## ABSTRACT

Rural Health Mission - State Health Society, Tamil Nadu - Strengthening of Dental Services in 22 Non-Taluk Hospitals and 43 upgraded Primary Health Centres - Sanctioned - Orders - Issued.

## ORDER:

Regular School Health Programmes in the State have reported 45% of Children with dental problem Caries tooth, Gingivitis, Dental Mottling, Impacted Tooth, Non Eruption of Tooth etc. are few of the problems faced by the Children. The District Headquarters and Taluk Hospitals are functioning as referral Centres for these identified cases. But not all Hospitals have fully functional dental wing as per Indian Public Health Standard. The dental wing has to be strengthened with infrastructure including manpower in the established First Referral Units. Hence the proposal for strengthening of dental services in First Referral Units has been included in the National Rural Health Mission Programme Implementation Plan 2008-09 by appointing the Dental Surgeons on contract basis in 65 First Referral Units in the existing Dental Clinics. The above proposal has been approved by the National Programme Co-ordination Committee of National Rural Health Mission.

2. Meanwhile, the posts of Dental Surgeons in the Dental Clinics have been filled by the Government through regular recruitment of Dental Surgeon by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. It has been identified that dental caries is one of the most prevalent causes of morbidity in the rural public and dental services are one of the optional outpatient services to be provided at the 30 bedded Community Health Centre/Hospital level as per IPH standards. Hence, it is proposed to provide Dental services to the 22 Non Taluk Hospitals with more than 30 beds as well as 43 upgraded Primary Health Centres based on outpatient strength and need by engaging contract Dental Surgeons. The Dental Surgeon will be appointed on contract basis at Rs:500/- per session for six session per week and the Dental Assistant will be appointed on contract

basis at Rs.250/- per session. The recurring and non-recurring expenditures involved in these proposals are as follows:-

- 3. The Dental Surgeons and Dental Assistants will be conducting the dental clinics in the 22 Non Taluk Hospitals and selected 43 upgraded Primary Health Centres from Monday to Thursday during the morning OP and on Friday and Saturday between 2.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m. timely to attend to children referred from the school health programme. The Project will be monitored every month by local Deputy Director of Health Services in respect of upgraded Primary Health and Centres and Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services inrespect of Non-Taluk Hospitals and every month by State Health Society. The Project will be evaluated by a team of Senior Dental Surgeons. It will be continued by the State Government.
- 4. The Mission Director, State Health Mission has informed that the above proposal has been placed in the 5<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting of State Health

1434

Society held on 29.9.2008 and the same has been approved. The Mission Director has requested the Government to issue orders for strengthening of dental services in 22 Non-Taluk Hospitals and 43 upgraded Primary Health Centres.

- 5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Mission Director, State Health Mission and decided to accept the same. Accordingly, the following orders are issued:-
  - (i) Permission is accorded to strengthen the Dental Services in 22 Non-Taluk Hospitals and 43 upgraded Primary Health Centres indicated in the Annexure-I and II to this order at a total cost of Rs.275.60 lakhs. The expenditure shall be met from the National Rural Health Mission funds.
    - (ii) Sanction is accorded to appoint one Dental Surgeon for each of the 22 Non-Taluk Hospitals and 43 upgraded Primary Health and Centres on contract basis for a period of one year at Rs.500 per session (3 hrs per session) for six sessions per week.
    - (iii) Sanction is also accorded to appoint one Dental Assistant (to assist Dental Surgeon) for each of the 22 Non-Taluk Hospitals and 43 upgraded Primary Health and Centres on contract basis for a period of one year at Rs.250/per session for six sessions per week.
    - (iv) The remuneration to the Dental Surgeon and Dental Assistant should be disbursed through the Patient Welfare Society of the respective Non Taluk Hospitals and Upgraded Primary Health and Centres.
    - (v) The Non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 1.78 lakhs per institution towards Dental chair and accessories should be transferred to Personal Deposit account of the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation for procurement of the equipments. The Mission Director, State Health Society shall transfer the amount of Rs.115.70 lakhs towards procurement of Dental Chairs to the Personal Deposit Account of the Mission Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation.
- 6. The Mission Director, State Health Mission is authorized to draw the funds sanctioned in para 5 above and credit it to the Personal Deposit Account of the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. The amount shall not be paid in cash but credited in the following head of account:

"K. Deposit and Advances (B) Deposit not bearing interest – 8443.00. Civil Deposits – 800. Other Deposits – CE. Deposits of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. (DPC: 8443 00 800 CE 00 0H (Receipts)".

by means of cheque drawn in favour of Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited.

The installation of the equipment shall be done by the respective Hospitals / Primary Health Centres.



ORDER:-

The Governor of Tamil Nadu in his address in the Legislative Assembly on 21.1.09 has made the following announcement:

"A new scheme called 'Chief Minister's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments' will be launched this year to ensure that such poor and low income groups who cannot afford costly treatment, are able to get free treatment in Government as well as private hospitals for such serious ailments. Under this scheme, each beneficiary family will be insured for availing free treatment up to Rs. 1 lakh. The Government will bear the entire premium for this purpose. About one crore poor families in the State will benefit from this revolutionary scheme".

2. The Government of Tamil Nadu is committed to provide quality health care to all the people. In Tamil Nadu all the three levels of care namely Primary, Secondary and Tertiary Health Care are provided free of cost to the poor people. Tamil Nadu has made significant progress in the reduction of Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR), Birth Rate and Death Rate. Life Expectancy at Birth has increased to 65.4 mainly due to the provision of good health care and other social welfare assistance. In Tamil Nadu, health services are delivered free of cost to the poor through a network of 8704 Health Sub Centres (HSCs), 1422 Primary Health Centres (PHCs), 235 Taluk / Non taluk Hospitals, 29 District Headquarters Hospitals and 15 Government Medical College Hospitals. People working in organized sector are covered through a network of ESI Dispensary and Hospitals. In addition to these services, financial assistance is provided to the needy people through the 'State Illness Society' for ailments like Heart Diseases, Cancer and certain other conditions. Despite the availability of huge network of Government Health Facilities with an annual budget allocation of Rs.2800 crores, poor people frequently approach the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Ministers, MPs, MLAs and District Collectors seeking assistance for medical or surgical treatment in the Private Hospitals as services for major ailments are either not adequately available in all the Government Institutions or available only in a few centres in Chennai, Madurai and Coimbatore or the demand is more. The poor and downtrodden still have to access private hospitals for serious illnesses like Cancer, Heart Diseases, Kidney failure, Spinal problems and life threatening accidents. Considering the above situations a



new scheme "Chief Minister's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments" has been announced in the Governor's address for poor and low income groups who cannot afford costly treatment in private hospitals.

- 3. The Government issue the following orders:-
- (i) Government approve the Chief Minister's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments for the benefit of poor people.
- (ii) The scheme will be operated through an approved insurance company which should be selected by calling Open Tender following the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tenders Act and the rules made there under. Only those health Insurance companies which are approved by the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority (IRDA) for providing health insurance shall be permitted to participate in the Tender.
- (iii) The Government constitute a State Empowered Committee, Chaired by the Chief Secretary to Government of Tamil Nadu with the following members to approve the Tender and to review the implementation of the Insurance Scheme periodically and to provide operational guidelines for the scheme whenever required:-

(iv) The State Health Society is designated as the implementing agency for this scheme. The Executive Secretary of State Health Society (Mission Director, State Health Society) is authorised to float the tender for the selection of the Insurance Company to implement the scheme. She will scrutinize the Tender documents and put up to State Empowered Committee for approval of Tender. 4



- (v) The taluk and district hospitals in this State provide emergency and elective services to majority of the ailments. Hence, it has been decided to cover those diseases which may not be adequately covered by the services at the district level and those which involve a substantial waiting list related delay at the tertiary institutions, under this scheme. The list of 51 diseases identified for availing the financial assistance under the insurance scheme is given in the Annexure to this order. The pre existing ailments will also be covered.
- (vi) The entire premium will be paid by the Government to the Insurance Company on behalf of the beneficiaries. Under this scheme, each beneficiary family will be insured for availing free treatment up to Rs. one lakh in a block period of four years.
- (vii) 75 lakhs of families who are given identity cards under Tamil Nadu Agricultural Labourers Farmers (Social Security and Welfare) Scheme, 2006 and 35 lakhs Members registered in the Tamil Nadu Manual Workers Welfare Board and 11 other Welfare Boards, Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board and various Unorganised Labour Welfare Boards will be included as eligible beneficiaries under this scheme. In addition to them, any family, whose annual income is less than Rs.24,000/- per annum as certified by the Village Administrative Officer, will be enrolled as Members under the scheme.
- (viii) The Insurance Company approved by the Government to implement this Insurance Scheme shall do the Empanelment of Hospitals by following the standard prescribed for the hospitals with regard to the availability of physical facilities, equipments for diagnoses / treatment and the qualified specialists and other staff for the diseases identified for the assistance.
- (ix) Government Hospitals having pay wards can also apply for the empanelment and they may also be entitled to claim the amount from insurance company for the listed conditions for patients admitted in the pay wards. The fund claimed from the insurance company shall be deposited in the Hospital Patient Welfare Society and utilised for the development of the institution as per the Patient Welfare Society guidelines.
- (x) Sanction is accorded to a sum of Rs.200 crores (Rupees Two hundred crores only) towards payment of premium to the Insurance Company for implementation of the scheme during the current year 2009.

  Necessary funds of Rs. 50 crores (Rupees Fifty crores only) will be provided in Final Supplementary Estimates 2008-09. The balance amount of Rs.150 crores (Rupees One hundred and fifty crores only) will be provided in Budget Estimate 2009-10.

## ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that Tamil Nadu has been proactively introducing various health care initiatives in the last few decades. Maternal mortality being one of the important areas, it was observed that an expectant mother, when in labour, sometimes needs to visit two to three health facilities before she finally reaches a hospital where Blood Bank, Operation Theater, Specialist Doctors and other emergency facilities are available. Much time is lost by then and all clinical parameters turned unfavourable. Tamil Nadu wanted to deal with such lacunae in the public health care system. Introduction of 24 hours Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care (CEmONC) Services was started by the Government in 66 centres in 2004. These centres were located in 2 to 3 hospitals in each of the districts throughout Tamil Nadu which is a land mark step in improving Obstetric care and bringing down maternal and infant mortality and an increase in institutional deliveries in general and Cesarean Operations in particular.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had strengthened these services by provision of additional buildings, equipments and staff for these hospitals. During Phase II of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, another batch of 32 hospitals have been designated as CEmONC centres, thereby any pregnant woman in Tamil Nadu can reach one of these centres within a period of 1 hour and can get guaranteed emergency Obstetric care.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the project is interested in documenting care provisions as a "Global Best Practice Document" to address the following issues:
  - i. Why have these initiatives worked so well in Tamil Nadu?
    - ii. What are the transformations in the last 20 years that have made hospital initiatives the norm, in remote areas?

- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 24.03.2009 for documentation of CemONC Services in Tamil Nadu as a "Global Best Practice Document" by hiring the services of a firm having expertise in documentation and for sanction an amount of Rs.9.50 lakhs. The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter. Documentation of CemONC services is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank.
- 5. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.9.50 lakhs (Rupees nine lakhs and fifty thousand only) as detailed below towards documentation of CEmONC services being implementated in Tamil Nadu as a "Global Best Practice Document" by hiring the services of a consultant firm having expertise in documentation. The duration of consultancy shall be for a period of 4 months.

## ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the Government ordered complete revision of the Tamil Nadu Medical Code and permitted the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to contract certain officials to carry out the revision within a period of one year. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that the Medical Code Revision Cell was formed in the Project Management Unit of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and the revision work has commenced in April 2007 and that as the revision of the Medical Code involves collection of several particulars, Government Orders, opinions on various issues from various Heads of Departments, the work could not be completed within the period of one year. Hence, a proposal was submitted to the State Empowered Committee to extend the period allotted for revision of Medical Code for a further period of one year from 09.04.2008 so as to update the code as on 31.12.2008 and to continue to utilize the services of the contract officials for this purpose. The State Empowered Committee had approved the proposal and the Government had issued orders in the reference 2nd read above extending the period by one year from 09.04,2008. The work of revision of Medical Code is an approved activity by the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has reported that certain portions of the Medical Code needs further revision, that the opinions from Heads of Departments on certain subjects are yet to be compiled and that the revised portions and the deleted portions of the Medical Code need to be approved by the Government before publication. He has therefore placed a proposal for extension of time limit by a further period of 6 months upto 30.09.2009 to complete the work of revision of Medical Code before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 24.03.2009. 

## ORDER:

In the G.O. first read above among others orders were issued sanctioning recurring expenditure Rs.3602.85 lakhs towards establishment of 24 hours emergency management services to be operated through the EMRI for the financial year 2008 - 2009.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in the reference second read above has stated that the TN EMRI has submitted a proposal for sanction of Rs.1329.66 lakhs including bills on hand for quarter IV of the year (January 2009 to March 2009) with breakup details of budget and actuals (both physical and financial) for quarter III including the proposed budget for quarter IV. The Project Director has also stated that the request of TN-EMRI for release of funds for quarter IV had been reviewed and it was observed that certain line items of expenditure requested by them vary from the original sanctioned amount, without exceeding the overall sanctioned amount of Rs.3602.85 lakhs. It is therefore necessary to revise the amount already sanctioned. The Project Director has further stated that the reasons for decrease / increase in recurring cost and non recurring cost is number of ambulances put into operation, fuel cost, personnel cost, medical consumable cost, administrative cost and ambulance modification cost etc,
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has circulated the above proposal to the State Empowered Committee of the Society for its approval. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal subject to the condition that while on account payment may be made based on claims based on actual expenditure incurred capped by approved rates in the contract, final payment shall be made with reference to internal audit recommendations.
- 4. The Project Director has therefore requested the Government to issue an amendment to G.O. Ms. No.137, Health and Family Welfare, dated 5.5.2008, 56 that the

original sanctioned amount Rs.3602.85 lakhs towards provision of Emergency Management Services to be operated through TN - EMRI for the financial year 2008 - 09 be revised to Rs.2929.66 lakhs. He has also requested that the Executive Committee of the State Health Mission may be empowered to approve the modification of the amount, if any within the existing overall sanctioned amount.

5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and decided to accept it. Accordingly, the following amendment is issued to G.O. Ms. No.137, Health and Family Welfare, dated 5.5.2008.

## **AMENDMENT**

The existing para 13 of G.O. (Ms) No. 137, Health and Family Welfare, dated 05.05.2008 shall be substituted with the following para as para 13.

- 13. Sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs.2,929.66 lakhs (Rupees Two thousand nine hundred and twenty nine lakhs and sixty six thousands only) towards establishment of 24 hours Emergency Management Services for the year 2008-2009. The projected recurring expenditure for the year 2008 09 is Rs.1,338.89 lakhs (Rupees One thousand three hundred and thirty eight lakhs and eighty nine thousands only) and the non-recurring expenditure for the year 2008 09 is Rs.1,590.77 lakhs (Rupees One thousand five hundred and ninety lakhs and seventy seven thousands only). A detailed break up of expenditure is given in the Annexure to this order.
- a. The recurring expenditure of Rs.1,338.89 lakhs (Rupees One thousand three hundred and thirty eight lakhs and eighty nine thousand only) is sanctioned for operating 198 ambulances and the expenditure shall increase corresponding to the increased number of ambulances.
- b. The central control room expenditure of Rs.258.78 lakhs (Rupees Two hundred fifty eight lakhs and seventy eight thousands only) is mainly related to procurement and installation of equipment, which will be permanent assets and will be moved from the temporary call centre to the permanent premises when constructed.
- c. The non recurring expenditure of Rs.822.32 lakhs (Rupees Eight hundred twenty two lakhs and thirty two thousands only) for refurbishing of ambulances is mainly meant for air-conditioning of the 198 new ambulances to be provided by the Government and to include certain additional equipments and modifications to the ambulances for picking up the patients in emergencies and to transport them to the hospitals with proper first aid and emergency management. When additional ambulances are handed over to the Emergency Management Research institute the corresponding expenditure will increase accordingly.
- d. The emergency response centre cost of Rs.509.67 lakhs (Rupees Five hundred nine lakhs and sixty seven thousands only) is for modification of temporary premises which includes renovation and infrastructure development and to establish the

permanent site and infrastructure to run the entire operations of Emergency Management Services (EMS).

Another pilot is for prevention and treatment of Cervical Cancer being conducted in Theni and Thanjavur districts. These pilots are being conducted for the last 18 months and will end by December 2009:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has also stated that before starting the pilot, a detailed base line survey was conducted on Cardio Vascular Diseases in four districts namely Villupuram, Theni, Virudhunagar and Sivagangai during the year 2005-2006 covering the following objectives
  - To estimate the prevalence of risk factors for cardiovascular disease and Type 2
    Diabetes Mellitus (T2DM) in the urban and rural population of four districts in
    Tamil Nadu.
  - ii. To identify the needs and the capacity of the health care infrastructure for prevention of CVD; to investigate the feasibility of integrating CVD surveillance and health promotion activities, as well as CVD risk reduction activities within the existing infrastructure of health care, in public as well as private health systems
  - iii. To evaluate the impact of such a CVD risk reduction programme on the knowledge, attitudes and practices of the community, patients, health care providers and administrators, and policy makers.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has further stated that the project has detailed interventions in Virudhunagar and Sivagangai districts for prevention and treatment of Cardio Vascular Diseases and detailed interventions in

The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.27.10/-lakhs (Rupees twnety seven lakhs and ten thousand only) as detailed in the Annexue to this order towards hiring the services of the consultants for conducting an end line survey for assessment of awareness regarding risk factors leading to Cardio Vascular Diseases in Villupuram, Theni, Virudhunagar and Sivaganga districts and knolwledge and behaviours for Cancer Cervix in Theni and Thanajvur districts.

This will be cross sectional community based observational study. The sampling technique will be multi stage random sampling within the administrative units of Urban-/ Rural areas. The design will be same as selected for the base line study.





#### ORDER:

In the Government order first read above, the Government accorded sanction for hiring of a consultancy firm to develop and implement web based Hospital Management Information System (HMIS) for all secondary care hospitals in the State. Accordingly, M/s. Tata Consultancy Services has been contracted to develop the software and to implement HMIS which includes Hospital Management System (HMS) and patients electronic medical records.

- 2. In the Government order second read above, the Government permitted the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to implement Phase I of the comprehensive web based HMIS in 36 hospitals in 5 districts, 5 PHCs and in 26 offices of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services except the office of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, Kancheepuram, Kannyakumari and Vellore. The Government also sanctioned a non recurring expenditure of Rs. 5,01,84,000/- towards purchase of the following equipments and other related activities.
  - i. Computers with peripherals
  - ii. LAN connectivity
  - iii. Connectivity to TNSWAN POP
  - iv. Computer furniture
  - v. Computer consumables

- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has stated that the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation had floated tenders for procurement of the equipments sanctioned in the Government Order and that there is difference in the value of lowest bid and the amount sanctioned in the Government Order second read above, in respect of purchase of computers, Low end UPS and Online UPS. He has, therefore, requested to sanction an additional amount of Rs.2,39,91,800/- to meet the increase in cost.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has further stated that in addition to the above, the scope of the phase I HMIS has been slightly broadened to include 7 hospitals which are being prepared for getting accreditation through National Accreditation Board for Hospitals which is an unit of Quality Council of India and that 105 additional computers are required for these hospitals. He has also stated that on piloting the HMIS in hospitals, 250 more computers are required to provide efficient service to the patients. He has also stated that an additional amount of Rs.20.00 lakhs is required to carry out, additional LAN Cabling in 5 hospitals in pilot districts, 43 hospitals in Phase I districts and their controlling offices due to the provision of additional computers. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has therefore requested to sanction of Rs.1,07,35,130/- for procurement of these additional items.
- 5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has therefore, circulated a proposal to the State Empowered Committee for sanction of Rs.347.28 lakhs to meet the additional requirment of funds towards implementation of HMIS pilot and Phase I. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.
- 6. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for incurring an additional expenditure of Rs. 2,39,91,800/- (Rupees two crores thirty nine lakhs ninety one thousand and eight hundred only), over and above the amount sanctioned in the Government Order second read above, to meet the additional expenditure relating to the procurement of Computers, Low end UPS and Online UPS as detailed in the annexure to this order.

From the Mission Director, State Health Society, Letter No. 3312/P/SHS/08 dated 24.2.2009.

#### ORDER:

The First Referral Units (FRUs) from Primary Health Centres to Secondary Level Health care whether it is District Headquarters, Taluk Hospital or Non-Taluk Hospital are a weak link in the Health Systems. For strengthening the First Referral Units in Tamil Nadu, Rs.55.7 crores was approved by National Programme Coordination Committee for the year 2008-09. This proposal was intended to cover the gaps in smaller non CEmONC institutions which form the weak link of the system.

- 2. The Mission Director, State Health Society has stated that it was proposed to provide a standard package of civil works, equipments and staff to each of the 50 institutions at a cost of Rs. 1.05 crores each. The package included increase of working space for operation theatres and wards (including repair works), equipments for setting up labours wards, theatres and Paediatric Intensive Care Units (PICU's) as well as cost of contractual specialists for these centres.
- 3. However, during discussion with the officials of the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services and the Tamil Naou Health Systems Project (TNHSP), it was ascertained that the civil works requirement (including operation theatres and maternity wards) of the smaller non CEmONC FRUs had already been assessed and sanctioned under Tamii Nadu Health Systems Project itself. Due to additional funds available from the World Bank, equipments and staff had also been sanctioned in the centres where construction has been undertaken. Hence, it was felt that the Programme Implementation Plan proposal for strengthening of First Referral Unit's could not be implemented in the current form.
- 4. The Mission Director, State Health Society has therefore informed that some modifications were made based on the revised schemes given by Tamil Nadu

Health System Project and Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. In Mew of urgency, the revised list was sent to Government of India pending approval of the Executive Committee. None of the revised proposa's involve any staff cost The Government of India, in Letter No. 10(18)/2008 – NRHM-I, dated 13.1.2009 has communicated the approval to the modified proposals sent to them. The Mission Director, State Health Society has therefore requested the Government to issue orders for strengthening of First Referral Units and the Primary Health Centres. The above revised proposal was placed in the VI Executive Committee Meeting of the State Health Society held on 12.11.2008 and the same was approved by the Executive Committee.

- 5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Mission Director State Health Society and decided to accept the same. Accordingly the following orders are issued:-
  - (i) The action of the Mission Director in having sent the revised proposal for strengthening of First Referral Units to the Government of India due to the urgency pending approval of the Executive Committee is ratified
  - (ii) The Mission Director is permitted to carry out the Civil Works in 25 First Referral Units indicated in Annexure-I to this order which were sanctioned under Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) but could not be taken up and to release the amount of Rs. 1681.80 lakhs to District Health Societies to execute the works through Public Works Department.
  - (iii) This Mission Director is permitted to carry out the Civil Works in the 12 Hospitals indicated in the Annexure-II to this order and the pay and use latrine in 45 First Referral Units and also to release the amount of Rs. 614 lakhs to District Health Societies to execute the works through Public Works Department. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, in consultation with the Mission Director shall furnish the list of 45 First Referral Units in which pay and use latrine has to be constructed to the Public Works Department.
  - (iv) The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will continue to monitor the civil works sanctioned in item 5 (ii) and (iii) above.
  - (v) The Mission Director is permitted to carry out the drainage facilities in 12 hospitals indicated in the Annexure III to this order through Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project (TNHSP) and also to release the amount of Rs.500 lakhs to Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will co-ordinate and monitor the work with Tamil Nadu Water Administrative Department for execution of the works.

(vi) The Mission Director is permitted to carry out the supply of equipments to 27 CEmONC Hospitals and 23 Non-CEmONC Hospitals as indicated in the Annexure-IV and Annexure-V respectively to this order through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation (TNMSC) and to release the amount of Rs.1498.45 lakhs to the following Personal Deposit account of the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. The amount shall not be paid in cash but credited to the following Personal deposit head of account:

"K Deposit and Advances (b) Deposits not bearing interest – 8443.00 Civil Deposits – 800. Other Deposits – CE. Deposits of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. (DPC 8443 00 800 CE 000H (Receipts)".

by means of a cheque drawn in favour of Personal Deposit Account of the Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited.

- (vii) The Mission Director is permitted to carry out the construction of the buildings for 20 Primary Health Centres as indicated in the Annexure-Vi to this order through the concerned District Health Society and to release the amount of Rs.372 lakhs to District Health Societies for execution of works through Public Works Department.
- (viii) The Mission Director is permitted to provide the diagnostic investigation facilities in selected well performing 180 Primary Health Centres indicated in the Annexure-VII to this order through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation and to release the amount of Rs.900 lakhs to Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation to the Personal Deposit Account of the Tamil Medical Services Corporation. The amount shall not be paid in cash but credited to the following deposit head of account:

"K Deposit and Advances (b) Deposits not bearing interest – 8443.00 Civil Deposits – 800. Other Deposits – CE. Deposits of Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation. (DPC 8443 00 800 CE 000H (Receipts)".

ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that strengthening of secondary care hospitals consisting of 29 district head quarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals is an important activity planned by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Strengthening of these hospitals includes provisions of required additional buildings apart from repairs and renovations to the existing hospital buildings. In the Government Orders read above, the Government have already sanctioned funds for carrying out of Civil Works in 22 hospitals in 9 districts during Phase II of the project of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that tenders for these civil works have been accepted by the "Tender Award Committee", Public Works Department that all the works in Phase II are in progress, that the Chief Engineer (Buildings) Public Works Department has stated that the bids have been accepted with excess amount over the departmental value indicated in the tender, that final expenditure for all the works will exceed the amount already sanctioned and that due to non response to the bid call, rebids have been called for all the packages and consequently the advertisement charges proposed in the sanctioned estimates have also exceeded the provisions made in the sanctioned estimates for all the works. He has further stated that the Chief Engineer (Buildings) has requested additional funds to meet the escalation in cost.
- 3. Construction of buildings for secondary care hospitals is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 24.03.2009 for sanction of additional tunds of Rs.362.56 lakhs to meet the additional cost involved due to tenders excess and additional advertisement cost for the bids for civil works being carried out in 22 hospitals in Phase under Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

#### ORDER:

In the Government Orders first read above, the Government of Tamil Nadu introduced the Insurance Scheme called "Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments". In the said G.O., State Empowered Committee chaired by the Chief Secretary to Government of Tamil Nadu was constituted to review the implementation of the Insurance Scheme periodically and to provide operational guidelines for the scheme whenever required. In the said Government order, an amount of Rs.200 crores was sanctioned towards payment of the premium to the Insurance Company for implementation of the above scheme.

2. The Mission Director, State Health Society in the letter third read above has stated that all the formalities of the Tenders were completed and L1 was selected. L1 Tenderer quoted Rs.999 as premium per family. Detailed discussions were held to bring down the L1 quoted price by negotiation. The final bid offer of the L1 Tender after negotiation was placed before the State Empowered Committee on 08.06.2009. The Empowered Committee approved the final rate of Rs.469/- per family inclusive of Card cost excluding Service Tax for each year for a period of four years given by the L1 Tenderer "M/s. Star Health and Allied Insurance Company Limited, Chennai". The terms of the additional undertaking given by the company that in case the claim ratio works out to be less than 65% (of the premium paid) inclusive of the card cost during the policy period, the difference between the incurred claim (claims paid and claims outstanding) as at the end of each policy period and the 65% of the premium paid including the Card cost will be paid back to Government has been accepted and taken on record by the Committee. Based on the agreed L1 price, the premium payable and service tax are worked out assuming the number of insured families to be one crore as indicated below:

The Mission Director has requested to sanction the additional provision of Rs.317.307 crores in the RE / FMA 2009-10.

- 3. The State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 20.4.09 and 8.6.09 has taken the following decisions:
  - (i) The State Health Insurance Unit may be set up under the Tamil Nadu Health System Society. The exact scale of staff would be decided between the Health Department and the Finance Department based on the staff already available under the Tamil Nadu Health System Society.
  - (ii) The State Empowered Committee constituted under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary shall function as the State level Monitoring Committee when the Insurance scheme starts its implementation.
  - (iii) The Committee approved the inclusion of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project as Member Convener of the Empowered Committee.
  - (iv) At the District level, the programme would be implemented by the Revenue Department with a District Core Group under the Chairpersonship of the District Collector with the Deputy Collector (Social Security Schemes) as convener and the District Labour Officer, Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Service, Deputy Director of Health Services, Dean of Medical College, District Programme Manager, Tamil Nadu Health System Project and representatives of Rural Development and Municipal Administration Departments as members.
  - (v) To nominate the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project as the nodal officer for this scheme and to position the staff for administering this scheme in the Tamil Nadu Health System Society office as already approved by the State Empowered Committee.
  - (vi) To nominate the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project and Secretary to Government, Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department as members of the State Empowered Committee.
- 4. The Government after careful examination accord revised administrative sanction to implement the 'Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life

Saving Treatments' at a cost of Rs.517.307 crores (Rupees five hundred and seventeen crores, three lakhs and seven thousand only) per annum as premium for four years including service tax. They also sanction an additional amount of Rs.317.307 (Rupees three hundred and seventeen crores, three lakhs and seven thousand only) towards payment of premium to the M/s. Star Health and Allied Insurance Company, Chennai to implement the scheme.

- 5. Necessary additional funds will be provided in the Supplement Estimates 2009-10. Pending provision of such funds, the Mission Director, State Health Society is authorized to draw the above amount to incur the expenditure and is requested to forward the Explanatory Note at appropriate time.
  - 6. The Government also issue the following orders:
  - In partial modification of the orders already issued in para 3 (vii) in G.O. i) Ms. No.49 Health and Family Welfare Department dated 04.02.2009 it is now ordered that all members who are given Identity Cards under Tamil Nadu Agriculture Labourers - Farmers (Social Security and Welfare) Scheme 2006 and the members registered in the Tamil Nadu Manual Workers Welfare Boards and 11 other Boards, Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board and various unorganized Labour Welfare Boards will be included as eligible beneficiaries under the scheme. In addition to this, any family whose annual income is less than Rs.72,000 (Rupees seventy two thousand only) as certified by the Village Administrative Officer, will be enrolled as members under the scheme. However, Government Employees, Pensioners and persons who are covered under the Employees State Insurance Scheme (ESI Scheme) are not eligible for enrolment as members under this Insurance Scheme.
    - The State Health Insurance Unit will be set up in the office of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society. The Project Director, Tamil Health System Project is nominated as Nodal Officer to implement the Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments. He will send proposals to Government for sanction of staff to administer the scheme.
    - The Secretary to Government, Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department, Chennal and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project are nominated as the Members of the State Empowered Committee constituted in G.O. Ms. No.49 Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 4.2.2009. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project shall be the Member Convener of the Committee.
    - iv) The State Empowered Committee constituted in the G.O. first read above under the Chairpersonship of Chief Secretary to Government of

Tamil Nadu shall function as the State Level Monitoring Committee when the Insurance scheme starts its implementation.

v) This Insurance Scheme shall be implemented by the Revenue Department in the Districts. A District Core Group is constituted under the Chairpersonship of the District Collector with the following members:

#### ORDER:

In the Government order read above, the Government ordered the establishment of Emergency Management Services for various types emergency cases, accident victims, etc., through Emergency Management Research Institute, Hyderabad(TN-EMRI). Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has been designated as the Nodal Agency and the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has been nominated as the Nodal Officer for implementing the scheme. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project has stated that the TN-EMRI is functioning from June' 2008, that till now, an amount of Rs. 22.2898 Crores has been transferred to TN-EMRI towards capital and running cost since June 2008., that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project had requisitioned the services of an Internal Auditor to audit the accounts of TN-EMRI during February 2009 and that the Accountant General has also audited the accounts of TN-EMRI. As the annual budget of TN-EMRI is estimated around Rs. 50 Crores, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project has proposed to have an internal audit system in TN-EMRI and placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in its meeting held on 24.03.2009. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal and suggested to consult an Audit Firm to conduct a concurrent audit along with periodical reporting (Quarterly) and to send a revised proposal. Accordingly, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has consulted the Audit Firm which has conducted the internal audit and circulated a proposal to the State Empowered committee for instituting a concurrent audit system. The Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

- 2. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for apointment of an Audit Firm to conduct a concurrent audit of TN-EMRI, intially for a period of two years from the date of appointment, with the objectives (a) to provide Project Management Unit of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project with timely information on the effectiveness of the financial management aspects of EMRI programme and (b) to enable the Auditor to express a professional opinion on the operation of the overall financial management systems including internal controls, compliance with financing agreements. The Government also direct that the concurrent audit firm shall furnish monthly reports which shall form the basis for payment to TN-EMRI. The monthly report should be sent to the Project Management Unit before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the subsequent month. The audit firm shall nominate two Auditors to conduct concurrent audit, out of which one Auditor shall be a senior person with Chartered Accountant qualification and an Assistant Auditor shall assist him.
- 3. Sanction is accorded for incurring a recurring expenditure of Rs.2,16,000/(Rupees two lakes and sixteen thousand only)per annum towards payment fees to the Audit Firm as detailed below:-

- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to hire the services of the existing internal auditor for conducting the Concurrent Audit by adopting a suitable Terms Of Reference.
- 5. The Government also direct that the concurrent audit would cover all the TN-EMRI activities including all sources and application of funds for the programme and also the various entities involved in the implementation of the programme. The Audit should be carried out in accordance with Audit & Assurance Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, and will include such tests and controls as the Auditor considers necessary under the circumstances. Specific areas of coverage of the concurrent audit are indicated in the annexure to this order. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is directed to place a copy of the Audit Report before the State Level Advisory Committee headed by the Chief Secretary to Government.



Strengthening of secondary care hospitals consisting of 29 District Head Quarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals is an important activity planned by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. #### ORDER:

The Director of Medical Education has stated that the existing diet system is a common procedure for all types of Hospitals and in existence for more than 50 years without any tangible changes. There are about 22 scales of die! specified in the Tamil Nadu Medical Code. Annual tender system is being adopted to procure storable and perishable items except rice and milk. Wherever annual tender could not be finalized, quarterly quotations are obtained. Rates obtained under the tender system are finalized with reference to the market rates obtained through local officials of the statistics department. Quarterly quotations are however finalized compared with the rates ascertained through a departmental Gazetted officer. He has also stated that the rice is obtained through Civil Supplies Corporation godowns on obtaining permit. Milk is obtained through AAVIN / Co-operative Milk supply Societies. Due to unhealthy competition and rigidity in procedure, quality items could not be procured. There is no freedom / flexibility to adopt suitable alternative menu according to local conditions. This resulted in improper supply of diet and there is tendency to supply milk and bread only. Though balanced diet is expected to be given as part of treatment, this is not being ensured. This uneven management of dietary system was examined during the course of discussion on the revision of medical code undertaken by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. There were several sittings of Dietitians and field study. Based on the feed back during the discussion and field study, it is considered that the existing diet system with regard to the nature of diet, procurement procedure etc., need to be changed according to present day conditions and also to suit local situation.

- 2) In the circumstances stated above, the Director of Medical Education has suggested the following changes:
  - a) Existing scales of diet shall be replaced with the model diet proposed as below:
    - 1) Standard Diet (Adult)
    - 2) Standard Children Diet.
      - a) Infant Diet up to 12 months.
      - b) Infant Diet for Special situations Diahorreal
      - c) Children Diet 1 year to 8 years General / HIV
      - d) Children Diet & years to 12 years General/HIV.
    - 3) Milk and Bread Diet (Convalescent Diet)
    - 4) Acute Special Diet (or) Enteral Feed.
    - 5) Hi-Protein diet (TB/HIV),
    - 6) Renal Diet (Salt free).
    - 7) Radium & Chemotherapy Diet.
    - 8) NCD Diet (Non-communicable diseases diet)
- 9) Diet for rural institution (Where there is no cooking facility)
  The details of model scales of diet is in the Annexure A to this order.
  - b) Procedure of procurement of items may be adopted as below:
    - (1) Direct purchase of storable items may be permitted in the following order of preference:
    - (a) Civil Supplies Department units
    - (b) AAVIN / Co-operative Milk Societies in respect of milk and milk products
    - (c) Oil items from Khadi and Village Industrial units
    - (d) Local Co-operative Super Markets
    - (e) Tender to be called for once in six months / quotations once in three months.
    - (2) In respect of non-storable perishable items 3/6 monthly quotations may be permitted to be called for.
      (3) Instead of bulk supply in cans, supply in 250 ml sachets may be
    - (3) Instead of bulk supply in cans, supply in 250 ml sachets may be preferred.
    - (4) Curd to be procured in 200ml sachets wherever feasible,
    - (5) Bread may be obtained in 200gm sliced packets.

The details of procedure is in the Annexure - B to this order.

- c) Diet Committee for the hospitals may be formed consisting of the following officials:-
  - (a) Hospital Superintendent / Chief Medical Officer / Professor of medicine
  - (b) RIMO (a senior Medical Officer where there is no post of RIMO).

- Nursing Superintendent (Senior most Nursing person) (d)
- Administrative Officer / Junior Administrative Officer / Senior (e) most Administrative staff.

The diet committee shall be authorized to adopt suitable diet as per the model diet or alternate diet as per the local need and with reference to the availability of seasonal items adhering to Nutritive value of each of the scales of diet. Existing financial powers in regard to purchase and settlement of bills of dietary items by Heads of Institutions will continue. The Director of Medical Education has requested the Government to consider the above suggestions for the revision of diet systems in the Government Medical Institutions and issue suitable orders so as to include same in the revised Medical Code stating that there is no financial commitment.

3) The Government have examined the suggestions of the Director of Medical Education in para 2 above carefully and decided to accept them. Accordingly the Government permit the Director of Medical Education to incorporate revised diet system in the Tamil Nadu Medical Code as detailed in Annexure 'A', 'B' & 'C' to this order.

#### PROCEDURE FOR PROCUREMENT OF DIET ARTICLES ITEMS

Direct Purchase of storable items may be permitted in the following order of preference:

1 Civil Supplies Department units.

- 2 AAVIN/ Co-operative Milk Societies in respect of milk and milk products
- 3 Oil items from Khadi and Village Industrial units

4 Local Co-operative Super Markets.

5 Tender to be called for once in six monthly / quotations once in three month.

In respect of non-storable perishable items 3/6 monthly quotations may be permitted to be called for (This is essential to secure competitive rates as tenders for a fixed rate for a year are not forthcoming). For shorter duration, number of tenderers will come forward to supply at reasonable rates and thereby quality supply can be expected. Moreover the non-storable perishable items are cultivated according to seasonal and monsoon activities. So availability and competitive price depends on that.

Milk:- Instead of bulk supply in cans, supply in 250 ml sachets may be preferred and issued to patients in sachets. It is already in practice in Government Rajaji Hospital, Madurai. The present supply contain 8.5 SNF. Instead, double toned milk with the composition of 4.5 SNF (Tea – Mate Milk) may be obtained from AAVINN. This is not only cheaper but free of excess fat also.

Curd: To be procured in 200ml sachets wherever feasible.

Bread:- May be obtained in 200 gm sliced packets.

For late admission cases there is difficulty in providing diet. Hence wherever possible walk in cold storage facilities both for storing milk and perishable items can be considered. The capacity of the walk -in refrigerator may be decided as per institutional demand. Half of the convalescent milk and bread diet may be given to the late admission cases.

#### ORDER:

Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has strengthened the 24 hours Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres (CEmONC) by provision of buildings, staff and equipments. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that Ventilators have been supplied to all CEmONC hospitals and that Paediatric Physicians posted to these hospitals need to be given special training in handling the Paediatric ventilators supplied to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) to ensure provision of Ventilatory support to the New Born.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the Department of Neonatology, Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children, Egmore, Chennai is conducting a ventilator training workshop for 5 days to focus on Neonatal ventilation in the ICH Auditorium, Egmore, Chennai. As this training workshop will be very useful for Paediatric Physicians working in CEmONC Centres to reduce neonatal morbidity and mortality, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has proposed deputation of 30 doctors @ one doctor each from 30 CEmONC hospitals for these workshops so that these doctors can train the other doctors in their hospitals at a later date.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 14.09.2009 to depute 30 Paediatric Physicians @ 1 each from 30 CEmONC hospitals to undergo the training in Neonatal ventilation at ICH, Chennai . The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter. The training of Paediatric Physicians in Neonatal ventilation is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable.



- 4. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.2,85,000/- (Rupees two lakhs and eighty five thousand only), as detailed in the Annexure to this order towards deputation of 30 Paediatric Physicians @ one each from 30 CemONC hospitals to undergo training in Neonatal ventilation for a period of 5 days in the Department of Neonatalogy, Institute of Child Health and Hospitals for Children, Egmore, Chennai. The period of training shall be treated as duty.





Imparting hospitals administration training is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable.

- 2. The Government, after careful examination, accord sanction for conducting Hospital Administration Training in the Anna Institute of Management, Chennai to 450 Chief Medical Officers / Medical Officers from various institutions.
- 3. Sanction is accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs.54.25 lakhs (Rupees fifty four lakhs and twenty five thousand only) as detailed in Annexure I to this order for conducting the training programme.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project is permitted to make payment of Rs.40.75 lakhs (Rupees forty lakhs and seventy five thousand only) to the Anna Institute of Management for conducting the training programme and to obtain

utilization certificate and vouchers for the expenditure. The Director General, Anna Institute of Management, Chennai, is permitted to incur the expenditure by reallocating the expenditure within the components without exceeding the total cost.

The syllabus is given in Annexure II to this order.
  - 7. The expenditure shall be drawn and disbursed through Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society Advance Grant "4.3.720 Training"




In the Government order read above, the Government sanctioned the implementation of a web based Hospital Management Information System which includes Hospital Management System and patients electronic medical records data base.

- 2. A proposal for outsourcing of a Technical Coordinator (IT) in each district and in Project Management Unit in phases was placed before the State Empowered Committee in its sixth meeting held on 24.03.2009. The State Empowered Committee had agreed to the proposal and suggested that " the Technical Coordinator (IT) has to be outsourced and placed as and when the scheme expands to the districts in phases". The Committee has also observed that the qualification criteria for the IT coordinator have to be reworked.
- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project has stated that subsequent to the State Empowered Committee meeting, in a discussion with the Managing Director, ELCOT, it was ascertained that M/s. ELCOT Ltd., had identified an outsourcing agency for hiring suitable candidates for any type of work connected with IT sector and that the agency would place an IT Coordinator as per his request. He has also stated that based on the modifications suggested by the State Empowered Committee the Managing Director, ELCOT has sent a revised proposal as follows:
  - (a) The Technical Coordinator (IT) shall be outsourced through M/s ELCOT Ltd.,
- (b) Initially five Technical Coordinators (IT) shall be hired @ one Coordinator for each of the five phase I districts where HMIS and HMS have been introduced and more Coordinators will be posted to other districts as and when the scheme is extended to those districts.
- (c) The qualification criteria for Technical Coordinator (IT) have also been revised in the proposal.
- (d) A consolidated payment of Rs.20,900 per month was proposed for the IT Coordinator which includes contract payment, accommodation charges, travel charges and telephone charges.

- 4. Based on the revised proposal the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has sent a proposal to the Government. The Government had suggested that the contract payment could be revised as follows:
  - (a) Contract payment @ Rs.12,900 per month
  - (b) Travel + accommodation Rs. 2,500 per month
  - (c) Telephone expenditure Rs.500 per month

The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal for appointment of 6 posts of Technical Coordinators IT in 5 phase I districts and in the Project Management Unit and suggested that the remaining posts may be considered for sanction when phase II of the HMIS is taken for implementation. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders. Appointment of Technical Coordinator (IT) is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable.

- 5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heatlh Systems Project is permitted to contract M/s. ELCOT for outsourcing the posts of Technical Coordinator as per a contract agreement to be signed by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heatlh Systems Project and Managing Direcor, ELCOT. The qualification and the job description for the post are indicated in the Annexure to this order.



### ORDER:

Strengthening of secondary care hospitals consisting of 29 district head quarters hospitals and 241 sub district hospitals is an important activity planned by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. Strengthening of these hospitals includes provisions of required additional buildings apart from repairs and renovations to the existing hospital buildings. In the Government Orders read above, the Government have already sanctioned funds for carrying out of Civil Works in 224 hospitals in 25 districts during Phase II of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that tenders for these civil works have been accepted by the "Tender Award Committee", Public Works Department, that all the works in Phase II are in progress, that the Chief Engineer (Buildings) Public Works Department has stated that the bids have been accepted with excess amount over the departmental value indicated in the tender, that final expenditure for all the works will exceed the amount already sanctioned and that due to non response to the bid calls, rebids have been called for all the packages and consequently the advertisement charges proposed in the sanctioned estimates have also exceeded the provisions made in the sanctioned estimates for all the works. He has further stated that the Chief Engineer (Buildings) has requested additional funds to meet the escalation in cost.

- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 14.09.2009 for sanction of additional funds of Rs.32.1318 crores to meet the additional cost involved due to tender excess and additional advertisement cost for the bids for civil works being carried out in 133 hospitals in 22 district and DMS annex building in Phase II under Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project. The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter. Construction of buildings for secondary care hospitals is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank.
- 4. The works shall be executed by the Public Works Department by following the normal Public Works Department procedures. The LOC systém in vogue in the Public Works Department shall be followed. The Chief Engineer (Buildings), Public Works Department and his officials at the regional level shall send the monthly statement of expenditure (SOE) and the progress report to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Helath Systems Project as per the requirement of the World Bank for submitting the reimbursement claims.
- 5. Based on the approval given by the State Empowered Committee the Government, after careful examination, accord Revised Administrative sanction for a sum of Rs.175.9041 crores (Rupees One hundred and seventy five crores ninety lakhs and forty one thousand only) and permit to incur additional expenditure (Rupees 175.9041 Rs.143.7763 crores) with in the provision made in Budget Estimate 2009-10 of Rs.32.138 crores (Rupees thrity two crores thirteen lakhs and eighty thousand only) as detailed in the Annexure to this order towards the additional cost involved due to tender excess and additional advertisement cost for the bids for the civil works carried out in 133 Hospitals and DMS Annex building in Phase II of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- 6. 


#### ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Heath Systems Project has stated that the World Bank did not approve the procurement plan for the above activity since Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation is the procurement agency approved by it and the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation has to procure and install the said generators.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 14.09.2009 to amend the Government order read above so as to enturst the work of procuring and installing of 40 K.V.A Generators in 21 Government Hospitals at the rate of one Generator per hospital by the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited., instead of the Public Works Department. The Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has now requested the Government to issue amendment to G.O. first read above.
- 3. Based on the approval of the State Empowered Committee the following amendments are issued to the G.O.(Ms).No. 306, Health and Family Welfare Department, dated 28.8.2007.


