ORDER:

The Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare has made the following Announcement on the floor of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly:-

2. The Indian system of Medicine commonly known as AYUSH system is serving human beings since the pre-historic period, globally. The entire system of medicine under the umbrella of AYUSH is the time-tested holistic approach to health care and healing. The term AYUSH is universally adopted for "traditional and Non-conventional system of health care and healing which includes Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Naturopathy, Siddha and Homoeopathy.

3. The Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine (AAGHIM) was established in the year 1970 at Arumbakkam, Chennai and it has grown from a 110-bed facility to a dynamic 310-bedded hospital, offering in-patient services for Siddha, Varma, Ayurveda, Homeopathy and Unani systems of medicine. The hospital is situated in the total area of 19 acres (8,27,460 sq. ft.). To improve the

quality of care and provide modernized facilities, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has proposed for Special repairs to the Pay ward at Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, TAMPCOL Main building, Arumbakkam, Chennai for the total estimated cost of Rs.40.00 Lakhs under Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program fund.

4.The budget estimate, number of rooms sanctioned for Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, TAMPCOL Main building, Arumbakkam, Chennai is as follows:-

5. He has furnished the detailed estimate for the above said activity for the year 2024-2025 which works out Rs.40,00,000/- with the approval obtained from the Engineer-in-Chief & Chief Engineer (General), Public Works Department and countersignature of the Head of the User Department concerned.

6. The State Empowered Committee has approved the above proposal.

7. The Government after careful examination, have decided to sanction a total cost of Rs.40,00,000/- (Rupees forty lakh only) towards special repairs to the Pay ward at Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, TAMPCOL Main building, Arumbakkam, Chennai through Public Works Department and ordered accordingly. The Commissioner of Indian Medicine and Homeopathy is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned above. The Deans / Hospital Superintendents concerned should follow the codal procedures in the Pay wards. All other existing norms and guidelines for the pay wards shall be followed to these pay wards.

8. The amount sanctioned in para 7 above shall be debited to the following Head of Account:-

2059 Public Works - 01 Office Buildings - 053 Maintenance and Repairs - State's Expenditure - BX Buildings - Indian Medicine and Homeopathy (Administered by Chief Engineering (Buildings)) - 317 Minor Works - 01 Minor Works.

9. Necessary additional funds of Rs.40,00,000/- will be provided in FMA 2024-2025. Pending provision of such funds, the Commissioner of Indian Medicine and Homeopathy is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in para 7 above. However, this expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the legislature by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2024-2025. The Commissioner of Indian Medicine and Homeopathy is also directed to include this expenditure while sending the budget proposals for FMA 2024-2025 and also send draft explanatory notes for inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2024- 2025 to Government in Finance (Health-I) Department at an appropriate time without fail.
