17. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to draw the amount in advance sanctioned towards conduct of certification of CEmONC centres, sensitization workshop for Chief Medical Officers and training of counselors and adjust the same after the activities are over.

18. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is authorized to reallocate the non recurring expenditure within the activities without exceeding the total cost sanctioned.

19. Necessary additional funds over and above Budget Estimate 2008-09 towards signboards, advertisement and payment to counselors will be provided in Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2008-2009. Pending provision of such funds, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to incur the expenditure. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is requested to include the above expenditure while sending Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2008-2009 proposals to Government in Finance Department without fail.

### ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government accorded sanction for hiring of a consultancy firm to develop and implement web based Health Management Information Systems (HMIS) for all the secondary care hospitals in the State at a total cost of Rs.500 lakh. Accordingly, M/S. Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) has been contracted to develop the software and to implement Hospital Management Information System which includes Hospital Management System (HMS) and Hospital Management Information System.

2. Considering that the target area includes 270 Government Hospitals and 20 Primary Health Centers, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has proposed in the letter second read above that the implementation of Hospital Management Information System may be done in three phases as follows:-

- I. Pilot :
  - 5 hospitals in 3 districts (2+2+1)
  - Office of the Joint Director of Health Services (JDHS) in 3 districts
  - Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (Location for Development and testing of software)
  - Director of Medical and Rural Health Services Office (for Monitoring and early acceptance of the system)

## II. Phase I

- 5 districts – 36 hospitals – (in Phase I Districts where civil works have been completed)
- 1 computer with accessories for all Hospitals (excluding 41 hospitals that are otherwise being covered) to make the Hospital Management Information System or Hospital Management System functional as a grid through all Government Hospitals
- All Offices of Joint Director of Health Services
- 5 PHCs (in the selected districts)

## III. Phase II

- 24 districts – 230 hospitals (HMS)
- 15 PHCs (in the selected districts)

3 (i). The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that the Health Management System is at the institution level (hospital and PHC). This effort will involve procurement for

- a) Provision of LAN (cabling etc) within the selected hospitals in the district
- b) Computers with Peripherals (with UPS or Generator backup)
- c) Consumables
- d) Internet connectivity at Data Centre and Hospitals (as the application is a web-enabled application) with backup i.e. broadband can be backed up by ISDN or normal dial up connection
- e) Change Management Agencies
- f) Software and Tools to monitor Server performance, maintenance and security e.g. Firewall, Anti Virus etc.

(ii). The Health Management Information System application (which is web-based) will network all the hospitals (270) and the PHC's – initially 20 in number (Later, all PHC's will be provided with the same application but that is outside the scope of this Project.) To facilitate, there are other aspects of the procurement and infrastructure required such as:

- a) Data Center with all required facilities (Power backup and adequate environment control) to house the servers. (the ELCOT data center is suitable for this and has already been inspected)
- b) Double back-up for Internet connectivity at each hospital
- c) Infrastructure requirements for the Administrator and the team + Monitoring and Evaluation Cell (M & E cell)

The phased deployment coupled with the unique and specialized nature of each activity will determine the procurement procedure. With this background, the procurement plan is detailed below:

This phase is planned for thirty six hospitals – All five districts that formed part of phase 1 of civil works are to be included in phase 1. The civil works have been completed in several hospitals and are nearing completion in others and the infrastructure can be cabled, 5 JDHS Offices are being included in this phase.

- a) Assessing the nodes required and their placement will be completed within the deadlines listed in the Activity Chart.
- b) An assessment of the LAN cabling that requires to be done in each hospital and estimates (with Bill of Materials) will be prepared. Deadlines listed in the Roll-out plan will be adhered to.
- c) As Tamil Nadu State Wide Area Network (TNSWAN) has been commissioned – all the above hospitals will be linked to TNSWAN from the last Point of Presence (POP) incurring minimum expenditure to secure Internet connectivity. The connectivity work will be carried out by BSNL. Initial discussions have already been held with BSNL and the quantum of costs will vary for each hospital. The work on securing Internet connectivity will begin from the pilot phase itself. Additionally, V-Sat provision is being considered and initial discussions have been held so as to ensure that Internet connectivity is not disturbed and there is the definite possibility of back-up.

4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that the Software Requirement specifications have been worked out and signed with TCS, that TCS has now completed preparation of OP Registration module, IP Registration module and casualty Registration module, that the User Acceptance testing has been completed and that these applications are now being implemented in the pilot hospitals from the beginning of May, 2006.

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has also informed that each district will benefit from a Change Management Agency that will manage change within the hospital scenario. The purpose of this arrangement is to ensure that the changes in style of functioning are done in such a manner that are learnt and found acceptable to all the staff in the hospitals concerned. It is important to underline the fact that this is a new initiative to ensure that acceptance is guaranteed within the hospital. That the change management agency will play a key role in training of health care providers and actively involve themselves in health functionaries being accustomed to computers. The Change Management Agency will be hired by following the World Bank procurement procedures by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project for the pilot.

6. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed to procure the hardware components, consumables and services as per the quantity worked out following approved World Bank procurement procedures at a non recurring expenditure of Rs.5,01,84,000/- and a recurring expenditure of Rs.43,29,850/-.

7. The activity of establishment of web based Health Management Information System in all secondary care hospitals and some Primary Health Centres is an approved activity by the World Bank and included in Component III subcomponent 1 (i) in the project implementation plan. The expenditure involved in this proposals is reimbursable by the World Bank

8. The Project Director Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has therefore placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee to procure hardware components, consumables and services as per the quantities worked out so as to ensure timely execution of the project and adequate time for handholding and change management for implementation of phase I of Health Management Information Systems. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

9. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and have decided to accept it. Accordingly the Government issue the following orders:

(i) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to implement Phase I of the comprehensive web based Health Management Information Systems in 36 hospitals in 5 districts, 5 PHCs, as detailed in the Annexure I to this order and in 26 office of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services except the office of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, Kancheepuram, Kanyakumari and Vellore,

(ii) Sanction is accorded for incurring a non recurring expenditure of Rs.5,01,84,000/- (Rupees Five crore one lakh and eighty four thousand only), and an annual recurring expenditure of Rs.43,29,850/- (Rupees Forty three lakh twenty nine thousand and eight hundred and fifty only), as detailed in the Annexure II to this order towards establishment of comprehensive web based Health Management Information System in secondary care hospitals and 20 designated PHCs.

10. The expenditure sanctioned in para 9 (ii) above, shall be debited to the following head of account:

**ORDER:**

In the Government order first read above the Government sanctioned the establishment of Mobile out Reach Health Services in 12 tribal areas in 10 districts. The Mobile out Reach Health Team consists of one Medical Officer, one Staff Nurse, one Lab Technician, one Auxiliary Nurse and Midwife and one Driver. Subsequently, the Government have announced that a new Medical College would be started in Sivagangai from the next academic year. In view of the above announcement, it has been decided not to take up the Civil Works, provision of Equipments and employment of staff in the above hospital.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has, therefore, placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for deleting the above items from the Government order already issued. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue necessary amendments to the orders already issued.

### ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the Government ordered the implementation of the clinic based pilot programme on prevention and control of Cardio Vascular Diseases in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts. The programme is being implemented in 80 Primary Health Centres and 18 Government Hospitals in both the districts. Staff Nurses and Counselors have been appointed in these centres. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that even though the doctors working in the centres were provided orientation training, many of them have been transferred and new doctors have come in. New counselors were also posted in the place of counselors who have left. He has also stated that based on the experience, certain minor changes have been made in the treatment protocol and that there is a need for a re-orientation training for the staff working in the centres.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee for strengthening of the ongoing pilot programme by provision of re-ordination training for Doctors, Nurses and Counsellors involved in the pilot programme in the two districts, regular periodical monitoring of the programme in the field by officials from the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, monthly review of the programme with the field functionaries and strengthening monitoring of the performance of the Counselors. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in this matter.

3. The above activity is included under component II sub component.2 in the Project Implementation Plan approved by the World Bank.

4. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for incurring an recurring expenditure of Rs.5,24,600/- (Rupees five lakh twenty four thousand and six

He has also stated that the counseling materials will be obtained from organizations like WHO, UNICEF, etc., and also developed in house by the Health Promotion Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter. The above proposal is an approved activity of the World Bank and is included in Component I, Sub Component 3 in the Project Implementation Plan.

3. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.12.00 lakh (Rupees twelve lakh only), towards the cost of counseling materials in the form of Charts, posters, booklets, etc., to the patient counseling centres established by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The counseling materials shall be procured from organizations like WHO, UNICEF, etc., and also developed in house by the Health Promotion Cell of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

#### ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the Hospital Maintenance Fund has been created to enable the hospital authorities to undertake repairs and maintenance of hospital buildings and equipments and replacement of tube lights, fans, furniture, toilet facilities etc. and similar purposes relating to the up keep and maintenance of hospital and its premises. The fund should not be utilized for salaries and allowances / purchase of vehicles, (other than ambulances) fuel and similar purposes. The fund has been created out of receipts from the following sources.

1. Donations from public, well to do patients, students and voluntary collections from public
2. Donations from philanthropists
3. Grant from Government and voluntary agencies for this specific purpose
4. Any other source permitted by the Government

The receipt towards the fund must be deposited into separate bank accounts in a nearby nationalized bank. The account shall be in the name of "Hospital Maintenance Fund" and shall be operated jointly by the Deans/Superintendent / Chief Medical Officers of the hospital and the Administrative Officer. The accounts of the fund are liable to audit by both the internal audit and by the Accountant General.

2. Under this fund expenditure on civil and electrical works, maintenance and repairs of equipments and purchase of certain other items were also permitted not exceeding Rs.50,000/- at a time. Inspite of the flexibility available for incurring expenditure under the Hospital Maintenance Fund, many of the Chief Medical Officers

have been unable to spend the money due to apprehensions on the possible audit caused by lack of total clarity on procedures causing unnecessary locking up of Government funds. On investigation, it was found that most doctors fear audit objections and were not prepared to spend the amount.

3. In the meanwhile, National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) came into existence in this State from 2006-2007. In the Government Order 4<sup>th</sup> read above, Government approved the setting up of Patient Welfare Society for the Government Taluk / Non - Taluk hospitals under the National Rural Health Mission. The Patient Welfare Society is functioning in Society mode. Instructions for the operation of funds and procurement of items are clear under the Patient Welfare Society and the activities including the expenditure are periodically monitored by the District Collector.

4. Since the Patient Welfare Society has been functioning effectively the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee to merge the Hospital Maintenance Fund being operated in District Head Quarters Hospitals, Taluk Hospitals and Non- Taluk Hospitals with the Patient Welfare Society established in these hospitals so that the activities permitted under the Hospital Maintenance Fund may be carried out by the Patient Welfare Society. He has also proposed to close the Bank Accounts opened under the Hospital Maintenance Fund and to transfer the balance to the Patient Welfare Society accounts. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal subject to the modification that the Hospital Maintenance Fund may be accessed for funds required by the Patient Welfare Society as long as the Patient Welfare Society continues to be administered by Government officials. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

5. The Government after careful consideration, direct that the Hospital Maintenance Fund being operated in the District Head Quarters Hospital, Taluk Hospitals and Non Taluk Hospitals shall be accessed for funds required by the Patient Welfare Society as long as the Patient Welfare Society continues to be administered by Government officials. These orders shall take effect from the date of issue.



The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society in the reference read above has stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society is implementing a district wide comprehensive Cervical Cancer Screening pilot in Theni and Thanjavur districts for the past one year, that the pilot is progressing as per the plan and that the forms, registers, referral slips, etc., supplied during the initial stage of the pilot are getting exhausted due to large scale turn out of beneficiaries. The Project Director has proposed to provide the required form, registers, referral slips, etc., to keep the pilot going without any problem. The above proposal is an approved activity of the World Bank and the non - recurring expenditure involved in the proposal is reimbursable by the World Bank.
