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

#### ORDER:

Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is being implemented from January 2005. The project has initiated many activities which are being implemented successfully. Notable among such activities are, CEmONC services, Tribal Health Development, PPP activities, Non Communicable Diseases pilots, Health Care Waste Management, Web based HMIS & many activities to improve Quality of Care in the hospitals. There are other States like West Bengal, Punjab, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Orissa, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakand who have completed Health Systems Projects or nearing completion. The experience of various activities performed by these States and Tamil Nadu needs to be shared and to plan for further improvement of the activities, not only in the above mentioned states, but in other states of the country as well.

- 2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project has reported that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has been creating significant impact in the status of health infrastructure and systems in the state, that it is engaged in providing technologically advanced medical equipments and imparting update training to health professionals and that the capacity building is also matched with the implementation of effective e-governance in the health sector of the State. He has also stated that the success, which is being experienced through implementing the health system project in the State, necessitates sharing the experience to other states, which in turn would lead to scaling up of strengthening the health system, that there are many best practices of strengthening health systems across the world, available for cross learning and that moreover, International experience in the above subjects and subjects like Health policy, Health financing, impact of globalization on NCDs influencing budgeting, Accreditation, Quality Assurance, etc., also need to be discussed. He has therefore proposed to organize an International Conference on Health Systems Development. Accordingly, he has circulated a proposal to the State Empowered Committee for approval. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.
- 3. Organizing a Conference on Health Systems Development is an approved activity of the World Bank and the expenditure is reimbursable by the World Bank.
- 4. The Government have examined the proposal carefully. Accordingly, The Government, accord sanction for conducting an International Conference on Health

Systems Development by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project during May 2010.

- 5. Sanction is also accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs.1.0095 crores (Rupees one crore and ninety five thousand only) as detailed in Annexure I to this order for conducting the International Conference. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to utilize the contributions offered by APAC-VHS and Public Health Management Institute and other agencies for conducting the Conference. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is also permitted to open a separate bank account for the Conference.

- 7. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society is requested to submit the out come of the conference and expenditure statement in the next meeting of the State Empowered Committee after the conference is over.
- 8. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society is permitted to incur the expenditure sanctioned above from out of the existing funds available in the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society grant under "COA - II. 1.900 (Health promotion)".

## International Conference on Health System Strengthening Organized by the Tamil Nadu Health System Project Chennai - May 6-10, 2010

#### introduction:

Tamil Nadu Health System Project has been creating significant impact in the status of health infrastructure and systems in the state. It is engaged in providing technologically advanced medical equipments and imparting update training to health professionals. The capacity building is also matched with the implementation of effective e-governance in the health sector of the state. The success, which is being experienced through implementing the health system project in the state, necessitates sharing the experience to other states, which in turn would lead to scaling up of strengthening the health system. There are many best practices of strengthening health systems across the world, available for cross learning.

Considering the above mentioned, it has been decided to organize an International Conference on Health System Strengthening.

#### Rationale:

The nation aims at increasing GDP, and strengthening health systems would complement the national goal by ensuring a healthy workforce.

Our country spends 5.2% of the GDP on health care. The share of public sector has increased from 0.9% to 1. 2 % ( 'WHO Commission on Macro Economics and Health'). Increased investment public sector health care and community based health insurance will reduce over dependency on private sector, which forces people to spend out of their resources. As per the ICSSR / ICMR report, there is a need for increasing health budget and simultaneously build the capacity of the state to use the allocated budget efficiently in public health.

A detailed discussion on this could help policy makers and planners to move forward in the direction with substantial measures. The proposed International Conference on Health System Strengthening would provide platform for such discussion

#### The Process:

The need for organizing an International Conference emerged at the level of TNHSP and it was discussed among the partner organizations which related to TNHSP professionally. The purpose of the conference attracted many and invited them to get involved in it; and as a result a committee was formed. The committee met in the Month of August 2009, discussed and arrived at a conclusion that many players need to be included as technical collaborators.

An exclusive Mnemonic has been developed for the conference and it will be used in all materials of the conference and promotional aspects.

A Technical Advisory Group was formed with representatives of the following agencies:

The Secretary, Health, Government of India informed the team her assurance to support the conference in the following aspects:

Visit to New Delhi also included discussions with the Director General, ICMR and the Director General, NACO. The Technical Advisory Group (TAG) has met several times and worked out detailed plan for the conference.

#### Aim of the Conference:

To provide evidence-based policy guidance for strengthening health systems India

#### Objective of the Conference:

- Discuss implementation issues in enhancing health systems with respect to service delivery, financing, human resources, and governance.
- Share international experiences to promote cross-learning of good practices in health systems strengthening.
- Guide the national and state policies for improving health systems, with respect to service delivery, financing, human resources, and governance.

For the conference it is proposed to focus on the four building blocks (themes) out of six identified by the World Health Organization (WHO); and they are:

- Health Service Delivery
- Human Resources
- Health care Financing
- Governance

It is proposed that presentations will be made on different topics of each of the four themes mentioned above. It is also proposed that a plenary lecture to be delivered at the inaugural session of the conference.





#### ORDER:

In G.O. (Ms.) No.49, Health and Family Welfare [EAP-II(2)] Department, dated 04.02,2009, while formulating the "Kalaignar Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments", the Government among others, ordered that Government Hospitals having pay wards can also apply for the empanelment and they may also be entitled to claim the amount from Insurance Company for the listed conditions for patients admitted in the pay wards and that the amount claimed from the insurance company shall be deposited in the Hospital Patient Welfare Society and utilized for the development of the institution as per the Patient Welfare Society guidelines.

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project in his letter fourth read above has stated that, based on the discussion held with M/s. Star Health and Allied Insurance Company Ltd., it has been decided to implement the Chief Minister Kalaignar Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments in selected Government Medical College Hospitals and attached institutions under the control of the Director of Medical Education in the first instance, and that a meeting was held on 30.07.2009 to discuss the modalities for implementing the scheme and that the Director of Medical Education was requested to discuss the matter in detail with the

Deans and Head of Departments of Government Medical Colleges in Chennai city and to send a report. He has also reported that the report sent by the Director of Medical Education was again discussed in the meeting held on 10.08.2009 with the Director of Medical Education, Dean and Heads of Departments of certain Departments of Government Medical Colleges in Chennai city and the representatives from M/S. Star Health and Allied Insurance Company Ltd,. Based on the discussion, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has sent a proposal for empaneling Government Medical College Hospitals and attached institutions and for issuing guidelines for implementation of "Chief Minister Kalaignar Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments" in Government Hospitals.

- 3. The Government have carefully examined the proposal and decided to approve it. They accordingly, direct that the Chief Minister Kalaignar Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments be implemented in the Government Medical Colleges and its attached institutions. The following orders / guidelines are issued to implement the Insurance Scheme in the Government Hospitals empanelled under the scheme:
  - The Deans of the respective Government Medical Colleges are permitted to sign the Memorandum of Understanding with M/s. Star Health and Allied Insurance Company for empanelment of Government Hospitals under Kalaignar Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments, in the form which should be approved by State Empowered Committee.
  - ii) The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society (TNHSS) shall get funds from the Insurance Company for the claims presented by the Government hospitals and maintain a separate account. Out of this amount, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society will remit 60% of the amount to the Government account and 40% to the Patient Welfare Society of the respective hospitals. This will ensure timely availability of funds to the hospitals. The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society shall monitor closely the surgeries done in Government hospitals and make claims on the insurance company for reimbursement. This system would involve additional work at the society level and therefore one post of Accountant and one post of Assistant in the scale of pay of Rs.5,200 20,200 + Grade Pay of Rs.2,400 are sanctioned to the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society to attend this work. These posts should be filled up through deputation.
  - iii) Purchases like consumables, small value equipments etc., be purchased through the Patient Welfare Society. If any high value equipment is to be purchased or any large purchase beyond the scope of Patient Welfare Society is to be made, the existing norms for purchase of equipments shall be followed with the financial limits at various levels for purchases being kept the same as that existing for purchase of equipments from State funds.
  - iv) If any appointments are to be made for the purpose of satisfying the requirements of the insurance scheme, the number of such appointments to be made and emoluments for the same shall be got approved by the Empowered Committee. Only after the approval of the Empowered Committee, appointment of such personnel on contract basis through the

patient welfare society shall be permitted. The payment of contract employment may be done through the funds given to the patient welfare society under the scheme. However, the HOD are permitted to hire any medical personnel, if such a personnel is not available for individual cases, at the rates to be approved by the Empowered Committee (eg., Radiologist if not available, can be outsourced on per case basis on approved rates by the HOD).

- v) Medical Audit shall be carried out by the Empanelled Department concerned every week. A representative from Star Health and Allied Insurance Company will attend the Medical Audit. The report of such audit be placed before the State Level Monitory Committee.
- vi) The auditing of Patient Welfare Society's account shall be done by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, Chennai-6. The payment for such audit may be done through the concerned Patient Welfare Society Fund.
- vii) The Business Plan for each hospital will be developed by the Dean and the implementation of the components of the Business Plan will be done after approval of the State Empowered Committee of Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society.
- viii)The Heads of the Empanelled Departments shall nominate one or more Dedicated Medical Officers (DMO) from their departments concerned for the scheme as per the requirements of the Insurance Company. However no fresh appointment should be made for this purpose.
- ix) No separate office will be established in the department or hospital for insurance purpose. However, the Patient Welfare Society will be provided the additional office support based on the guidelines to be approved by the Empowered Committee.
- x) The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society shall remit 60% of the insurance amount received from the Insurance Company to the Government account and 40% to the hospital of which 25% should be for hospital expenditure and improvement, while 15% should be for honorarium to Doctors and Staff. On the honorarium to Staff, 15% would be available only for those operations which are taken up outside the working hours and above the base limit of operations taken up in the hospital. The maximum number of monthly average number of operations performed during April to September 2009 shall be the base limit. The total amount available for the Doctors / Staff will be capped at 15% of the amount reimbursable by the insurance company during the month. If the eligible honorarium comes to less than 15% of the amount reimbursable, then the balance could be used for hospital improvement but shall not be carried over to another month for payment to Doctors/Staff. As regard to payment to Doctors and staff, following arrangements shall be followed:
  - a) No honorarium shall be paid for doing routine work during hospital working hours.
  - b) Honorarium may be provided for taking up surgeries during other than hospital working hours.

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- c) The quantum of payment to the Doctors and other staff involved in the surgery / treatment will be worked out by the Director of Medical Education, which will not be more than 50% of what is to be provided to Doctors who would have been hired for the same purpose.
- d) The 15% shall be disbursed among the staff down the line from the Referring Doctors to the last cadre of the supporting staff of the hospital (team incentive)
- e) Surgeries which are performed after regular working list, under this scheme alone shall be eligible for the staff remuneration.
- f) If more than one unit is necessary panel for surgeons, anesthetists, staff nurses and other supportive staff shall be prepared by the HOD from among those who are willing to stay and perform surgeries under the scheme in the afternoon and evening of the day. This panel shall be approved by the Dean of the Institution concerned.
- g) HOD concerned shall be the Chairman of the team.
- h) Allotment of cases shall be made by the HOD if more than one unit is functioning.
- A separate theater list with proper assessment etc., should be sent to dean and got approved.
- j) Admitting unit will be fully in charge from the day of admission to the day of discharge and for further follow up.
- k) Any patient in the hospital is the responsibility of duty doctors irrespective of paying / non paying or under insurance coverage. All emergency situations shall be attended by the duty doctors of the medical college hospital concerned. However, it is the responsibility of the specialty doctor to rush and attend the patients at the earliest. The team medical officer should make night rounds regularly atleast for patients under insurance coverage.

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- The HOD is permitted to hire the qualified Government medical officer from the speciality department based on the recommendations of the committee constituted by the HOD and the Dean of the hospital concerned.
- xi) Any changes or renovation to be done in the pre operative and post operative wards, operation theatre, reception, toilets, etc., and any additional requirements of infrastructure shall be proposed to the State Empowered Committee of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society and necessary orders shall be obtained accordingly.
- 4. The Government direct that the Insured persons, who seek treatment in the empanelled Government Hospitals be given incentives in the form of preferential surgery on insured persons over waitlisted persons, additional facilities in special wards, paid tests of TNMSC, etc. to induce patients to avail treatment in Government hospital through insurance scheme. The Deans of the Government Hospitals in consultation with the Head of empanelled Departments should carry out and

implement the incentives to attract more patients to the Government Hospital for treatments under the Insurance Scheme.



### ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project in his letter 2<sup>nd</sup> read above stated that since the Kalaignar Insurance Scheme is in its initial stage, lot of IEC activities have to be carried out for creating awareness about the scheme among the public so as to enroll all the eligible persons. Further, information about the types of treatments available under the scheme and the details of accredited hospitals where the public can take treatments have to be brought to the notice of the public. Apart from this, IEC activities have to be planned and broadcast in Radio and Television. To coordinate all the above activities, services of an IEC Officer are essentially required. Stating the above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to sanction one post of IEC Officer at a senior level in the scale of pay of Rs.37,400 – 67,000 + 8,800 GP for a period of one year from the date of appointment.

2. He has also stated that in the Government Order 1st read above, the Government permitted hiring of 2 vehicles for 6 months at a cost of Rs.1.20 lakhs (i.e. Rs.10,000/- per vehicle per month), but, vehicles are not available for hiring @ Rs.10,000/- per month and therefore requested the Government to permit him to increase the charges for hiring of vehicle from Rs.10,000/- per month to Rs.15,000/- per month.



- 3. The Government after carefully examining the proposals of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Project issue the following orders:
  - i) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is permitted to appoint an iEC officer on contract basis for one year or till a District Revenue Officer joins the post sanctioned in G.O. ### ORDER:

In the Government Orders 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> read above, orders have been issued to launch Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments. As per the above said Government Orders, an agreement has been executed between the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society and M/s Star Health and Allied Insurance Co., Ltd. (which has been selected by the Society through a national level competitive bidding) to implement the scheme.

2. In para 2 of the said agreement, it has been indicated that "the annual premium payable to the Insurance Company by the society is Rs.469 per family inclusive of card cost, but excluding service tax for each year for a period of 4 years. The premium shall be paid every year in four quarterly installments on or before the first day of the quarter every year, with the year being reckoned from the date of commencement of the Scheme. The first premium for the first year of the scheme

would be paid on or before the date of commencement of the scheme. The amount of premium would be arrived as twenty-five percent of the premium payable based on 100 lakhs families. For the subsequent quarters, adjustments would be made based on the actual numbers enrolled in the scheme in the beginning of the quarter, based on the lists of eligible persons given by the Government".

- 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society in his letter 3<sup>rd</sup> read above has stated that the society had provided a list of 116 lakhs families on the first day of the first quarter of the scheme (ie 23.7.2009) comprising of the total number of Agricultural Labour Welfare Board members and other un-organized Welfare Board members. The Insurance company has as on 09.03.2010 enrolled 1,44.12,936 number of families and issued 1,30,05,004 smart cards. The insurance company has sent a request for payment of additional premium for 30 lakhs families amounting to Rs.113, 96,91,516 inclusive of Service Tax. This is calculated based upon additional premium for 30 lakhs cards over and above 1 crore families from 23.07.2009 which is the day 1 of the starting of insurance coverage.
- The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has therefore proposed to pay additional premium to the Insurance company for having covered 16 lakhs additional families for the First and Second quarters (w.e.f 23.7.2009) and 30 lakhs additional families from the Third quarter (w.e.f 23.01.2010) over and above the 1 crore families under the Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments as detailed below:

5. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has also stated that this proposal was placed before the State Empowered Committee for Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments in its 9<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 18.03.2010 and the Committee approved the proposal to pay the additional premium and directed that the final reconciliation of the total numbers beyond the 30 lakhs cards to be made after completion of the De-Duplication process. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society has also stated that an allocation of Rs.96.15 crore is available in R.E. 2009-10 to meet out the above payment of Rs.80.182 crores.

- 6. The Government after careful examination, accept the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society and accordingly permit the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Society to pay a sum of Rs 80.182 crores (Rupees Eighty Crores Eighteen lakhs and twenty thousands only) towards insurance premium to M/s Star Health and Allied Insurance Co Ltd for having covered 16 lakhs additional families for the First and Second quarters (w.e.f. 23.7.2009) and 30 lakhs additional families from the Third quarter (w.e.f. 23.01.2010) over and above the 1 crore families under the Chief Minister Kalaignar's Insurance Scheme for Life Saving Treatments, from the funds available in R.E. 2009-2010. ### Activities of Internal Audit

### a. Objectives:

The objectives of the internal audit is to

- (i) provide timely information on the effectiveness of the physical and financial management aspects of the offices of Project Management Unit, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation, District Project Management Units (DPMUs), NGOs and Civil Works and
- (ii) enable the Internal auditor to express a professional opinion on the operation of 29 DPMUs, NGOs and Civil Works undertaken by PWD for the project in 24 Districts.

### b. Coverage of the Internal Audit:-

The Internal Audit would cover all the project activities. The Internal Audit would cover offices of Project Management Unit, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation, 29 District Project Management Units and NGOs involved in the implementation of the project. The internal audit of civil works in 24 districts would also be covered.

### c. <u>Timing:</u>

The internal audit would be carried out concurrently and on quarterly basis in the offices Project Management Unit, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation and Civil Works for DMS annex and on an half yearly basis in the offices of District Project Management Units (DPMUs), NGOs and Civil Works in 24 districts.

- (iii) Trichy Region: Karur, Trichy, Perambalur, Ariyalur, Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Nagapattinam and Pudukkottai districts
- (iv) Vellore Region: Vellore, Tiruvallur, Kancheepuram, Tiruvannamalai, Villupuram, and Guddalore districts.
- (v) Chennai Region: Project Management Unit, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation and Civil Works for DMS annex

The audit would be carried out in a manner that each district and the NGO contract within the district and civil works audit are covered twice—in a year i.e., on six monthly basis for 2009-10 & 2010-11.

### d. Reporting:



The Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project stall would also serve as a health facility stall as an add on feature. All persons visiting the stall would be registered in the HiViS and unique ID would be generated for them and handed over as a computerized printout. Arrangement for measuring BP/Blood gulucose for suitable visitors would also be taken care of in the stall, but however drugs will not be issued at the exhibition stall. 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

The Project Director has also stated that as per the MoU the Government have to provide land and budget for the establishment of permanent emergency response centre. - 3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has submitted a proposal to sanction a sum of Rs 7927.23 lakes towards continuance of the Emergency Ambulance Services run by the Tamil Nadu - EMRI for the year 2010-11 and requested the Government to issue orders.
- 4. The Government, after careful consideration, accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.5922.29 lakhs (Rupees fifty nine crores twenty two lakhs and twenty nine thousand only) towards Recurring and Non-recurring expenditure as detailed in the



annexure to this order for operating the Emergency Management Services through the TN-EMRI for the financial year 2010-2011. Out of the total expenditure Rs.5833.19 lakhs is recurring expenditure and Rs.89.1 lakhs is non recurring expenditure, 60% of the recurring expenditure i.e. Rs.3499.91 Lakh and non recurring expenditure of Rs.89.10 lakhs should be borne through State share towards National Rural Health Mission. Remaining Rs.2333.27 lakhs (i.e. 40% of recurring expenditure) will be provided by State Government separately.

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has strengthened 24 hours Comprehensive Emergency Obstetric and New Born Care Centres in 125 hospitals in Tamil Nadu by providing additional buildings, additional man power and equipment and that the number of pregnant women accessing these hospitals are increasing day by day. He has also stated that another important activity of the project is the implementation of the tribal health development activities, which include (i) Operating Mobile Outreach Health Services through NGOs/ medical teams in remote tribal areas of 10 districts, (ii) Provision of bed grant to NGO run hospitals in tribal areas. (iii) Interventions to tackle Sickle Cell Aneamia, (iv) Employing Tribal Counselors in Government Hospitals and Primary Health Centres located in tribal areas and (v) Advance stay of ante natal tribal mothers in Primary Health Centres and provision of food and transport. He has also stated that though these activities are going on smoothly, there are still gaps which were analyzed and found out that targeted IEC programmes have to be initiated to bridge the gap. He has therefore placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 03.08.2010 to undertake IEC activities with a view to generate demand on the CEMONC facilities established in the Government Hospitals for Ante natal mothers and to make the community aware of tribal health issues and services offered by the Government and also to communicate the general health messages to the public. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

- 2. This activity comes under Component I Sub Component A & B in the Project Implementation Plan document approved by the World Bank. The expenditure involved is reimbursable by World Bank

- 3. - 1. Tribal Mobile Out reach services
- 2. Provision for bed grant to Non Government organizations for inpatient services for Tribals.
- 3. Sickle Cell Anaemia intervention
- 4. Tribal Health Counsellors
- 5. Conducting workshops on the following topics:
  - Consultative workshop for NGOs working in tribal areas
  - ii. Consultative Workshop for Tribal leaders
  - iii. State level workshop of all the stakeholders

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 03.08.2010 for continuing the above activities and also for provision of eight additional mobile outreach services and for appointing 200 Tribal Health Workers in the tribal areas. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.

2. This activity comes under Component I Sub Component B in the Project Implementation Plan document approved by the World Bank. The expenditure involved is reimbursable by World Bank

- 3. The Government after careful consideration pass the following orders:
- (i) Sanction is accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs.62.40 lakks (Rupees sixty two lakks forty thousand only) towards fuel and maintenance of the vehicle, contract pay for the medical personnel, supervision charges for NGOs etc as detailed in Annexure I to this order.

The initial drug kit will be provided by project and subsequently replenished from the drug supplied to Village Health Nurse by Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. She will also sensitize all the Ante Natal mothers to utilize 108 ambulance services. They will be given induction training.

### ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that Emergency Response Centre (ERC) of Emergency Management Ambulance Services, is now functioning temporarily at the premises of the Govt Kasturiba Gandhi Hospital for Women and Children, Triplicane, Chennai-5 and that while introducing the services, it was agreed to provide the required land for the construction of permanent ERC at Chennai so as to accommodate the call centre and training centre. He has further stated that during the course of review of the performance of the Emergency Ambulance Services, it was agreed to allot suitable land for the setting up of the permanent Emergency Response Centre and that it was also decided to locate the permanent Emergency Response Centre at the campus of the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services where there is a 200 years old dilapidated building of the Director of Medical and Rural Health Services and several small structures around that building.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project after holding discussions with the other Programme Officers and Staff Welfare Associations in the meeting held on 16.6.2010 sent a proposal to Government for construction of a permanent building for the Emergency Response Centre of Emergency Management Ambulance Services, in the place where the dilapidated buildings of the Directorate of

Medical and Rural Health Services, which was already handed over to National Rural Health Mission as per the G.O. first read above for renovation, exist. He has also proposed certain alternate arrangements till the permanent building is constructed.

- 3. The Government have carefully examined the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, and decided to approve it. Accordingly, the Government, accord "in principle" approval for construction of a permanent building to locate the Emergency Response Centre of the Emergency Management Services, by demolishing the existing dilapidated old building of the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services, which was handed over to National Rural Health Mission for renovation, as per the G.O first read above and the small structures around the building in the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services campus site.
- 4. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is also permitted to take over the site along with the old structures mentioned in paragraph 3 above and to demolish the old buildings by following the prescribed Codal procedure.
  - 5. The Government also issue the following orders:
- (i) The Mission Director, National Rural Health Mission, will place the Government Order for handing over of the dilapidated building to Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project before the Executive Committee of National Rural Health Mission for information.
- (ii) The fifth floor in the DMS annex building under construction by the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project will be provided to the National Rural Health Mission after the construction is over. Till such time, 7<sup>th</sup> floor of the DMS building is allotted to National Rural Health Mission when Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project moves to the new building.
- (iii) The existing adjoining old buildings in which the offices of the Additional Director (Leprosy), Deputy Director (Leprosy), Govt. Modern Dispensary, Old cycle shed, Tiled roof buildings accommodated as store room of DPH office, former current section of DMS office shall also be demolished and the land shall be allotted to Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project.
- (iv) The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services will continue to be the custodian of the proposed new building.
- (v) Offices of the Additional Director (Leprosy) and Deputy Director (Leprosy) and Govt. Modern Dispensary will be temporarily shifted to Shed II in which the Engineering wing of the Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project is currently functioning with necessary modifications. After construction of DMS annex building and ERC buildings, shifting of these offices to pucca buildings in the campus can be considered.



- (vi) The stores of the office of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, accommodated in the tiled buildings adjoining the DMS office old current section may be shifted to a alternative accommodation.
- (vii) The existing prayer shed used by Muslim members in the old asbestos discarded cycle shed adjoining the modern dispensary will be left out as such as per the wishes of the members.

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#### ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the Government ordered the hiring of a consultancy firm to develop and implement Web based HMIS in all secondary care hospitals. Accordingly a web based comprehensive HMIS is being implemented. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has stated that M/s. Tata Consultancy Services has developed the software and implementation is completed in 5 pilot hospitals and 43 Phase I hospitals.

- 2. In the Government Order second read above, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has been permitted to implement Phase I of the comprehensive web based Health Management Information Systems in 36 hospitals in 5 districts, 5 PHCs, 26 office of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services except the office of the Joint Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, Kancheepuram, Kanyakumari and Vellore.
- 3. In the reference third read above, the Government accorded "in principle" approval for establishment of comprehensive HMIS under phase II in 222 secondary care hospitals and their controlling offices namely offices of the Joint Director Medical and Rural Health Services and the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services and in 15 designated Primary Health Centres and directed the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project to send proposals to the State



Empowered Committee again for this purpose, after receipt of appropriate funding to cover the entire cost of the HMIS phase II proposal.

- 4. Since the Additional financing has now been sanctioned by the World Bank, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project has placed a proposal before the State Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 03.08.2010 for implementation of Phase II HMIS and the procurement of hardware and connectivity. The State Empowered Committee has approved the proposal. The Project Director has requested the Government to issue orders in the matter.
- 5. The activity of establishment of web based Health Management Information System in all secondary care hospitals and some Primary Health Centres is an approved activity by the World Bank and included in Component III subcomponent A in the project implementation plan.
- 6. The Government, after careful examination of the proposal, passes the following orders.
  - (i) The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project, is permitted to implement Phase II of the comprehensive web based Health Management Information Systems in 222 hospitals in 222 secondary care hospitals and their controlling offices namely offices of the Joint Director Medical and Rural Health Services and the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services as detailed in Annexure I to this order and in 15 designated Primary Health Centres to be identified by the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project during the actual implementation.
  - (ii) Sanction is accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs. 68,49,40,878/(Rupees sixty eight crores forty nine lakhs forty thousand eight hundred and seventy eight only), as detailed in Annexure II to this order towards procurement of hardware components through M/s. ELCOT and advertisement charges. With regard to the procurement of TNSWAN connectivity through M/s ELCOT, the hardware and connectivity charges for the initial 3 years will be met from the World Bank funds and the charges for the next 2 years would be met from the State Government budget. The details are provided in the Annexure II.
  - (iii) Sanction is accorded for incurring an expenditure of Rs. 70,00,000/(Rupees seventy lakhs only) as detailed in Annexure III to this order towards procurement of additional LAN cabling and UPS cabling items for the existing pilot and Phase I hospitals through M/s. Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation.
  - (iv) Sanction is accorded for incurring of a recurring expenditure of Rs. 12,87,72,000 (Rupees twelve crores eighty seven lakes seventy two thousand only) as detailed in Annexure IV to this order, towards procurement of computer consumables, server hosting charges.
