### ORDER:

The Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare has made the following Announcement on the floor of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly:-

"சென்னை எழும்பூர் - அரசு குழந்தைகள் நல மருத்துவமனை, அரும்பாக்கம் - அரசு சித்த மருத்துவ கல்லூரி மருத்துவமனை மற்றும் அரசு யோகா (ம) இயற்கை மருத்துவக் கல்லூரி மருத்துவமனைகளில் நவீன வசதிகளுடன் கூடிய கட்டண படுக்கைகள் (Pay Ward) ரூபாய் 3.00 கோடி மதிப்பீட்டில் அமைக்கப்படும்."

2. The Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children, Egmore is one of the best performing institution and is located in the heart of the city. This Hospital was established in 1975 to cater to the needs of the children especially suffering from congenital anomalies, childhood infections and fractures. It garners the pride of being the largest public sector Paediatric Hospital in South East Asia. The patients benefit from several diagnostic, treatment and operative equipment like ventilators, monitors, infusion pumps, theatre equipment, video endoscopic system and laparoscopy.

3. As a part of the announcement, to improve the quality of care and provide modernized facilities, it has proposed for special repairs to the pay wards and other wards on the third floor of the D block at the Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children, Egmore, Chennai for the total estimated cost of Rs.63,80,000/- under TNHSRP fund.

4. The estimated budget, number of beds allotted for pay wards for the said institution are as follows:-

The estimate has been prepared based on the Schedule of Rates for the year 2023-2024 and the total estimated amount works out to Rs.51.50 lakh and with 10% price escalation for the year 2024-2025, the total estimate amount works out to Rs.56.65 lakh (Rs.40.15 lakh for Civil Works and the estimate amount works out to Rs.16.50 lakh for Electrical Work). The estimate have been approved by the Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Public Works Department and countersigned by the Director of Medical Education and Research, Chennai.

6. The State Empowered Committee has approved the above proposal.

7. The Government, after careful examination, have decided to sanction a sum of Rs.63,79,387/- (Rupees Sixty-Three Lakhs Seventy Nine Thousand Three Hundred and Eighty Seven only) towards special repairs to pay wards and other wards at Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children, Egmore, Chennai and ordered accordingly. The Director of Medical Education and Research is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned above. The Deans / Hospital Superintendents concerned should follow the codal procedures in the Pay wards. All other existing norms and guidelines for the pay wards shall be followed to these pay wards.

8. The amount sanctioned in para 7 above shall be debited to the following Head of Account:-

para – 7 above. However, this expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the legislature by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2024 – 2025. The Director of Medical Education and Research is also directed to include this expenditure while sending the budget proposals for FMA 2024 – 2025 and also send necessary draft explanatory notes for inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2024 – 2025 to the Government in Finance (Health-II) Department at an appropriate time without fail.
